# THIS MODEL DEVICE MEETS THE GOVERNMENT'S REQUIREMENTS FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES.

Your wireless device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured to not exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kq.\*

Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions specified by the FCC with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the device while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

Before a device model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified to the FCC that it does not exceed the limit established by the government-adopted requirement for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model.

Body-worn measurements differ among device models, depending upon availability of accessories and FCC requirements. While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various devices and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for safe exposure.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model device with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF emission guidelines.

#### Optimize your Device's Performance

Use the instructions in this guide to learn how to optimize the performance and life of your device and battery.

### Air Bags

If you have an air bag, DO NOT place installed or portable device equipment or other objects over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If equipment is not properly installed, you and your passengers risk serious injury.

#### Medical Devices

Pacemakers—Warning to pacemaker wearers: Wireless devices, when in the 'on' position, have been shown to interfere with pacemakers. The device should be kept at least six (6) inches away from the pacemaker to reduce risk.

The Health Industry Manufacturers Association and the wireless technology research community recommend that you follow these guidelines to minimize the potential for interference.

- Always keep the device at least six inches (15 centimeters) away from your pacemaker when the device is turned on.
- Do not carry your device near your heart.
- Use the ear opposite the pacemaker.
- If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, turn off your device immediately.

Hearing aids—Some digital wireless devices may interfere with hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to call the customer service line to discuss alternatives.

#### Potentially unsafe areas

If the screen seems frozen and the keypad does not respond to key presses, reset the device by completing the following steps:

- Remove the battery cover.
- Remove and replace the battery.

If the problem persists, return the device to the dealer for service.

#### Radio Frequency (RF) Energy

Your device is a radio transmitter and receiver. When it is on, it receives and sends out RF energy. Your service provider's network controls the power of the RF signal. This power level can range from 0.006 to 0.6 watts.

In August 1996, the U.S. Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted RF exposure guidelines with safety levels for hand-held wireless devices. These guidelines are consistent with the safety standards previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies in the following reports:

- ANSI C95.1 (American National Standards Institute, 1992)
- NCRP Report 86 (National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements, 1986)
- ICNIRP (International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection, 1996)

# Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC) with Mobile Phones

Some mobile phones and hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants), when used together, result in buzzing, humming, or whining noises detected by the user.

Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and phones also vary in the amount of interference they generate.

The wireless telephone industry has developed ratings for some of their mobile phones, to assist hearing device users in finding phones that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all phones have been rated.

Phones that are rated have the rating on their box or a label on the box. The ratings are not guarantees and results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and hearing loss. If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interference, you may not be able to use a rated device successfully. Trying out the device with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

M-Ratings—Phones rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than phones that are not labeled. M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings.

T-Ratings—Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to be more usable with a hearing device's telecoil ("T Switch" or "Telephone Switch") than unrated phones. T4 is the better/higher of the two ratings. (Note that not all hearing devices have telecoils in them.)

Hearing devices may also be measured for immunity to this type of interference. Your hearing device manufacturer or hearing health professional may help you choose the proper rating for your mobile device. The more immune your hearing aid is, the less likely you are to experience interference noise from mobile phones.

# Install Battery

- Hold the device face-down.
- 2. Find the device lace-down.
  1. Hold the device lace-down.
  2. Find the notch at the bottom of the device. The notch is rectangular and in the middle of the device.

  Remove the cover by pressing a thumbnail against the notch.
- 3. Place the battery in the battery casing with the metal contacts facing to the top. The metal contacts of the battery must make contact with the metal contacts of the battery casing.
- Replace the battery door by lining up the notches with the openings at the top and on each side of the battery casing.
- 5. Snap the battery door into place.

## Charge Battery

1. Connect the USB cable to the Wall/USB Charger, and then connect the Micro-USB side of the cable to the Micro-USB jack on the left side of the device.



Plug the Wall/USB Charger into a wall outlet

The battery icon in the upper right corner of the screen indicates whether the device is:

- Charging (the icon is animated)
- Partially charged
- Fully charged 
   The device must have at least a partial charge in the battery to make or receive calls. The

battery can be recharged at any time, even with

a partial charge.

Note: The device can also be charged by plugging the USB cable into the PC and the Micro-USB jack into the device.

**Warning:** Before removing the battery, make sure the device is powered off.

## **Battery Safety Guidelines**

- Do not disassemble or open the battery.
- Do not crush, bend, deform, puncture, or shred the battery.
- Do not attempt to insert foreign objects into the battery.
- Do not immerse the battery or expose it to water or other liquids. Even if a battery appears to dry out and operate normally, internal parts can slowly corrode and pose a safety hazard.
- Always keep the battery between 15° C and 25° C (59° F and 77° F). Do not expose the battery to extremes of temperature (heat or cold), fire, or other hazards such as a cooking surface, iron, or radiator.
- Never use any damaged battery.
- Only use the battery for its intended device.
- Only use the battery with a qualified charger. Use of an unqualified battery charger may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard. If it not clear whether a charger is qualified, contact customer support.
- Do not short-circuit the battery or allow metallic conductive objects—such as keys, coins, or jewelry—to contact the battery's terminals
- Replace the battery only with another qualified battery. Use of an unqualified battery may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard. If it is not clear whether a replacement battery is compatible, contact customer support.
- Promptly dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations and

- recycle if possible. Do not dispose as household waste.
- Supervise all battery usage by children.
- Avoid dropping the device or battery. If the device or battery is dropped, especially on a hard surface, an internal short-circuit can occur and pose a safety hazard. If battery damage is suspected, take it to a service center for inspection.
- Improper battery use may result in a fire, explosion, or other hazard.

# Battery Life Management

Because the device provides an abundance of information and applications at 3G speed, it requires a lot of power. To get the most out of the battery, consider turning off options that require a data connection for notification tasks like Bluetooth, GPS, and Wi-Fi. Also, decrease the screen brightness, screen timeout time and listen to music directly from the SD card rather than stream over the network or via Wi-Fi. The following can also reduce battery life

between charges:

- Playing games or using the Web.
- Keeping backlighting on.
- Operating when far away from a base station or cell site.
- Using data cables or accessories.
- Operating when no service is available, or service is available intermittently.
- High earpiece and ringer volume settings.
- Repeating sound, vibration, or lighted alerts.

# **Memory Card**

The device's memory can be extended with a MicroSD memory card (SD card).

# Remove Memory Card

Warning: Be sure to follow the steps below before removing the card. Otherwise, the data on the device may be lost or damaged. Do not remove the card while downloading or saving files to the card

- 1. From **Settings**, touch **Storage**.
- 2. Touch **Unmount SD card**. The SD card can now be safely removed.
- 3. Hold the device face-down.
- 4. Find the notch at the bottom of the device. The notch is rectangular and in the middle of the device. Remove the cover by pressing a thumbnail against the notch.
- Find the pull tab on the battery. Use the pull tab to lift the battery out of the battery casing.
- 6. Slide the SD card slot to the left to unlock it.



