# **Assembling**

#### Insert the SIM card

When you subscribe to a cellular network, you are provided with a plug-in SIM card loaded with your subscription details, such as your PIN, available optional services, and other features.

With gold contacts facing down and the angled corner of the SIM card facing into the slot, push the SIM card into the slot until it locks into place.





The plug-in SIM card can be easily damaged by scratching or bending, so be careful when handling, inserting, or removing the card. Keep all SIM cards out of reach of small children.



If the card is not inserted correctly, the tablet does not detect the SIM card. Re-orient the card back into the slot if the SIM is not detected.

# Charge the battery

Your device has a built-in battery. Before using the device for the first time, you must charge the battery.




Use only Samsung-approved chargers. Unauthorized chargers can cause batteries to explode or damage your device.



- Charge the battery only with a charger. You cannot charge the battery with the PC data cable.
- When your battery is low, the device will emit a
  warning tone and display a low battery message. The
  battery icon will also be empty. If the battery level
  becomes too low, the device will automatically power
  off. Recharge your battery to continue using your
  device.
- Connect the PC data cable to the USB power adapter and then plug the end of the PC data cable into the multifunction jack.



The shape of the USB power adapter may differ depending on your region.



Connecting the travel adapter improperly may cause serious damage to the device or USB power adapter. Any damage caused by misuse is not covered by the warranty.

Plug the USB power adapter into a power outlet.



- You can use the device while it is charging, but it may take longer to fully charge the battery.
- While the device is charging, the touch screen may not function due to an unstable power supply. If this happens, unplug the USB power adapter from the power outlet or unplug the PC data cable from the device.
- While charging, the device may heat up. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.
- If your device is not charging properly, bring your device and the charger to a Samsung Service Centre.
- 3 When the battery is fully charged (the battery icon is no longer moving), unplug the USB power adapter and PC data cable from the device and then from the power outlet.



To save energy, unplug the travel adapter when not in use. The travel adapter does not have a power switch, so you must unplug the travel adapter from the outlet to interrupt the power supply.

# Turn your device on and off

To turn on your device,

- Press and hold [♠].
- 2 If you turn on your device for the first time, follow the on-screen instructions to set up your device.

To turn off your device, press and hold  $[\mathbb{O}]$  then select **Power off**  $\rightarrow$  **OK**.

# > Switch to Flight mode


In Flight mode, you can disable all wireless connections and use non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as airplanes and hospitals.


To activate Flight mode, go to **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Wireless and networks**  $\rightarrow$  **Flight mode** or press and hold  $[\mathbb{O}]$  and select **Flight mode**.

To deactivate Flight mode and use wireless connections, go to **Settings** → **Wireless and networks** and clear the check box next to **Flight mode**.

#### Use the touch screen

Your device's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions. Learn basic actions to use the touch screen.



- To avoid scratching the touch screen, do not use sharp tools.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with other electrical devices. Electrostatic discharges can cause the touch screen to malfunction.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with water. The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.



- For optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your device.
- Your touch screen has a layer that detects small electrical charges emitted by the human body. For best performance, tap the touch screen with your fingertip. The touch screen will not react to touches of sharp tools, such as a stylus or pen.

You can control your touch screen with the following actions:

- Tap: Touch once with your finger to select or launch a menu, option, or application.
- Drag: Tap and drag your finger up, down, left, or right to move to items on lists.
- Tap and hold: Tap an item and hold it for more than 2 seconds to open a pop-up option list.
- Drag and drop: Tap and hold your finger on an item, and then drag your finger to move the item.
- Double-tap: Tap twice quickly with your finger to zoom in or out while viewing photos.

#### > Rotate the touch screen

Your device has a built-in sensor that detects its orientation. If you rotate the device, the interface will automatically rotate according to the orientation.

To set the interface to keep the orientation, select the system bar at the bottom right of the screen and then select **Auto rotation** on the notifications panel.


