Please read this manual before operating your phone and keep it for future reference.



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Your phone features earSmart<sup>™</sup>, an intelligent voice processor that delivers a clear voice experience, allowing you to *hear and be heard* in nearly any environment. earSmart technology uses the science of human hearing to distinguish sounds, identify your voice, and suppress surrounding noise for clear conversations just about anywhere.

#### How Does It Work?

- The earSmart voice processor in your phone captures your voice and all the sounds around you.
- Working like the human ear, it processes and distinguishes these sounds, isolates your voice conversation, and removes background noise from both
  ends of a call.
- It also automatically equalizes and adjusts voice volume so you can hear and talk naturally, even in the noisiest places.
- With earSmart technology, you can talk where you want, and have clear conversations for mobile calls, video chats, even speakerphone calls, without
  worrying about surrounding noise.

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# **Section 1: Getting Started**

This section reviews how to get started by configuring your hardware, activating your service, and setting up your voice mail.

# **Setting Up Your Phone**

Prior to use, it is necessary to install both the battery and SIM into their corresponding internal compartments.

1. Locate the slot on the side of the cover, use this slot to pull the cover up, and then lift it away from the phone.





#### **Installing the SIM Card**

A Subscriber Identity Module (SIM Card) is a "smartcard" that houses personal information, such as your mobile phone number, calling plan, account information, and content, such as contacts, text messages, and call history.

The Verizon Wireless 4G LTE SIM Card is compatible with any Verizon Wireless 4G LTE certified device. You can move the 4G LTE SIM Card from one device to another and your wireless service will work seamlessly as long as you have a compatible device and service plan. To see which devices are compatible with the Verizon Wireless 4G LTE SIM Card, visit verizonwireless.com/certifieddevice.

Important! The plug-in SIM card information and its contacts can be easily damaged by scratching or bending, so be careful when handling, inserting, or removing the card. Keep all SIM cards out of reach of small children.

 With the battery removed, carefully slide the SIM card into the SIM card socket (as shown) until the card locks into place.

Make sure that the card's gold contacts face into the phone and that the upper-left angled corner of the card is positioned as shown.



Note: If the card is not inserted correctly, the phone will not detect the SIM card. Re-orient the card back into the slot if the SIM is not detected.

#### **Installing the Battery**

- Insert the battery into the opening on the back of the phone, making sure the three metal connectors align (1).
- 2. Gently press down to secure the battery (2).



Replace the battery cover (the back of the phone) by aligning the bottom of the battery cover with the phone as shown. 4. Press the cover down into place.



Press down firmly along the edges of the cover to ensure that the cover is flush with the phone. You should hear a light click as the cover locks in place.



**Note:** Make sure the battery is properly installed before switching on the phone.

# **Charging a Battery**

Your phone is powered by a rechargeable Li-ion battery. The Wall/USB Charger, which is used to charge the battery, is included with your phone. Use only approved batteries and chargers. Long backlight settings, searching for service, vibrate mode, browser use, and other variables may reduce the battery's talk and standby times.

Although you can use the phone while the battery is charging, doing so requires additional charging time.

**Note:** You must fully charge the battery before using your phone for the first time. A discharged battery recharges fully in approximately 4 hours.

#### **Using the Wall/USB Charger**

- 1. Connect the USB cable to the power adapter.
- 2. Plug the power adapter into a standard electrical outlet.
- Connect the small end of the USB cable into the phone's Micro USB Charging Port.



When you connect the charger, your phone powers on automatically. Your Windows phone stays powered on whenever it is charging.

**4.** When charging is finished, remove the flat end from the interface connector jack on the phone.

**Caution!** Failure to unplug the wall charger before you remove the battery can cause damage to the phone.

#### **Low Battery Indicator**

When the battery is weak and only a few minutes of talk time remain, the "Battery critically low" warning appears and the device sounds a warning tone at regular intervals.

For a quick check of your battery level, glance at the battery charge indicator located in the upper-right corner of your device's display. A solid battery icon ( ) indicates a full charge.

When the battery level becomes too low, the phone automatically turns off.

**Note:** If the phone automatically turns off because the battery level is too low, you must charge the battery until the phone turns on automatically.

#### **Memory Card**

Your device supports optional, removable, microSD or microSDHC memory cards (not included) for storage of music, pictures, and other files.

#### **Installing a Memory Card**

- 1. Locate the microSD card slot on the side of the phone.
- 2. Place the card with the gold strips facing down.
- Carefully slide the optional microSD card into the card slot (as shown) until it "clicks" into place.



#### Removing a Memory Card

**Warning!** To prevent damage to data stored on the memory card, unmount the card before removing it from the device.

- From the Home screen, touch ♥ Settings. Under the system menu, touch phone storage → SD card → remove SD card.
- At the prompt, read the warning and select **OK** to continue. Wait for the SD card safe to remove icon to appear in the Status bar and Notification panel.
- **3.** Locate the microSD card slot on the side of the phone.
- **4.** Push the memory card inward to release the lock, and then carefully pull the card out.

#### **Turning your Phone On or Off**

- To turn **ON**, press and hold the Power/Lock button.
- To power OFF, press and hold the Power/Lock button and follow the prompts.

**Note:** The display language is preset to English at the factory. To change the language, use the Language menu. For more information, refer to "Language + Region" on page 106.

# **Locking and Unlocking your Phone**

Prevent accidental key presses by locking your phone.

- To lock, press the **Power/Lock** button.
- To unlock, press the Power/Lock button. Then swipe your finger up the screen.

Note: Your phone is able to make emergency calls without being set up or having a SIM card installed, if your mobile operator allows. To place an emergency call, touch emergency call and dial 911 or the appropriate emergency phone number.

#### **Using the Start-Up Wizard**

The very first time you turn on your phone, the Start-up Wizard screen will guide you through the basics of setting up your device.

Follow the prompts to choose a default language, country/region and time zone, date and time, Wi-Fi network.

 To get apps, play games, automatically sync Windows Live information to the web, and more, you need a Microsoft account. If you already have an Xbox LIVE, Hotmail, or Windows ID, you already have a Microsoft account.

The Start-up Wizard will prompt you to sign in with your existing Microsoft account, or to create a new one.

Note: If you choose Sign in later, you can postpone setting up your Microsoft account. A Microsoft account required screen displays when you try to use a feature that requires that you be signed in.

 You can also set up Backup Assistant Plus, a free service from Verizon Wireless that automatically backs up your contacts. Visit verizonwireless.com/baplus to learn more.

# **Setting Up Your Voice Mail**

- 1. From the Home screen, touch .
- 2. Dial \*86 and touch Call, or touch ( voicemail.
- 3. If you hear a greeting, press # to interrupt, and follow the setup tutorial.

Note: These steps may be different depending on your cellular network.

#### **Accessing Your Voice Mail**

- 1. From the Home screen, touch 🕻 .
- 2. Dial \*86 and touch Call, or touch ( voicemail.
- When you hear the greeting, press # to interrupt, and follow the prompts.

#### **Accessing Your Voice Mail from Another Phone**

- 1. Dial your wireless phone number.
- 2. When you hear the greeting, press the # to interrupt, and follow the prompts.

Important! Voice mailboxes not set up within 45 days will be canceled. Your voice mailbox is not password protected until you create a password by following the setup tutorial.

#### Visual Voice Mail

View a list of messages without dialing into a mailbox. Listen or erase with the touch of a button.

Note: Data charges apply when using Visual Voice Mail.

# **Phone Updates**

Updating your phone can make it work better and add new features. Updates can also make your phone more secure.

# **Section 2: Understanding Your Phone**

This section outlines some key features of your phone and describes the screen and the icons that appear when the phone is in use. It also shows how to navigate through the phone.

#### **Front View**

The following items can be found on the front of your phone.

- 1. Earpiece: Use to hear the caller.
- 2. Proximity and light sensors: The Proximity sensor detects how close an object is to the surface of the screen (such as when your face is against the phone during a call or the phone is in your pocket), locks the keys to prevent accidental key presses, and turns off the screen. Light sensors use the ambient light level to adjust screen brightness and contrast.
- Front-facing camera: Use to photograph yourself, or view yourself while video chatting.



- 4. Indicator icons: Shows the information needed to operate your phone, such as the received signal strength, phone battery level, and time. If the icons are not showing, touch the top of the display to show them.
- Display: Shows the information needed to operate your phone, such as the Application Tiles, icons, and so on.
- Back: Use to step backwards when navigating a menu or web page. Touch and hold the Back key to view the current screen and up to six screens most recently displayed.

- Home: Access the Home screen from any screen.Touch and hold to activate the voice search engine.
- 8. Bing search: Access the Bing search engine, which allows you to search for items on the internet, scout, music, vision, and voice. For more information, refer to "Bing Search" on page 18.

**Note:** Some applications, such as People and Store, display a search button (2) that allows you to search within that application.

#### **Back, Top, and Bottom View**

The following items can be found on the back, the top, and the bottom of your phone.



- IR transmitter: Used to emit infrared signals used for controlling external devices.
- 2. 3.5mm headset jack: Plug in for accessories.
- Power/Lock: Press and hold the Power/Lock button until the phone switches on. Also be use to lock or unlock the touch screen. For more information on locking your phone, see "Locking and Unlocking your Phone" on page 20.
- 4. Flash: Use when taking photos or recording videos.
- USB/charging port: Use to connect a charger or other optional accessories such as a USB/data cable.
- Microphone: Allows callers to hear you when you are speaking to them. Also allows you to use the voice search engine.
- **7. External speaker**: Allows you to hear when the Speakerphone is turned on.

- 8. Volume: Adjust the ringer volume while in standby mode or adjust the voice volume during a call. When receiving an incoming call, briefly press down either volume key to mute the ring tone. Also use to adjust the volume while playing music or videos, press the volume key to display additional controls.
- Rear-facing camera: Use to take pictures and record videos.

#### **Display Layout**

Your display screen provides a wealth of information about the phone's status and options, as well as providing access to application icons. For more information, refer to "Front View" on page 13.

#### **Indicator Icons**

This list identifies the symbols that appear on your phone's display and Indicator area:

Note: Touch the top of the screen to display hidden icons.



Displays your current signal strength. The greater the number of bars, the stronger the signal.




Displays when there is no SIM card in the phone.



Displays when the SIM card is locked.



Displays your battery charge level. Icon shown is fully charged.



Battery critically low, which means your battery needs to be charged soon or your phone will turn off.

Displays when battery saver is on.

Displays when battery power or the state of the battery is not currently known.

Displays when your connection to an EDGE network is active.

G Displays when your connection to an GPRS network is active.

E Displays when your connection to a HSDPA/HSUPA network is active.

**1X** Displays when your connection to a RTT network is active.

**DO** Displays when your connection to an EVDO network is active.

Displays when your connection to an EVDV network is active.

3G Displays when your connection to a UMTS network is active.

**4G** Displays when your connection to a 4G network is active.

LTE Displays when your connection to a 4G LTE network is active.

Displays when the ringtone is set to vibrate only.

Displays when the ringtone is set silent.

Displays when Bluetooth is activated and your phone has been connected with a Bluetooth device.



Displays when Bluetooth is activated, but your phone has not connected with a Bluetooth device.



Displays when Wi-Fi is connected, active, and communicating with a Wireless Access Point (WAP).



Displays when Wi-Fi is connected, active, and communicating with a Wireless Access Point (WAP).



Displays when Wi-Fi is active, but there is a communication issue with the target Wireless Access Point (WAP).



Indicates that Airplane Mode is active. You cannot send or receive any calls or access online information.

#### Bing Search

Bing Search provides an onscreen Internet search engine. It also lets you link to Local Scout, listens to music and searches for it, scans text that can be used as a search term, and lets you say a search term.

**Tip:** Some applications, such as People and Store, display a search button that allows you to search within that application.

- 1. From any screen, touch 🙇.
- 2. Touch the Bing Search bar.
- Use the onscreen keyboard to enter the item you want to search for.
- Touch → to see search results and then touch on a link.
- 5. Touch music to launch a Bing audio search, causing the phone to start listening for nearby music. If the recorded sample can be found in the Windows Phone Store, the artist and song appears in a pop-up window with a direct link to the Windows Phone Store, which lets you purchase and download the song.

- Touch **⊚** vision to scan barcodes, QR Codes, Microsoft Tags, book covers, CDs, DVDs, or text.
- Touch voice (in the search bar) to use Voice Search. Speak the word you want to search for, and then follow the onscreen instructions.
- **8.** Touch ••• **Options** to access the following options:
  - Music history: After touching music and searching for music, your matches are saved here for future reference.
  - Settings: Opens the Search settings screen. For more information, refer to "Search" on page 120.

# **Speech Engine**

There is an intuitive speech engine integrated into the Start key on your phone.

From any screen, touch and hold to activate the intuitive speech engine.

