Chapter 1: Getting started

1.1 Your phone

Front



Back

Earphone jack: Use a headset for hands-free conversation or listening to music.

Power:

- Press and hold to turn the phone on or off.
- To save battery, quick press to turn the screen on or off temporarily.



Side



Note: The battery can also be charged while connected to a computer.

1.2 Installing the SIM card, battery and memory card

Caution: before assembling, charging or using your phone for the first time, please read the important legal and safety information at the back of this guide.

To remove the back cover

- 1. Turn the phone off.
- 2. Push and slide down to open the back cover.



SIM card

The SIM card contains your phone number, memory storage and network service details.

To install the SIM card

Insert the SIM card as shown. Make sure the gold contacts are facing down and the cut-off corner facing towards the battery slot.

To remove the SIM card

- 1. Remove the battery.
- 2. Slide the SIM card from the card slot.



Battery

Your phone comes with a rechargeable Li-Ion battery. Battery life varies depending on the network and applications used and the type of connections attached to your phone.

To install the battery

Insert the battery. Make sure the contacts of the battery are aligned with the connectors on the battery slot.

To remove the battery

Lift the battery tab and remove the battery.



Secure the hooks on the back cover with the designated holes on the phone and close the back cover.

Caution: Please read "Battery use & safety" on page 71.



Memory card

You will need a microSD memory card to store photos, music, videos and other data.

To install the memory card

- 1. Insert the memory card with the gold contacts facing down.
- 2. Push the memory card until it clicks into place.

To remove the memory card

- 1. For safe removal, go to Settings > SD card, USB mass storage & phone storage > Unmount SD card.
- 2. Push the memory card down to eject it from the slot.

Note: Please note that the microSD memory card is already inserted in the phone.

1.3 Charging the battery

The battery out of the box is only partially charged. To fully charge the battery, charge it for 2 hours.

- 1. Open the Micro USB connector cover.
- 2. Plug in the battery charger as shown in the diagram.
- 3. Plug the AC adapter to the wall outlet to start charging.

When the battery is charging, the red LED is activated;

the 🙆 icon is also displayed in the status bar. When the battery is fully charged, the red LED disappears and the

green LED is activated; if the phone is turned on, the

Note:

- The battery can also be charged when you connect your phone to the computer.
- To ensure safety, do not remove the battery from the phone while the AC adapter is connected or while it is being charged.

1.4 Using a headset

For hands-free conversation or to listen to music, plug a headset into the headset jack.

Note: using a mobile device or accessory while driving may cause distraction and may be illegal. Always obey the laws and drive safely.





1.5 Turning the phone on or off

After installing the SIM card and charging the battery, you are now ready to turn on your phone.

To turn on your phone

Press and hold the Power key until the phone vibrates.

To turn off your phone

- 1. Press and hold the Power key.
- 2. A pop-up window appears, tap Power off.
- 3. Select **OK** to confirm.

To set your phone to sleep mode

To set your phone to sleep mode, press the Power key briefly. This will turn the display off.

To turn the display on, press the Power key briefly.

Touch calibration

The touch calibration appears when the phone is turned on for the first time.

The touch calibration helps you to calibrate the screen to ensure touch accuracy and change the screen orientation and text size before you start using the phone. Follow the on-screen instructions for screen calibration.

Chapter 2: The basics

2.1 The Home screen

From the Home screen, you can quickly access common features and view notifications of missed calls, received messages, battery and connection status.



Status bar icons

The status bar icons indicate different types of information. Tap the status bar and scroll down to view notifications or view system information easily. To close the window, press \mathfrak{D} .

Tap to display the system information.

Shortcut menu

The Shortcut menu displays notifications or other information related to each menu item, tap the item on the Home screen. By default, the following applications are displayed:

	Dialler	Displays phone keypad. Tap to enter the phone number and make calls. See page 17.
	Contacts	Displays contacts saved on the phone. Tap to select the contact to make a phone call or send a text message. See page 14.

Customising the shortcut menu

To add a shortcut:

- 1. Tap Menu > Add > Shortcuts.
- 2. Tap Applications to display the list of applications.
- 3. Tap to add the items that you want to appear on the Home screen.



To remove a shortcut:

- 1. Tap and hold the desired shortcut icon. The icon expands.
- 2. An appears at the bottom of the Home screen.
- Drag the icon to for to delete.
 The shortcut icon is then removed.



Application drawer

The Application drawer contains all applications and settings. Tap 🚯 to display the menu.



Using widgets

Save time with live updates right on your Home screen and get all of your personalised updates in one place.

You may add and customise the Widgets on your Home screen as you like.

- From the Home screen, tap Menu > Add > Widgets.
- 2. A list of all available widgets is displayed. Tap to select the widget you want to appear on your Home screen.

To remove widgets:

- 1. From the Home screen, tap and hold the desired widget.
- 2. A appears at the bottom of the Home screen.
- 3. Drag the widget to find to delete.



Setting the wallpaper

You can customise the wallpaper on your Home screen using default wallpaper or using pictures taken with your phone.

Set wallpaper from pictures

- 1. From the Home screen, tap Menu > Wallpaper.
- 2. Select wallpaper from is displayed on screen.
- 3. Tap Pictures.
- 4. You will see thumbnail images of all pictures. Tap to select the picture you want to use as wallpaper.
- 5. Drag your finger to select the crop area and tap inside the box to crop the image.
- 6. Tap **Save** and the cropped image appears as wallpaper on your Home screen.

Set wallpaper from Wallpaper gallery

- 1. From the Home Screen, tap Menu > Wallpaper.
- 2. Select wallpaper from is displayed on screen.
- 3. Tap Wallpaper gallery.
- 4. All system wallpapers are displayed. Tap to preview the wallpaper.
- 5. Tap Set wallpaper to apply your selection.