7. Lift the SD card slot up.



- Slide the SD card out of the slot
- Lower the SD card slot into place, then slide the SD card slot to the right to lock it.



10. Place the battery in the battery casing with the metal contacts facing to the top. The metal contacts of the battery must make contact with the metal contacts of the battery casing.

### Install SD Card

- 1. Hold the device face-down.

- Replace the battery door by lining up the notches with the openings at the top and on each side of the battery casing.
- 10. Snap the battery door into place.

**Note:** A notification appears when the card is ready for use. Do not use the card until the notification appears on the screen.

## **Device Overview**

The device is shown here in the closed position. The external cover is a touch screen.


- 1. Earpiece speaker.
- Touch screen.
- 3. **Home** key returns the display to the home screen. Make sure to press the key below the icon.
- Menu key opens the menu options for the current screen or application. Make sure to press the key below the icon.
- Search key launches the Google Search application. Make sure to press the key below the icon.
- Back key returns the display to the previous screen or closes a dialog box. Make sure to press the key below the icon.

The following shows the back of the device.

- Power key turns on the device. Press and hold the Power key to
  turn the device on or off. Press the Power key to lock the touch
  screen.
- 2. Camera lens.
- Camera key launches the camera. Press and hold the Camera key to activate camera mode.
- 4. Jack for a hands-free headset (sold separately).
- Volume key raises or lowers ringer volume. Vibrate and silent modes can also be activated with the Volume key.
- 6. Jack for AC adapter and Micro-USB cable.
- 7. External speaker.
- 8. Accessory eyelet (for optional straps and lanyards).

Warning: Inserting an accessory into the incorrect jack will damage the device.





The device is shown here in the open position. Text can be entered using the QWERTY keypad.

- Touch screen.
- QWERTY keypad for entering numbers, letters, or symbols.
- Shift key changes the case mode in text entry. Press the Shift key once to change case mode or press twice to toggle between case modes.
- 4. Function key enables entry of symbol characters or acts as a toggle between letters and symbols. Press the Function key once to change the input mode for the next character; press twice (within 2 seconds) to toggle between letters and symbols.



- 5. Symbol key accesses symbols that are not available on the QWERTY keypad.
- 6. Delete key erases characters during text entry.
- 7. Enter key selects an option on the touch screen or generates a carriage return during text entry.
- 8. key enters a space during text entry.

# Google Account

### Create Account from Device

A Google account can be created from the device.

- From Accounts & sync, touch Add account.
- 2. Select the Google application.
- Touch Next and follow the prompts to create a user name and password. Accept the Google Terms of Service to create an account.
- Once an account is created, select the desired Google applications to synchronize with the device.

## **Guide Conventions**

In this guide, the following conventions are used when describing device features.

**Touch** means to touch an area on the screen. For example, "Touch **Done**" means to physically touch the word **Done** on the device screen.

**Touch and hold** means to touch and hold an area on the screen. For example, "Touch and hold a contact" means to physically touch a contact name on the device screen and hold it until the screen reacts.

Touch and drag means to touch an area on the screen and drag it to another location. For example, "Touch Answer icon and drag it right" means to physically touch Answer icon on the device screen and use a finger to move it right.

Flick means to touch an area on the screen and drag it quickly across the screen. For example, "Flick Answer icon" means to physically touch Answer icon on the device screen and use a finger to move it quickly to another area on the screen

**Press** means to use a device key. For example, "Press the **Menu** key to access more features" means to physically press the **Menu** key on the device.

**Press and hold** means to use a device key. For example, "Press and hold the **Power** key" means to physically press the **Power** key on the device and hold it until the screen reacts.

Scroll means to swipe or slide to move through a list on the display. For example, "Scroll through the contacts list to choose a contact" means to physically swipe the screen with a finger up or down to scroll through the contact list on the display.

**Select** means to choose an option. For example, "Select **Settings**" means to physically touch the screen to select the highlighted **Settings** option.

- > (greater than symbol) means to select an option from a menu or list. For example, "Settings > Accessibility" means to:
- 1. From the main menu, touch **Settings**.
- Scroll to the Accessibility option.
- 3. Touch Accessibility.

# 2 Home Screen


The home screen is the starting point for all applications. Applications can be launched and notifications can be viewed from here.

# Home Screen Overview

The home screen refers to the initial state of the device. This is also called the idle state. The home screen has the following elements.

- Status bar displays notifications and other device icons.
- Quick Search bar runs Google Search. Use the Quick Search bar to perform text or voice searches.
- 3. Work area displays widgets and shortcuts.
- 4. Call icon launches Phone.
- Main Menu icon launches the main menu. This lists all the applications currently on the device.
- 6. Browser icon launches Browser.
- Screen panel indicators identify which panel of the home screen that is currently active.

**Note:** Press the **Home** key from within any application to return to the home screen.



# View Screen Panels

The home screen has five panels to place shortcuts and widgets on.

- From the home screen, scroll to the left or right see another panel.
- At any screen panel, do one of the following:
  - Touch Call icon to make calls with Phone.
  - Touch Main Menu icon to access the main menu.
  - Touch Browser icon to surf the Internet with Browser.
  - Touch and hold the screen to access features specific for that panel.
  - Press the Menu key to access more features.
  - Press the **Home** key to return to the center panel of the five panels.

**Note:** The screen panel indicators at the bottom of the screen show which panel is currently in view.

# **Device Key Options**

This device has dedicated keys that access the following features.

### Power Device On

Press and hold the **Power** key until the screen turns on.

#### Power Device Off

- Press and hold the Power key.
- Touch Power off.
- Touch **OK** to confirm the power off request.

# **Enable Airplane Mode**

While in an airplane, it is normally required to turn off the mobile device because it emits RF signals that interfere with air traffic control. In airplane mode, however, the device does not emit RF signals. The device cannot make or receive calls, send text messages, use a browser or bluetooth devices, but the device can play games, use the calendar, set the clock, and make emergency calls to designated emergency numbers. Please check with uniformed personnel before operating the device in airplane mode.

- 1. Press and hold the Power key.
- Touch Airplane mode. The airplane mode icon will appear on the status bar.

To disable airplane mode, repeat the steps.

### **Enable Silent Mode**

Silent mode can be enabled for the device at any time.

- Press and hold the Power key.
- Touch Silent mode. The vibrate only icon will appear on the status bar.

To disable silent mode, repeat the steps.

**Note:** If the device is locked, flick **Sound icon** to enable silent mode. To disable silent mode, flick **Vibrate icon**.

### Lock Touch Screen

To avoid the screen from accidentally being touched, the touch screen will automatically lock after a length of time. The touch screen can be locked manually at any time.

Press the **Power** key. The backlight will turn off while the screen is locked.

To unlock the touch screen, press the **Power** key. Then flick **Lock icon**.