**2.** Speak the words that you would like to search on or the action that you would like to perform.

The following examples show the flexibility of the speech engine:

- · "Call Chris mobile"
- · "Find coffee in Seattle"
- "Open calendar"
- "Text Brandy"
- "Note send birthday card"
- **3.** To change speech settings, see "Speech" on page 107.

Note: The first time you use the Speech engine, you are asked to allow Microsoft to use your voice data to provide and improve the service, which makes additional features available to you. Touch accept or decline. Touch Privacy Statement for more information.

#### **Menu Navigation**

You can tailor the phone's range of functions to fit your needs using menus. Menus, sub-menus, and features can be accessed by scrolling through onscreen menus.

#### **Locking and Unlocking your Phone**

To unlock your phone:

- Press the Power/Lock button located on the upper right side of your phone. The lock screen displays.
- 2. Swipe the lock screen in an upward direction.
- 3. The Home screen displays as shown.

#### **Home Screen Overview**

The Home screen is the starting point for many applications and functions, and you can pin items like application icons, shortcuts, contacts, and web pages to your Home screen to give you instant access to information and applications. The Home screen is accessible from any menu or application by pressing  $\blacksquare$ .

#### **Navigating to the Application Menu**

- 1. At the Home screen, swipe the screen to the left.
- 2. The Application Menu displays.
- 3. Touch one of the application icons to launch the app.
- **4.** Swipe the screen up or down to access all of the available application icons.
- To return to the Home screen, swipe the display to the right.

#### **Navigating Using Sub-Menus**

Sub-menus are available when you are at any screen such as Phone, People, Messaging, or Internet and ••• Options displays at the bottom of the screen.

- Touch ••• Options on the bottom right corner of your display. A sub-menu appears at the bottom of the screen.
- Touch an option. The following example shows the call history screen before and after touching • • • Options.

#### **Customizing Your Home Screen**

You can customize your Home screen by doing the following:

- Adding and removing application tiles on the Home screen
- Repositioning application tiles
- Changing the background

#### Adding a Tile from the Applications Menu

- 1. At the Home screen, swipe the screen to the left. The Application menu displays.
- 2. Touch and hold an application.
- Touch pin to start after it displays under the icon.
   The application now appears as the bottom Tile on the Home screen. You can then move it if you would like.

#### Removing a Tile from the Home Screen

To delete an Application Tile from your Home screen, follow these steps:

- From the Home screen, touch and hold the Application Tile that you want to remove.
- 2. Touch **(\*) unpin** to delete the Tile.

**Tip:** After deleting any Application Tile, you can add it back later by pinning it to the home screen from the Applications Menu. For more information, refer to "Adding a Tile from the Applications Menu" on page 21.

#### **Moving Tiles On the Home Screen**

To move an Application Tile on your Home screen, follow these steps:

- From the Home screen, touch and hold the Application Tile that you want to move.
- **2.** Drag the Tile to the new location and release.
- Touch the center of the icon to place it in the new location.
  - Be careful not to touch wunpin. If you do, the Tile will be deleted.

#### **Resizing Tiles On the Home Screen**

Tiles may be displayed as small, medium, or large tiles.To resize an Application Tile on your Home screen, follow these steps:

- From the Home screen, touch and hold the Application Tile that you want to resize.
- 2. Touch ( , e , or ( ) to toggle between small, medium, and large.

Note: Not all tiles may be resized as small, medium, or large.

#### **Changing the Lock Screen Background**

You can change the background of your Lock screen by following these steps:

- From the Home screen, swipe the screen to the left to display the Application Menu, and then touch
   Settings.
- 2. Under the system menu, touch lock screen.

- 3. Touch the **Background** field to choose an image location:
  - photo: Sets a photo as the Lock screen background.
     Touch the change photo field to select a photo from your photo albums. Slide the photo within the window to crop it, and then touch to save.
  - Bing: Randomly sets professional Bing images as the Lock screen background.
  - Live Wallpaper: Sets Live Wallpapers as the Lock screen background. Touch the open app field to launch Live Wallpaper.
  - Photo Editor: Edit the background image with Photo Editor. Touch the open app field to launch Photo Editor.
- Touch the Power/Lock button twice to view the new Lock screen background.

#### **Changing the Color Theme**

You can change the color theme of your phone by following these steps:

- From the Home screen, swipe the screen to the left to display the Application Menu, and then touch
  - Settings.
- 2. Under the system menu, touch theme.
- 3. Touch the Background field.
- 4. Touch on dark or light to set your background color.
- 5. Touch the Accent color field.
- 6. Touch on a color that you like.
- 7. Press I to return to the Home screen.

**Note:** Battery power is consumed at a faster rate when the background is set as **light**.

# **Section 3: Entering Text**

This section describes how to select the desired text input method when entering characters into your phone.

This section also describes the predictive text entry system that reduces the amount of key strokes associated with entering text.

Note: Your phone comes equipped with an orientation detector that can tell if the phone is being held in a portrait (upright) or landscape (sideways) orientation. The landscape orientation makes entering text easier. If the phone is sideways or upright, an onscreen, QWERTY keyboard displays.

#### **Keys**

You can enter characters into your phone by using an onscreen, QWERTY, portrait or landscape keyboard. In both formats, the keys are associated with alphabetic letters, special characters, or numbers, as shown in the following layouts.

 From a screen where you can enter text, such as the New Message screen, hold your phone in an upright position to display the portrait version of the onscreen QWERTY keyboard.



 Rotate your phone counterclockwise to display the landscape version of the onscreen QWERTY keyboard.



Based on your keyboard settings, the first letter of an entry is capitalized and all consecutive letters are kept in lowercase unless you touch the Shift key or enter a period. After entering a character, the cursor automatically advances to the next space. For more information, refer to "Keyboard" on page 105.

 For certain fields, such as the New Message To field, a dialer keyboard displays when you touch the 123 key to enter a recipient's phone number. For more information, refer to "Messaging" on page 45.



# **Using the QWERTY Keyboard**

Your phone offers the convenience of an onscreen QWERTY keyboard. Using the QWERTY keyboard to type letters, numbers, punctuation, and other special characters into text entry fields or other applications should be simple and fast.

# **Changing the Text Input Mode**

There are three main keyboard layout keys that change the onscreen keys within the QWERTY keyboard.

The available Text Input modes are:



**Symbol and Number Mode**: Activates the symbol and number keys.



**Alphabetic Mode**: Activates the default alphabet keys. Switch between uppercase and lowercase by touching the **Shift key**.



**Emoticons**: Activates the Emoticon keys.

Note: When in abcd mode, the &123 key appears. When in &123 mode, the abcd key appears.

# **Using Alphabetic Mode**

- Whenever you enter text (while creating a message, an email, and so on), if desired, rotate your phone counterclockwise to a landscape orientation.
- 2. A screen similar to the following displays:



The Text Input mode is initially set to **abcd** mode.

Touch the desired alphabetic characters. After typing the first letter, the following letters are lowercase. 4. Touch \( \bar{\chi}\) to input another uppercase letter. Touch \( \bar{\chi}\) twice to switch to caps lock mode and the shift key changes to \( \bar{\chi}\). All following letters are uppercase until you touch the shift key again.

#### **Using Symbol and Numeric Mode**

Use Symbol and Numeric mode to add numbers and symbols.

 Touch 6123 at the bottom of the screen. The following screen displays:



- 2. Touch the desired number and symbol characters.
- 3. Touch either → or ← to cycle through additional symbol pages.
- 4. Touch abcd to return to Alphabetic mode.

# **Using Emoticon Mode**

Use Emoticon mode to add combinations of characters to your text input.

 Touch at the bottom of the screen. The following screen displays:



Note: Emoticons are not available for some input fields.

- **2.** Touch a category at the bottom of the screen, and then swipe up or down to display more Emoticons.
- **3.** After all characters have been selected, touch etc return to Alphabetic mode.

#### **Using Text Suggestions**

Based on your keyboard settings, your phone suggests alternatives to what you are typing including correct spelling of words similar to what you are entering. For more information, refer to "Keyboard" on page 105.

- 1. Touch a text input field.
- 2. Begin typing a word. A list of word options displays.



- 3. Touch one of the words to replace the word that has already been typed or swipe across the list of words for more word suggestions. If you replace the word, a space is entered after the word and the cursor automatically advances to the next space.
- **4.** Continue typing. When finished, touch **⑤ send**. For more information, refer to "*Messaging*" on page 45.

#### **Keyboard Settings**

You can customize the way your phone handles certain functions while you enter text. You can also remove all the words you have added to your suggestion list.

For more information, refer to "Keyboard" on page 105.

# **Copy and Paste**

Windows Phone 8 supports copy and paste. You can copy text from most locations on the phone and paste it in most places you can type.

#### Copy

There are two copy and paste methods: **Highlight option** and **Menu Option**.

#### **Highlight Option**

Some locations enable you to copy a specific text string by highlighting it.

To copy text that supports the Highlight option:

- Touch and briefly hold the text you want to copy to highlight it.
- Drag the arrows at each end of the highlighted text until only the text you want to copy is highlighted.
- 3. Touch **(b)** copy that displays near the highlighted text.

The following locations support the Highlight option:

- Web pages in the browser.
- Bodies of email messages.
- Office documents.
- Editable fields in native applications.

#### **Menu Option**

Some locations enable you to copy an entire section of text by using a menu option.

To copy text that supports the menu option:

- Touch and hold the text or link you want to copy until a menu appears.
- Touch copy or copy link.

The following locations support this option:

- · Headings of email messages.
- · Directions in maps.
- Links in the browser.
- Information in contact cards and social networking profiles in the People hub.
- Messages you have sent or received.
- Details pages for local search results.

#### **Paste**

To paste text that you have copied:

- 1. Touch where you want to paste the text.
- Touch (6) paste in the text suggestion bar above the keyboard.

After you paste the text, the paste icon disappears. However, you can paste the copied text again by panning from left to right in the text suggestion bar to bring back the paste icon.

You can paste text in editable fields in native applications, including password fields.

#### **Section 4: Call Functions**

This section describes how to make or answer a call. It also includes the features and functionality associated with making or answering a call. For more information on call settings, see "Phone" on page 118.

#### **Making a Call**

- 2. Touch call to make the call.

#### Making an International Call

- Use the onscreen keypad to enter the country code, area code, and phone number.
   If you make a mistake, touch until the desired numbers have been deleted.
- 3. Touch call to make the call.

#### **Correcting an Entered Number**

After entering a number using the keypad, use the following steps to correct a mis-typed entry when dialing.

- If you make a mistake, touch 
   \subseteq to erase a single character
- 2. Touch and hold **x** to erase the entire string of numbers.

#### **Ending a Call**

■ Touch end call.

#### **Dialing a Recent Number**

All incoming, outgoing, and missed calls are recorded in the **history**. If the number or caller is listed in your People, the associated name is also displayed.

- **1.** From the Home screen, touch ... The **history** screen displays.
- Touch an entry to enter the contact's detail page, and then touch call number or text.

## **Making a Call from People**

You can store phone numbers that you use regularly in the phone's memory. These entries are collectively called **People**.

For further details about the **People** feature, see "Dialing or Messaging from People" on page 39.

# **Answering a Call**

When a call is received, the phone rings and displays the caller's phone number and name if stored in People.

At the incoming call screen:

- Touch answer to answer the call and touch end call to end the call.
  - or -

Touch ignore to send the call to your voicemail.

## **History**

The phone stores the numbers of the calls you have dialed, received, or missed in the history. The history displays the details of the call.

From the **Home** screen, touch 📞

The history screen displays. If the number or caller is listed in your People, the associated name displays.

All calls made, received, and missed are listed. Types of calls are identified on the history screen as Incoming, Outgoing, or Missed.



#### **Calling Back a Missed Call**

To call back a missed call number:

- From the Home screen, touch .
   The history screen displays a list of recent calls. If the number or caller is listed in your People, the associated name displays.
- 2. Touch ( call to call the displayed number.

## Saving a Recent Call to People

- From the Home screen, touch .
   The history screen displays a list of recent calls.
- **2.** Touch the call you want to save to your People. The profile screen displays.
- Touch save.
   The CHOOSE A CONTACT screen displays.

- 4. Touch new to add the caller as a new contact or touch an existing contact to edit manually. The EDIT PHONE NUMBER screen displays. The Phone number and Phone number type fields are automatically filled in with the information of the recent call.
- Touch the Phone number or the Phone number type field and use the keypad to edit, if necessary.
- When finished, touch ( save. The NEW MICROSOFT ACCOUNT CONTACT screen displays with the Phone number already added.
- **7.** Touch the other fields to add name, other phone numbers, email, ringtone, and other information.
- 8. Touch 🗐 save.

For further details about the People feature, see "Adding a New Contact" on page 36.

#### Sending a Message to a Recent Call

- From the Home screen, touch .
   The history screen displays a list of recent calls.
- Touch the call entry to which you want to send a message.