2.2 LED indicators

Your phone has two LED indicators: green and red. Whether your phone is turned on or off, the LED indicators provide useful information.

LED	Location	Indication
Green (solid)	Call key	Battery is fully charged.
Red (solid)	End key	Battery is charging.

Note: When the phone is on, pressing the **Call** or **End** key will light all the LED indicators.

2.3 Adjusting the volume

Your phone features three types of volume which can be adjusted separately:

- Media volume: set the volume for music and videos.
- **Ringer volume**: set the volume for incoming calls and notifications.
- **In-call volume**: set the volume during a call.



To adjust ringer volume

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Settings> Sound & display.
- 2. Tap **Ringer volume** or press the Volume key on the right side of your phone to activate the volume window.
- 3. Tap the slider for the volume you want to adjust.
- 4. Do either of the following:
 - a. Drag the slider right to increase or drag the slider left to decrease volume.
- Ringer volume
 Incoming call volume
 Use Incoming call volume for
 notifications
 OK
 Cancel

Ringer volume slider

- b. Tap Silent mode to set the phone to silent mode or drag down the slider until it clicks in place to switch to silent mode.
 Note: when the phone is set to silent mode, all sounds are turned off except media and alarm.
- 3. Tap **OK** to save your settings.
- 4. Tap \bigcirc to exit the menu.

To adjust in-call volume

- 1. During a phone call, press the Volume key on the right side of your phone.
- 2. Increase or decrease the volume by:
 - Pressing the Volume key up or down.
 - Using your finger to drag the slider left or right.

To adjust media volume

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Settings> Sound & display.
- 2. Tap **Media volume** to activate the volume window.
- 3. Tap the slider for the volume you want to adjust.
- 4. Increase or decrease the volume by:
 - Pressing the Volume key up or down.
 - Using your finger to drag the slider left or right.
- 5. Tap OK to confirm.

2.4 Contacts

Contacts lets you store names, phone numbers, email addresses and other information. Contacts are stored in the phone memory. You can save information such as names, pictures, phone numbers, email addresses, etc. You can also add the frequently used contacts to the favourites list. See "Favourite contacts" on page 16.

Adding a contact

- 1. On the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap Menu > New > Create contact.
- 3. Tap each field to enter the contact information using the on-screen keyboard.

Tips:

- To add a picture, tap Menu > Add icon, then select a picture file or take a photo of the contact immediately. To take a photo of the contact, select Menu > Capture picture.
- To assign a ring tone, tap **Ringtone** then select a tone from the list.
- 4. Tap Done to save.

Searching for contacts

On the Contacts screen, do any of the following to easily search for contacts:

- Tap Menu > Search.
- Type the first few letters of the contact to search. The list is filtered as you type.
- For example, to view names that start with "k", tap "k" to see all contacts that start with "k".
- To filter the contacts list by categories, tap Menu > By group, then select one of the following options: All contacts, Contacts with phone numbers or My contacts.





Importing contacts

Copy SIM contacts to the phone

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap Menu > Import > SIM card.
- 3. Tap **OK**.
- Note:
- To copy a single contact, simply tap the contact, then edit contact information as in "Adding a contact".
- To copy all contacts, tap **Menu** > **Import all**. All contacts on the SIM card are imported.



Copy microSD contacts to the phone

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap Menu > Import > SD Card.

Note:

- To copy a single contact, simply tap the contact, tap **Import one VCard file** and tap to select the contact you want to copy. Then edit contact information as in "Adding a contact".
- To copy all contacts, tap **Import all VCard files**. All contacts on the SD card are imported.
- 3. Tap **OK**.



Backing up contacts

You can copy the contacts to the microSD memory card to back up the contact information or import contacts from the memory card to your phone.

Export contacts to the microSD memory card

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap Menu > Export contacts.

Note:

- Copying contacts to the microSD memory card will overwrite the old backup file.
- 3. A warning message pops up, tap **OK** to proceed. All contacts are copied to the memory card.

Import contacts from the microSD memory card

- 1. On the Home screen, tap Contacts.
- 2. Tap **Menu** > **Import** > **SD** card.
- 3. Tap **OK**.
- 4. The backup contacts are copied to the phone.

Favourite contacts

You can add the most frequently called contacts to the favourite contact list which helps you to access the contacts quickly and easily.

Add to favourites

- 1. From the Home screen, tap Contacts.
- 2. From the contact list, tap and hold the desired contact.
- 3. Tap Add to favourites.

A gold star will appear next to the contact name.

4. The contact is now in the favourites list.

Remove from favourites

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap the Favourites tab.
- 3. Tap and hold the desired contact.
- 4. Tap Remove from favourites.





Chapter 3: Making and answering calls

To open the call features:

- On the Home screen, tap **Dialler**.
- From any application screen, press the Call key.

3.1 Voice calls

Making a call

To make a call from the phone screen

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Dialler**.
- 2. Enter the phone number using the keypad.

Note: tap to erase a wrong number. Tap and

hold **•** to erase the entire number.

- 3. Tap the phone number or press the **Call** key to dial.
- 4. To end the call, press the End key.

To make a call from contacts

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap the desired contact.
- 3. Tap **Call mobile**, **Call work** or **Call home**. Alternatively press the **Call** key to dial the default number.







To make emergency calls

Emergency calls without a SIM card:

- 1. Open the phone screen.
- 2. Enter the emergency number using the keypad.
- 3. Tap the phone number or press the **Call** key.

