

Setting Up Your Device

Install the battery by:

 Grasping the device firmly and locating the cover release latch



Placing your finger nail in the opening and firmly "pop" the cover off the device (similar to a soda can). Caution!: Do not bend or twist the back cover excessively.

Doing so may damage the cover.

- Insert the battery into the opening in the back of the device, making sure the connectors align and gently press down to secure the battery.
- Position the battery cover over the battery compartment and press down until you hear a click.



5. Press and Hold to turn on the device.

Note: If your device is activated, it turns on, searches for Boost Mobile service, and enters standby mode.

Unlocking Your Device Screen

To unlock your phone from this screen, swipe upward with your finger on the screen.

Mobile ID

An exclusive service from Boost Mobile, Mobile ID is loaded with a variety of "ID packs" for Android powered phones. Each pack is a customized experience of the best applications, widgets, shortcuts, wallpapers and ringers.

You can install as many as many as six ID packs including MyID at any one time, and you can easily switch from one ID Pack to another without losing any applications already installed.

Installing Your First ID Pack

1. Press and tap Sim > Mobile ID.

Note: Your device must be activated, your battery should be fully charged, and you should be in a network coverage area before you install an ID Pack.

- On the Choose Your ID screen, tap Get New ID Packs.
- Touch an ID Pack on the Mobile ID > Get New ID
 Packs screen. Read the information screen for a
 description of the ID Pack and touch Install.
- Touch Agree to accept the Terms & Conditions.
- If prompted, touch Continue on any following screens until you see the progress icon in the upper-left corner of your screen.

Making Calls

- From the Home screen, tap and use the on-screen keypad to enter the number you wish to dial.
- 2. Tap to make the call.

Ending a Call

Tap the key.

Setting Up Your Voicemail

Your device automatically transfers all unanswered calls to your voicemail, even if your device is in use or turned off. You should set up your Voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your device is activated. Always use a password to protect against unauthorized access.

- 1. Press then press and hold 1
- 2. Follow the system prompts to:
 - Create your password.
 - Record your name announcement.

Record your greeting.

Note: Voicemail Password

Boost Mobile strongly recommends that you create a password when setting up your voicemail to protect against unauthorized access. Without a password, anyone who has access to your device is able to access your voicemail messages.

Account Passwords

Your Device



Key Functions

- Earpiece lets you hear the caller and automated prompts.
- LED Indicator lights when charging, you have missed events, or incoming notifications. The light turns on by default unless you turn it off.
- Status Bar Icons provide information about your device's status and options, such as signal strength, wireless technology, ringer setting, messaging, and battery charge.
- Display Screen displays all the information needed to operate your device, such as the call status, the Contacts list, and the date and time. Also provides one-touch access to all of your features and applications.
- Menu Key allows you to access your device's main functions menu: Edit, Create folder, Search, and Settings. While in a menu, press to open a list of actions available from the current screen or onscreen option.
- Microphone allows other callers to hear you clearly when you are speaking to them.
- Home Key returns you to the Home Screen. Press and hold to open the recently-used applications window.

- Back Key When in a menu, pressing the Back key returns you to the previous menu, closes a dialog box, or exits an onscreen menu/option.
- Front Facing Camera allows you to take pictures and videos of yourself when you set the camera shooting mode to Front portrait.
- Proximity/Light Sensor uses the ambient light level to adjust keypad access. If the light path is blocked, for example, when holding the phone close to your ear, the touch screen will turn off.


Phone Camera and External Views



- Camera Lens as part of the built-in 3.0 megapixel camera, this lens lets you take pictures and videos
- External Speaker lets you hear the different ringers and sounds. You can mute the ringer when receiving incoming calls by pressing the volume

- button. The speaker also lets you hear the caller's voice in speakerphone mode.
- Camera flash helps illuminate subjects in low-light environments when the camera is focusing and capturing a photo or video.
- Volume Button allows you to adjust the ringer volume in standby mode, the voice volume during a call, and media playback volume.
- microSD Card* Slot lets you use a microSD card to expand the memory of your phone.
- Power Button lets you turn the device on or off, or turn off the touchscreen display.
 - When the screen is turned off, press once to return to Screen lock mode.
 - While the device is unlocked and not on an active call, press and hold to display the Phone options menu (Silent mode, Airplane mode, Power off).

Note: *microSD Card not included. Must be purchased separately.