The call detail page displays.

- 3. Touch text.
- Use the keyboard to type in a message.
- 5. When you are done with your message, touch send.

For more information, refer to "Creating and Sending Text Messages" on page 46.

## **Deleting a Call from History**

- From the Home screen, touch .
   The history screen displays a list of recent calls.
- 2. Touch and hold the call you want to delete from the call log.
- 3. Touch delete item.

The call is deleted from the call history.

## **Options During a Call**

Your phone provides a number of control options that you can use during a call.

#### **Adjusting the Call Volume**

During a call, to adjust the earpiece volume, use the **Volume** buttons on the left side of the phone.

 Press the Up volume button to increase the volume level and press the Down volume button to decrease the volume level.

From the Home screen, you can also adjust the ringer volume using these same buttons.

#### **In-Call Options**

During an active call, there are several options available by touching a corresponding onscreen button.

- end call: Terminates the call.
- dialer :: Displays the onscreen keypad, where you can enter a number using DTMF (Dual Tone Multi-Frequency).
- speaker: Routes the phone's audio through either the speaker or through the earpiece. Touch speaker to turn on the speakerphone. Touch again to turn it off.
- mute: Turn the onboard microphone either on or off. Touch to mute your phone during a call. Touch again to unmute.
- flash: When a second call is received, touch flash to place your current call on hold and answer the incoming call.
   Touch flash again to place the incoming call on hold, and return to the previous call. (Your cellular plan must include call-waiting to use this feature.)
- bluetooth: This option appears if a Bluetooth device is active.
   Touch to activate the Bluetooth device.
- add call: Allows you to add another call to your present conversation. For more information, refer to "3-Way (Multi-Party) Calling" on page 35.

#### Making a New Call During a Call in Progress

- Touch add call.
   The history screen displays.
- 2. Select a number from your recent calls, or touch **keypad** (iii) to dial a number.

You can also touch **people** (18) to enter a number from your People. Enter the number to add and touch **call**.

Once connected, the active call appears on the call screen and the call on hold appears in a box at the top of the display.

#### **Switching Between Calls**

When you have an active call and a call on hold, you may switch between the two calls, changing the one on hold to active and placing the other on hold.

- Touch the bar at the top of your display to swap between the two calls.
  - The current call (caller #2) is placed on hold and the previous call on hold (caller #1) is then reactivated so that you can continue conversing with that person. The active call appears on the call screen.
- Touch the bar at the top of your display again to swap back.
- Touch end call to end the currently active call. The call on hold is then reconnected.

## **Answering a Call During a Call in Progress**

- There are several options available when a call is received when you have a call in progress. Touch one of the following:
  - answer: Allows you to answer the incoming call and put the first call on hold.
  - ignore: Sends the new call to your voicemail. The first call stays connected.
- If you selected answer, touch the bar at the top of your display to swap between the two calls.

## 3-Way (Multi-Party) Calling

The 3-Way or Multi-Party feature allows you to make or answer a series of incoming calls and place them on hold. If this service is supported by the network, all calls can be joined together.

- While connected to two different callers (one is on hold), touch merge calls.
  - The three calls are conferenced together and are displayed on the Conference screen.
- 2. Touch end call to end the conference call.

# **Section 5: Your People Hub**

This section allows you to manage your daily contacts by storing their name, number, email, and other information in your phone using the People feature.

## **Importing SIM Contacts to Your Phone**

You can import all contacts from your SIM card to your phone.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- Touch • • Options → settings.
- Touch import SIM contacts.
   The phone then copies all contacts from your SIM card to your phone.

Note: The import SIM contacts option is only available if there are contacts stored on the SIM card.

## **Adding a New Contact**

Use the following procedure to store a new contact to your People.

- From the Home screen, touch People.
- 2. From the all screen, touch (+).
- 3. The CREATE CONTACT IN screen displays.
- 4. Select an account to store the contact.
- 5. Touch the add photo icon and assign a picture to the new entry. Select a picture from your photos or touch the a icon to take a new picture with your camera. Touch when you have made a selection.
- 6. Enter contact information:
  - Touch name then touch the First name and Last
    name fields and use the onscreen keyboard to enter
    names for each entry. You can also scroll down to enter
    additional information. For more information, refer to
    "Entering Text" on page 24. Touch ( save to save
    your entry.

- Touch **phone** then touch the **Phone number** field. The numerical keypad displays. Enter a number.
- Touch the Phone number type field and select a number type. Touch save to save your input.
- Touch **email** then touch the **Email address** field and use the onscreen keyboard to enter an email address.
- Touch the Email address type field and select an email type. Touch ( save to save your input.
- Touch ringtone and select a ringtone from the displayed list.
- Touch **text tone** and select a text tone from the displayed list.
- Touch other then select any fields that you would like to add to the contact.
- 7. Touch ( save to save the contact information.

## **Editing an Existing Contact**

When editing an existing contact, you can touch a field and change or delete the information, or you can add additional fields to the contact's list of information.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- 2. Swipe to the **all** screen, and then touch the contact that you want to edit.
- 3. At the contact profile screen, touch ( ) edit.
- **4.** Touch the fields that you want to edit and then use the keyboard to make any changes.
- **5.** Touch **( ) save** to save the edited information.

## **Deleting Contacts**

You can delete contacts from your phone's memory. To delete any People entry:

- **1.** From the Home screen, touch **People**.
- **2.** Swipe to the **all** screen, and then touch and hold a contact that you want to delete.
- 3. Touch **delete** on the displayed list.
- 4. If there are linked profiles for the contact, the CHOOSE A PROFILE TO DELETE screen displays. Touch the profile that you want to delete.
- 5. At the Delete contact? prompt, touch delete.

# **Creating a New Group**

The Group function makes it possible to make individually named groups of people you care about, such as family, friends, coworkers, or social media friends. Once you create a group, you can pin it to your home screen and it becomes a live tile. Notifications appear as new posts, comments, or pictures are added to this group.

Use the following procedure to create a new group of your contacts.

- **1.** From the Home screen, touch **People**.
- 2. Swipe to the together menu, and then touch +.
- 3. Touch Group.
- **4.** Enter a group name. Touch **(R)** save to save.
- 5. Touch  $\bigoplus$  to add members to the group.
- The CHOOSE A CONTACT screen displays. Scroll through your contacts and touch a contact to add it to the group.
- Repeat Steps 5 and 6 until you have added all group members.
- 8. Touch an entry in the list of group members to change that person's preferred phone number or email address or to remove the entry from the group. Touch done to save the edited information.

## **Group Options**

Once you have created a group, there are several options available for editing, deleting, and so on.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- Swipe to the together menu, and then scroll down and touch the group that you want to display. The group screen displays.
- Touch text to send a text message to all members of the group.
- Touch send email to send an email message to all members of the group.
- 5. Touch (\*) pin to pin the group to the home screen.
- 6. Touch edit group to display the EDIT GROUP screen. Touch to add more members to the group. Touch an entry in the list of group members to change that person's preferred phone number or email address or to remove the entry from the group. For more information, refer to "Deleting Contacts" on page 38.
- 7. Touch  $\bullet \bullet \bullet$  Options  $\rightarrow$  rename to rename the group.
- Touch • Options → delete to delete the group.

**Note:** Deleting a group does not delete the contacts.

## **Using Your People List**

#### Dialing or Messaging from People

Once you have stored phone numbers in your People, you can dial or message them quickly and easily.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- Swipe to the all screen, and then touch any letter (on the left side of the display) to highlight all of the letters for which you have contacts.

Touch a letter to quickly jump to the contacts beginning with that letter.



- 4. Touch the contact you want to call or message.
- Touch call mobile to make a phone call or text to send a message.

For more information, refer to "Creating and Sending Text Messages" on page 46.

## **Searching for People**

You can also find a contact in your People list by using the Search option.

- **1.** From the Home screen, touch **People**.
- Swipe to the all screen, and touch (2) search.
   The search screen displays with a listing of all your contacts' names.
- Use the onscreen keyboard to type the beginning letters of the contact's name that you are trying to find.
   The list displays names that begin with the letters you have typed.
- **4.** Touch a name in the list to display the contact's profile.

## **Linking People**

#### **Linking People Information**

Many people now maintain multiple email accounts, social networking logins, and other similar account information. For example, a Facebook account login name might differ from a corporate email account login because they are maintained separately and for different groups of people.

This device can synchronize with multiple accounts such as Windows Live, Outlook, Google, Facebook, Twitter, and Linkedln. When you synchronize your phone with these accounts, each account creates a separate contact entry in the People list.

If one of your contacts (Amy Smith, for example) has a regular email account that you maintain in Hotmail, but also has a Facebook account under her maiden and married name, as well as a Google account, when you merge these accounts into your Contacts list you can link all of her entries and view the information in one record.

The next time you synchronize your phone with your accounts, any updates that contacts make to email account names, email addresses, and so on, automatically update in your People list.

For more information about synchronizing accounts, see "Synchronizing Accounts" on page 42.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- Touch a contact name (the name you want to link to another entry). Typically, this is the same contact with a different name or account information.
- **3.** Touch **∞**.
- 4. Touch choose a contact.
- Touch the second contact entry (the entry in which to link). The second contact is now linked with the first and the account information is merged into one screen.

**Note:** The information is maintained in the first entry that you selected.

6. Touch the linked contacts to view the contact information you linked. The contacts and information displays with a label next to the contact name to indicate what type of account information is contained in the entry.

#### **Unlinking People**

- **1.** From the Home screen, touch **People**.
- 2. Touch a contact name (the account name from which you want to unlink an entry).
- Touch (2). A number displays over the link symbol showing how many contacts are linked to this contact.
   The names of all the contacts that are linked are displayed.
- **4.** Touch the contact you want to unlink.
- At the prompt, touch unlink. The contact is now "unlinked" and no longer displays in the merged record screen.

## **Synchronizing Accounts**

From the Accounts menu you decide if you want applications to synchronize, send, and receive data at any given time, or if you want the applications to synchronize automatically.

After determining how you want the accounts to synchronize, indicate which account to synchronize with your People list.

To set up an account, follow these steps:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- Swipe to the what's new screen, and then touch set up account.
- Touch an account type to add. Select Outlook, Microsoft Account (Hotmail, Xbox, Messenger, Windows), Outlook, Backup Assistant Plus, Google, Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, or advanced setup (used for accounts that use Exchange ActiveSync).
- Follow the onscreen instructions.
   The selected account type synchronizes with your Contacts list.

#### What's New

Synchronized accounts display information on the **what's new** screen. For example, if you add your Facebook account, you can see what your contacts are posting.

#### **Importing Facebook Contacts**

When you add your Facebook account, your profile picture displays at the top of your People list. Touch the picture to go to your Facebook profile. Your phone also imports all of your Facebook contacts and creates a profile for each contact or adds information to existing profiles.

You can limit imported Facebook contact information to the existing contacts already on your phone. For more information, refer to "People" on page 117.

## **People Options**

You can access several options while viewing the details page for a specific entry.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch People.
- **2.** Touch a specific contact entry.
- 3. Touch one of the following options:
  - **pin**: Touch the pin icon to pin this contact to your Home screen.
  - link: Touch the link icon to link several contacts together. For more information, refer to "Linking People" on page 41.
    - edit: Touch the edit icon to make changes to the contact's information.
    - • share contact: Touch the options icon, and then touch share contact. Touch share to send a contact's in formation via Tap + Send, Messaging, or an email account.

**delete**: Touch the options icon and then touch **delete** to delete the contact from your People list.

## **Additional People Options**

Depending on your settings, additional information from accounts such as Facebook, Twitter, or LinkedIn displays on the profile pages of your contacts.

- From your People list, touch a contact entry.
   Depending on the information available on your
   accounts, phone numbers, home addresses, company
   names, email addresses, birthdays, and so on, are
   displayed. There is also a write on wall option and a
   send email option.
- Swipe the screen to the left on any contact profile to the what's new screen for that contact. Posts for the contact are displayed. Scroll down the posts to display additional posts.

Swipe the screen to the left on any contact profile to the history screen for that contact. Recent activity from that contact is displayed. Scroll down the posts to display additional posts.

Use the **filter my contact list** option to limit additional information from accounts such as Facebook, Twitter, or LinkedIn from displaying on the profile pages of your existing contacts. For more information, refer to "People" on page 117.

#### **Recent Activities**

From the **recent** screen, you can see the contacts that you viewed last.

- **1.** From the Home screen, touch **People**.
- If necessary, swipe your screen to the left or right to display the recent screen.
- 3. Touch a contact to see their profile.

# **Section 6: Messaging**

This section describes how to send and receive different types of messages. It also includes the features and functionality associated with messaging.

## **Types of Messages**

Your phone provides the following message types:

- Text Messages
- Multimedia (Picture) Messages
- · Email Messages
- · Online Messages

The Short Message Service (SMS) lets you send and receive text messages to and from other mobile phones or email addresses. To use this feature, you may need to subscribe to your service provider's message service.