To make international calls

- 1. Open the phone screen.
- Tap and hold until the international prefix code "+" is displayed.
- 3. Enter the country code, area code and the phone number.
- 4. Tap the phone number or press the **Call** key.

Answering a call

When you receive an incoming call:

- The phone rings (if the ring volume is turned on).
- A notification message appears on the screen.

To accept or reject an incoming call

- To accept the call, press the **Call** key.
- To reject the call, press the **End** key.

To put a call on hold

If a call comes in while you are already on another call, tap **Hold** to put the first call on hold.

To unhold a call, tap **Hold** again.

To switch between calls

If a call comes in while you are already on another call, tap **Hold** to put the first call on hold. Tap **Swap calls**

気 to switch between calls.

To make a conference call

- 1. If you are already on a call, tap **Hold** to put the call on hold.
- 2. Tap **Add** to display the dialpad and then enter the second number you wish to call.
- 3. Tap Merge calls \uparrow to set up the conference call.





Note: conference call is a network service. Check with your network provider for the availability of this function.

To use other voice call features

- Tap **Speaker** to activate or deactivate the speakerphone.
- Tap **Mute** to mute or unmute the microphone.
- To view the call history, tap **Menu** > **Dialler** > **Call log**.

Ending a call

To end a call, tap **End call m** or press the **End** key.



Chapter 4: Entering information

4.1 On-screen keyboard

The keyboard appears when an application requires text input, such as messaging and writing emails. The keyboard input method is activated by default.



CAPs Lock Tap to toggle between upper case or lower case. Dictionary: tap to enable dictionary.

Input method selector: tap to choose your preferred input method.

Using the on-screen keyboard

Tap the screen to display the on-screen keyboard.

Numbers and symbols

- Use the keys on the on-screen keyboard as you would a computer keyboard.
- Tap the keys to enter the characters.
- To toggle between upper and lower case letter display, tap
- To display the numeric and symbols keyboard, tap $\begin{bmatrix} 0 \\ 12 \end{bmatrix}$. Tap **for to toggle back**.

Setting the input method

Your phone supports several text input methods, select your preferred method.

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Settings > Locale & text.
- 2. In Text settings, you will see a list of the input methods. Select and check the options you prefer.

Changing the input method

1. Tap and hold any text field in an application. For instance, in **Messaging**, tap and hold the field "**To:**".

The input method screen pops up.

2. You may select one of the available input methods to use.



4.2 Configuring phone keyboard settings

You can use the keyboard to help you enter text.

- Tap Application drawer > Settings > Locale & text.
- 2. Tap TouchPal.
- 3. You can check all applicable options.



Keyboard setting options:

Setting option	Description
Word prediction	Enables word prediction function.
Key press sound	Phone sounds when user presses any key on the on- screen keyboard.

Key press vibration	Phone vibrates when user presses any key on the on- screen keyboard.
Layout in portrait mode	Select to change the keyboard layout in portrait mode.
Layout in landscape mode	Select to change the keyboard layout in landscape mode.
Swipe to switch layout	Enables swipe to change layout orientation function.
Enable mixed language input	Check to enable text input in different languages.
Select languages	Select the languages you want to use and switch between them on the main keyboard.
Predict next word	Automatically predicts the next word when entering text.
Enable prediction	Automatically predicts the word when entering text.
Correct mistyping	Automatically corrects spelling mistakes.
Slide-down symbols	Slide down on keys to input symbols.
Relevant words	Slide on candidates for relevant words (for example: run> running, ran, runs).

Chapter 5: Email & Messaging

Use **Messaging** to access text and MMS messages. Use **Email** to send and receive email messages via your internet email accounts.

To open messaging

- On the Home screen, tap
- From the Application Drawer, tap Messaging.

5.1 Text messages

A text message can only contain letters, numbers and symbols.

Creating and sending a text message

Your phone offers several ways to create and send a new text message.

From the Messaging screen

1. Tap New message.

The Compose screen is displayed.

- 2. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's phone number.
 - **Tip:** To add recipients from Contacts, tap **To** and enter at least two numbers of a contact number or two characters of a contact name. Then the corresponding contact will be listed for you to select from.
- 3. Type your message in the **Type to compose** field.
- 4. Tap **Send** or press the **Call** key to send your message.



From Contacts

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap a contact to display the contact information.
- 3. Tap Text mobile.
- 4. Compose your message.
- 5. Tap **Send**.

From Call log

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap the Call log tab to view all call history.
- 3. Tap a call from the Call log.
- 4. Tap Send SMS/MMS message.
- 5. Compose your message.
- 6. Tap Send.

Note: If you exit Messaging before sending, the unsent message will automatically be saved as a draft.

To request message delivery notification

- 1. In Messaging, tap Menu > Settings to access SMS and MMS settings.
- 2. Tap to check the **Delivery reports** check box.
- 3. Tap \bigcirc to exit the menu.

Receiving and managing messages

When you send and receive messages from a contact, these messages are grouped as a message thread. A message thread looks like a conversation.

To reply to a text message

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Messaging.
- 2. Tap a message thread to open it.
- 3. Tap Type to compose to enter your message.
- 4. Tap **Send**.



To forward a text message

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Messaging**.
- 2. Tap to view a message thread.
- 3. Tap and hold a message to display the message options.
- 4. Tap Forward.
- 5. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's phone number.
- 6. Tap **Send**.



To delete all text messages

You can delete all text threads in Messaging.

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Messaging.
 - To delete one message thread, tap and hold the message thread you want to delete, and tap **Del. thread**.
 - To delete a message within a thread, tap the message thread to open it. Then, tap and hold the message, and tap **Del. message**.
- 2. Tap Menu > Del. threads.
- 3. Tap **OK** to confirm.