#### Lock or unlock the touch screen

When you do not use the device for a specified period, your device turns off the touch screen and automatically locks the touch screen to prevent any unwanted device operations. To manually lock the touch screen, press  $[\mathbb{O}]$ .

To unlock, turn on the screen by pressing  $[\mathbb{O}]$ , and drag  $[\mathbb{O}]$  in any direction until it reaches the border of the circle. If you set a screen lock, you need to enter your PIN or password, or draw a pattern.  $\triangleright$  24

#### Get to know the Home screen

When the device is in Idle mode, you will see the Home screen. From the Home screen, you can view your device's status and access applications. Scroll left or right to a panel of the Home screen.

  - App shortcuts: Add shortcuts to applications on the Home screen.
  - Wallpapers: Set a background image.
  - More: Add shortcuts to items, such as bookmarks, contacts, and maps.
- 3 Select an item to add to the Home screen.

#### Move items on the Home screen

# Change the language of the display

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Language and input → Select language.
- 2 Select the language you want.

#### > Set the current time and date

- 1 From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Date and time.
- 2 Select Automatic date and time or set your time zone and the time and date. You can also change the time and date formats.

#### > Turn the touch tone on or off

From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Sound**  $\rightarrow$  **Audible selection**.

## Adjust the device's volume

- Press the Volume key up or down.
- 2 Select s and drag the sliders to adjust the volume level for media sounds and notifications.

#### Switch to Silent mode

From the Home screen or while using an application, select the right side of the system bar and then select **Sound** on the notifications panel.

You can also press and hold  $[\mathbb{O}]$  and select **Silent mode** to mute or unmute your device.



You can set the device to vibrate to alert you to various events in Silent mode. From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Settings** → **Sound** → **Vibrate** → **Always, Never, Only in Silent mode** or **Only when not in Silent mode**. When you switch to Silent mode, **Vibration** will appear in place of **Silent** on the notifications panel.

# > Select a wallpaper for the Home screen

- I From the Home screen, select  $+ \rightarrow$  **Wallpapers**.
- 2 Select an image folder.
- If you selected the Wallpapers folder, select **Home screen**Wallpaper and select an image.
  - If you selected Live Wallpapers, select a wallpaper and select **Set wallpaper**.
  - If you selected Gallery, select **Home screen Wallpaper**, select an image, move or resize the rectangle to select a portion of the image, and then select **Ok**.

## > Activate animation for switching windows

You can set a transition effect between windows while using the device.

- I From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Screen**  $\rightarrow$  **Animation**.

# Adjust the brightness of the display

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Screen → Brightness.
- 2 Clear the check box next to Automatic brightness.
- 3 Drag the slider to adjust the level of brightness.
- 4 Select **OK**.



The brightness level of the display will affect how quickly the device consumes battery power.

#### > Set a screen lock

You can lock the touch screen with an unlock pattern or password to prevent unauthorized people from using the device without your permission.

- 4 Select **Continue**.
- 5 Draw the pattern again to confirm.
- 6 Select **Confirm**

#### Set an unlock PIN code

- I From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Settings** → **Location and security** → **Configure** lock screen → PIN.
- 2 Enter a new PIN (numeric) and select Continue.
- Enter the PIN again and select OK.

#### Set an unlock password

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Location and security → Configure lock screen → Password.
- 2 Enter a new password (alphanumeric) and select **Continue**.
- 3 Enter the password again and select **OK**.

#### **Enter text**

You can enter text by selecting characters on the virtual keypad, inputting handwriting on the screen, or speaking words into the microphone.



You cannot enter text in some languages. To enter text, you should change the writing language to one of the supported languages. ▶ p. 84

# Change the keyboard type

You can change the keyboard type.







- To customize browser settings, select → Settings.

# Search for information by voice



This feature may be unavailable depending on your region or service provider.

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Browser**.
- 2 Select Q.
- 3 Select  $\square$  and say a keyword into your device's microphone.