Important! When creating a message, adding an image to a text message changes the message from a text message to a multimedia message.

When messages are received, the number of messages displays in the Messaging icon 22 on the Home screen.

# **Creating and Sending Text Messages**

To create a new message and send it to another mobile phone or an email address:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Wessaging.
- 2. Touch Touch new.
- Touch the To field to manually enter a recipient. Touch the 123 key on the onscreen keypad to enter a phone number.

- or -

Touch the  $\bigoplus$  button to the right of the **To** field to select a recipient from your People list. Valid entries must have a wireless phone number. Contacts with only an email address are not listed.

**4.** Touch the ① button to add additional recipients from your People list. Each contact is placed in the **To** field separated by a semicolon (;).

- or -

Add more recipients by touching the recipient field.

**Note:** Each additional recipient entry must be separated by a semicolon (;).

- To remove recipients, touch the entry in the To field then touch remove. You can also open the contact's profile or copy the contact.
- Touch the type a message box and enter your message. For more information, refer to "Entering Text" on page 24.
- 7. Review your message and touch send.

**Note:** If you exit a message before you send it, the message is saved as a draft.

## **Voice to Text Messages**

To create a new message using your voice:

- Create a new message and add recipients in the To field. For more information, refer to "Creating and Sending Text Messages" on page 46.
- Touch (\*) speak and say your message when go is displayed. When you stop speaking, your words are displayed.
- To repeat the message, touch (1) speak. The original message is deleted and the new message is displayed.
- **4.** Once your spoken message is correct, touch send.

# Creating and Sending Multimedia Messages

A multimedia message is a message that contains a picture attachment. To create a multimedia message and send it to another mobile phone or an email address:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Messaging.
- 2. Touch (+) new.
- 3. Touch the **To** field or touch the ① button to the right of the **To** field to enter a recipient.

For more information, refer to "Creating and Sending Text Messages" on page 46.

- Touch the type a text message box and use the onscreen keyboard to type your message. For more information, refer to "Entering Text" on page 24.
- 5. Touch (1) attach to add a picture, video, your current location, a voice note, or a contact to the message.
- To remove an attachment, touch and hold the attachment, then touch remove from the pop-up menu.
- **7.** Review your message and touch send.

## **Messaging Conversations**

Any messages you have sent or received can be viewed in the Messaging **threads** list.

Sent and received text, picture, and online messages are grouped into message threads. Threaded messages allow you to see all the messages exchanged (similar to a chat program) and displays a contact on the screen. Message threads are listed in the order in which they were received, with the latest message displayed at the bottom.

# **Displaying a Messaging Conversation**

To view a conversation in the Messaging threads list:

From the Home screen, touch Messaging → threads.

The Messaging threads list displays any messages you have sent or received.

All messages to or from another phone or email address are grouped in one conversation.

Entries in the Messaging threads list contain the recipient's phone number, contact name, or email address, the time that the last message was received or sent, and the first words of the last message.

An entry for conversations with multiple recipients starts by indicating the number of recipients (such as **3 recipients**) and then the recipients are listed.

- Touch the type a text message and use the onscreen keyboard to type a reply message to the recipient. For more information, refer to "Entering Text" on page 24.

#### **Viewing a Picture Attachment**

To view a picture attached to a message:

- Touch an entry in the Messaging conversations list.
- **2.** Locate the message box that contains the picture.
- Touch Get media content now to download the attachment. Touch the picture to open Photos and display the picture. Pinch the screen with two fingers to out or stretch the screen outward to zoom in.
- 4. Touch to return to Messaging conversations.

## Viewing a Video Attachment

To view a video attached to a message:

- 1. Touch an entry in the Messaging conversations list.
- 2. Locate the message box that contains the video attachment. The file name is underlined.
- Touch the video file name in the message box.The video player opens and plays the video.
- 4. To pause playback of the video attachment, touch (II).
  - To continue playback of the video attachment, touch (•).
  - To stop playback of the multimedia message, touch —.

#### Listening to an Audio Attachment

To listen to an audio attached to a message:

- 1. Touch an entry in the Messaging conversations list.
- Locate the message box that contains the audio attachment.
- Touch the file name to open the audio player and play the audio file.

## **Deleting a Messaging Conversation**

To delete a Messaging conversation:

- From the Home screen, touch Messaging.
   The Messaging conversations list displays any messages you have sent or received.
- Touch and hold a message in the list, then touch delete.
  - or -

Touch a message in the list, then touch • • • • Options → delete thread.

Touch delete to delete all messages in the selected conversation or touch cancel to return to Messaging conversations.

#### **Deleting a Message**

To delete a message in a Messaging conversation:

- Touch and hold the message box that contains the message you want to delete.
  - The **delete**, **forward**, and **copy** options display.
- 2. Touch delete.

The **Delete message?** screen displays.

Touch delete to delete the message or touch cancel to return to Messaging conversations.

#### Forwarding a Message

To forward a message in a Messaging conversation:

- Touch and hold the message box that contains the message you want to forward. The delete, forward, and copy options display.
- Touch forward. The New Message screen displays with the contents of the selected message included.
- Touch the To field or touch the button to the right of the To field to enter a recipients. For more information, refer to "Creating and Sending Text Messages" on page 46.
- **4.** Touch **send** to forward the message.

#### **Messaging Settings**

To view and change messaging settings:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch [2] Messaging.
- 2. Touch • Options → settings.

The messaging settings screen displays. For more information, refer to "Messaging" on page 115.

## **Message Drafts**

When you exit a message without sending, the message is automatically saved as a draft.

- From the Home screen, touch Messaging.
- Touch • Options → drafts.
  - Touch any message to resume editing. Once the message is sent, it will be removed from drafts.
    - or -

Touch and hold a message until the delete pop-up displays. Touch **delete** in the pop-up to permanently delete the message.

## **Online Messaging**

You can chat with friends online via social networks, such as Facebook. Friends who are currently online are displayed on the online screen.

#### To set your status:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch [2] Messaging.
- 2. Swipe to the **online** screen and touch **(a) status**. The **SET CHAT STATUS** displays.
- 3. Touch one of the following options to set your chat status:
  - available: You are online and available to send and receive chat messages.
  - busy: You are online, but temporarily unavailable.
  - away: You are online, but unavailable for a period of time, such as at lunch.
  - invisible: You are online, but you appear as offline to others.
  - offline: You are offline.

## **Using Email**

Email enables you to review and create email using Outlook, Google, and several other email services. You can also receive text message alerts when you receive an important email.

Note: The options on screens and in menus may vary depending on which email account you have enabled.

#### **Setting Up an Email Account**

To set up an email account:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **Email**.
  - or –

From the Home screen, touch **☑** Email →

- • Options → add email account.
- or -

From the Home screen, touch ❖ Settings. Under the system menu, touch email+accounts →

(+) add an account.

The **ADD AN ACCOUNT** screen displays with the possible email services choices.

Touch an email service, such as Outlook, Hotmail, Backup Assistant Plus, Yahoo! Mail, Google, Facebook, Twitter, and so on.

Touch **other account** to add other types of email accounts.

- 3. Enter your email address in the **Email address** field.
- 4. Enter your password in the Password field.
- 5. Touch sign in.

If your email information is found, your account information is saved.

If Attention required displays, touch the account, correct your user name and Password, and touch save.

#### **Advanced Email Setup**

For some email accounts, such as a corporate account, entering your email address and password may not be enough information. You may need to enter additional information.

**Note:** If you are not sure which option to choose, check with your service provider.

## **Email Account Settings**

Once your email account is set up, you may want to adjust some of your settings.

**Note:** Available options may differ depending upon your email service provider.

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch email + accounts.
- Touch your email account. The Settings for your email account display.
- 3. Touch the field that contains the information you want to change.

The following fields display (depending on the email account):

- Account name: Use this field to change the name that appears on your phone for this account.
- Email address: Displays the email address for this account.

- Download new content: Allows you to set how often you want your phone to download new email for this account. Possible values are: as items arrive, every 15 minutes, every 30 minutes, hourly, and manually. If you choose manually, see "Syncing Your Email Account" on page 54.
- Download email from: Allows you to limit the email downloaded to your phone for this account. Possible values are: the last 3 days, the last 7 days, the last 2 weeks, the last month, and any time.
- Content to sync: Indicates which content to synchronize between your phone and the account, such as, Email, Contacts, Calendar, and so on.
- Your name: This is the name that appears on your messages.
- Incoming email server: Displays the email server name.
- User name: Displays your user name.Password: Displays your password.

• Server: Displays the email server name.

- Outgoing server requires authentication: Access to server requires authentication.
- Use the same user name and password for sending email: Use same login information for both outgoing and incoming email.
- Require SSL for incoming email: Use SSL security for incoming email.
- Require SSL for outgoing email: Use SSL security for outgoing email.

**Note:** Additional fields may display, depending on the account type. Some fields should not be changed without consulting your service provider.

#### **Deleting an Email Account**

To delete email accounts other than Windows Live:

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch email + accounts.
- 2. Touch and hold the email account that you want to delete until the option list pop-up displays.
- 3. Touch **delete** in the pop-up to delete the account.

Note: Microsoft accounts cannot be deleted.

## **Syncing Your Email Account**

In order to view email messages on your phone for any email account, content has to be downloaded to your phone. Syncing is simply downloading content from your email provider and storing it on your phone.

Use the following method if you choose to download new content manually:

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch email + accounts.
- 2. Touch and hold the email account that you want to sync. An option list displays.
- 3. Touch sync.

**Syncing** displays while new content is downloaded.

#### **Linked Inboxes**

Each time you add a new email account, a tile is added to the Home screen with the email name and to the Apps list.

When you add more than one email account, it is possible to link two or more email accounts so you can see all messages from those accounts in one inbox. When email accounts are grouped in this way, one tile is displayed on the Home screen for each linked group instead of the individual email tiles.

#### **Creating Linked Inboxes**

To create linked inboxes:

- From the Home screen, touch Email for one of the email accounts that you want to link and then touch
  - $\bullet \bullet \bullet \to linked inboxes$ . This inbox and other inboxes to which it can be linked are displayed.
- Touch one or more of the other inboxes that you want to link to this inbox.
- Touch rename linked inbox to give the linked inboxes a new name.
- **4.** Touch **Back** ← to exit linked inboxes set up.

#### Unlinking Inboxes

#### To unlink inboxes:

- From the Home screen, touch a linked inbox and then touch ••• → linked inboxes.
- 2. Touch the email account listed under this inbox that you want to unlink.
- Touch unlink to unlink the inboxes. The unlinked email account displays under other inboxes.

## Setting Up a Microsoft Account

When you set up a Microsoft account, you are doing more than just setting up an email account. You can get apps, play Xbox LIVE games, and more.

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch email+accounts →
  - (+) add an account.
- 2. Touch Microsoft account.

The BEFORE YOU SIGN IN... screen displays.

- Read the information, including the Windows Phone Terms of Use, and touch next.
- Touch the Microsoft account field and enter your email address.
- Touch the Password field and enter your password.Touch Show password to display the characters.
- Touch Allow Microsoft to email me information and tips about my Windows Phone to enable this option.
- 7. Touch sign in.
- Follow the instructions to set up your Microsoft account to use SkyDrive(OneDrive), sync your text messages, and back up your phone settings.

## **Section 7: Multimedia**

This section explains how to use the multimedia features of your phone, including Music Player, Video Player, Gallery, Camera, and Camcorder.

#### **Xbox Music Pass**

Xbox Music Pass is a monthly music subscription service giving you unlimited access to millions of songs. Download or stream as many songs as you like and listen to them for as long as your subscription is up to date. On your Windows Phone, the streaming feature requires wireless network access. Carrier fees may apply. For more information, visit xbox.com/music.

**Note:** Before using Xbox Music to buy music, you must set up a free Microsoft Account. For more information, refer to "Setting Up a Microsoft Account" on page 55.

#### Music+Videos

This section explains how to access music, videos, podcasts, and radio on your phone. Navigate the **Music+Video** app as follows:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Music + Videos.
- Swipe left across the screen to view the following menus:
  - collection: Displays media categories such as music, video, and podcasts, as well as a link to the Store app.
  - history: Displays thumbnails that indicate songs or videos you have recently played. Touch the thumbnail to return to replay that song or video.
  - new: Allows you to play music, videos, and podcasts downloaded from your PC, as well as media stored on a memory card. It also gives you access to the music area of the Xbox Music Store.
  - apps: Displays links to other music applications, such as ATIV Beam, Share Box, and Verizon Tones.
  - xbox: Displays featured artists from the Xbox Music Store. Touch a thumbnail to play the song and see more details about the artist from the Xbox Music Store.

