safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



Safety warnings

Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

Protect your hearing



Listening to a headset at high volumes can damage your hearing. Use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone.
 Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.

Ensure maximum battery and charger life



You can lock the keys to prevent any unwanted phone operations. To lock or unlock these keys, press and hold [*].



assembling and preparing your mobile phone

Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

Install the SIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To install the SIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.





If the phone is on, press and hold $[\P \]$ to turn it off

2. Insert the SIM card.

Your phone has 2 SIM card slots to allow you use 2 SIM cards and switch between tem.

- Place the SIM card in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.
- Without inserting a SIM card, you can use your phone's non-network services and some menus.

3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

- Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the phone.
- 2. Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warrantv.

- 3. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- When the battery is fully charged (the initial icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 5. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- 6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.



About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards up to 8 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).



Formatting the memory card on a PC may cause incompatibility with your phone.
Format the memory card only on the phone.

- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Unlock the memory card holder.



3. Lift the memory card holder and insert a memory holder with the label side facing up.




4. Close the memory card holder.

5. Lock the memory card holder.



6. Replace the battery cover.

To remove the memory card, remove the battery cover, unlock and lift the memory card holder, and remove the memory card.



using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

- 1. Press and hold [.
- 2. Enter your PIN and press < OK> (if necessary).
- Press <OK> and assign a name and icon to the new SIM card.
- 4. Press < Next>.
- Activate a SIM card or select a default SIM card (if necessary).
- 6. Press < Save>.

To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

Switch to the offline profile

By switching to the offline profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplanes and hospitals. To switch to the offline profile, in Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles → Offline.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- In Idle mode, press < Menu> to access Menu mode.

You may need to press the Confirm key to access Menu mode depending on your region or service provider.

Use the Navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.

- 3. Press < Select>, < OK>, or the Confirm key to confirm the highlighted option.
- 4. Press < Back> to move up one level; Press [] to return to Idle mode.

Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

Adjust the volume of the key tones

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Scroll to the profile you are using.
- 3. Press < Options > → Edit.
- 4. Scroll left or right to Phone sounds.
- Select Phone sound volume.

- 6. Scroll left or right to adjust the key tone volume.
- 7. Press < Save > twice.

Switch to or from the silent profile

In Idle mode, press and hold [#] to silence or unsilence your phone.

Change your ringtone

To change the ringtone of the current profile,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Scroll to the profile you are using.



If you are using the silent profile, you are not allowed to adjust the volume of the ringtone.

Press < Options> → Edit → Voice call ringtone.

- Select a ringtone category → a ringtone.
- 5. Press < Save>.

To switch to another profile,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Select a profile you want.

To create a phone profile,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Press <Options> → Create.
- 3. Enter a name for the profile and press the Confirm key.
- 4. Customise the sound settings as desired.
- 5. When you are finished, press < Save>.

Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → Home screen.
- Scroll left or right to Images and select Wallpaper.
- Select an image category → an image.
- 4. Press < Save>.

Select a theme for the display

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → My theme.
- Select a theme.

Set menu shortcuts

In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone settings → Shortcuts.

- Select a key to use as a shortcut.
- 3. Select a menu to assign to the shortcut key.

Lock your phone

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Security → Phone → Phone lock → On.
- 2. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and press < OK>.
- 3. Enter the new password again and press < OK>.



- The first time you access a menu that requires a password, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.

Manage your SIM cards

Your phone supports the Dual SIM mode, enabling you to use two SIM cards at the same time without changing them. Learn to select a default SIM card and set the SIM cards settings.

Select a default SIM card

- 1. In Idle mode, press [H].
- 2. Select **Default** under the SIM card to use.
- 3. Press < Save >. You phone will automatically reboot.

Switch the SIM cards automatically

- In Menu mode, select Settings → SIM cards management → SIM auto switch.
- 2. Scroll left or right to On.

- 3. Specify the schedule for each SIM card to be used and press < Save>.
- 4. Press <Save>.

Change the names and icons of the SIM cards

- In Menu mode, select Settings → SIM cards management → Register card.
- 2. Scroll to a SIM card.
- 3. Change the name and icon.

Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.

Make a call

- In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.
- 3. To end the call, press [].