The device searches for information and web pages related with the keyword.

## Open multiple pages

You can open multiple pages and switch back and forth between them.

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Browser.

## Manage feed sources

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Pulse.
- 2 Select to view the feed source list.





To disconnect the device from the PC, click the USB device icon on the Windows task bar and click the option to safely remove the mass storage device. Then remove the PC data cable from the PC. Otherwise, you may lose data stored on your device or damage your device.



Ensure that USB debugging is turned off in **Settings** → **Applications** → **Development** or this procedure will not work.

#### Wi-Fi

Learn to use your device's wireless networking capabilities to activate and connect to any wireless local area network (WLAN) compatible with the IEEE 802.11 a/b/g/n standards.

You can connect to the internet or other network devices anywhere an access point or wireless hotspot is available.

#### Activate the WLAN feature

- 1 From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Wireless and networks → Wi-Fi settings.
- 2 Select Wi-Fi to activate the WLAN feature.



An active WLAN running in the background will consume battery power. To preserve battery power, activate the WLAN only when needed.

#### Find and connect to a WLAN

- 1 From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Wireless and networks → Wi-Fi settings.
  - The device will automatically search for available WLANs.
- 2 Select a network under Wi-Fi networks.
- 3 Enter a password for the network (if necessary).
- 4 Select **OK**.

# Add a WLAN manually

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Wireless and networks → Wi-Fi settings → Add Wi-Fi network.
- 2 Enter the SSID for the network and select the security type.

#### Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct allows Wi-Fi devices to talk to each other without the need for wireless access points (hot spots).



Activating this feature will disconnect your current Wi-Fi network connection.

- 2 Tap Wi-Fi Direct. A check mark displays next to the feature indicating it is enabled. Your phone will search for other devices enabled with Wi-Fi direct connections.
- 3 Tap a device name to begin the connection process. The target device must also have Wi-Fi Direct service activated and running before it can be detected by your device.
- 4 Tap **Connect**. The direct connection is established.
- 5 When prompted to complete the connection, tap **OK**. The status field now reads "Connected" and the connected device is shown within the Wi-Fi Direct devices listing.

## **Bluetooth**

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology capable of exchanging information over a distance of about 10 m without requiring a physical connection.

You do not need to line up the devices to beam information with Bluetooth. If the devices are within range of one another,

you can exchange information between them even if they are located in different rooms.



- Samsung is not responsible for the loss, interception, or misuse of data sent or received via the Bluetooth wireless feature.
- Always ensure that you share and receive data with devices that are trusted and properly secured. If there are obstacles between the devices, the operating distance may be reduced.
- Some devices, especially those that are not tested or approved by Bluetooth SIG, may be incompatible with your device.

#### > Turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Wireless and networks → Bluetooth settings.
- 2 Select **Bluetooth** to turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature.

## Find and pair with other Bluetooth-enabled devices



Some devices, especially headsets or hands-free car kits, may have a fixed Bluetooth PIN, such as 0000. If the other device has a PIN, you must enter it.

- 2 Select an option for sending data via Bluetooth.



3 Search for and pair with a Bluetooth-enabled device.

## Receive data using the Bluetooth wireless feature

- From the Home screen, open the application list and select Settings → Wireless and networks → Bluetooth settings → Visible.
- When prompted, enter the PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature and select **OK** (if necessary).
- 3 Select to on the system bar and select **Accept** to confirm that you are willing to receive data from the device.



#### **GPS**

Your device is equipped with a global positioning system (GPS) receiver. Learn to activate location services.

To receive better GPS signals, avoid using your device in the following conditions:

- between buildings, in tunnels or underground passages, or inside buildings
- in poor weather
- around high voltage or electromagnetic fields
- in a vehicle with sun protection film





This feature may be unavailable depending on your region or service provider.