#### **Adding New Music and Videos**

To add new music and videos with your Xbox Music Pass:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch 🞧 Music+Videos.
- 2. Swipe left across the screen to view the **new** menu.
- 3. Touch Xbox Music Pass.
- **4.** Sign in with your account information, and follow the online prompts to download new music and videos.

To add new music and videos from your computer:

- From the Home screen, touch Music + Videos.
- 2. Swipe left across the screen to view the **new** menu.
- 3. Touch Connect to your computer to add stuff.
- 4. There are several ways available to transfer music and videos between your phone and computer, such as using the cloud (Internet storage such as OneDrive), using a USB cable, using a Windows phone app, and so on. Select the appropriate set up for your phone, and follow the online instructions to install and use the file transfer software of your choice.

## **Playing Music**

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Music+Videos.
- Swipe left across the screen to view the collection menu.
- Touch music. Songs are organized by artists, albums, songs, playlists, and genres.
- **4.** Touch and hold a song to display the following option:
  - add to now playing: Add the selected song to the list of songs currently playing.
  - play smart dj mix: Play your Smart DJ mix. Smart DJ is a dynamic way to launch instant mixes based on any album, artist, or song in your collection. Using criteria you provide, Smart DJ selects similar songs from your collection and suggests songs from Xbox Music.

    You can also create Smart DJ playlists and sync them to your phone. For more information, visit <a href="xbox.com/">xbox.com/</a>
    music.
  - share: Allows you to share the song with Tap + Send or via an account or connection.

**Note:** Sharing may be restricted for some content due to copyright protection.

- pin to start (albums only): Allows you to add a tile on the Home screen for this album. For more information, refer to "Moving Tiles On the Home Screen" on page 21.
- delete: Delete the song.
- Touch the song that you want to play. Song details such as artist and time information (time played and time remaining) are displayed.
- **6.** The following music controls are available:
  - Pause the music.
  - Start the music after being paused.
  - Touch and hold to rewind the music. Tap twice to play the previous song.
  - Touch and hold to fast-forward the music.

    Touch to play the next song.

# **Playing Videos**

To play videos from the Music+Videos app:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch \( \bigcap \) Music + Videos.
- Swipe left across the screen to view the collection menu.

The **all** videos category displays. Videos that have been downloaded are displayed.

To view your personal videos, see "Viewing Videos" on page 63.

- Touch and hold a video thumbnail to display the following option:
  - pin to start: Allows you to add a tile on the Home screen for this video. For more information, refer to "Moving Tiles On the Home Screen" on page 21.
  - delete: Delete the video.
- 4. Touch the video that you want to play. The video begins to play in landscape mode. At the bottom of the screen, the video file name, the video controls, and the time information (time played and total time) are displayed.

- **5.** The following video controls are available:
  - Pause the video.
  - Start the video after being paused.
  - Touch and hold to rewind the video.
  - Touch and hold to fast-forward the video.
  - Display the video in full screen.
  - Display the video in a reduced format.


Note: If no control icons are displayed on the screen in addition to the picture, touch anywhere on the screen to display them.

6. Touch  $\leftarrow$  to return to the **thumbnails** screen.

#### **Podcasts**

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Music + Videos.
- Swipe left across the screen to view the collection menu.
- Touch podcasts. Podcasts are organized by audio and video.
- A thumbnail, the podcast name, the category, and the date created are displayed for each file.
- 5. Touch and hold a podcast thumbnail to display the following option:
  - pin to start: Allows you to add a tile on the Home screen for this podcast. For more information, refer to "Moving Tiles On the Home Screen" on page 21.
  - delete: Delete the podcast.
- 6. Touch the podcast that you want to play. The podcast begins to play in portrait mode. At the bottom of the screen, the time information (time played and time remaining) and the podcast controls are displayed.

**7.** The following podcast controls are available:



Start the podcast after being paused.

Rewind the podcast.

Fast-forward the podcast.

#### **Store**

To visit the music area of the Store app from **Music + Videos**:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Music + Videos.
- Swipe left or right to view the collection menu, then touch store.
- 3. Touch music. The artist of the week displays.
- 4. Swipe left or right to view more music categories.

#### **Photos**

The Photos application is where you view photos and play back videos. You can set photos as your lock screen background or share them as a picture message. And you can use your camera to scan barcodes, QR Codes, Microsoft Tags, books, CD's, and other DVD's and get more information on these products with your Internet browser.

## **Uploading To SkyDrive(OneDrive)**

Windows Live SkyDrive(OneDrive) provides free storage so you can store photos online, share them with the people you choose, and access them from any web browser. Various options include **share on SkyDrive(OneDrive)** if you have set up a Microsoft account.

For more information about SkyDrive(OneDrive), visit <a href="mailto:onedrive.com">onedrive.com</a> and click on **SkyDrive(OneDrive)**.

#### **Accessing Pictures and Videos**

When you take a photo or shoot a video, the file is saved so you can view your photos and videos at any time. To access photos and videos:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch <a> Photos</a>.
- 2. Photos and videos are displayed depending on which option you choose:
  - camera roll: Thumbnails are displayed for taken photos and videos.
  - albums: Thumbnails are displayed for groups of pictures such as Camera Roll, Screenshots, and so on.
     Other albums are displayed depending on the accounts you have set up such as Microsoft, Facebook, and so on.
  - date: Thumbnails of all photos and videos are displayed in order of month and year created.
  - people: Thumbnails are displayed of all People photos that you have viewed from your accounts, such as Facebook, Twitter, and Linkedln. You can also touch choose contact and touch a contact to load that contact's posted pictures.

- 3. Swipe left across the screen to view the following menus:
  - favorites: Photos added to favorites can set to display on the animated Photos Tile on the Home screen, or may be pinned there for one-tap access.
  - what's new: Displays photos posted by your contacts on your synchronized accounts, such as Facebook, Twitter, and LinkedIn.
  - apps: Get direct access to photo apps such as ATIV Beam, Live Wallpaper, Photo Editor, and Share Box.

#### **Thumbnail Options**

- When viewing groups of thumbnails, additional options may be available. Touch one or more thumbnails. A check mark indicates selection (touch again to deselect).
- Touch Additional options to display the following options:
  - **add to favorites**: Adds the photo(s) to your favorites
  - (iii) delete: Deletes the photo.
  - share: Share the photo(s) via Tap + Send,
     Messaging, an email account, social network, or add
     the photo to OneNote as a Quick Note.
- 3. Touch • Options and select an option.

## **Viewing Pictures**

Once you locate the photo you want to view:

- 1. Touch the thumbnail to view the picture.
- While viewing a photo, touch each side of the photo and pinch inward or stretch outward to zoom in or out.
   or –

Tap the screen twice to zoom in or out.

You can magnify the photo up to 400 percent.

Touch and slide a magnified photo to move the focus to the area you touch.

- Swipe across the screen to the right or left to view more photos and videos.
- 4. Touch and hold a photo or touch ••• Options to display the following options:
  - share...: Share the photo with others. Touch an option, such as, Tap+Send, Messaging, an email account, and so on, and follow the on-screen instructions.
  - edit: Make adjustments to the photo such a cropping, rotating, and auto fix, or using applications such as Paper Artist and Photo Editor.

- delete: Delete the photo or video.
- add to favorites/remove from favorites: Add or remove the photo as a favorite.
- set as lock screen: Sets the photo as the lock screen background.
- save to SkyDrive(OneDrive): Upload the photo to SkyDrive(OneDrive) (see "Uploading To SkyDrive(OneDrive)" on page 60).
- apps...: Edit the photo with your installed photo editing apps.

Tip: If your device displays that the memory is full when you access **Pictures**, delete some of the files.

Touch to return to the thumbnails screen.

#### **Viewing Videos**

To view a video:

- Touch the thumbnail to view the video. The first frame
  of the video displays indicating the length of the video
  in minutes and seconds (for example, 01:25). The play
  button s also displayed.
- To play the video, touch .
   To pause the video playback, touch .
   To fast forward through the video, touch and hold .
   To rewind the video, touch and hold .

Note: If no control icons are displayed on the screen in addition to the video, touch anywhere on the screen to display them.

- 3. Touch and hold a video or touch ••• Options to display the following options:
  - **share...**: Share the photo with others. Options are:
    - Tap + Send: Shares the photo via Bluetooth.
  - Messaging: Opens a New Message screen with the photo in-line. For more information, refer to "Creating and Sending Multimedia Messages" on page 47.
  - Email: Opens a New Email screen with the photo in-line. This option varies depending on how you have your email set up.
  - **delete**: Delete the photo or video.
  - save to SkyDrive(OneDrive): Upload the photo to SkyDrive(OneDrive) (see see "Uploading To SkyDrive(OneDrive)" on page 60).
- **4.** Touch ← to return to the thumbnails screen.

You can also play videos from Music + Videos. For more information, refer to "Playing Videos" on page 58.

#### Camera

This section explains how to use the camera and the camcorder on your phone. You can take photographs and shoot videos by using the built-in camera functionality. Your 13 megapixel camera produces photos in JPEG format.

To activate the camera:

From the Home screen, touch commera.

## **Adding a Location Tag To Your Pictures**

The first time you open the Camera application, you are asked if a tag location (known as Geotagging) can be added to your pictures. This allows you to see where your pictures were taken.

**Caution!** Be aware that your location may be present on a photo when posting your photos on the internet.

If you are interested in this service:

- 1. Touch **Privacy Statement** to view the Windows Phone 8 Privacy Statement Highlights document.
- Touch allow or cancel to accept or reject location tagging.

#### **Camera and Camcorder Mode**

To toggle between Camera and Camcorder mode:

■ Touch the **Camera** or **Camcorder Mode** icon (**③**).

Once you change the mode, the corresponding settings appear. For more information, refer to "Camera and Camcorder Settings" on page 67.


## **Taking Photos**

Taking photos with your device's built-in camera is as simple as choosing a subject, pointing the camera, and pressing the camera key.

Important! Do not take photos of people without their permission.Do not take photos in places where cameras are not allowed.Do not take photos in places where you may interfere with another person's privacy.

To activate the camera mode:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **Camera**.
- Using the phone's main display screen as a viewfinder, adjust the image by aiming the camera at the subject.
- Before you take a photo, pinch the screen to zoom out or stretch the screen to zoom out. You can magnify the picture up to 400 percent.
- **4.** Touch **flash** to turn flash on **3** or off **3**, or to use the automatic flash **4**.
- To take a picture of yourself, touch the Front Facing Camera icon (a) to enable or disable the Front Facing Camera.
- 6. If desired, before taking the photo, you can touch ••• Options to access various photo and video settings. For more information, refer to "Camera and Camcorder Settings" on page 67.
- 7. Touch the screen to take a photo.



Photos are automatically stored within your designated storage location.

#### Lenses

Your camera can scan barcodes, QR Codes, Microsoft Tags, books, CD's, and other DVD's and instantly retrieve information about these products using specialty apps called Lenses. Text may also be scanned and translated or searched.

**Note:** Touch **more lenses** to download additional scanning software and features.

#### **Bing Vision**

- 1. From the Home screen, touch **and Camera**.
- 2. Touch  $\P$  Lenses  $\rightarrow$  Bing Vision.
- Focus on the code or tag until the camera recognizes it and displays a thumbnail of it. If the item is correctly identified, touch the thumbnail to launch a Bing search for the product. (If the item is not identified or incorrect, try scanning the code or tag again).
- 4. Touch **history** to see recently scanned items.
- Touch scan text to search text. Once scanned, each word is highlighted.
  - Touch **translate** and select a target language. Each highlighted word is then translated.
  - To search on a word or words, touch each word to add to the search bar at the top. Touch the search bar and use the keyboard to edit any word if necessary. Touch search to perform a Bing search on the selected word or words.

# **Shooting Videos**

Tip: When shooting video in direct sunlight or in bright conditions, it is recommended that you provide your subject with sufficient light by having the light source behind you.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch 🔯 Camera.
- 2. Touch the Camera or Camcorder Mode icon ((a)) to switch to Camcorder mode ((a)).
- To shoot a video of yourself, touch the Front Facing Camera icon ((a)) to enable or disable the Front Facing Camera.
- **4.** Touch to turn on the camcorder's light while recording. Touch to turn the light off.
- Using the phone's main display screen as a viewfinder, adjust the image by aiming the camcorder at the subject.
- Touch the screen to begin shooting video.
- Touch the screen again to stop the recording and save the video file to your Pictures folder.