# Launch Google Search

Press the **Search** key at any time. For more information, see "Google Search" on page 76.

## Access Current Menu

To view features for the current application or screen, press the **Menu** key. The features will change depending on which application is in use.

**Note:** If one of the options is **More**, this means that more features are available than shown. Touch **More** to view these features.

# Return to Home Screen

Press the Home key at any time.

# Return to Previous Screen

Press the Back key to view previous screen.

# Adjust the Volume

Press the **Volume** key up or down. Which volume setting is adjusted depends on the application in use. For example, when adjusting the volume while playing music, the media volume is adjusted.

# **Home Screen Options**

The following features can be accessed from the home screen.

### Create a Shortcut

Create a shortcut on the home screen.

- At the home screen, touch and hold an empty space on the screen.
- 2. Touch Shortcuts.
- 3. Select a shortcut option from the list.
- Complete the appropriate task. The shortcut will now appear on the home screen.

**Note:** Alternatively, press the **Menu** key and touch **Add** > **Shortcuts** to create a shortcut.

# Install a Widget

Install a widget on the home screen.

- At the home screen, touch and hold an empty space on the screen.
- 2. Touch Widgets.
- 3. Select a widget from the list.
- Complete the installation. The widget will now appear on the home screen.

**Note:** Alternatively, press the **Menu** key and touch **Add > Widgets** to install a widget.

#### Link to a Folder

Create a shortcut to a folder on the device.

- 1. At the home screen, touch and hold an empty space on the screen.
- 2. Touch Folders.
- Select a folder on the device. The folder shortcut will now appear on the home screen

**Note:** Alternatively, press the **Menu** key and touch **Add > Folders** to link to a folder.

# Set the Wallpaper

Change the wallpaper for the device.

- 1. At the home screen, touch and hold an empty space on the screen.
- 2. Touch Wallpapers.
- Select a wallpaper from the available options.
- Touch Set wallpaper to set the wallpaper as the background.

**Note:** Alternatively, press the **Menu** key and touch **Wallpaper** to set the wallpaper.

## Manage Applications

- 1. At the home screen, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Manage Apps.
- Select an application to manage from the applications list.

### View Notifications

When a notification is received, the device displays an icon in the status bar at the top of the screen. An alert will be heard or felt, depending on the notification.

- 1. At the home screen, press the **Menu** key.
- 2. Touch Notifications.
- Select a notification from the notifications list.
- 4. Complete the appropriate task.

**Note:** Any time a notification is received, touch the icon and drag it down to open the notifications list. The device do not need to be at the home screen.

# Access Device Settings

- 1. At the home screen, press the **Menu** key.
- Touch Settings.
- At the **Settings** menu, select a setting to change.

For more information, see "Settings" on page 50.

# Use Google Search

- 1. At the home screen, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Search.
- Enter characters to search. For more information, see "Google Search" on page 76.

### Access Main Menu

At the home screen, touch **Main Menu icon** to go to the main menu. This lists all the applications installed on the device.

# Access Call History

At the home screen, touch **Call icon** to go to the call history. For more information, see "Call log" on page 30.

### Launch Browser

At the home screen, touch **Browser icon** to launch the browser. For more information, see "Browser" on page 69.

### Reposition an Item

- At the home screen, touch and hold an item (such as a shortcut or widget) to reposition it. The item becomes moveable.
- 2. Drag the item to the desired location.
- Release the item to finalize the new location.

**Note:** To reposition an item to an extended panel, drag the item to the edge of the screen until the home screen extends.

### Delete an Item

- At the home screen, touch and hold an item (such as a shortcut or widget) an item to delete it. The item becomes moveable.
- 2. Drag the item to the **Trash icon**.
- Release the item to delete it from the home screen.

# View Recent Applications

At the home screen, press and hold the **Home** key to view the last applications used by the device.

# 3 Phone

From Phone, numbers can be dialed.

# Make Phone Calls

Make sure the device is in an area where a signal can be received. Look for the signal strength icon on the home screen. The more bars, the stronger the signal. If there are no bars, move to where the signal strength is better.

There are several ways to make a phone call.

### Dial a Number

- From the home screen, touch Main Menu icon.
- 2. At the main menu, touch Phone.
- 3. If necessary, touch **Phone** again.
- 4. At the dialpad, enter a number.
- 5. Touch Call icon to dial the number.

#### Call a Contact

- 1. At the dialpad, touch Contacts.
- At the contacts list, touch and hold a contact.
- 3. Touch Call contact.
- 4. If applicable, select a number from the list.
- 5. Complete the phone call.

### Call a Favorite

- 1. At the dialpad, touch Favorites.
- 2. At the favorites list, touch **Call icon** next to the number to dial it.
- 3. Complete the phone call.

### Redial a Number

- 1. At the dialpad, touch Call log.
- At the records list, touch Call icon next to the number to dial it.
- 3. Complete the phone call.

#### Save Number to Contacts

- When entering a number, press the Menu key.
- Touch Add to Contacts to add the number to Contacts.

### Enter a Time Pause

A time pause causes the device to stop dialing for two seconds.

- When entering a number, press the Menu key.
- Touch Add 2-sec pause to insert a time pause.
- 3. Enter the remaining numbers.
- Touch Call icon to dial the number.

#### Enter a Hard Pause

A hard pause causes the device to wait until you confirm the dialing to continue.

- When entering a number, press the Menu key.
- Touch Add wait to insert a hard pause.
- 3. Enter the remaining numbers.
- 4. Touch Call icon to dial the number.

### Use Voice Dialer

Use voice commands to call a contact or to dial a device number. For more information, see "Voice Dialer" on page 78.

# Call Emergency Services

The device can call an emergency code even if the it is locked or an account is restricted. When the call is made, the device enters emergency mode. This allows the device to receive calls from emergency services personnel. The device must exit this mode to make or receive regular calls after dialing this code.

- At the dialpad, enter the 3-digit emergency code
- Touch Call icon to dial emergency services.
- 3. When the call is complete, touch **End**.
- 4. Touch **Exit** to exit emergency mode.

# Answer Phone Calls

When a call comes in, the device rings, vibrates, or lights up. The phone number of the caller also appears if it is not restricted. If the number is stored in the contacts list, the contact's name appears.

There are several ways to respond to an incoming call.

### Answer a Call

When call alert is received, touch **Answer** to answer the call.

If the device is locked, flick **Answer icon** to answer the call.

## Ignore a Call

When a call alert is received, touch **Ignore** to silence the alert. If applicable, the call will go directly to voicemail.

If the device is locked, flick **End icon** to ignore the call.

## End a Call

To end a phone call, touch **End**.

# Adjust Volume During a Call

Press the **Volume** key up or down to adjust the earpiece volume.

# Dial Number During a Call

During a call, touch **Add call** to dial another number.

When two or more active calls are active, touch a call status to toggle between the calls or **Merge calls** to create a conference call.