To copy message text

You can use this function to copy the text from a message to a new message you are composing.

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Messaging**.
- 2. Tap a message thread to open it.
- 3. Tap and hold the message to display the submenu options.
- 4. Tap Copy message text.
- 5. Go to New Message.
- 6. Tap and hold **Type to compose**.
- 7. Tap **Paste** to paste the copied text to your new message.

5.2 Multimedia messages

A Multimedia message or MMS can contain letters, an image, an audio or video file.

Creating and sending an MMS message

Your phone offers several ways to create and send an MMS message.

From the Messaging screen

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Messaging**.
- 2. Tap New Message.
- Tap Menu > Add sbj.
 The message automatically converts to an MMS message.
- 4. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's phone number or email address.
 - **Tip:** To add recipients from Contacts, tap **To** and enter at least two numbers of a contact number or two characters of a contact name. Then the corresponding contact will be listed for you to select.
- 5. Enter the **Subject**.
- 6. To insert a picture or video file, tap **Menu > Attach**.
- 7. To insert text, tap **Type to Compose**, then enter your message.
- 8. To insert an audio file, tap **Menu > Attach > Audio**.
- 9. Tap Send.

From Contacts

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap a contact.
- 3. Tap Menu > Text Mobile.

- 7. To insert an audio file, tap **Menu** > **Attach** > **Audio**.
- 8. To insert text, tap **Type to Compose**, then enter your message with the on-screen keyboard.
- 9. Tap Send.

5.3 Voice messages

Your phone can be used to send voice messages.

To create a voice message

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Messaging**.
- 2. Tap New Message.
- 3. Tap Menu > Attach > Record audio.
- 4. Tap **e** to record your message.
- 5. Tap **[I**] to stop recording.
- 6. Tap **b** to listen to your recording.
- 7. Tap **Save** to proceed or **Discard** to return to the compose message screen.
- 8. Tap **Play** to listen to your recording again, or tap **Remove** to delete your recording from the MMS message.
- 9. Enter the mobile phone number in the **To** field.
- 10. Tap to enter your text message and tap **Send**.





Recording voice

- 1. Tap **e** or **Record** to record your message.
- 2. Tap **[** or **Stop** to stop recording.

Note: Tap **Note**: Tap **Note**:

- 3. Tap Send.
- 4. In the To field, enter the mobile phone number.
- 5. Tap Send.

Managing recorded voice

- To listen to the recording, tap **b** to play.
- To redo the recording, tap **e** to record.
- To save the recording, tap **Save**.
- To stop recording, tap **___** to stop.

5.4 Email accounts

Your phone can send and receive emails just as you do with a computer. Your phone supports Internet email: an email account provided by an Internet Service Provider (ISP) or web-based email, such as Google Mail[™], Hotmail[™], Yahoo! Mail[™], etc.

Setting up an Internet email account

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Email.
- 2. Select your email account provider.
- 3. Enter your **Email address** and **Password**.
- 4. Tap Next.
- 5. The phone will automatically retrieve the email settings.
 - If the email settings are pre-configured, the Email setup wizard displays a successful message, tap **Next**.
 - If the email settings are not found, tap **Manual** setup.
- 6. Enter **Your Name** and the **Account display name**, then tap **Next**.

Note: the Account display name is the name shown on the Home screen and the Email screen.

- 7. In **Automatic Send/Receive**, select how often you want the phone to connect to the server to send and check for emails.
- 8. Tap **Done**.

To open email

From the Application Drawer, tap **Email** to view your email accounts.

To select an account

- 1. Tap **Application drawer** > **Email**.
- 2. The account picker screen lists the available email accounts.
- 3. Tap the account you want to access.





To configure email settings

Configure message settings using the **Settings** submenu.

- 1. On the Your accounts screen, tap to select an email account.
- 2. Tap **Menu** > **Settings** to open the email settings menu.



5.5 Using email

Composing and sending an email

- 1. Tap **Application drawer** > **Email**, then tap an email account.
- 2. Tap Menu > Compose.
- 3. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's email address.

Tip: to add recipients from Contacts, tap To or tap Menu > Add recipient, then select the names.

- 4. Enter the Subject.
- 5. Compose your email.
- 6. Tap Send.


Sending an email from contacts

You can send an email to a contact with an email address stored in Contacts.

- 1. On the Home screen, tap Contacts.
- 2. Tap a name to open contact.
- 3. Tap Send email.
- 4. Enter the Subject and compose your email.
- 5. Tap Send.

Adding attachments to an email message

- 1. Before sending your message, tap Menu > Attach.
- 2. Select the picture you want to attach.



Receiving emails

Emails are automatically received in your Inbox when your phone connects to a wireless network.

To receive emails manually

- 1. Tap **Application drawer** > **Email**, then tap an email account.
- 2. Tap **Menu** > **Send/Receive**.

Reading and replying to emails

The Inbox displays the email headers. When you open the email, it shows only a part of the message, unless it is a very short message. Download the email to view the complete content.

To download attachments

- With POP3 email accounts, attachments are downloaded when you download the complete message.
- With IMAP4 email accounts, tap the attachment to mark it for download. The attachment is downloaded the next time you connect to your email server.

Note: Only supported file types can be opened on your phone.

To reply to or forward an email

- 1. Open the message.
- 2. Do any of the following:
 - Tap **Reply** or **Reply all** to reply to the email.
 - Tap **Menu** > **Forward**. Then enter the recipient in the **To** field.
- 3. Compose your message.
- 4. Tap Send.

If you are viewing the messaging list screen of one account and you want to view the list of another account, tap **Menu** > **Accounts**, then tap the account you want to view.