# **Camera and Camcorder Settings**

- For photo options, touch ••• Options → photo settings... The following options are available:
  - Focus Mode: Set focus to Normal or Macro.
  - White Balance: Set this option to Auto (default), Cloudy, Daylight, Fluorescent, or Tungsten.
  - Exposure Metering: Set the exposure metering to Average, Center Weighted (default), or Center Spot.
  - ISO: Determines how sensitive the image sensor is to light. Valid values are: Auto (default), 100, 200, 400, or 800.
  - Effects: Change the color tone or apply special effects to the photo. Options are: Off (default), Mono, Negative, Sepia, Solarize, Posterize, Vintage Cold, Vintage Warm, Point Blue. Point Green, and Point Red-Yellow.
  - Contrast: Adjust the contrast of the photo.
     Options are: 2 (maximum), 1 (high), 0 (default),
     -1 (low), or -2 (minimum).
  - Saturation: Adjust the color saturation of the photo. Options are: 2 (maximum), 1 (high),
     0 (default), -1 (low), or -2 (minimum).

- Sharpness: Adjust the sharpness of the photo.
   Options are: 2 (maximum), 1 (high), 0 (default),
   -1 (low), or -2 (minimum).
- EV: Helps you avoid underexposed (too dark) or overexposed (too light or white) photos.
   Options are: 2 (maximum), 1 (high), 0 (default), -1 (low), or -2 (minimum).
- Anti-Shaking: Automatically adjust the image to account for camera movement.
- Photo Resolution: Set the image size.
   Options include: 4128 x 3096 (4:3) (default),
   3264 x 2448 (4:3), 2592 x 1944 (4:3),
   2048 x 1536 (4:3), 1920 x 1080 (16:9),
   1600 x 1200 (4:3), 1280 x 960 (4:3),
   1280 x 720 (16:9), or 640 x 480 (4:3).
- For video options, touch • • Options → video settings... The following options are available:
  - White Balance: Set this option to one of the following choices: Auto (default), Cloudy, Daylight, Fluorescent, or Tungsten.

- Effects: Change the color tone or apply special effects to the video. Options are: Off (default), Mono, Negative, Sepia, Solarize, Posterize, Vintage Cold, Vintage Warm, Point Blue, Point Green, and Point Red-Yellow.
- Contrast: Adjust the contrast of the video.
   Options are: 2 (maximum), 1 (high), 0 (default),
   -1 (low), or -2 (minimum).
- Saturation: Adjust the color saturation of the video. Options are: 2 (maximum), 1 (high),
   0 (default), -1 (low), or -2 (minimum).
- **Sharpness**: Adjust the sharpness of the video. Options are: **2** (maximum), **1** (high), **0** (default), **-1** (low), or **-2** (minimum).
- Photo Resolution: Set the video size.
   Options include: 1920 x 1080 (16:9) (default),
   1280 x 720 (16:9), or 640 x 480 (4:3).

## **Accessing Photos and Videos**

When you take a photo or shoot a video, the file is saved in the Photos folder. You can view your photos and videos immediately or view them anytime in the Camera folder.

■ From the Home screen, touch Photos. For more information, refer to "Photos" on page 60.

# Assigning an Image to a Contact

The Camera can be used to create an image which can be assigned to the contact's profile or to your Me profile.

- **1.** From the Home screen, touch **People**.
- From the People menu, touch the contact that you want to edit.
- At the contact profile screen, touch at the bottom of the screen.
- 4. Touch add photo → (a) camera.
- 5. Take a photo and touch accept or retake.
- Touch each side of the photo and swipe inward or outward to zoom in or out within the crop area. Touch and slide the photo to move it within the crop area.
- 7. Touch to assign the cropped photo to the contact. For more information, refer to "Your People Hub" on page 36.

# **Setting a Photo as Your Lock Screen Background**

### **Photo Editor**

Photo Editor is the ultimate photo editor for your Windows Phone, combining an easy interface and professional grade tools and effects.

- 1. From the Home screen touch Photo Editor.
- **2.** There are three ways to select a photo for editing:
  - Touch a thumbnail of a recently taken photo.
  - Touch ( album to select a photo from a photo album.
  - Touch (a) camera to take a new photo.

The PHOTO EDITOR screen is displayed.

- 3. Touch **Edit** to resize, rotate, or crop the photo.
  - **Resize**: Change the photo's size. Options are 25%, 50%, 75% or 100%.

- Rotate: Change the photo's orientation. Options are 90° clockwise, 90° anticlockwise, Flip vertically, or Flip horizontally.
- **Crop**: Crop the photo. Options are Free ratio, 1:1, 3:4, 9:16, or Lasso.
- 4. Touch Color to change the photo's overall color.
  - Touch the color tool icons to apply the effect. Some color tools will display adjustment controls.
  - Touch **\* original** to remove the color change.
- 5. Touch \* Effect to add a special effect to the photo.
  - Touch the effect tool icons to apply the effect. Some effects tools will display adjustment controls.
  - Touch **(\*)** original to remove the effect.
- Touch Decoration to add a decoration to your photo.
  - Frame: Add a frame to your photo. Choose from several styles and colors.
  - **Sticker**: Add clip art to your photos. Choose from Brushes, Comics, Papers, and Graphical images.

- Multi-grid: Take multiple separate photos and mix them together. Options are Split in 2, Split in 3, or Split in 4.
- Touch Undo to remove the last edit. Touch
   Redo to reapply the last edit.
- 8. Touch Share to share the photo via Tap+Send, Messaging, an email account, or ATIV Beam. You can also add the photo to today's MiniDairy entry, add the photo to OneNote as a Quick Note, or open the photo in Paper Artist.
- Touch Cancel to close the photo without saving changes.
- Touch • Options to select a picture, take a picture, or use this picture as the Lock screen background.
- **11.** Touch **( save** to save the changes to the photo.

# **Section 8: Applications**

This section contains a description of each application that is available in the Applications Menu, its function, and how to navigate through that particular application. If the application is already described in another section of this user manual, then a cross reference to that particular section is provided.

Tip: To open applications quickly, add the icons of frequentlyused applications to one of the Home screens. For details, see "Customizing Your Home Screen" on page 21.

# **GPS Applications**

GPS applications allow you to achieve real-time, GPSenabled, turn-by-turn navigation and to access local searches based on a variety of category parameters. To receive better GPS signals, avoid using your device in the following conditions:

- inside a building or between buildings
- · in a tunnel or underground passage
- · in poor weather
- around high-voltage or electromagnetic fields
- in a vehicle with tinted windows

Global GPS turn-by-turn navigation, mapping, and Point of Interest content is available for three continents, including North America (U.S., Canada, and Mexico), Western Europe, and China, where wireless coverage is available.

Important! If you touch or cover the internal GPS antenna while using GPS services, it may impede the GPS signal resulting in the GPS services not working in an optimal manner. Refer to the following diagram to locate the approximate location of the internal GPS antenna.

#### **Alarms**

The Alarms application allows you to access and set alarms.

# Setting a New Alarm

- From the Home screen, swipe left to display the Applications menu and touch Alarms → Add.
- Touch the **Time** field then use your finger to swipe the hour and minute fields to set the time you want for the alarm.
- Touch the Repeats field if you want the alarm to sound on multiple days instead of only once. Touch the days that you want the alarm to sound.
- Touch the Sound field and touch the sound title you want. You can hear a sample by touching the symbol next to the sound name.
- Touch the Name field and use the keyboard to enter a name for this alarm.
- **6.** Touch ( save to save the alarm.

# **Turning Off an Alarm**

To turn off an alarm when it sounds:

- Touch dismiss on your display to stop the alarm.
  - or -

Touch **snooze** to temporarily stop the alarm.

### **Changing an Alarm**

To make changes to an existing alarm:

- From the Home screen, swipe left to display the Applications menu and touch Alarms.
- 2. Touch the alarm you want to change.
- **3.** Touch and change fields. For more information, refer to *"Setting a New Alarm"* on page 72.
- 4. Touch ( save to save the updated alarm.

# **Deleting an Alarm**

To delete an alarm:

- From the Home screen, swipe left to display the Applications menu and touch Alarms.
- 2. Touch the alarm you want to delete.
- 3. Touch (iii) delete to delete the alarm.

# **App Folder**

Group shortcuts and apps into one group and pin it to the Home screen.

# Adding an App Folder

- From the Home screen, swipe left to display the Applications menu and touch ☐ App Folder → ⊕ add.
- 2. Enter a name for this folder in the **Enter folder name** field and touch () ok.
- Select applications to add to the folder and touchok.
- 4. Select a folder style and touch 🕢 ok

# Removing an App Folder

- From the Home screen, swipe left to display the Applications menu and touch App Folder.
- Touch and hold a folder in the list, then touch delete in the pop-up.
  - or -

Touch **select**, touch the folders to remove, touch **delete**, and touch **ok** to confirm your deletion.

#### **ATIV Beam**

Use ATIV Beam to share files by beaming them to another NFC capable device.

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch and slide the **Status** slider to the right to turn Bluetooth **On**.
- 3. From the Home screen, swipe left to display the **Applications** menu and touch **ATIV** Beam.
- From the Status field, touch and slide the slider to the right to turn the ringer On.
- **5.** Turn on NFC on the device receiving the files.
- Select the file to share from one of the folders (Pictures, Documents, Music, or Videos) and touch
   Share.
- **7.** Tap your phone on the other NFC-capable device to share the files.

# **Bing Finance**

View the latest market conditions for items in your portfolio. You can view information using charts, or track items in your portfolio.

From the Home screen, swipe left to display the
 Applications menu and touch Bing Finance.

# **Bing News**

Stay up to date on news information. Select which sources you want to use to gather your news, then view each category of news such as top stories, world news, technology and science, politics, opinions, entertainment and much more.

From the Home screen, swipe left to display the
 Applications menu and touch Bing News.

# **Bing Sports**

Bing Sport provides dates and times for the games as well as scores for the NBA, NHL, and NCAA basketball.

From the Home screen, swipe left to display the
 Applications menu and touch Bing Sports.

# **Bing Weather**

Use Bing Weather to prepare for the latest weather conditions with hourly, daily, and 10-day forecasts.

# Accessing Internet Explorer

To access the Internet Explorer browser:

At the Home screen, touch Internet Explorer.

## Wi-Fi

#### **About Wi-Fi**

Wi-Fi (short for wireless fidelity) is a term used for certain types of Wireless Local Area Networks (WLAN). These device types use an 802.11 wireless specification to transmit and receive wireless data. Wi-Fi communication requires access to an existing and accessible Wireless Access Point (WAP). These WAPs can either be Open (unsecured) as within most Hot Spots, or Secured (requiring knowledge of the Router name and password).

# Turning Wi-Fi On

By default, your device's Wi-Fi feature is turned on. Turning Wi-Fi on makes your device able to discover and connect to compatible in-range WAPs.

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch Wi-Fi.
- Touch and slide the Wi-Fi networking slider to the right to turn Wi-Fi On.
- The device scans for available, in-range wireless networks and displays them under Wi-Fi networks on the same screen.
- 4. Press to return to the Home screen.

#### Connect To a Wi-Fi Network

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch Wi-Fi.
- Make sure Wi-Fi has been turned on. The network names and security settings (open or secure) of detected Wi-Fi networks are displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- Touch the network to which you want to connect.

**Note:** When you select an open network, you are automatically connected to the network.

- Enter a wireless password, if necessary. If the connection is successful, connected appears under the Wi-Fi network name.
- 5. Touch advanced to display Known networks and set additional options:
  - Touch add to add a new network name. Touch
     select, touch each network you want to delete,
     then touch delete to delete the selected networks.
  - Touch Notify me when new networks are found to turn this option On.
  - Touch Automatically connect to Wi-Fi hotspots to turn this option On.
  - Touch Send information about Wi-Fi connections to help discover nearby Wi-Fi to turn this option On.
  - Touch Keep Wi-Fi on when the screen times out to turn this option On.

## **Turning Wi-Fi Off**

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch Wi-Fi.
- Touch and slide the Wi-Fi networking slider to the left to turn Wi-Fi Off.

Note: Use of Wi-Fi consumes more battery power.

#### Wi-Fi Status Indicators

The following icons show your Wi-Fi connection status at a glance:



Displays when Wi-Fi is connected, active, and communicating with a Wireless Access Point (WAP).



Displays when Wi-Fi is active but there is a communication issue with the target Wireless Access Point (WAP) or it is not connected to a WAP.

## **Bluetooth**

#### **About Bluetooth**

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth devices, such as headsets and hands-free car kits, and Bluetooth-enabled handhelds, computers, printers, and wireless devices. The Bluetooth communication range is usually up to approximately 30 feet.

# **Turning Bluetooth On and Off**

To turn Bluetooth on:

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch Bluetooth.
- Touch and slide the Status slider to the right to turn Bluetooth On. When you turn Bluetooth on, your device is discoverable and it immediately scans for Bluetooth devices.
- Touch and slide the Status slider to the left to turn Bluetooth Off.
- **4.** Press to return to the Home screen.

#### **Bluetooth Status Indicator**

The 

 icon displays at the top of your screen when Bluetooth is active and your phone is connected with a Bluetooth device.