### Create Conference Calls

- During a call, touch Add call to dial another number.
- Touch Merge calls to create a conference call.

During a conference call, touch **Manage** to access the phone lines on the conference call.

# Use Dialpad During a Call

This feature works as a toggle. During a call, touch **Dialpad** to use the dialpad. Touch **Hide** again to close the dialpad.

# Use Speaker During a Call

This feature works as a toggle. During a call, touch **On** under **Speaker** to activate the speakerphone. Touch **Off** to turn off the speakerphone.

# Mute Sound During a Call

This feature works as a toggle. During a call, touch **On** under **Mute** to silence the microphone. Touch **Off** to turn off the microphone.

# Use Bluetooth during a Call

The Bluetooth feature works as a toggle.

- 1. During a call, press the **Menu** key.
- Touch Bluetooth to connect to a paired Bluetooth device. Touch Bluetooth again to disconnect.

For more information, see "Bluetooth settings" on page 53.

# Voicemail

Voicemail can be access from the device. To control the settings associated with voicemail, see "Call settings" on page 55.

## Configure Voicemail

Before the device can receive voicemail messages, a password must be set up and personal greeting recorded with the service provider.

When the voicemail is set up, all unanswered calls to the device are automatically transferred to voicemail, even if the device is in use or turned off.

- From the home screen, touch Main Menu icon.
- 2. At the main menu, touch **Phone**.
- 3. At the dialpad, touch **Voicemail icon**.
- Follow the system prompts to create a password and record a greeting.

**Note:** Alternatively, touch and hold 1 to access voicemail.

## Respond to Voicemail Notifications

When a voicemail is received, the device displays a voicemail icon in the status bar at the top of the screen. An alert will be heard or felt, depending on the settings.

- When the voicemail icon appears, touch the icon and drag it down to open the notifications list.
- 2. Touch the voicemail notification.
- Follow the system prompts to retrieve the message.

**Note:** At the dialpad, touch and hold 1 to access voicemail at anytime.

# Call log

From **Call log**, the call history can be reviewed.

# View Call Log

Incoming, outgoing and missed calls are recorded in a call log.

- 1. From the home screen, touch **Main Menu** icon
- 2. At the main menu, touch Phone.
- At the dialpad, touch Call log. Incoming, outgoing and missed calls are designated by icons.

- 4. At the call log, do one of the following:
  - Touch Call icon next to a number to redial it.
  - Touch and hold a record to access features for the specific record.
  - Press the Menu key to access more features.

# Respond to Missed Call Notifications

When a call is missed, the device displays a missed call icon in the status bar at the top of the screen. An alert will be heard or felt, depending on the settings.

- When the missed call icon appears, touch the icon and drag it down to open the notifications list.
- Touch the missed call notification to view the call log.

## Call log Options

### Redial a Number

- 1. At the call log, touch and hold a record.
- 2. Touch Call [number].
- 3. Complete the phone call.

### Edit Number before Redialing

- 1. At the call log, touch and hold a record.
- 2. Touch Edit number before call.
- 3. At the dialpad, edit the number.
- 4. Complete the phone call.

- 1. At the call log, touch and hold a record.
- Touch Add to contacts to add the number to Contacts.

### View a Contact

- Touch Send text message.
- 3. Complete the message.

### Delete a Record

- 2. Touch Clear call log.
- 3. Touch **OK** to confirm.

# View Contacts List

- From the home screen, touch Main Menu icon.
- 2. At the main menu, touch Contacts.
- 3. At the contacts list, do one of the following:
  - Touch a contact to view details.
  - Touch and hold a contact to access features for the specific contact.
  - Press the Menu key to access more features.

# Create a Contact

- 1. At the contacts list, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch New contact.
- 3. At the edit contact screen, touch **First**name to enter a first name.
- 4. Touch Last name and enter a last name.
- 5. Touch **Phone** and enter the phone number.
- Enter any additional phone numbers, email addresses, and other contact details.
- 7. Touch **Done** to save.

### View Favorites

- At the contacts list, touch Favorites.
- At the favorites list, do one of the following:

- Enter letters to search by name. As text is entered, the screen displays contacts that match the typed letters.

## Display Only Contacts with Numbers

- 1. At the contacts list, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Display options.
- Touch Only contacts with phones to only display contacts that have phone numbers. A check mark indicates Only contacts with phones is enabled.
- 4. Touch **Done** to save.

### Sort Contacts

- 1. At the contacts list, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Display options.
- 3. Touch Sort list by.
- 4. Select a sort option from the list.
- 5. Touch Done to save.

# Set Contact Display

- At the contacts list, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch **Display options**.
- 3. Touch View contact names as.
- 4. Select a display option from the list.
- Touch **Done** to save.

### Add Contacts from an Account

- At the contacts list, press the Menu key.
- Touch Accounts to access the account settings.
- Touch Add account.
- 4. Select an application or account type.
- 5. Complete the settings as needed.

### Import Contacts from SD Card

- 1. At the contacts list, press the **Menu** key.
- 2. Touch Import/Export > Import from SD card.
- 3. Choose where to place imported contacts.
- 4. Choose a vCard file on the SD card to read. To export contacts to an SD card, select **Export to SD card**.

## **Share Contacts**

- 2. Touch Import/Export > Share visible contacts.
- 3. Select a sharing option.
- Complete the appropriate task to send the contact list.

To access more detail fields, touch More icon.

- At the edit contact screen, touch Add icon to add a detail such as a number or address.
   To remove a contact detail, touch Subtract icon next to a number or address.
- 4. Enter the number or address.
- 5. Touch **Done** to save.

To view more detail fields, touch More icon.

## Change Number Label

- When viewing a contact, press the Menu key.
- Touch Edit contact.
- 3. At the edit contact screen, touch the label next to the phone number.
- 4. Select a label from the list.
- Touch **Done** to save.

# Assign Image to Contact

- When viewing a contact, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Edit contact.
- At the edit contact screen, touch the image icon.
- 4. Take a new picture or assign one from the **Gallery**.
- 5. Touch Done to save.

## Assign Ringtone to Contact

- When viewing a contact, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Options.
- Touch Ringtone and select a sound from the list.
- 4. Touch **OK** to assign to contact.

#### Send Calls to Voicemail

- When viewing a contact, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Options.
- Touch Incoming calls to send incoming calls from the contact directly to voicemail. A check mark indicates Incoming calls is enabled.

### Share a Contact

- When viewing a contact, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch **Share** and select a sharing option.
- Complete the appropriate task to send the contact.

### Delete a Contact

- When viewing a contact, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch **Delete contact**.
- 3. Touch **OK** to confirm.

Use **Messaging** to manage messages on the device.

# View All Message Threads

All messages are displayed as a list of threads. A thread is group of messages sent between you and a contact, number or email address. The thread with the most recent message is displayed first.