- Headset Jack allows you to plug in an optional headset for convenient, hands-free conversations.
 CAUTION! Inserting an accessory into the incorrect jack may damage the device.
- Camera Button lets you activate the camera and camcorder and take pictures and videos.

- Charger/Accessory Jack allows you to connect the phone charger or a USB cable (included).
 CAUTION! Inserting an accessory into the incorrect jack may damage the device.
- Microphone allows other callers to hear you clearly when you are speaking to them.

Turning Your Phone On and Off

- Press and hold until the phone switches on.
- 2. Sweep your finger across the screen to unlock the phone.

Turning Your Phone Off

- 1. To switch off the phone, press and hold _____, until the Device options screen displays.
- 2. Tap Power off to switch off the phone.
- 3. At the Power off prompt, tap **OK**.

Battery and Charger

WARNING: Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers with your device. The failure to use a Samsung-approved battery and charger may increase the risk that your device will overheat, catch fire or explode, resulting in serious bodily injury, death or property damage.

Battery Capacity

Your device is equipped with a Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) battery. It allows you to recharge your battery before it is fully drained.

Note: Watch your device's battery level indicator and charge the battery before it runs out of power.

Long backlight settings, searching for service, vibrate mode, browser use and other variables may reduce the battery's talk and standby times.

Installing the Battery

Removing the Battery

- Make sure the power is off so that you don't lose any stored numbers or messages.
- Grasp the device firmly, locate the cover release latch, and then place your fingernail in the opening and firmly "pop" the cover off the device.
- 3. Carefully remove the battery from the device.

WARNING: Do not handle a damaged or leaking Li-lon battery as you can be burned.

Charging the Battery

Keeping track of your battery's charge is important. If your battery level becomes too low, your device

automatically turns off and you will lose any information you were just working on.

Always use a Samsung-approved desktop charger, travel charger, or vehicle power adapter to charge your battery.

Plug the first end of the charger into the phone's charger jack and the other end into an electrical outlet.

With the Samsung-approved Li-lon battery, you can recharge the battery before it completely runs down.

Navigation and Customization

The Samsung Galaxy Rush™ is a touch-sensitive device which allows you to select onscreen options with a single tap, and also scroll through long menu lists. Simply slide up and down through the display with your fingertip.

Tip: Some menu options are also accessed by pressing and holding an onscreen item, such as a Contact entry from the Contacts tab.

Home Screen Overview

The Home Screen is the starting point for many applications and functions, and it allows you to add items like application icons, shortcuts, folders, or widgets to give you instant access to information and applications.

Press from any menu to access the default page.

 Status bar, located at the top of the screen, displays both Notification and Status icons.



- Status area displays icons associated with the status of the device such as communication, coverage, Bluetooth and Wi-Fi communication, battery levels, GPS, etc.
- Notification area displays icons associated with enduser notifications such as: email messages, calls (missed, call in progress), new voicemail, upcoming events, a USB connection, and text/MMS.
- Main Display a customizable screen that provides information about notifications and device status, allows access to application widgets.
- Shortcuts are icons that launch available device applications such as Camera, Samsung App, and Play Store.
- Widgets are self-contained onscreen applications (not shortcuts). These can be placed onto any of the available screens (Home or Extended).
- Extended Home Screens are screens that extend beyond the current visible screen width to provide more space for adding icons, widgets, and more.
 - There are seven available screens. Three of those screens are populated with default shortcuts or widgets, and four empty screens to customize. There are seven white dots in the middle, lower

portion of the screen. The boldest, white dot indicates the current page.

Note: The Status bar is visible across all Home screens.

Screen #3 is the Home screen.

 Applications tab accesses all of your available applications. Some of these applications also exist as Widgets to place onto an available screen.

Using the Applications Tab

All of the application icons are accessed through this tab.

- 1. Press and tap to open the tab.
- Scroll through the list and tap an icon to launch the associated application.

You can set up Circles of friends, visit the Stream to get updates from your Circles, use Messenger for fast messaging with everyone in your Circles, or use Instant Upload to automatically upload videos and photos to your own private album on Google+ (page 129).



Internet – Launches the Web browser (page 113). The browser is fully optimized and comes with advanced features to enhance Internet browsing on your device.

Latitude – Lets you see your friends' locations and share yours with them. The application also lets you See your friends' locations on a map or in a list (page 137).



Local – Allows others to find your business on local search results using either Google Search or Google Maps (page 137).



