## **Before You Use Your Smartphone**

## **Safety Warnings**

Read the following safety warnings carefully before using your smartphone.

- This equipment is intended for use with power supplied from supplied battery charger(s) and/or power supply unit(s). Other usage will invalidate any certification given to this product and may be dangerous.
- Switch off your cell phone when in an aircraft. The use of cell phones in an aircraft may be dangerous to the operation of the aircraft, could disrupt cellular networks, and may be illegal. ## **Setting Up Your Smartphone**

Congratulations on the purchase of your Dell Mini 3iX. This section provides information about setting up your smartphone.

## **Smartphone Requirements**

To use all of the smartphone features, you need:

- A wireless service plan with a carrier
- · An Internet connection
- A computer with a USB 2.0 port

## **Activating Phone Service**

Before you can use any of the smartphone features, you must activate the smartphone. To activate the smartphone you must:

- Sign up for a service plan with a service carrier in your area
- · Register the smartphone with the network

If you purchased this smartphone from a service carrier, activation may have been done during the purchase.

# Setting Up the Phone for the First Time

You must install the battery, SIM card, and charge the battery before you can use your smartphone.

### To set up your phone for the first time:

### 1 Open the cover

Slide a finger into the finger slot, and then lift the cover.



### Install the SIM card

Hold the SIM card with the metal contacts facing downwards and insert the card into the SIM card holder.



NOTE: To ensure proper installation, align the cut corners in the card and the SIM card slot.



### 3 Install the MicroSD card (if not installed)

- Hold the microSD card with the metal contacts facing upwards, and slide it into the microSD card slot.
- b Press in on the microSD card until it clicks into place.



### 4 Install the battery

Align the metal contacts on the battery with the contacts on the battery holder and insert the battery.



### 5 Close the cover

Insert the tabs on the cover into the slots on the phone and snap the cover in place.



### 6 Charge the battery



CAUTION: Do not use any non-approved chargers as they may damage your smartphone and invalidate any warranties.



**NOTE:** It takes at least one chargingdischarging cycle for the battery to reach its peak performance.

- Using the Mini-USB to USB cable, plug the power adapter into a power outlet and then into your smartphone. You can also charge your smartphone by connecting to a computer USB port.
- Charge your smartphone for about 2 hours. Ensure that your smartphone is

fully charged by checking the charge status indicator on the display.



- 7 When charging is complete, press the power button for 2 seconds to exit the charging mode.
- 8 Your smartphone is now ready to use.

## **Maintaining Your Smartphone**

This section provides information about removal and replacement of components (SIM card and microSD card) and charging the battery.

## **Battery**

### **Charging the Battery**



CAUTION: Do not use any non-approved chargers as they may damage your smartphone and invalidate any warranties.



**NOTE:** It takes at least one chargingdischarging cycle for the battery to reach its peak performance.

- 1 Ensure that the battery is installed.
- 2 Using the Mini-USB to USB cable, plug the power adapter into a power outlet and then into your smartphone. You can also charge your smartphone by connecting to a computer USB port.



3 Charge your smartphone for about 2 hours. Ensure that your smartphone is fully charged by checking the charge status indicator on the display.

### Removing & Replacing the Battery

1 Turn off the smartphone
Press and hold the power button for 3 second, and then tap Power off.

### **Maintaining Your Smartphone**

Open the cover by sliding a finger into the finger slot, and then lift the cover.



3 Slide fingers into the finger slots, and then lift to remove the battery.



4 Align the metal contacts on the battery with the contacts on the battery holder and insert the battery.



5 Close the cover by inserting the tabs on the cover into the slots on the smartphone, and then snap the cover in place.



### SIM Card

### Removing and Replacing the SIM Card

1 Open the cover by sliding a finger into the finger slot, and then lift the cover.



Slide the SIM card out of the SIM card holder.



3 Hold the SIM card with the metal contacts facing downwards and insert the card into the SIM card holder.



NOTE: To ensure proper installation, align the cut corners in the card and the SIM card slot.



4 Close the cover by inserting the tabs on the cover into the slots on the smartphone, and then snap the cover in place.




### MicroSD Card

## Removing and Replacing the microSD Card

 Open the cover by sliding a finger into the finger slot, and then lift the cover.



2 Press in on the microSD card to eject the card from the microSD card holder.



- 3 Slide the microSD card out from the microSD card holder.
- 4 Hold the microSD card with the metal contacts facing upwards, and slide it into the microSD card slot.
- 5 Press in on the microSD card until it clicks into place.



