The torch light on your phone helps you see in dark places by turning the flashlight on. To turn on the torch light, In Idle mode, press and hold the Navigation key up in Idle mode. You can also select Applications → Torch light  $\rightarrow$  <0n>.

To turn off the torch light, press and hold the Navigation key up again in Idle mode