# **Connecting Bluetooth Devices**

The Bluetooth connecting process allows you to establish trusted connections between your device and another Bluetooth device. When you connect devices, they share a passkey, allowing for fast, secure connections while bypassing the discovery and authentication process.

To connect your device with another Bluetooth device:

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch Bluetooth.
- Touch and slide the Status slider to the right to turn Bluetooth On. When you turn Bluetooth on, your device is discoverable and it immediately scans for Bluetooth devices.
- Your device displays a list of discovered, in-range Bluetooth devices. Touch a device from the list to initiate connecting.

- Enter the passkey or PIN code, if needed, and touch ok.
- 5. The external device then has to also accept the connection and enter your device's PIN code.
  Once successfully connected to an external device, \* appears at the top of your screen and connected appears under the device name.

**Note:** Due to different specifications and features of other Bluetooth-compatible devices, display and operations may be different.

Note: Connecting between two Bluetooth devices is a onetime process. Once a connection has been created, the devices continue to recognize their partnership and exchange information without having to re-enter a passcode.

# **Disconnecting Bluetooth Devices**

Disconnecting a connected device breaks the connection between the device and your phone, but retains the knowledge of the connection. At a later point when you want to reconnect the device, there is no need to set up the connection information again.

- 1. Verify your Bluetooth is active.
- From the Bluetooth settings page, touch the previously connected device. The status changes to not connected.
- 3. Touch the device name again to reconnect.
- 4. To delete the device name from your list of Bluetooth devices, touch and hold the device name until delete displays. Touch delete to remove the device from your list.

**Note:** Disconnections are manually done but often occur automatically if the connected device goes out of range of your phone or it is powered off.

#### **PC Connections**

There are several ways available to transfer music, videos, photos, and other files between your phone and PC, such as using the cloud (Internet storage such as SkyDrive(OneDrive)), using a USB cable, using a Windows phone app. and so on.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Music + Videos.
- 2. Swipe left across the screen to view the **new** menu.
- 3. Touch Connect to your computer to add stuff.
- 4. There are several ways available to transfer music and videos between your phone and computer, such as using the cloud, using a USB cable, using a Windows phone app, and so on. Select the appropriate set up for your phone, and follow the online instructions to install and use the file transfer software of your choice.

Note: Internet sharing reduces battery power.

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch internet sharing.
- 2. Touch and slide the slider to the right to turn **Sharing** On.

#### Lock Screen

From this menu you can change the background, set a timeout screen that locks the phone after a specific amount of time, and set up the phone to require a 4-digit password to unlock the phone.

  - photo: Touch the change photo field to select a background from your photos.

- Touch the Screen times out after field and select a screen time-out time. Options are 30 seconds, 1 minute, 3 minutes, or 5 minutes.

- Touch and slide the Password slider to the right to turn the password requirement mode On.
  - Touch the **New password** field and enter a 4-digit password. Touch Show password to display the password as you type.
  - Touch the Confirm password field and re-enter the 4-digit password. Touch Show password to display the password as you type. Touch done to confirm.
  - After you create a password, touch change password to create a new password.
  - After you create a password, touch the Require a
     password after field to set how often the password is
     required. Options are each time, 30 seconds, or 1, 3,
     5, 15, or 30 minutes.

Note: To remove the password requirement, touch and slide the **Password** slider to the left to turn the password requirement mode **Off** and enter the password.

#### Wi-Fi

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch Wi-Fi.
- 2. Touch and slide the Wi-Fi networking slider to the right to turn Wi-Fi On.

#### **Bluetooth**

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch Bluetooth.
- 2. Touch and slide the **Status** slider to the right to turn Bluetooth On.

# Tap + Send

Tap + send (NFC sharing) allows you to share photos, websites, contacts, and more, or pair your phone by tapping to another NFC-capable device.

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch tap + send.
- Touch and slide the slider to the right to turn NFC sharing On.

# **Airplane Mode**

Airplane mode allows you to use many of your phone's features, such as Camera, Games, and more, when you are in an airplane or in any other area where making or receiving calls or data is prohibited.

**Important!** When your phone is in airplane mode, it cannot send or receive any calls or access online information or applications.

- 1. From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the system menu, touch airplane mode.
- 2. Touch and slide the slider to the right to turn airplane mode On.

#### Cellular

You can select whether your phone supports roaming outside your home area in your Wireless Provider's network.

Note: You may or may not be able to send or receive data.

Touch Learn more to learn how to use the recommended Internet Explorer settings.

#### Location

The Location settings allow you to activate location services so other applications (such as Maps) can access your location information.

# **Driving Mode**

To return to default phone mode:

Press the Power / Lock key to power off and press it again to power back on, and then enter the password that you set up in Step 3, above.

To add a Kid's Corner tile to your Home screen:

Once kid's corner has been set up, you can turn this feature off and on.

  - Touch the Store new pictures on and select phone or SD card.

# **Backup**

Certain information on your phone can be automatically backed up to the cloud (data storage available on the Internet such as SkyDrive(OneDrive)), guarding you against possible data loss.

The phone menu allows you to configure phone settings such as your voicemail number, international assistance, and SIM security. Your cellular provider and network may offer additional features.

- From the Home screen, touch Settings. Under the applications menu, touch phone. The phone settings screen displays.
- The My phone number field displays the phone number associated with the SIM card installed in your phone.
- 3. Touch and slide the Use default voicemail number slider to the right to use the #86 (default) to retrieve voice mails. To set a custom number, Touch and slide the Use default voicemail number slider to the left, then touch the new voicemail number field. Use the onscreen keypad to enter a new voicemail number, and touch anywhere outside the field to save the custom number.

### **Auto Upload of Pictures and Videos**

# **Section 11: Health and Safety Information**

This section outlines the safety precautions associated with using your phone. The terms "mobile device" or "cell phone" are used in this section to refer to your phone. **Read this information before using your mobile device**.

# **Exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) Signals**

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has published information for consumers relating to Radio Frequency (RF) exposure from wireless phones. The FDA publication includes the following information:

# Do cell phones pose a health hazard?

Many people are concerned that cell phone radiation will cause cancer or other serious health hazards. The weight of scientific evidence has not linked cell phones with any health problems.

Cell phones emit low levels of Radio Frequency (RF) energy. Over the past 15 years, scientists have conducted hundreds of studies looking at the biological effects of the radio frequency energy emitted by cell phones. While some researchers have reported biological changes associated with RF energy, these studies have failed to be replicated. The majority of studies published have failed to show an association between exposure to radio frequency from a cell phone and health problems.

The low levels of RF cell phones emit while in use are in the microwave frequency range. They also emit RF at substantially reduced time intervals when in the stand-by mode. Whereas high levels of RF can produce health effects (by heating tissue), exposure to low level RF that does not produce heating effects causes no known adverse health effects.

The biological effects of radio frequency energy should not be confused with the effects from other types of electromagnetic energy.

Very high levels of electromagnetic energy, such as is found in X-rays and gamma rays, can ionize biological tissues. Ionization is a process where electrons are stripped away from their normal locations in atoms and molecules. It can permanently damage biological tissues including DNA, the genetic material.

The energy levels associated with radio frequency energy, including both radio waves and microwaves, are not great enough to cause ionization of atoms and molecules. Therefore, RF energy is a type of non-ionizing radiation. Other types of non-ionizing radiation include visible light, infrared radiation (heat), and other forms of electromagnetic radiation with relatively low frequencies.

While RF energy does not ionize particles, large amounts can increase body temperatures and cause tissue damage. Two areas of the body, the eyes and the testes, are particularly vulnerable to RF heating because there is relatively little blood flow in them to carry away excess heat.

# Research Results to Date: Is there a connection between RF and certain health problems?

The results of most studies conducted to date say no. In addition, attempts to replicate and confirm the few studies that have shown a connection have failed.

The scientific community at large therefore believes that the weight of scientific evidence does not show an association between exposure to Radio Frequency (RF) from cell phones and adverse health outcomes. Still the scientific community has supported additional research to address gaps in knowledge. Some of these studies are described below.

# **Interphone Study**

Interphone is a large international study designed to determine whether cell phones increase the risk of head and neck cancer. A report published in the International Journal of Epidemiology (June, 2010) compared cell phone usage for more than 5,000 people with brain tumors (glioma and meningioma) and a similar number of healthy controls.

Results of this study did NOT show that cell phones caused brain cancer. In this study, most people had no increased risk of brain cancer from using cell phones. For people with the heaviest use of cell phones (an average of more than  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour per day, every day, for over 10 years) the study suggested a slight increase in brain cancer. However, the authors determined that biases and errors prevented any conclusions being drawn from this data. Additional information about Interphone can be found at

Interphone is the largest cell phone study to date, but it did not answer all questions about cell phone safety. Additional research is being conducted around the world, and the FDA continues to monitor developments in this field.

# International Cohort Study on Mobile Phone Users (COSMOS)

The COSMOS study aims to conduct long-term health monitoring of a large group of people to determine if there are any health issues linked to long-term exposure to radio frequency energy from cell phone use. The COSMOS study will follow approximately 300,000 adult cell phone users in Europe for 20 to 30 years. Additional information about the COSMOS study can be found at

# Risk of Brain Cancer from Exposure to Radio Frequency Fields in Childhood and Adolescence (MOBI-KIDS)

MOBI-KIDS is an international study investigating the relationship between exposure to radio frequency energy from communication technologies including cell phones and brain cancer in young people. # Surveillance, Epidemiology, and End Results (SEER) Program of the National Cancer Institute

The National Cancer Institute (NCI) actively follows cancer statistics in the United States to detect any change in rates of new cases for brain cancer. If cell phones play a role in risk for brain cancer, rates should go up, because heavy cell phone use has been common for quite some time in the U.S. Between 1987 and 2005, the overall age-adjusted incidence of brain cancer did not increase. ### **Cell Phone Industry Actions**

Although the existing scientific data do not justify FDA regulatory actions, the FDA has urged the cell phone industry to take a number of steps, including the following:

- Support-needed research on possible biological effects of RF for the type of signal emitted by cell phones;
- Design cell phones in a way that minimizes any RF exposure to the user: and
- Cooperate in providing users of cell phones with the current information on cell phone use and human health concerns.

The FDA also is working with voluntary standard-setting bodies such as the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE), the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP), and others to assure that safety standards continue to adequately protect the public.

# Reducing Exposure: Hands-Free Kits and Other Accessories

# Steps to Reduce Exposure to Radio Frequency Energy

If there is a risk from being exposed to radio frequency energy (RF) from cell phones - and at this point we do not know that there is - it is probably very small. But, if you are concerned about avoiding even potential risks, you can take a few simple steps to minimize your RF exposure.

- Reduce the amount of time spent using your cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between your head and the cell phone.

#### **Hands-Free Kits**

Hands-free kits may include audio or Bluetooth® headsets and various types of body-worn accessories such as belt-clips and holsters. Combinations of these can be used to reduce RF energy absorption from cell phones.

Headsets can substantially reduce exposure because the phone is held away from the head in the user's hand or in approved body-worn accessories. Cell phones marketed in the U.S. are required to meet RF exposure compliance requirements when used against the head and against the body.

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that hands-free kits reduce risks. Hands-free kits can be used for convenience and comfort. They are also required by law in many states if you want to use your phone while driving.

# Cell Phone Accessories that Claim to Shield the Head from RF Radiation

Because there are no known risks from exposure to RF emissions from cell phones, there is no reason to believe that accessories which claim to shield the head from those emissions reduce risks. Some products that claim to shield the user from RF absorption use special phone cases, while others involve nothing more than a metallic accessory attached to the phone.

Studies have shown that these products generally do not work as advertised. Unlike "hands-free" kits, these so-called "shields" may interfere with proper operation of the phone. The phone may be forced to boost its power to compensate, leading to an increase in RF absorption.

### **Children and Cell Phones**

The scientific evidence does not show a danger to any users of cell phones from RF exposure, including children and teenagers. The steps adults can take to reduce RF exposure apply to children and teenagers as well.

- · Reduce the amount of time spent on the cell phone;
- Use speaker mode or a headset to place more distance between the head and the cell phone.

Some groups sponsored by other national governments have advised that children be discouraged from using cell phones at all. For example, The Stewart Report from the United Kingdom made such a recommendation in December 2000. In this report, a group of independent experts noted that no evidence exists that using a cell phone causes brain tumors or other ill effects. Their recommendation to limit cell phone use by children was strictly precautionary; it was not based on scientific evidence that any health hazard exists.

# Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) Certification Information

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the exposure limits for Radio Frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government.

These FCC RF exposure limits are derived from the recommendations of two expert organizations: the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurement (NCRP) and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE). In both cases, the recommendations were developed by scientific and engineering experts drawn from industry, government, and academia after extensive reviews of the scientific literature related to the biological effects of RF energy.

The RF exposure limit set by the FCC for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy by the human body

expressed in units of watts per kilogram (W/kg). The FCC requires wireless phones to comply with a safety limit of 1.6 watts per kilogram (1.6 W/kg).