#### **System Reset**

If your device has fatal errors, hangs up, or is frozen and unresponsive, you may need to reset the device to regain functionality.

Press and hold the Power/Reset/Lock key [①] for 8 to 10 seconds.

### **Android System Recovery**

Android System Recovery is used to restore the tablet's system software to the original as-shipped state and delete all user data. Under normal operating conditions you should never need to perform a system recovery.



 If you entered this menu by mistake, use the Volume Up/Down keys to select **reboot system now**, then press the Power/Reset/Lock key. Your tablet will then continue to boot up.

To enter the Android System Recovery mode, follow these steps:

- With the tablet turned off, press the Power/Reset/Lock key and the Volume Up key at the same time until the phone switches on (Volume Up is the right side, closest to the Headset jack).
- When the start-up screen appears, release the Power/ Reset/Lock key while continuing to press the Volume Up key.
- 3 Continue to press the Volume Up key for at least 8 seconds, until Recovery mode is launched and the Android System Recovery screen displays the following options:
  - reboot system now: this option restarts your tablet without making any changes.

- apply update from external storage: this option allows you to apply updates from your memory card to your tablet.
- wipe data/factory reset: erases all data from the tablet and resets all settings to factory default values. It does not delete content stored on an inserted microSD card.
- wipe cache partition: allows you to delete all cache data such as log files.
- 4 Release the Volume Up key.
- 5 Use the Volume Up/Down keys to scroll to wipe data/ factory reset, then press the Power/Reset/Lock key to select the option.

## Your device displays network or service error messages

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription.
   Contact your service provider for more details.

### The touch screen responds slowly or improperly

If your device has a touch screen and the touch screen is not responding properly, try the following:

- Remove any protective covers from the touch screen.
   Protective covers may prevent the device from recognizing your inputs and are not recommended for touch screen devices.
- Ensure that your hands are clean and dry when tapping the touch screen.
- Restart your device to clear any temporary software bugs.
- Ensure that your device software is upgraded to the latest version.
- If the touch screen is scratched or damaged, take it to your local Samsung Service Centre.

#### Your device freezes or has fatal errors

If your device freezes or hangs, you may need to close programs or reset the device to regain functionality. If your device is frozen and unresponsive, press and hold  $[\mathbb{O}]$  for 8-10 seconds. The device will reboot automatically.

If this does not solve the problem, perform a factory data reset. From the Home screen, open the application list and select **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Privacy**  $\rightarrow$  **Factory data reset**  $\rightarrow$  **Reset device**  $\rightarrow$  **Erase everything**.

### The device beeps and the battery icon flashes

Your battery is low. Recharge the battery to continue using the device.

## The battery does not charge properly or the device turns off

If the battery will no longer charge completely, you need to replace it with a new battery. Take your device to your local Samsung Service Centre.

#### Your device is hot to the touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your device for an extended period of time, your device may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.

#### Error messages appear when launching the camera

Your Samsung mobile device must have sufficient available memory and battery power to operate the camera application. If you receive error messages when launching the camera, try the following:

- Charge the battery.
- Free some memory by transferring files to a PC or deleting files from your device.
- Restart the device. If you are still having trouble with the camera application after trying these tips, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

### Error messages appear when opening music files

Some music files may not play on your Samsung mobile device for a variety of reasons. If you receive error messages when opening music files on your device, try the following:

- Ensure that the music file is not Digital Rights Management (DRM)-protected. If the file is DRM-protected, ensure that you have the appropriate license or key to play the file.
- Ensure that your device supports the file type.

#### Another Bluetooth device is not located

- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on your device.
- Ensure that the Bluetooth wireless feature is activated on the device you wish to connect to, if necessary.
- Ensure that your device and the other Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 m).

If the tips above do not solve the problem, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

## A connection is not established when you connect the device to a PC

- Ensure that the PC data cable you are using is compatible with your device.
- Ensure that you have the proper drivers installed and updated on your PC.