Maps – Launches Google Maps for mobile that helps you find local businesses, locate friends, view maps and get driving directions (page 136).



Memo – Launches the Memo application.



Messaging – Provides access to your text messaging application (SMS) (page 109).



Messenger – Messenger allows you to bring groups of friends together into a simple group conversation. When you get a new conversation in Messenger, Google+ sends an update to your phone. (page 130).

You can customize your Home Screen by doing the following:

- Add Widgets
- Adding Folders
- Adding Pages
- Changing the Background (Wallpaper)

Creating Shortcuts

Learn how to add, move, or remove items from the home screen.

- 1. Press
- Navigate to the desired Home Page and tap to display your current applications.
- Scroll through the list and locate your desired application.
- Touch and hold the application icon. This creates an immediate shortcut of the selected icon and closes the Applications tab.
- While still holding the onscreen icon, position it on the current page. Once complete, release the screen to lock the new shortcut into its new position on the current screen.

Adding Items from the Home Screen

- 1. Press
- 2. Navigate to the desired Home Page.
- 3. Touch and hold an empty area of the Home screen.

- Tap Add to Home screen > Apps and widgets, then touch the Apps tab.
- Touch and hold the application icon. This creates an immediate shortcut of the selected icon and closes the Applications tab.
- While still holding the onscreen icon, position it on the current page. Once complete, release the screen to lock the new shortcut into its new position on the current screen.

Deleting a Shortcut

- 1. Press 🛆.
- 2. Touch and hold the desired shortcut. This unlocks it from its location on the current screen.
- Drag the icon down toward the lower-right portion of the screen to the Delete icon and release it. As you place the shortcut into the Trash, both items turn red.

Note: This action does not delete the application, it simply removes the shortcut from the current screen.

Adding and Removing Primary Shortcuts

You can change any of your primary shortcuts with the exception of the Apps shortcut. The primary shortcuts are the bottom row of application shortcuts that remain static on all home screens (by default Phone, Contacts, Messaging, Internet, and Apps).

Note: Before replacing a primary shortcut, you must first add the replacement shortcut to the Home Screen.

- 1. Press
- Touch and hold the primary shortcut you want to replace and then drag it to an empty space on any Home screen.
- Touch and hold the new shortcut and then drag it to the empty space in the row of primary shortcuts.
 The new primary shortcut displays on all Home screens.

Adding and Removing Widgets

Widgets are self-contained applications that reside either in your Widgets tab or on the main or extended Home screens. Unlike a shortcut, the Widget appears as an onscreen application. Widgets can include Contacts shortcuts, bookmarks, Facebook status windows. Gmail and email accounts, and many other types of applications.

Adding a Widget

- 1. Press
- Navigate to the desired Home Page.
- 3. Touch and hold an empty area of the Home screen.
- 4. Tap Add to Home screen > Apps and widgets, then touch the Widgets tab.
- 5. Touch and hold an available Widget to position it on the current screen.

Removing a Widget

1. Press



- 2. Touch and hold the desired widget. This unlocks it from its location on the current screen.
- 3. Drag the widget down toward the lower-right portion of the screen to the Delete icon and release it. As you place the Widget into the Trash, both items turn red.

Adding Folders

- 1. Press
- Navigate to the desired Home Page.
- 3. Touch and hold an empty area of the Home screen.
- 4. Tap Folder.

A new, untitled folder is added to the Home screen.

5. Tap the folder and enter a new name for this folder in the Unnamed folder field

Adding Pages

- 1. Press
- 2. Navigate to the desired Home Page.
- 3. Touch and hold an empty area of the Home screen.

- Tap Page. A thumbnail view of the Home screens displays.
- Tap the page with the plus sign on it to add a new page.

Changing the Background Wallpaper

You can customize the screen's wallpaper image on the Home screen, Lock screen, or you can place the same image on both the Home and lock screens.

- 1. Press and tap **Settings** > **Settings** > **Wallpaper**.
- Select the screen(s) in which to change the wallpaper. Selections: Home screen, Lock screen, or Home and lock screens.
- Select a location in which to search for wallpaper, then select a wallpaper image. Selections are:
 - Home screen: Choose from Gallery, ID wallpapers, Live wallpapers, Wallpapers (Launcher), or Wallpapers (SecWallpaperChooser).
 - Lock screen: Choose from Gallery or Wallpapers.
 - Home and lock screens: Choose from Gallery, Live wallpapers, or Wallpapers.