The FCC SAR limit incorporates a substantial margin of safety to give additional protection to the public and to account for any variations in measurements.

SAR tests are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum reported value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output of the phone. Before a new model phone is available for sale to the public. it must be tested and certified to the ECC that it does not exceed the SAR limit established by the FCC. Tests for each model phone are performed in positions and locations (e.g. at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC. For body-worn operation, this phone has been tested and meets

FCC RF exposure guidelines when used with an accessory that contains no metal and that positions the mobile device a minimum of 1.0 cm from the body.

# Smart Practices While Driving On the Road - Off the Phone

The primary responsibility of every driver is the safe operation of his or her vehicle.

Responsible drivers understand that no secondary task should be performed while driving whether it be eating, drinking, talking to passengers, or talking on a mobile phone - unless the driver has assessed the driving conditions and is confident that the secondary task will not interfere with their primary responsibility. Do not engage in any activity while driving a moving vehicle which may cause you to take your eyes off the road or become so absorbed in the activity that your ability to concentrate on the act of driving becomes impaired. Samsung is committed to promoting responsible driving and giving drivers the tools they need to understand and address distractions.

Check the laws and regulations on the use of mobile devices and their accessories in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. The use of these devices may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas. For example, only hands-free use may be permitted in certain areas.

Before answering calls, consider your circumstances. Let the call go to voicemail when driving conditions require. Remember, driving comes first, not the call!

If you consider a call necessary and appropriate, follow these tips:

- Use a hands-free device;
- Secure your phone within easy reach;
- Place calls when you are not moving;
- Plan calls when your car will be stationary;
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations;
- Let the person with whom you are speaking know that you are driving and will suspend the call if necessary;
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving;

Notice regarding legal restrictions on mounting this device in an automobile:

Laws in some states may prohibit mounting this device on or near the windshield of an automobile. In other states, the law may permit mounting this device only in specific locations in the automobile. Be sure to consult the state and local laws or ordinances where you drive before mounting this device in an automobile. # **Battery Use and Safety**

Important! Handle and store batteries properly to avoid injury or damage. Most battery issues arise from improper handling of batteries and, particularly, from the continued use of damaged batteries.

- Do not disassemble, crush, puncture, shred, or otherwise attempt to change the form of your battery. Do not put a high degree of pressure on the battery. This can cause leakage or an internal short-circuit, resulting in overheating.
- Do not let the phone or battery come in contact with liquids.
  Liquids can get into the phone's circuits, leading to corrosion.
  Even when the phone appears to be dry and appears to operate normally, the circuitry could slowly corrode and pose a safety hazard. If the phone and/or battery get wet, have them checked by your service provider or contact Samsung, even if they appear to be working properly.
- Do not place your battery in or near a heat source. Excessive
  heating can damage the phone or the battery and could cause the
  phone or the battery to explode. Do not dry a wet or damp battery
  with an appliance or heat source such as a microwave oven, hair
  dryer, iron, or radiator. Avoid leaving your phone in your car in
  high temperatures.

- Caution: Some applications or prolonged usage may increase device temperature. - Do not dispose of the phone or the battery in a fire. The phone

The display on your mobile device is made of glass or acrylic and could break if your mobile device is dropped or if it receives significant impact. Do not use if screen is broken or cracked as this could cause injury to you.

# WARRANTY DISCLAIMER: PROPER USE OF A TOUCH-SCREEN MOBILE DEVICE

If your mobile device has a touch-screen display, please note that a touch-screen responds best to a light touch from the pad of your finger or a non-metallic stylus. Using excessive force or a metallic object when pressing on the touch-screen may damage the tempered glass surface and void the warranty. For more information, please refer to the "Standard Limited Warranty".

### **GPS**

Certain Samsung mobile devices can use a Global Positioning System (GPS) signal for location-based applications. A GPS uses satellites controlled by the U.S. Government that are subject to changes implemented in accordance with the Department of Defense policy and the 2008 Federal Radio navigation Plan (FRP). Changes may affect the performance of location-based technology on your mobile device.

Even with GPS, when you make an emergency call:

- Always tell the emergency responder your location to the best of your ability; and
- Remain on the mobile device for as long as the emergency responder instructs you.

# **Navigation**

Maps, directions, and other navigation-data, including data relating to your current location, may contain inaccurate or incomplete data, and circumstances can and do change over time. In some areas, complete information may not be available. Therefore, you should always visually confirm that the navigational instructions are consistent with what you see before following them. All users should pay attention to road conditions, closures, traffic, and all other factors that may impact safe driving or walking. Always obey posted road signs.

# **Emergency Calls**

This mobile device, like any wireless mobile device, operates using radio signals, wireless and landline networks, as well as user-programmed functions, which cannot guarantee connection in all conditions, areas, or circumstances.

Therefore, you should never rely solely on any wireless mobile device for essential communications (medical emergencies, for example). Before traveling in remote or underdeveloped areas, plan an alternate method of contacting emergency services personnel. Remember, to make or receive any calls, the mobile device must be switched on and in a service area with adequate signal strength.

Emergency calls may not be possible on all wireless mobile device networks or when certain network services and/or mobile device features are in use. Check with local service providers.

### To make an emergency call:

- 1. If the mobile device is not on, switch it on.
- Key in the emergency number for your present location (for example, 911 or other official emergency number). Emergency numbers vary by location.

If certain features are in use (call blocking, for example), you may first need to deactivate those features before you can make an emergency call. Consult your User Manual and your local cellular service provider. When making an emergency call, remember to give all the necessary information as accurately as possible. ### **Care and Maintenance**

Your mobile device is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you fulfill any warranty obligations and allow you to enjoy this product for many years:

### Keep your Samsung Mobile Device away from:

### Liquids of any kind

Keep the mobile device dry. Precipitation, humidity, and liquids contain minerals that will corrode electronic circuits. If the mobile device does get wet, do not accelerate drying with the use of an oven, microwave, or dryer, because this may damage the mobile device and could cause a fire or explosion.

Do not use the mobile device with a wet hand. Doing so may cause an electric shock to you or damage to the mobile device.

#### Extreme heat or cold

Avoid temperatures below 0°C / 32°F or above 45°C / 113°F

#### Microwaves

Do not try to dry your mobile device in a microwave oven. Doing so may cause a fire or explosion.

#### **Dust and dirt**

Do not expose your mobile device to dust, dirt, or sand.

### Cleaning solutions

Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean the mobile device. Wipe it with a soft cloth slightly dampened in a mild soap-and-water solution. If the mobile device has a retractable camera lens, do not use soap and water to clean the lens. Use a blower or brush or lens cleaning paper dampened in a lens cleaning solution.

### Shock or vibration

Do not drop, knock, or shake the mobile device. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards.

### **Paint**

Do not paint the mobile device. Paint can clog the device's moving parts or ventilation openings and prevent proper operation.

# **Responsible Listening**

### Caution! Avoid potential hearing loss.

Damage to hearing occurs when a person is exposed to loud sounds over time. The risk of hearing loss increases as sound is played louder and for longer durations. Prolonged exposure to loud sounds (including music) is the most common cause of preventable hearing loss. Some scientific research suggests that using portable audio devices, such as portable music players and cell phones, at high volume settings for long durations may lead to permanent noise-induced hearing loss.

This includes the use of headphones (including headsets, earbuds, and Bluetooth® or other wireless devices). Exposure to very loud sound has also been associated in some studies with tinnitus (a ringing in the ear), hypersensitivity to sound, and distorted hearing. Individual susceptibility to noise-induced hearing loss and potential hearing problem varies. Additionally, the amount of sound produced by a portable audio device varies depending on the nature of the sound, the device settings, and the headphones

that are used. As a result, there is no single volume setting that is appropriate for everyone or for every combination of sound, settings, and equipment.

You should follow some common sense recommendations when using any portable audio device:

- Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source.
- Set the volume in a quiet environment and select the lowest volume at which you can hear adequately.
- Be aware that you can adapt to higher volume settings over time, not realizing that the higher volume may be harmful to your hearing.
- When using headphones, turn the volume down if you cannot hear the people speaking near you or if the person sitting next to you can hear what you are listening to.
- Do not turn the volume up to block out noisy surroundings. If you
  choose to listen to your portable device in a noisy environment,
  use noise-cancelling headphones to block out background
  environmental noise. By blocking background environment noise,
  noise cancelling headphones should allow you to hear the music
  at lower volumes than when using earbuds.

- Limit the amount of time you listen. As the volume increases, less time is required before you hearing could be affected.
- Avoid using headphones after exposure to extremely loud noises, such as rock concerts, that might cause temporary hearing loss.
   Temporary hearing loss might cause unsafe volumes to sound normal.
- Do not listen at any volume that causes you discomfort. If you
  experience ringing in your ears, hear muffled speech, or
  experience any temporary hearing difficulty after listening to your
  portable audio device, discontinue use and consult your doctor.

# **Operating Environment**

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in any area, and always switch your mobile device off whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger. When connecting the mobile device or any accessory to another device, read its user's guide for detailed safety instructions. Do not connect incompatible products.

# Using Your Mobile Device Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from Radio Frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless mobile device. Consult the manufacturer to discuss afternatives

## **Implantable Medical Devices**

A minimum separation of six (6) inches should be maintained between a handheld wireless mobile device and an implantable medical device, such as a pacemaker or implantable cardioverter defibrillator, to avoid potential interference with the device.

Persons who have such devices:

- Should ALWAYS keep the mobile device more than six (6) inches from their implantable medical device when the mobile device is turned ON:
- Should not carry the mobile device in a breast pocket;
- Should use the ear opposite the implantable medical device to minimize the potential for interference;
- Should turn the mobile device OFF immediately if there is any reason to suspect that interference is taking place;
- Should read and follow the directions from the manufacturer of your implantable medical device. If you have any questions about using your wireless mobile device with an implantable medical device, consult your health care provider.

#### Other Medical Devices

If you use any other personal medical devices, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information. Switch your mobile device off in health care facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

#### **Vehicles**

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. #### **Posted Facilities**

### When your Device is Wet

Do not turn on your device if it is wet. If your device is already on, turn it off and remove the battery immediately (if the device will not turn off or you cannot remove the battery, leave it as-is). Then, dry the device with a towel and take it to a service center.

# Restricting Children's Access to Your Mobile Device

Your mobile device is not a toy. Do not allow children to play with it because they could hurt themselves and others, damage the mobile device, or make calls that increase your mobile device bill.

Keep the mobile device and all its parts and accessories out of the reach of small children.

# FCC Notice and Cautions

The mobile device may cause TV or radio interference if used in close proximity to receiving equipment. The FCC can require you to stop using the mobile device if such interference cannot be eliminated.

#### **Cautions**

Any changes or modifications to your mobile device not expressly approved by Samsung could void your warranty for this equipment and void your authority to operate this equipment. Only use approved batteries, antennas, and chargers. The use of any unauthorized accessories may be dangerous and void the mobile device warranty if said accessories cause damage or a defect to the mobile device.

Although your mobile device is quite sturdy, it is a complex piece of equipment and can be broken. Avoid dropping, hitting, bending, or sitting on it.

# **Other Important Safety Information**

- Only qualified personnel should service the mobile device or install the mobile device in a vehicle. Faulty installation or service may be dangerous and may invalidate any warranty applicable to the device.
- Ensure that any mobile devices or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted.
- Check regularly that all wireless mobile device equipment in your vehicle is mounted and operating properly.
- When using a headset in dry environments, static electricity can build up in the headset and cause a small quick static electrical shock. To minimize the risk of electrostatic discharge from the headset avoid using the headset in extremely dry environments or touch a grounded unpainted metal object to discharge static electricity before inserting the headset.
- Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the mobile device, its parts, or accessories.

- For vehicles equipped with an air bag, remember that an air bag inflates with great force. Do not place objects, including installed or portable wireless equipment near or in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.
- Switch your mobile device off before boarding an aircraft. The use
  of wireless mobile devices in aircraft is illegal and may be

  an aircraft.
- Failure to observe these instructions may lead to the suspension or denial of cell phone services to the offender, or legal action, or both.
- While using your device, leave some lights on in the room and do not hold the screen too close to your eyes.
- Seizures or blackouts can occur when you are exposed to flashing lights while watching videos or playing games for extended periods. If you feel any discomfort, stop using the device immediately.

- Reduce risk of repetitive motion injuries. When you repetitively perform actions, such as pressing keys, drawing characters on a touch screen with your fingers, or playing games, you may experience occasional discomfort in your hands, neck, shoulders, or other parts of your body. When using your device for extended periods, hold the device with a relaxed grip, press the keys lightly, and take frequent breaks. If you continue to have discomfort during or after such use, stop use and see a physician.
- If your device has a camera flash or light, do not use the flash or light close to the eyes of people or pets. [122011]