Customising email settings

You can configure the general settings of your email account such as Account name, email checking frequency, default account and server settings.

To set up your account name

- 1. Tap an email account.
- 2. Tap **Menu** > **Settings** to view the email account settings and make adjustments.
- 3. Tap **Account name** to change the account name.
- 4. Tap **OK** to confirm.

To set up the email checking frequency

- 1. Tap an email account.

3. Tap **Email check frequency**. You can set the phone to check for new email automatically every 5 mins, every 10 mins, every 15 mins, every 30 mins, every hour or never.

To set up default account

- 1. Tap an email account.
- 2. Tap Menu > Settings to view the email account settings and make adjustments.
- 3. Tap **Default account** to send email from this account by default.

To delete an email account

- 1. Tap **Application drawer** > **Email**.
- 2. Tap and hold the account to delete.
- 3. Tap Remove account.
- 4. Tap OK to confirm.



5.6 Google Mail

Google Mail is Google's web-based email service. Google Mail is configured when you first set up your phone. Depending on your synchronisation settings, Google Mail on your phone is automatically synchronised with your Google Mail account on the web.

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Google Mail.
- 2. Tap Create or Sign in your Google account.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions to login or create your Google Mail username and password.
- 4. Once logged in, you can begin reading and sending emails from your Google Mail account.

- 4. If you select an unsecure network, the connection is automatically established. Otherwise, proceed to the next step.

5. To connect to a secured connection, you will be prompted for the network key. Enter the key, then tap **Connect**.

When Wi-Fi is connected, the real connection icon is displayed in the status bar.







To add a Wi-Fi network

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Application drawer** > **Settings** to access Wireless Controls.
- 2. Tap Wi-Fi settings.
- 3. In Wi-Fi networks, tap **Add Wi-Fi network**. A new window is displayed.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions and enter the necessary information, then tap **Save** to store settings.

To configure Wi-Fi settings

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Application drawer** > **Settings** to access Wireless Controls.
- 2. Tap Wi-Fi settings.
- Tap Menu > Advanced.
 Note: if you use static IP, enter the IP settings as required.
- 4. In IP settings, enter the information for IP address, gateway, netmask and DNS. Tap **OK** to save your settings.

Mobile data network

Check the availability of these connections with your network service provider and obtain the following information:

- Port

- Password







To set up a mobile data connection

- **Note:** you should not need to change these settings. If you do, contact your network service provider for details.

Online

Chapter 7: Using Bluetooth[®]

Bluetooth modes

- **On:** Bluetooth is turned on. Your phone detects other Bluetooth devices, but your phone is not visible to others.
- **Discoverable:** Bluetooth is turned on and your phone is visible to other Bluetooth devices.
- Off: Bluetooth is turned off.

To turn Bluetooth on or off

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Wireless Controls.
- 2. Tap Bluetooth Settings.
- 3. Tap to check **Bluetooth** and activate.
- To make your phone visible to others, check Discoverable to make this phone visible to other devices.



7.1 Connecting to Bluetooth devices

A connection to a Bluetooth device is called a partnership. You need to pair and create a partnership with a Bluetooth device to exchange information.

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Settings > Wireless controls.
- 2. Tap Bluetooth settings to view the menu options.
- 3. To search for a new device, tap Scan for devices.
- 4. Tap the device to connect.
- 5. To start pairing, enter the **Passcode**, then tap **OK**.
 - **Note:** the passcode you enter on your phone must be the same passcode that will be entered on the other Bluetooth device.
- 6. If you connect with an audio device which only supports HSP/HFP, "**Connected to phone audio**" will be displayed on the screen.
- 7. If you connect with audio device which supports HSP/HFP/A2DP, "Connected to phone and media audio" will be displayed on the screen.
 - **Note:** tap and hold the selected device to enter device options menu.
 - **Note:** once a partnership has been created, connecting to that device again will no longer require entering the passcode.

- 1. Tap the thumbnail to view the image in full screen size.
- Tap **DELETE to** delete the picture and view the next picture.
- Tap **SHARE W** to share the picture via Email or Messaging.
- Tap SET AS **TAP** to set the image as **Contact icon** or **Wallpaper**.
- Tap **DONE I** to save your settings.



Reviewing a video

After recording a video, the video thumbnail is displayed in the lower left corner of the screen.

- 1. Tap the video thumbnail to playback the video in full screen mode.
- Tap **DELETE to** delete the picture and view the next picture.
- Tap **SHARE W** to share the picture via Email or Messaging.
- Tap **PLAY I** to playback the video clip.
- Tap **DONE C** to save your settings.

- 3. Tap a video to play it.



Chapter 9: Navigation

9.1 Using GPS tracker

Your phone supports a GPS tracker to record your position, your speed and track distance. You can also save the data as personal sports records.

Turning on GPS

- 1. Tap Application drawer > GPS tracker.
- 2. When GPS is connected, tap 📝 to set POI.
- 3. Tap **b** to start tracking.
- 4. You can view your tracking distance, speed, trackers and the number of POIs on screen.
- 5. Tap Menu > Mode to set your mode: Walk, Bicycle or Car.

Hiding the GPS window

To use other applications and keep the GPS tracking:

- 1. In the GPS Tracker, tap Menu.
- 2. Tap **Hide** to hide the tracking application in the background.

Note: if you tap ⁵, the GPS Tracker will stop tracking.





Managing tracking data

You can save the tracking data for your personal record.

Set GPS file format

9.2 Google Maps

Goole Maps is Google's mapping service to search for places of interest.