- 1. From the home screen, touch **Main Menu** icon
- At the main menu, touch Messaging. All message threads are displayed. Threads are displayed in the following ways:
  - Unread threads are in bold text. The number of messages in the thread is shown in parenthesis after the address of the sender, for example **Luthor Bone** (5). If there is only one message in a thread, no number is displayed.
  - Read threads are in plain text. Messages with attachments or messages that are locked are designated by applicable icons.
  - Drafts are designated by an icon.
  - Browser alerts are designated by an icon.
  - Scheduled messages are designated by an icon. These messages will be sent at a time set previously.

- Pending messages are designated by an icon. These messages will be sent when possible.
- Failed messages are designated by an icon. These messages cannot be sent.
- 3. At the thread list, do the following:
  - Touch a thread to view messages in the thread. When viewing a thread, touch a message to view that individual message.
  - Touch and hold a thread to access features for the specific thread.
  - Touch New message to create a new message.
  - Press the Menu key to access more features

# Create a Message

Messages can only be sent to phone numbers capable of receiving them or to email addresses. If the character and file size limit for a single message is exceeded, the message must be edited to meet the size limitation.

- At the thread list, touch New message.
- At the compose screen, enter a recipient's phone number, email address or contact name.

- Enter a message. Touch and hold the text entry field to access more text entry features.
- Press the Menu key to access more message features.
- 5. When done, touch Send.

If a call is received while creating a message, a notification appears. Do one of the following:

- Touch **Ignore** to ignore the call and return to the compose screen.
- Touch Answer to answer the call. The message is automatically saved as a draft.

# Respond to Message Notifications

When a message received, the device displays a message icon in the status bar at the top of the screen. An alert will be heard or felt, depending on the settings.

- When the message icon appears, touch the icon and drag it down to open the notifications list.
- Touch the messages notification.
- If necessary, touch a thread from the thread list. Threads containing new messages are in bold text.
- If necessary, touch **Download** to get media attachments.
- 5. At the message thread, compose the reply.

# **Compose Message Options**

# Send Message to Contact

- At the compose message screen, enter a name at the top of the screen.
- 2. Select a contact from the contacts.
- 3. Complete the message.

### Add a Subject

- 1. At the compose message screen, press the **Menu** key.
- 2. Touch Add subject.
- 3. Enter a subject in the subject field.
- 4. Complete the message.

### Create a Media File

- At the compose message screen, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Attach.
- 3. Select an option from the list. For example, touch **Capture video** to record a video.
- 4. Complete the message.

### Attach a Media File

- At the compose message screen, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Attach.
- 3. Select an option from the list. For example, touch **Pictures** to attach a picture.
- Select a media file.
- 5. Complete the message.

### Attach a Slideshow

- At the compose message screen, press the Menu key.
- Touch Attach > Slideshow.
- Use the controls to create a slideshow of multiple media files.
- 4. Complete the message.

# Insert a Smiley

- At the compose message screen, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Insert smiley.
- 3. Select a smiley from the list.
- 4. Complete the message.

### Return to Threads List

- At the compose message screen, press the Menu key.
- Touch All threads to return to the threads list. Any messages that have not been sent are saved as a draft.

### Discard a Message

- At the compose message screen, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch **Discard** to return to the threads list without saving the draft.

### Set Priority

- At the compose message screen, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Set priority.

- 3. Select a priority level.
- 4. Complete the message.

# Text Entry Options

# Enter Text with Android Keyboard

- When composing a message, touch a text entry field to activate the virtual Android keyboard.
- 2. At the keyboard, do one of the following:
  - Touch keyboard to enter text.
  - Touch and hold entry field to access more text options.
  - If applicable, touch **Done** to close the keyboard. Otherwise, press the **Back** key.

Settings for the Android keyboard can be modified. For more information, see "Android keyboard" on page 63.

# Enter Text with QWERTY Keyboard

- 1. Slide open the device's built-in keyboard.
- 2. When composing a message, scroll to a text entry field. Do one of the following:
  - Press the keyboard buttons to enter text.
  - Touch and hold entry field to access more text options.

The settings for the built-in keyboard can be modified. For more information, see "Built-in keyboard" on page 65.

### **Enter Numbers and Symbols**

- When entering text, touch SYM. The keyboard changes to show numbers and symbols.
- Enter characters as needed. Touch Shift to see more characters.

To return to letters, touch ABC.

### Change Letter Case

The device enters letters in sentence case. This can be changed to upper or lower case, if needed.

When entering text, touch **Shift** to change the letter case mode. The keyboard will change accordingly.

An indicator next to the Android keyboard **Shift** key signals when the Caps lock is on. Touch **Shift** to turn the Caps lock off.

### Add Smileys

When entering text, touch :-) to enter a smiley. Touch and hold :-) see more smileys.

### **Use Word Dictionary**

When a message is created, the device can speed up word completion. The device uses a dictionary to guess words that are typed. When entering text, touch words from the choices shown to add them to the message. If the choices do not fit on the screen, use the arrow controls to view more words. For example, to enter the word "Wyoming", enter w > y > 0 and touch Wyoming.

### Add Word to Dictionary

- 1. When entering text, touch and hold the entry field after a word is typed.
- Touch the applicable Add [word] to dictionary option to add the word to the user dictionary.
- 3. Touch **OK** to confirm.

### Copy and Paste Text

- When entering text, touch and hold the entry field after typing content.
- Touch a selection option. For example, touch Select all to choose all the content. The selected content is highlighted.
- Move the cursor to a new position. Touch and hold the entry field again.
- 4. Touch **Paste Paste**to place the text.

**Note:** To copy the content for use later, touch **Copy**.

### Delete Text

- 1. When entering text, touch and hold the entry field after typing content.
- Touch a selection option. For example, touch Select all to choose all the content. The selected content is highlighted.
- 3. Touch and hold the entry field again.
- 4. Touch **Cut** to delete the selected content.

**Note:** To delete text one character at a time, touch **Delete**.

### Change Input Method

- 1. When entering text, touch and hold the entry field.
- 2. Touch Input method.
- Select an option for entering text. This may change how the keyboard operates.

- At the compose screen, enter a recipient's phone number, email address or contact name.

- 1. At the threads list, touch and hold a thread.
- 2. Touch Delete thread.
- 3. Touch **Delete** to confirm.

### Delete All Threads

- 1. At the threads list, press the Menu key.
- Touch Delete threads.
- Touch **Delete** to confirm.

- When viewing a thread, enter a message in the text entry field at the bottom of the screen. All thread recipients are included in the reply.
- 2. When done, touch Send.

- Select an option from the list. For example, touch Capture video to record a video.
- 4. Complete the reply message.

### Attach a Media File

- When viewing a thread, press the Menu key.

- Select an option from the list. For example, touch Capture picture to attach a picture.
- 4. Select a media file.
- 5. Complete the reply message.