6 Close the cover by inserting the tabs on the cover into the slots on the phone, and then snap the cover in place.



## **Mini 3iX Smartphone Accessories**

Your smartphone may ship with the following accessories:


- Mini-USB headset allows you to listen to music or a phone conversation. Callers hear you through the integrated microphone. To use the headset, connect it to the Mini-USB port. See "Left View" on page 20.
- Stylus allows you to quickly enter text using the on-screen keyboard and handwriting tools. See "Selecting an Input Method" on page 33.





**NOTE:** Comes only with phones purchased in China.

 USB to Mini-USB data cable — allows you to connect your smartphone to a computer for file transfers and data synchronization (see "PC Sync Tool" on page 137).





**NOTE:** The USB to Mini-USB cable is also used to connect the power adapter for charging the battery.

 Power adapter — use to charge the battery (see "Charging the Battery" on page 13).





**NOTE:** The type(s) and number of the power adapter head(s) that ship with your smartphone may vary depending on the country where you purchased the phone.

 Microfiber pouch — allows you to store the phone for protection when not in use, and to clean the screen as needed.








## **Mini 3iX Smartphone Features**

### Front View




- Speaker Use to listen to phone conversations.
- 2 Touch screen Displays phone images.
- 3 Microphone Use for voice calls.

### **Back View**



- Camera Use to capture photos and videos.
- 2 Camera flash Use to capture photos in dim light.
- 3 Cover Covers the battery, SIM card, and microSD card holders.

### **Left View**



- 1 Power/Lock button Short press (when the display is active): locks or unlocks the display. Short press (when the display is in sleep mode): wakes up the display. Long Press: Power On/Power Off.
- 2 Home/Back button Short press: navigate back one screen at a time.
  Long press: return to the Home screen.
- 3 Mini-USB Port Use to charge the phone, connect to a computer, or connect to a headset.

### **Right view**



- Volume button Press up to increase volume.
   Press down to decrease volume.
- Options button Short press to open the Options menu.
- **3 Camera button** Press to activate the camera and capture photos or video.

## **Using The Touch Screen**

This section provides information about using the touch screen features.

 Selection — To select an item or open an application, touch the item or application with your fingertip.

To go back to the previous screen, tap the **Back** icon or press the **Home/Back** button.


To go back to the Home screen, long press the **Home/Back** button.



- 1 🛅 Back icon
- 2 **Options** icon
- 3 Function tab

- Options icon To open the function menu for an item on the screen, tap and hold the item for a second and release. The function menu pops up when you release your finger.
- Function tab To perform the function or open the submenu of the current function, tap and hold the item for a second and release.
- Pop up menu Provides the options available for the current selection. You may have to scroll within the menu to see all the available options.

### Zoom in/Zoom out —



To zoom in the current view, expand your fingers at the section of the screen where you want to zoom in.


To zoom out the current view, pinch the section of the screen where you want to zoom out.

### Drag Items —



To move an item on the screen, place your finger and drag the item to the desired position.

### Scroll Up/Down —



To scroll up or down in a list or page on the screen, slide your finger up/down on the screen.

### Scroll Right/Left —



To scroll left or right in a menu or back to the previous menu, slide your finger right/left on the screen

### **Connection Manager**

 Tap and hold the status bar, then slide the panel downwards to open the Communication Manager.



1 Expand icon

2 Tap the Expand icons to view more options.



- Go to Settings icon
  - Communication Tap Mobile Network to turn the cellular network service on or off. Tap WLAN to turn WLAN on or off. Tap Bluetooth to turn Bluetooth on or off.

- Profile Tap an option to set the profile.
- Notifications Displays notification messages.
- 3 Press the Home/Back button to close Communication Manager.

### Status Bar



The Status bar is located on the top of your phone screen. Icons appear on the status bar to notify you of a new message, upcoming calendar event, alarm or other information important to you.

## **Using the Home Screen**

The Home screen provides access to all the applications available on your smartphone. The following are the applications available on your smartphone:

Application	Description
Phone	Allows you to make calls using either the recent caller list, contacts list, or manually using the numeric keypad.
Browser	Allows you to browse the Internet.
Messaging	Allows you to send and receive MMS and SMS text messages.
Alarm	Allows you to set up, add or delete alarms.
Contacts	Allows you to view, search, add, change, or delete contacts.
Email	Allows you to send and receive e-mail messages via Internet, SMS, MMS, or WAP mobile Internet access.
Settings	Allows you to set up connections, networks, basic functions, and applications.
👼 Calendar	Allows you to set alerts to remind you of events, appointments, and deadlines.