To open Google Maps

- To search for a place of interest: tap **Menu** > **Search** then type in a keyword to begin the search.
- To get direction: tap **Menu** > **Directions**.
- To select a map mode: tap **Menu** > **Map mode** then tap **Map**, **Satellite** or **Traffic**.
- To go back to my location: tap **Menu** > **My location**.
- Tap Join latitude and tap Allow and share to share your location with friends.
- To clear the map: tap Menu > More > Clear Map.
- To view terms, privacy and notices: tap Menu > More > Terms, privacy & notices.
- To view information about Google Maps: tap **Menu** > **More** > **About**.

10.1 Calculator

With Calculator, you can perform basic arithmetic functions on your phone.

Tap Application drawer > Calculator.

10.2 Calendar

The Calendar lets you schedule and sound alarms for appointments, meetings and other events. Scheduled appointments for the day can be displayed on the Home screen.

To schedule an event

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Calendar.
- 2. Tap Menu > New event.
- 3. Enter event details.
- 4. Select the dates for the From and To fields.

Note: for an all-day event, check All day.

- 5. To set repetition, select the repetition from the list.
- 6. To set a reminder, select the reminder time from the list.
- 7. When finished, tap **Save** to return to the calendar.

Tip: from the Calendar screen, tap a day or a time slot then tap Menu > New event to set a new appointment on the tapped date or time.

To add a new task

- 1. On the Calendar screen, tap Menu > New task.
- 2. Enter event details.
- 3. Select the dates for the From and To fields.
- 4. Enter task descriptions.
- 5. To set priority, select from the list.
- 6. When finished, tap **Save** to return to the calendar.

Tip: from the Calendar screen, tap a day or a time slot then tap **Menu** > **New task** to set a new task on the tapped date or time.

10.3 Clock

The clock function contains alarm clock, global time, timer and stop watch. For alarm clock settings, see page 67.

Viewing world clock

Use world clock time to view the current time in different locations.

- 1. Tap **Application drawer** > **Clock**.
- 2. The current time of selected cities is displayed on the world clock tab.
- 3. Tap **Menu** > **Add** to select from the world cities list.
- 4. The current time of the selected cities is shown on the atlas screen.



Using stop watch

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Clock.
- 2. Tap the stop watch tab.
 - Tap **Start** to start and time elapsed will appear on screen.
 - Tap Lap to record the time for finishing one lap.
 - Tap **Restart** to continue counting.
 - Tap **Reset** to reset the stop watch.
 - Tap **Save** to save the counting results.



Using countdown timer

- 1. Tap **Application drawer** > **Clock**.
- 2. Tap the countdown timer tab.
 - Tap Set to set the countdown time.
 - Tap **Start** to start and time elapsed will appear on screen.
 - Tap **Ring** to set a ringtone when the time is up.



10.4 Note pad

Use the note pad to write down notes as you would on a note pad.



To create a note

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Note pad.
- 2. Tap Add note.
- 3. Enter your notes using the on-screen keyboard.
- 4. Tap **Menu** > **Edit title** to add a title to the note.
- 5. When you are done, tap ¹ to return to the Note pad screen. The note is automatically saved.

11.1 Documents To Go

Documents To Go allows you to open Microsoft[®] Office and Adobe file formats.

Word To Go[®] Viewer

Word To Go[®] Viewer allows you to view Microsoft[®] Word documents (.doc and .docx). It supports embedded pictures, font colour, bold, italics, underline, bulleted, numbered list and more.

- To open Word To Go Viewer
- 1. Tap Application drawer > Documents To Go > Word To Go Viewer.
- 2. Tap Open File.
- 3. Tap the file you want to open.
- Slide your finger on the screen to pan or go through other pages.
- 4. To close the file, tap **Back**.
- **Note:** to create a new document or edit an existing document, purchase the full version of **Documents To Go**.

Sheet To Go[®] Viewer

Sheet To Go[®] Viewer allows you to view Microsoft[®] Excel spreadsheets (.xls and .xlsx). It supports cell and number formatting, row and column alignment, formulas and fast finger-friendly panning.

To open Sheet To Go Viewer

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Documents To Go > Sheet To Go Viewer.
- 2. Tap Open file.
- 3. Tap the file you want to open.
 - Slide your finger on screen to pan through the sheet.
 - To view other worksheets on file, tap **Menu** > **View** > **Worksheets**, then tap the worksheet name you want to view.
- 4. To close the file, tap **Back**.

Note: to create a new spreadsheet or edit an existing spreadsheet, purchase the full version of **Documents To Go**.



Slideshow To Go[®] Viewer

Slideshow To Go[®] Viewer allows you to view Microsoft[®] PowerPoint presentations (.ppt and .pptx). It supports slide view, outline view, speaker notes, images, charts, font formatting and effortless slide "flick" navigation.

To open Slideshow To Go Viewer

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Documents To Go > Slideshow To Go Viewer.
- 2. Tap Open file.
- 3. Tap the file you want to open.
- 4. To close the file, tap **Back**.

Note: To create a new presentation or edit an existing presentation, purchase the full version of **Documents To Go.**

PDF To Go[®] Lite

PDF To Go[®] Lite allows you to view Adobe[®] PDF files (.pdf). It supports page view, word wrap, multiple zoom levels, auto-rotate, embedded images and more.

To open PDF To Go Lite

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Documents To Go > PDF To Go Lite.
- 2. Tap Open File.
- 3. Tap the file you want to open.
 - Tap the screen to bring up the zoom controls.
 - Slide your finger up or down to view the next or previous page.
- 4. To close the file, tap **Back**.

Purchase Documents To Go

To get the full version of Documents To Go:

- 1. Tap the lock tab
- 2. Tap Buy. Browser is launched and you will be redirected to www.dataviz.com.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete your purchase.