### Attach a Slideshow

- When viewing a thread, press the Menu key.
- Touch Attach > Slideshow.
- Use the controls to create a slideshow of multiple media files.
- 4. Complete the reply message.

### Insert a Smiley

- When viewing a thread, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Insert smilev.
- 3. Select a smiley from the list.
- 4. Complete the reply message.

### View the Sender

- When viewing a thread, press the Menu key.
- Touch View contact to view the sender contact information.

### Add Sender to Contacts

- When viewing a thread, press the Menu key.
- Touch Add to Contacts to add the sender to Contacts.

### View an Attachment

- When viewing a thread, touch and hold a message with an attachment. Messages with attachments are designated by icons.
- 2. Touch the applicable option. For example, touch **View picture** to view a picture.

### Play an Attachment

- When viewing a thread, touch and hold a message with an attachment. Messages with attachments are designated by icons.
- 2. Touch the applicable option. For example, touch **Play video** to play a video.
- Touch the screen icons to control the playback.

### Save an Attachment

- When viewing a thread, touch and hold a message with an attachment. Messages with attachments are designated by icons.
- Touch the applicable option. For example, touch Save picture to save a picture. The attachment is saved to the SD card

### Share an Attachment

- When viewing a thread, touch and hold a message with an attachment. Messages with attachments are designated by icons.
- 2. Touch the applicable option. For example, touch **Share picture** to share a picture.

- 3. Select a sharing option from the list.
  - Complete the appropriate task to share the attachment.

### Lock a Message

- When viewing a thread, touch and hold a message.
- Touch Lock message to protect it from accidental deletion. To unlock a message, touch Unlock message.

### Forward a Message

- When viewing a thread, touch and hold a message.
- Touch Forward to open compose message screen, with message text added.
- 3. Complete the message.

# Copy Message Text

- When viewing a thread, touch and hold a message.
- Touch Copy message text to copy the text in a message.

# View Message Details

- When viewing a thread, touch and hold a message.
- Touch View message details to view the details.
- 3. Touch **OK** to return to the thread.

### Return to Threads List

- When viewing a thread, press the Menu key.
- Touch All threads to return to the threads list. Messages that have not been completed are saved as drafts.

# Set Priority

- When viewing a thread, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Set priority.
- 3. Select a priority level.
- 4. Complete the reply message.

# Delete a Message

- When viewing a thread, touch and hold a message.
- 2. Touch Delete message.
- 3. Touch **Delete** to confirm.

### Delete a Thread

- When viewing a thread, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Delete thread.
- 3. Touch Delete to confirm.

# Message Settings

Message settings affect all messages unless they are changed for an individual message. At the thread list, press the **Menu** key and touch **Settings** to modify the following features.

### **Delete Old Messages Automatically**

Touch **Delete old messages** to delete old messages automatically when message limits are reached. A check mark indicates **Delete old messages** is enabled.

### Set Text Message Limit

A limit can be set for the number of messages allowed for each conversation.

- 1. Touch Text message limit.
- 2. Use the controls to enter a new limit.
- Touch Set to save.

# Set Multimedia Message Limit

A limit can be set for the number of multimedia messages allowed for each conversation.

- Touch Multimedia message limit.
- 2. Use the controls to enter a new limit.
- Touch Set to save.

### Set CMAS Alerts

Touch **CMAS Alerts** to choose the type of Commercial Mobile Alert System messages received from the federal government.

# Enable Multimedia Message Read Reports

Touch **Read reports** to request a notice when a sent message is read. A check mark indicates **Read reports** is enabled.

### **Enable Auto-retrieve**

Touch **Auto-retrieve** to automatically retrieve messages with multimedia content. If disabled, a prompt to download messages with multimedia content is received. A check mark indicates **Auto-retrieve** is enabled.

# Enable Roaming Auto-retrieve Touch Roaming auto-retrieve to automatically retrieve messages with multimedia content when roaming. If disabled, a prompt to download messages with multimedia content is received. A check mark indicates Roaming auto-retrieve is enabled.

### **Enable Notifications**

Touch **Notifications** to display message notifications in the status bar. A check mark indicates **Notifications** is enabled.

# Set Message Ringtone

- Touch Select ringtone.
- Select a sound from the list. Touch the names to preview a sound.
- 3. Touch **OK** to save.

### Set Message Vibrate Alert

- 1 Touch Vibrate
- 2. Select one of the following:
  - Always enables vibrate for message alerts.
  - Only when silent enables vibrate when Silent mode is enabled.
  - Never disables vibrate for message alerts.

### **Enable Callback Number**

Touch Callback number to send a callback number with the outgoing messages. A check mark indicates Callback number is enabled.

### Set Callback Number

- 1. Touch Edit callback number.
- 2. Modify the callback number.
- 3. Touch **OK** to save.

# 6 Gallery

Use **Gallery** to store media files and other downloads.

# View Gallery

The media files are grouped into albums. The albums are sorted in several ways, including by source and file types. This allows for quick browsing of saved content.

- From the home screen, touch Main Menu icon.
- 2. At the main menu, touch **Gallery**.
- 3. At the albums list, do one of the following:
  - Touch a group to view the file list.
  - Touch and hold a group to access features for the specific group.
  - Press the Menu key to access more features.

### Take a Picture

- At the albums list, touch Camera icon.
- 2. Take the picture.

# File List Options

### View a Slideshow

- 1. At a file list, select a file.
- Touch Slideshow to start the slideshow of all files in the album. To stop the slideshow, touch the screen.

### View a File

- At a file list, select a file.
- 2. At the file display, do one of the following:
  - Touch the screen to access commonly used features and controls.
  - Scroll left to view the previous file in the album
  - Scroll right to view the next file in the album
  - Press the Menu key to access more features

### Play a File

- 1. At a file list, select a file.
- Touch the screen to use the playback controls.

### Share a File

- 1. At a file list, touch and hold a file.
- Touch Share.
- 3. Select a sharing option from the list.
- Complete the appropriate task to share the file.

# Share Multiple Files

- Touch other files to select them. A check mark indicates a file has been selected. Touch again to remove a check mark.

- Touch the highlighted border to display the crop tools. Crop the file as needed. To keep the aspect ratio when cropping, touch and hold one of the four corners.
- 4. Touch Save to save the cropped file.

### Assign a File

- 1. At a file list, touch and hold a file.
- 2. Touch Set as
- 3. Select an option.
- Complete the appropriate task to assign the file

### View File Details

- 1. At a file list, touch and hold a file.
- 2. Touch **Details** view the file details.
- 3. Touch **OK** to close the detail screen.

### Delete a File

- 1. At a file list, touch and hold a file.
- 2. Touch Delete.
- 3. Touch **OK** to confirm.

### Delete Multiple Files

- 1. At a file list, touch and hold a file.
- Touch other files to select them. A check mark indicates a file has been selected. Touch again to remove a check mark.
- 3. Touch Delete.
- 4. Touch **OK** to confirm.