Tasks	Time management program that allows you to add time, date, priority, and status to your tasks.

### Moving Items on the Home Screen

 To move an item from your Home screen, touch and hold the item to open the menu manager.



- 2 Tap Reorder menu to enter reorder mode.
- 3 Tap and drag the item to its new location.



**NOTE:** If you want to cancel and exit the reorder mode screen, press the **Back** button.

4 When done, tap the **Home/Back** button to save and exit the reorder mode.

### Removing Items on the Home Screen

- To remove an item from your Home screen, touch and hold the item to open the menu manager.
- 2 Tap Delete shortcut.



**NOTE:** Only icons that the user have added can be deleted.

## Sleep Mode

Your smartphone may automatically enter the sleep mode after a period of inactivity. You can set the period of inactivity after which the smartphone changes to sleep mode using the phone settings menu. While in sleep mode the display turns off, and your smartphone consumes lesser battery power.

### Activating sleep mode

Short press the **Power/Lock** button to activate sleep mode.

### Waking up the phone

- 1 To wake up the phone, press the Power/Lock or the Back/Home, or the Options button.
- 2 Tap and slide the lock panel to unlock.

## **Entering Text**

When you start a program or select a field that requires text or numbers, the input panel appears automatically. You can select an input method and start inputting text (predictive text). The phone may automatically suggest vocabularies or commonly used phrases as you enter text.


Your phone supports inputs in multiple languages, and provides the following input methods and keyboards:

- QWERTY Kevboard
- Phone Keypad
- HandWriting

### Selecting an Input Method

1 Tap a text field, such as in a note or new contact, to open the input panel.

2 Tap and hold the **Switch Input Method** icon to open the Input Method Settings screen.



- Switch Input Method icon
- 3 Tap the input method you prefer.

### **Selecting Input Languages**

You can select two languages as main input languages and quickly switch between two languages by tapping the **Switch Input Method** icon.

To select main input languages:

- 1 Tap a text field, such as in a note or new contact, to open the input panel.
- 2 Tap and hold the **Switch Input Method** icon to open the Input Method Settings screen.



3 Tap to select IME Settings more.

- 4 Tap **Optional Input Language One** to select the first language.
- 5 Tap desired language.



- Tap **Optional Input Language Two** to select the second language.
- 7 Tap desired language.
- 8 Tap the **Back** icon to close the Input Method Setting screen.

### To switch between languages:

1 Tap the **Switch Input Method** icon to switch between the two languages.

The space bar on the keyboard changes to indicate the current language.



### **Entering Text with QWERTY**

To type text using the standard keyboard, you should be in the QWERTY input mode. As you type, each letter appears above your thumb or finger. The letter is not entered until you release your finger from the key. To switch input method to the QWERTY mode:

- 1 Tap a text field, such as in a note or new contact, to open the input panel.
- Tap and hold the Switch Input Method icon and select QWERTY Keyboard as your input method.

3 Tap the keys on the keyboard to enter text. As you tap the keys, word suggestions appear on the suggestion area. Tap a word to select it.



Suggestion area

### **Entering Numbers and Symbols**

Tap the **Numbers and Symbols** icon to change the input to numbers and symbols.



1 Numbers and Symbols icon

### **Using HandWriting**


Handwriting allows writing across the entire screen.

- 1 Tap a text field, such as in a note or new contact, to open the input panel.
- 2 Tap and hold the Switch Input Method icon and select HandWriting as your input method.

3 Use a stylus or your finger to write anywhere on the screen.



4 The handwriting will be converted to text shortly after you lift the stylus or your finger from the screen.



- 1 Screen
- Displays possible word. Tap the word to select it.

### Using the Phone KeyPad

In the phone keypad, you can text by typing out letters similar to texting on a numeric keypad.

- 1 Tap a text field, such as in a note or new contact, to open the input panel.
- Tap and hold the Switch Input Method icon and select Phone KeyPad as your input method.
- 3 Use a stylus or your finger to touch a key on the keypad. Characters, numbers, or symbols appear on the box.
- 4 Continue touching the key to toggle different characters, numbers, or symbols.
- 5 Tap the desired character, number or symbol to insert it immediately.
- 6 As you tap the keys, the smartphone matches the characters you type to the words in the dictionary and displays predicted texts. Tap a word to complete the entry.
- 7 Tap the Back icon to exit the input panel.