11.2 File browser

File browser lets you browse the contents of your phone.

- 1. Tap Application drawer > File browser.
- 2. Tap the folder list and tap the folder you want to explore.

Managing files and folders

- To open an item, tap it.
- To move, copy, delete, rename or set the picture as Contact icon or Wallpaper, tap and hold the item then tap the option.

- To paste an item, tap **Menu** > **Paste**.
- To sort items, tap **Menu** > **Sort**, then select an option.
- To search for a file, tap **Menu** > **More** > **Search**.

11.3 RoadSync

RoadSync provides secure, wireless and direct push synchronisation of corporate email, calendar, contacts and attachments.

Set up RoadSync for the first time

- 1. Tap **Application drawer > RoadSync**.
- 2. The setup wizard appears. Tap **Next**, then follow the on-screen instructions.
- 3. Read and accept the licence agreement. Tap **Accept**.
- 4. Enter your name and email to register RoadSync. Tap **Register**.
- 5. Enter your Exchange account information: User Name, Password, Server address, Domain and SSL option.
- 6. Tap Finish.

Customise RoadSync

After registering RoadSync for the first time, the **Preferences** screen is displayed automatically. Use the Preferences screen to customise synchronisation settings.

To access the Preferences screen at any other time, tap **Application drawer** > **RoadSync** > **Settings**.

Server Settings

Tap to edit server settings such as **User name**, **Password**, **Server address**, **Domain** and enable or disable **SSL**.

Data sync settings

Tap to choose the data to synchronise. Tap to select the check boxes of the following:

- Email: to sync Inbox messages and attachments.
- Calendar: to sync Exchange appointments to RoadSync Calendar application.
- **Contacts**: to sync Exchange contacts to the built-in Contacts application.
- **Show status icon**: to display the RoadSync icon in the notification bar when synchronisation is in progress.





Sync schedule

Tap to set the synchronisation schedule.

- **Peak schedule**: to set the time interval for synchronisation during a peak schedule.
- **Off peak schedule**: to set the time interval for synchronisation during an off peak schedule.
- **Peak start time**: to set the peak start time. Tap the [+] or [-] buttons to adjust the time. Tap to select **AM** or **PM**. Tap **Set** to complete.
- **Peak end time**: to set the peak end time. Tap the [+] or [-] buttons to adjust the time. Tap to select **AM** or **PM**. Tap **Set** to complete.
- Peak days: tap to choose which day(s) of the week to set as peak day(s).
- Sync when roaming: tap to enable synchronisation even when roaming.

Note: additional charges may be incurred when you use this function.

Email options

Tap to configure the email settings.

- Email download size: to set the maximum size of the email to download.
- Auto download: to download incomplete messages automatically when they are opened.
- Signature: to customise and add your signature to emails you send.
- **My email address**: to enter the email address to exclude when sending or replying emails to all.
- **Status bar**: select this check box to display a notification in the status bar when a new email arrives.
- Select ringtone: to set the email notification ringtone.
- Vibrate: to enable the phone to vibrate when a new email arrives.
- **LED Indicator**: to set the colour of the LED indicator that lights up when a new email arrives.

Calendar options

Tap to configure the calendar settings.

- Calendar date range: to set the date range to synchronise.
- Set alerts & notifications: to turn alerts and notifications on or off when an appointment is due.
- Select ringtone: to set the calendar notification ringtone.
- **Vibrate**: to enable the phone to vibrate when an appointment is due.
- Set default reminder: to set the default reminder time before an appointment is due.

Start synchronisation

- 1. Tap Application drawer > RoadSync.
- 2. On the RoadSync main screen, tap **Start sync** to start synchronisation.
- 3. To stop synchronisation manually, tap **Stop sync**.

Update RoadSync

Tap Application drawer > RoadSync > Check for updates.



11.4 RoadSync calendar

Use the **RoadSync calendar** to view and add events or appointments on your calendar.

Note: RoadSync must be set up first to use this application. See "RoadSync" on page 60.

To open RoadSync calendar

- 1. Start synchronisation first. See "Start synchronisation" above.
- 2. Tap Application drawer > RoadSync calendar.
- 3. Do any of the following:
 - To add an event, tap **Menu** > **New event**.
 - Slide your finger on screen to pan the calendar.
 - To change the calendar view, tap Menu > Agenda, Day, Week or Today.
 - To edit email settings, tap Menu > Settings.

11.5 RoadSync mail

Use the RoadSync mail to send and receive emails on your phone.

Note: RoadSync must be set up first to use this application. See "RoadSync" on page 60.

To open RoadSync mail

- 1. Tap Application drawer > RoadSync mail.
- 2. Do any of the following:
 - To view a message, tap the message.
 - To create a new message, tap Menu > New message.
 - To reply to or forward a message, tap Menu > Reply/Forward.
 - To flag a message, tap Menu > Flag.
 - To sync email manually, tap Menu > Sync.
 - To delete email, tap **Menu** > **Delete**.
 - To view other folders, tap **Menu** > **More** > **Folders**, then the folder.
 - To edit email settings, tap Menu > More > Settings.
 - To view on-line help , tap Menu > More > Help.

11.6 Rss reader

Use the **Rss reader** to get live updates from your favourite websites.

Add a new Rss feed

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Rss reader.
- 2. Tap Menu > New feed.
- 3. Tap an import option:
 - Import from OPML file: select a file from the SD card.
 - Import OPML from Internet: enter the URL to import OPML from.
 - Manual Add: manually enter a URL.
 - **Import from Google reader**: sign in to Google reader to import feed.
- 4. Tap **OK** to confirm.

Update Rss feed

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Rss reader.
- 2. Tap **Menu** > **Update all** to update the RSS feeds. New feeds will be displayed in the RSS feed inbox.