# 7 Camera

Use **Camera** to take pictures and record videos.

# Camera Tips

Before using the device's camera, here are some tips:

- The SD card must be installed to take pictures or record videos.
- Do not use the camera while the device is connected to a computer and the storage card is recognized as a USB drive.
- If a low memory error appears, check the resolution and quality compression settings.

### Take a Picture

- From the home screen, touch Main Menu icon.
- 2. At the main menu, touch Camera.
- Adjust the settings as needed.
- To take the picture, touch Take picture icon. The new image is saved to the Gallery.

# Record a Video

- From the home screen, touch Main Menu icon.
- 2. At the main menu, touch **Camera**.
- Use the slider control to switch to video mode.
- 4. Adjust the settings as needed.
- To start the recording, touch **Record video** icon.
- To end the recording, touch Record video icon again. The new video is saved to the Gallery.

# **Camera Options**

Save Store Location

- When taking a picture, touch Store location icon.
- Touch On to save the store location with the picture.
- Touch Store location icon close and confirm.

### **Review Last Picture**

When taking a picture, touch the thumbnail in the right corner to view the last picture taken or saved to the SD card.

Pictures can be viewed as needed. For more information, see "Gallery" on page 45.

### Switch to Camcorder

When taking a picture, use the slider control to switch from the **Camera icon** to the

Camcorder icon. The device can now record a video.

### Set White Balance

- When taking a picture, touch White balance icon.
- 2. Select a color temperature from the list.
- Touch White balance icon to close and confirm.

### Use Camera Zoom

- 1. When taking a picture, touch **Zoom icon**.
- 2. Use the slider control to zoom in or out.
- 3. Touch **Zoom icon** to close and confirm.

The current zoom level is shown on the screen.

### Set Focus Mode

- 1. When taking a picture, touch **Settings icon**.
- 2. Scroll to Focus mode.
- 3. Select a focus option for pictures.
- 4. Touch Settings icon to close and confirm.

### Set Scene Mode

- 1. When taking a picture, touch **Settings icon**.
- Scroll to Scene mode.
- 3. Select a scene mode for pictures.
- 4. Touch **Settings icon** to close and confirm.

### Set Picture Size

- 1. When taking a picture, touch Settings icon.
- 2. Scroll to Picture size.
- Select a default size for pictures.
- 4. Touch Settings icon to close and confirm.

**Note:** If a larger picture size is selected, the pictures taken will be larger in file size.

# Set Picture Quality

- 1. When taking a picture, touch Settings icon.
- 2. Scroll to **Picture quality**.
- Select a quality level for videos.
- Touch Settings icon to close and confirm.

**Note:** If a higher quality level is selected, the pictures taken will be larger in file size.

# Set Color Effect

- 1. When taking a picture, touch Settings icon.
- 2. Scroll to Color effect.
- 3. Select a color option for pictures.
- Touch Settings icon to close and confirm.

### Set Auto Exposure

- When taking a picture, touch Settings icon.
- Scroll to Auto exposure.
- 3. Select an exposure option for pictures.
- 4. Touch **Settings icon** to close and confirm.

### Restore Default Settings

- When recording a video, touch Settings icon
- 2. Scroll to Camera settings.
- Touch Restore to defaults to reset camera settings to the default settings.
- Touch Settings icon to close and confirm.

# **Camcorder Options**

### Review Last Video

- When recording a video, touch Review icon to view the last video recorded or saved to the SD card.
- 2. Touch the screen to play the video. Use the playback controls on the screen.

Videos can be viewed as needed. For more information, see "Gallery" on page 45.

### Switch to Camera

When recording a video, use the slide control to switch from the **Camcorder icon** to the **Camera icon**. The device can now take a picture.

### Set White Balance

- When recording a video, touch White balance icon
- 2. Select a color temperature from the list.
- Touch White balance icon to close and confirm

### Set Video Quality

- When recording a video, touch Video quality icon.
- 2. Select a quality level for videos.
- Touch Video quality icon to close and confirm.

**Note:** If a higher quality level is selected, the videos taken will be larger in file size.

### Set Color Effect

- When recording a video, touch Settings icon
- 2. Scroll to Color effect.
- 3. Select a color option for videos.
- 4. Touch **Settings icon** to close and confirm.

### Set Auto Exposure

- When recording a video, touch Settings icon.
- Scroll to Auto exposure.
- 3. Select an exposure option for videos.
- 4. Touch Settings icon to close and confirm.

### Restore Default Settings

- When recording a video, touch Settings icon.
- Scroll to Camera settings.
- 3. Touch **Restore to defaults** to reset camcorder settings to the default settings.
- 4. Touch Settings icon to close and confirm.

### Wireless & networks

From **Wireless & networks**, the following features can be modified.

# Enable Airplane Mode

While in an airplane, it is normally required that the device is turned off, because it emits wireless signals that interfere with air traffic control. In airplane mode, however, the device does not send wireless signals.

Touch **Airplane mode** to enable airplane mode and disable all wireless signals. A check mark indicates that the device is in airplane mode.

### Wi-Fi settings

From **Wi-Fi settings**, the following features can be modified

### Enable Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi provides a wireless Internet connection when connected to a wireless access point over a distance of up to 328-feet (100-meter). The availability and range of Wi-Fi varies depending on environmental obstructions through which the signal passes.

Before the device connects with a wireless local area network, the Wi-Fi feature on the device must be enabled

Touch Wi-Fi to enable Wi-Fi. A check mark indicates Wi-Fi is active. If the device does not automatically scan for available networks, a prompt appears when a scan begins. Once the scan is complete, a list of available networks is shown.

Note: Using Wi-Fi will drain the battery faster.

### Enable Wi-Fi Notifications

Touch **Network notification** to request a notification when an open network is available for Wi-Fi use.

### Add a Network

If the device does not automatically detect a network, it can be added manually.

- 1. Touch Add Wi-Fi network.
- 2. Enter the Network SSID.
- 3. Select the security level.
- 4. Touch Save to add it to the network list.

### Connect to an Open Network

With Wi-Fi enabled, the device can connect to an open network that has no security.

- At the Wi-Fi network list, select an open network.
- The device should automatically connect. No password is needed for an open network.

### Connect to a Secure Network

With Wi-Fi enabled, the device can connect to a secure network

- At the Wi-Fi network list, select a secure network.
- Enter the applicable security key. This is normally a WPA or WEP key.
- 3. Touch **Connect** to connect.

**Note:** The next time the device connects to a secure network, a prompt for the security key will not appear.

### Scan for Networks

- At the Wi-Fi network list, press the Menu key.
- 2. Touch Scan to refresh the network list.

### Access Advanced Options

The Wi-Fi options can be modified. These options are recommended for users experienced with configuring network connections.

- At the Wi-Fi network list, press the Menu key.
- 2. Select Advanced.
- 3. Modify the advanced options as needed.