## **Connecting to the Internet**

Your phone connects to the Internet using a cellular data network

### **Selecting Cellular Data Networks**

You can connect to the Internet through EDGE, GPRS, 3G, HSDPA, or WiFi networks. Check the carrier's network coverage in your area for availability. Ensure that you get the appropriate service plan for a desired network.

## **Basic Phone Settings**

This section provides information about the basic settings for your smartphone.

In the Home screen, tap the **Settings** icon to open the **Settings** screen.



### **Display Settings**

Display settings allow you to adjust the screen brightness, screen timeout, and screen lock settings.

### **Enabling Auto Brightness**

- 1 In the Home screen, tap the **Settings** icon to open the Settings screen.
- 2 In the Phone basics section, tap Display Settings to open the Display Settings screen.



3 Tap to select the Auto brightness check box to enable auto brightness.

### Setting Brightness Manually


- 1 In the Home screen, tap the Settings icon to open the Settings screen.
- In the Phone basics section, tap Display settings to open the Display settings screen.
- 3 Ensure that the Auto brightness is disabled.
- 4 Tap Brightness from the Display settings screen to open the Brightness panel.
- 5 Use your finger or stylus to move the slider left or right to adjust the brightness.



- 1 Slider
- 6 Tap **OK** to save and exit the Brightness panel.

### **Setting Screen Timeout**

- In the Home screen, tap the Settings icon to open the Settings screen.
- In the Phone basics section, tap Display settings to open the Display settings screen.
- 3 Tap Screen timeout to open the Screen timeout panel.



- 4 Tap the available options to select the idle time after which the screen turns off.
- 5 To exit the screen, tap Cancel.

### **Date & Time Settings**

Date and time settings allow you to manually set the date, time, time zone, and formats.



NOTE: Set the time zone first to automatically set the date and time on your location. See "To set time zone" on page 42.

### Setting the Date and Time Automatically

- 1 In the Home screen, tap the **Settings** icon to open the Settings screen.
- 2 In the Phone basics section, tap Date & time settings to open the Date & time settings screen.
- 3 Tap Set time zone to open the Set time zone screen.
- 4 Slide your finger up or down on the screen to view the entire list.

5 Tap the time zone you desire to select the time zone.



The date and time are automatically set base on the selected time zone.

### **Setting the Date Manually**

- 1 In the Home screen, tap the Settings icon to open the Settings screen.
- 2 In the Phone basics section, tap Date & time settings to open the Date & time settings screen.
- 3 Tap Set date to open the Change date panel.



- Slide your finger up or down on each field to increase or decrease the value of the date.
- 5 Tap Save to save your changes and exit the Change date panel.

### Setting the Time Manually

- 1 In the Home screen, tap the Settings icon to open the Settings screen.
- 2 In the Phone basics section, tap Date & time settings to open the Date & time settings screen.
- 3 Tap Set time to open the Change time panel.





- Caller ID Select this check box to hide or show your number to recipient's of your call.
   When your number shows, your phone number and Caller ID picture will appear to people you call, provided the call recipient's device supports this feature.
- Call waiting Select this check box to display incoming calls when you are on a call. Clear the check box to ignore incoming calls when you are already on a call.



**NOTE:** When call waiting is set to ignore incoming calls, routing of the ignored call is determined by your Call forwarding settings.

If PC Sync is not on the microSD card, or if you simply want to ge the latest version, please visit <u>support.dell.com</u>.

#### Installing PC Sync from the microSD card:

- Connect your smartphone to a USB connector on your computer with the USB to mini-USB cable that shipped with your phone.
- 2 In the menu that appears on your screen, tap Mass Storage (USB Mass Storage Mode). Your computer displays the phone memory as Removable disk (X:) in My Computer, where X is the drive letter on your computer. The drive letter on your computer may vary.
- 3 Double-click Removable disk (X:).

4 In the Dell Mini 3 Desktop Suite folder, drag the file to your computer desktop. Doubleclick the installation file and follow the instructions.



**NOTE:** You may be instructed to connect or reconnect the phone to your computer to complete the installation.

# **Connecting the Smartphone**

After installing the PC Sync Tool, connect a USB cable to the mini USB port on the device and to a PC. The PC will detect your device automatically.



**NOTE:** You will be prompted to change the phone USB mode. Select **SYNC MODE** to enable synchronization via USB cable.