12.2 Changing basic settings

Date and time

To set the date and time

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Settings > Date & time.
- 2. Set the date.
- 3. Select the time zone from the list.
- 4. To adjust the time, tap the hour, minute, second or AM/PM field, and use the up and down arrows to increase or decrease the value.
- 5. To adjust the date, tap the month, day, or year field, and tap + or to increase or decrease the value.
- 6. Tap Set to apply the values.



Setting alarms

You can set up three alarms on your phone.

To set the alarm

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Clock.
- Under the Alarm clock tab, tap to select from the existing alarm clock settings or tap Menu > Add alarm to set up a new alarm.
- 3. Tap **Time** open a clock and set the time for the alarm. To enter the time numerically, tap the hour, minute or AM/PM field and use the up and down arrows to change the values.
- 4. Tap **Ringtone** to set up the preferred ringtone when your alarm sounds.
- 5. Tap **Vibrate** to enable/disable vibration when the alarm sounds.
- 6. Tap **Repeat** to select a day to sound the alarm. Tap **OK** to confirm.
- 7. Tap Label and enter an alarm description.
- 8. Tap **Time** open a clock and set the time for the alarm.
 - To enter the time numerically, tap the hour, minute or AM/PM field and use the up and down arrows to change the values.
- 9. To turn on the alarm, check Turn on alarm.
- Tip: to sound an alarm even when your phone is set to silent or vibrate mode, tap the More tab and check Sound alarms even when the phone is set to silent or vibrate.


Display settings

The display settings of your phone affect the battery and external power level.

To turn off backlight when the phone is idle

- 1. Tap **Application drawer** > **Settings** > **Sound & display** to enter the submenu.
- 2. In the **Display settings**, tap **Screen timeout**.
- 3. Select from the screen timeout list. Your setting is automatically saved.

To adjust brightness

- 1. Tap **Application drawer** > **Settings** > **Sound & display** to enter the submenu.
- 2. In Display settings, tap Brightness.
- 3. Drag the **Brightness** slider to adjust brightness settings.
- 4. Tap **OK** when finished.

To change the screen orientation

- 1. Tap **Application drawer** > **Settings** > **Sound & display** to enter the submenu.
- 2. In **Display settings**, tap **Orientation**.
- 3. Check the box to switch the screen orientation automatically when rotating the phone.

Ring settings

You can assign a ring tone and a ring tone type for various events such as an incoming call, new message received, etc.

To change the ring tone and ring type of an incoming call

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Settings > Sound & Display.
- 2. On the Sound settings tab, tap Phone ringtone.
- 3. Select the **Ring tone** from the lists.
- 4. Tap **OK** when finished.

To change the ring tone of other events

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Settings > Sound & display.
- 2. On the **Sound settings** tab, tap **Notification ringtone**.
- 3. Select the **Ring tone** from the lists.
- 4. Tap **OK** when finished.

12.3 Using wireless control

Wireless Manager provides shortcuts to access Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and Phone connection settings.

- 1. Tap **Application drawer > Settings > Wireless controls**.
- 2. To turn on or off **Wi-Fi**, **Bluetooth** or **Phone**, simply tap their corresponding bars.
- 3. To change connection settings, tap **Menu**, then select the setting to change.

12.4 Protecting your phone

You can protect your phone from unauthorised users by requiring the PIN code or entering a password.

Enable or disable SIM card PIN

When PIN code is enabled, you are required to enter the PIN code before making a call.

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Settings > Security & location.
- 2. On the SIM card lock tab, tap Set up SIM card lock.
- 3. Tap Lock SIM card to use PIN to use the phone. Check to enable, uncheck to disable.
- 4. Enter the current PIN code.
- 5. To change the PIN code, tap Change PIN.
- 6. Enter the old PIN code.
- 7. Enter the new PIN code and confirm.

Enabling password protection

When password is enabled, you are required to enter the password every time the phone is turned on.

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Settings > Security & location.
- 2. Tap Set security question and answer.
- 3. Enter your question and answer, tap **Next** to save your settings.

12.5 Resetting the phone

You can reset your phone to its factory defaults.

Warning: this feature will clear all data stored on your phone.

- 1. Tap Application drawer > Settings > SD card & phone storage.
- 2. On the Internal phone storage tab, tap Factory data reset.
- 3. Tap **Reset phone** to reset.

12.6 Transferring files to your computer

To transfer your captured images, recorded video clips and other contents onto your computer:

- 1. Open the Micro USB connector cover.
- 2. Connect the USB cable to the phone.
- 3. Connect the other end of the USB cable to the computer.
- 4. Turn on your phone.
- 5. From the Windows desktop, double click My computer and locate the CD drive.
- 6. Browse and double click **Setup.exe**.



- 7. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the driver installation.
- 8. Locate the Removable disk drive.
- 9. Double click on the Removable disk drive and locate the DCIM folder.



10. Double click on the **DCIM** folder to open it to find more folders.

Your recorded images and video clips will be inside these folders.

- 11. Copy and paste the image and video files to a folder on your computer.
- **Note:** to copy the music files onto the memory card, simply create a music folder. Drag and drop the desired music files from the computer into that music folder.

Safety, regulatory & legal

Battery use & safety

Important: handle and store batteries properly to avoid injury or damage. Most battery issues arise from improper handling of batteries, and particularly from the continued use of damaged batteries.

DON'Ts

Battery charging

- Motorola batteries and charging systems have circuitry that protects the battery from damage from overcharging.

Specific Absorption Rate (ICNIRP)

Your model wireless phone meets international guidelines for exposure to radio waves.

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines.