### Bluetooth settings

From **Bluetooth settings**, the following features can be modified

### Enable Bluetooth

Bluetooth technology allows devices to wirelessly exchange information over a short distance of up to 32 feet (9.8 meters).

Before the device can connect with another Bluetooth device, the Bluetooth feature on the device must be enabled.

Touch **Bluetooth** to activate Bluetooth. A check mark indicates Bluetooth is active. The device automatically scans for available devices. Once the scan is complete, a list of available devices is shown.

**Note:** Using **Bluetooth** will drain the battery faster

### Pair with a Device

To enable the device to communicate with a Bluetooth device, the device needs to "pair" the Bluetooth device. The following instructions describe the process. Reference the user guide provided with the Bluetooth device, if necessary.

- Prepare the Bluetooth device (accessory) for pairing as described in the device's user guide.
- Touch Scan for devices. The device then searches and detects any available Bluetooth device in the vicinity. The

- Bluetooth feature on the device must be enabled to find devices.
- At the device list, touch and hold the device. If prompted, accept the pairing.
- 4. If necessary, enter the password provided with the Bluetooth device.
- 5. Touch **OK** to save pairing.

To unpair a device, select the device. Press the **Menu** key and select **Unpair** or **Disconnect & unpair** (if connected).

**Note:** Once a Bluetooth device has been paired, the device will not prompt for password entry again.

### Connect to a Device

Before using Bluetooth, the device must be ready to communicate with another device. This is called "connecting". Some Bluetooth devices will attempt to automatically connect to the device when the Bluetooth feature is turned on. To connect manually, do the following:

- At the device list, touch and hold a paired Bluetooth device.
- Press the Menu key, touch Pair & connect. The Bluetooth device can now connect with the device.

To disconnect from a Bluetooth device, touch **Disconnect**.

**Note:** When Bluetooth hands-free headsets or car kits are connected to the device, the Bluetooth connection icon appears on the status bar. When a second headset is paired, the first headset is automatically disconnected.

### Set Device's Name

The name the device has on a Bluetooth network can be changed.

- 1. Touch **Device name**.
- 2. Edit the name of the device.
- 3. Touch **OK** to save the name.

### Allow Visibility

Touch **Discoverable** to allow the device to be visible to other Bluetooth devices for a limited time, usually about 120 seconds. A check mark indicates **Discoverable** is enabled.

# Tethering & portable hotspot

From **Tethering & portable hotspot**, the following features can be modified.

### Enable Tethered Mode

Tethered mode shares the device's Internet connection when the device is connected to a computer with a USB cable.

Touch **Tethered mode** to activate tethered mode. A check mark indicates **Tethered mode** is active

**Note:** When using **Tethered mode**, the device's SD card will not be seen as a storage drive on the computer.

### Enable Wi-Fi Hotspot

**Portable Wi-Fi hotspot** shares the device's Internet connection with other Wi-Fi devices.

Touch **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot** to activate the Wi-Fi hotspot. A check mark indicates **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot** is active.

### Access Wi-Fi Hotspot Settings

Touch **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot settings** to modify the Wi-Fi hotspot settings on the device. These options are recommended for users familiar with experience configuring network connections.

### Mobile networks

From **Mobile networks**, the following features can be modified.

### **Enable Data Connection**

Touch **Data enabled** to allow connections to data services. A check mark indicates **Data enabled** is enabled.

### **Enable Data Roaming**

Touch **Data enabled** to allow connections to data services when roaming. A check mark indicates **Data roaming** is enabled.

### Set Data Roaming

- 1. Touch System select.
- 2. Select one of the following:
  - Home only does not allow roaming data calls.
  - Automatic allows roaming data calls.

# Call settings

From **Call settings**, the following features can be modified

### Set Voicemail Service

- Touch Voicemail service.
- Select the preferred voicemail service provider.

### Set Voicemail Number

- Touch Voicemail settings.
- 2. Touch Voicemail number.
- Enter the voicemail number or touch Call icon to set a contact as the voicemail number.
- 4. Touch OK to save.

# Enable North American Dialing Touch North American dialing to enforce North American dialing standards as needed for outgoing calls. A check mark indicates North American dialing is enabled.

### Set International Dialing Code An international dialing code can be configured for outgoing calls.

- 1. Touch International dialing.
- 2. Enter the country code.
- 3. Touch **OK** to save the code.

### Connect to TTY Device

The device can be connected to a teletype (TTY) device (sold separately) for the hearing impaired.

**Note:** Enable TTY only when using the device with a TTY device.

- Connect the TTY device to the device.
- Touch TTY mode.
- If necessary, touch **OK** to clear the notification
- 4. Select one of the following:
  - TTY Off disables TTY devices.
  - TTY Full enables TTY devices.
  - TTY HCO enables TTY devices and hearing carry over.
  - TTY VCO enables TTY devices and voice carry over.

### **Enable Voice Privacy**

Touch **Voice Privacy** to use enhanced digital CDMA privacy. A check mark indicates **Voice Privacy** is enabled.

### Set DTMF Tones

Touch **DTMF Tones** to set how long the dual-tone multi-frequency (DTMF) tones last when a number is dialed.

### Accounts

From **Accounts**, the following features can be modified

### Add an Account

The device can receive calls from an Internet-based phone account, when Wi-Fi is enabled. To add an account, do the following:

- Touch Add Account.

Gmail is a Web-based email service provided by Google. A **Gmail** application comes preconfigured on the device. **Gmail** is synchronized with Web-based Gmail when associated with a valid Google account.

- 2. At the main menu, touch Gmail.
- At the Gmail screen, do one of the following:
  - Touch an email thread to open the thread.
  - Touch and hold an email thread to access features for that specific thread.
  - Press the Menu key to access more features.

**Note:** To select multiple email threads, touch the check box next to the threads. Touch the check box again to deselect. Options that apply to multiple email threads appear at the bottom of the screen.

### Create an Email

- Enter a message. Touch and hold the text entry field to access more text entry features.
- Press the Menu key to access more Gmail features.
- 7. When done, touch Send.

# Set Eco Mode

The device can be configured to conserve battery life while in use.

- From the home screen, touch Main Menu icon.
- 2. At the main menu, touch **Eco Mode**.
- 3. At the Eco Mode screen, adjust the slider bar to one of the following:
  - Always to always use Eco Mode when the device is on.
  - 10-90% to automatically switch the device to Eco Mode according to remaining battery power.
  - Never to disable Eco Mode.

Touch **Eco settings** to adjust the **Eco Mode** settings. Select the items to set. The leaf icon turns green when selected.

#### **Email**

Email allows the device to access email accounts from service providers that support POP3, IMAP or Exchange.

#### Configure an Email Account

When **Email** is launched for the first time, an email account needs to be configured for the device.

- From the home screen, touch Main Menu icon.
- 2. At the main menu, touch Email.
- At the email screen, enter the email address.
- 4. Enter the password.
