

## **2** Getting Started

### Installing the SIM Card and the Battery

You can install two SIM cards in the phone at the same time. When installing a SIM card, ensure that the golden contact area on the SIM card is facing downward and that the beveled edge of the SIM card is properly aligned with that of the SIM card slot.







### Removing the Battery and the SIM Card

Before removing the battery and the SIM cards, ensure that your phone is powered off.



### Installing a microSD Card

Δ

Before installing or removing a microSD card, power off the phone. Once the phone is powered on, it will indicate whether the microSD card has been installed properly.

You can install a microSD card to expand the memory capacity of your phone. When installing a microSD card, ensure that the golden contact area on the microSD card is facing downward.





### Charging the Battery

- Connect the smaller end of the USB cable to the charger jack of the phone and the larger end to the charger.
- 2. Connect the charger to a power socket.







- 3. Wait until the battery is fully charged. While the battery is charging, the charging icon is animated. When the battery is fully charged, the charging icon animation stops.
- 4. Disconnect the charger from the power socket and then from the phone.

Please do not make a call during charging your phone.

### **Accessing a Function Menu**

### **USB Mode**

When the phone is connected to a PC using the USB cable, options including **Mass storage** are displayed on the phone screen.

When you select **Mass storage**, you can manage the files stored on the phone and the microSD card from the PC's File Manager application.

The microSD card and the phone memory appear as removable disks on the PC. You can do the following:

- 1. Double-click a disk to open it.
- 2. Copy, paste, or delete the files on the disk.
- 3. Disconnect the phone from the PC.
- Щ
- Ensure that you connect and disconnect the USB cable properly.
- Do not format the phone memory on a PC; doing so may cause permanent damage to the phone memory.
- The USB cable can be used to transfer data and charge your phone. The PC must be running a Windows based operating system (for example: Windows XP, Windows 2000, Windows 7). Mac OS systems are not supported.

### PIN and PUK

The personal identification number (PIN) protects your SIM card from unauthorized use. The PIN Unblocking Key (PUK) is used to unblock a blocked PIN. Both the PIN and the PUK are provided with the SIM card. For details, contact your service provider.

To enable the SIM1 lock function, do the following:

- In standby mode, select Menu > Settings > Security settings > SIM1 security settings > SIM1 lock.

The procedure for setting the SIM2 lock is similar to that of setting SIM1 lock.

If you repeatedly enter an incorrect PIN, on a specified number of consecutive attempts, the phone asks you to enter the PUK.

If you repeatedly enter an incorrect PUK, on a specified number of consecutive attempts, the SIM card becomes permanently invalid. In that case, contact your service provider for a new SIM card.

### Locking the Keypad

In standby mode, press and hold for about 3s to lock the keypad. To unlock the keypad, press (Unlock), and then 2.

If the Auto keypad lock function is enabled, the phone locks the

keypad automatically after it is idle for a preset period. To enable the Auto keypad lock function, select Menu > Settings > Security settings > Auto keypad lock, select a preset duration, and then press

When the keypad is locked, you can press to answer an incoming call or make an emergency call.

### **Network Settings**

Before accessing WAP sites, you must set your data account and WAP parameters on your phone.

#### Setting a Data Account

- Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Data account.
- Press Options), and then select Add.
- Set the parameters based on the information obtained from your service provider.
- Press (Done) to save the settings.
- If the data account provided by your service provider already exists, you do not need to create a data account.

### Connecting to a Wi-Fi Network

- 1. Select Menu > Settings > Connectivity > Wi-Fi.
- 2. You can do the following:
- Enable Wi-Fi: to enable the Wi-Fi function on your phone.
- Wi-Fi status: to view your phone's MAC address and other relevant information if Wi-Fi is enabled.
- Search for networks: to search for available wireless LAN networks.
- Access point settings: to view or edit the list of the wireless LAN networks to which you have connected. You can also manually enter relevant parameters to connect the phone to a new wireless LAN network.

### Setting the WAP Profile

- 1. Select Menu > WAP > Settings > Profiles.
- Select SIM1 or SIM2.
- 3. Select Add new.
- Set the Internet parameters based on the information provided by your service provider.

### Selecting a SIM Card

You can select a SIM card with which to connect to the network.

Only one SIM card can be used each time you access the network.

To select a SIM card:

- 1. Select Menu > WAP > Settings > Select SIM.
- Select Always ask, SIM1, or SIM2.
- Press (OK) to save the setting.

### Connecting to a Network

- Select Menu > WAP > Input address.
- 2. Enter a Uniform Resource Locator (URL) address.
- Press (Options), and then select Done to access the WAP site.

### **11** Bluetooth

Using Bluetooth, you can exchange data between your phone and other Bluetooth devices, and use a Bluetooth headset.

Before using the Bluetooth function, configure the Bluetooth settings.

### **Using a Bluetooth Headset**

No Bluetooth headset is included in the product package. If you want to use a Bluetooth headset, you must purchase it separately.

- After pairing, exchange data between your phone and the Bluetooth device.

## **12** STK

The SIM Tool Kit (STK) function is available only if your service operator provides it. It is a value-added service provided by your operator, which allows you to send text messages, view news, and use other applications. For further details, contact your network operator.

### **13** Chat Functions

The built-in chat applications, **Facebook** and **Twitter**, on your phone allow you to send instant messages and files on the move.

To launch Facebook:

- Select Menu > Fun & Games > FaceBook > Start.
- 2. Enter your email account and password.

The method for launching Twitter is similar to that for launching Facebook.

Your phone supports AccuWeather.com, an application that provides you the most localized and accurate weather information for your chosen city.

To launch the weather application:

- Press (Options) to select Update, Select City, Delete City, Settings and More Info.

Check whether you have installed the SIM card or connected to a Wi-Fi network before using the AccuWeather.com application.

## **15** Warnings and Precautions

This section contains important information pertaining to the operating instructions of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safely. Read this information carefully before using your device.

#### Electronic Device

Power off your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device when using the device causes danger or interference with electronic devices.