Answer a call

- 1. When a call comes in, press [-].
- 2. To end the call, press [.

Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Navigation key up or down.

Use the speakerphone feature

- During a call, press the Confirm key → <Yes> to activate the speaker.
- 2. To switch back to the earpiece, press the Confirm key again.



In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better performance, use the normal phone mode.

Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press and hold the headset button.
- To answer a call, press and hold the headset button.
- To end a call, press and hold the headset button.

Send and view messages

Learn to send and view text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), and email messages.

Send a text or multimedia message

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create new message → Message.
- 2. Enter a destination number and scroll down.
- Enter your message text. ► Enter text
 For sending as a text message, skip to step 5.
 For attaching multimedia, continue with step 4.
- Press < Options> → Add multimedia and add an item.
- Press < Options> → Send to send the message.

Send an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create new message → Email.
- 2. Enter an email address and scroll down.
- 3. Enter a subject and scroll down.
- 4. Enter your email text.
- Press < Options> → Attach multimedia or Attach organiser and attach a file (if necessary).
- 6. Press < Options> → Send to send the message.

Enter text

When entering text, you can change the text input mode:

 Press and hold [#] to switch between T9 and ABC modes. Depending on your country, you may be able to access an input mode for your specific language.

- Press [#] to change case or switch to Number mode.
- Press [*] to switch to Symbol mode.
- Press and hold [*] to select an input mode or change the input language.

Enter text in one of the following modes:

Mode	Function	
ABC	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.	
Т9	Press the appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word. When the word displays correctly, press [0] to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, press the Navigation key up or down to select an alternate word.

View text or multimedia messages

- In Menu mode, select Messages → My messages → Inbox.
- 2. Select a text or multimedia message.

View an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → My messages → Email inbox.
- 2. Press Check new email.
- 3. Select an email or a header.
- If you selected a header, press < Options> → Retrieve to view the body of the email.

Add and find contacts

Learn the basics of using the phonebook feature.

Add a new contact

- 1. In Idle mode, enter a phone number and press < Options>.
- 2. Select $\mathbf{Save} \rightarrow$ a memory location (phone, SIM1, or SIM2) \rightarrow \mathbf{New} .
- 3. Select a number type (if necessary).
- 4. Enter contact information.
- Press < Options> → Save to add the contact to memory.

Find a contact

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find.

3. Select the contact's name from the search list.



Once you have found a contact, you can:

- call the contact by pressing [-]
- edit the contact information by pressing the Confirm key

Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

Capture photos

- In Menu mode, select **Camera** to turn on the camera
- 2. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 3. Press the Confirm key to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.

View photos

In Menu mode, select My files \rightarrow Images \rightarrow My photos \rightarrow a photo file.

Capture videos

- In Menu mode, select Camera to turn on the camera.
- 2. Press [1] to switch to Recording mode.
- 3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 4. Press the Confirm key to start recording.
- Press < > > or the Confirm key to stop recording.
 The video is saved automatically.
- 6. Press < >> to record another video (step 4).

Listen to music

Leam how to listen to music via the music player or FM radio.

Listen to the FM radio

- Plug the supplied headset into the phone's multifunction jack.

If you are having trouble with your mobile phone, try these troubleshooting procedures before contacting a service professional.

When you turn on your phone or while you are using the phone, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
Password	When the phone lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the phone.
PIN	When using the phone for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM card. You can disable this feature by using the PIN lock menu.

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
PUK	Your SIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.
PIN2	When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

The phone prompts you to insert the SIM card.

Ensure that the SIM card is installed correctly.

Your phone displays "No networks found" or "Network error."

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

You enter a number, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that you have pressed [-].
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number.

Another caller cannot reach you.

· Ensure that your phone is turned on.

- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number.

Another caller cannot hear you speaking.

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

The phone beeps and the battery icon flashes.

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the phone.

The audio quality of the call is poor.

- Ensure that you are not blocking the phone's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

You select a contact to call, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.

The battery does not charge properly or sometimes the phone turns itself off.

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both gold-colored contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery.

Your phone is hot to the touch.

When you use several applications at once, your phone requires more power and may heat up.

This is normal and should not affect your phone's lifespan or performance.