Displaying Your Phone Number

Press and tap > Settings > About device > Status. (Your phone number and other phone information displays.)

Entering Text Using the Samsung Keyboard

The Samsung Keyboard is an onscreen QWERTY keyboard.

- 1. Press

 and tap

 Settings > Language and input.
- Tap to the right of Samsung keyboard to access these options:
 - Portrait keyboard types: Select text input method.
 Choose from Qwerty or 3x4 keyboard.
 - Input language: Select the text input language.
 Choose from Use system language, English, or Español.

- Predictive text: Enables the predictive text entry mode. This must be enabled to gain access to the advanced settings. Tap Predictive text to access the advanced settings.
- Continuous input: Enter text by sliding your finger across the keyboard without lifting your finger.
- Keyboard swipe: Swipe the keyboard horizontally between letters and symbols.
- Handwriting: The phone recognizes onscreen handwriting and convert it to text.
- Voice input: Activates the Voice input feature. This feature uses Google's networked speech recognition application to convert speech into text.
- Auto capitalization: Automatically capitalizes the first letter of the first word in each sentence (standard English style).
- Auto-punctuate: Automatically inserts a period at the end of a sentence when you tap the space bar twice while using the onscreen QWERTY keyboard.
- Character preview: Provides an automatic preview of the current character selection within the text

- string. This is helpful when multiple characters are available within one key.
- Key-tap vibration: Key-tap vibration enables vibration when you tap an onscreen key.
- Key-tap sound: Enables auditory feedback when you tap an onscreen key.
- Tutorial: Launches a brief onscreen tutorial covering the main concepts related to the Samsung keyboard.
- Reset settings: Reverts the Samsung Keyboard settings you applied back to their defaults.

Creating a Google Account

You will need a Google account to access several device features such as Gmail, Google Maps, Google Talk, and the Google Play Store applications.

Making Calls

There are several convenient ways to place calls from your phone.

- Using the Keypad
- From Logs
- From Favorites
- From Contacts
- Call a Number in a Text Message
- Email Message
- Call Emergency Numbers

Call Using the Keypad

The most "traditional" way to place a call is by using the phone's dialer screen.

- 1. Press and tap 🔃
- Tap the number keys on the dialpad to enter the phone number.

Tip: As you enter digits, Smart Dial searches for contacts that match. If you see the number you want to dial, tap it to place the call immediately without entering the rest of the number.

- 3. Tap to place the call.
- 4. Tap to end the call.

Calls From Logs

All incoming, outgoing and missed calls are recorded in the Call log. You can place a call to numbers or contacts that display in this area.

- 1. Press and tap .
- Tap the Logs tab. A list of recent calls displays.

Tap the contact to call, then tap to place a call

Tip: Swipe the entry left to right to place a call or from right to left to send a message.

Call from Contacts

You can place calls directly from your Contacts list using either of the following procedures.

- 4. Press and tap .
- 5. Tap the contact you want to call and then tap to place a call.

– or –

- Touch and hold the picture icon to the left of the contact or number.
- 2. Tap \ \ to call.

Call a Number in a Text Message

While viewing a text message, you can place a call to a number that is in the body of the message. For more information, see "Text Messaging (SMS)" on page 109

1. Press 📤 and tap 😾

2. Open the message then tap the phone number.

Tip: You can also call the number from with you received a text or MMS message. Tap the name at the top of the conversation and then tap a phone number.

3. Tap Call to dial the number.

Call a Number in an Email Message

While viewing an email or Gmail message, you can place a call to a number that is in the body of the message.

- 1. Press and tap or tap :::: > .
- 2. Open the message with the phone number and then tap the phone number.

The Phone screen opens, with the phone number automatically filled in and ready to dial.

3. Tap to place the call.

Call Emergency Numbers

You can place calls to 911 even if the phone's screen is locked or your account is restricted.

To call the 911 emergency number when the phone's screen is locked with a screen lock:

- 1. Press and tap .
- 2. Dial 911 and press (.

To call the 911 emergency number normally or when your account is restricted:

- 1. Press and tap .
- 2. Dial 911 and press (.

Receive Phone Calls

When you receive a phone call from a contact, the Incoming call screen display the caller ID icon, name, and phone number of the calling party. When you receive a phone call from someone not stored in Contacts, only the default caller ID icon and phone number display on the Incoming call screen.

Note: If your phone is turned off, all calls are automatically sent to voicemail.

Answer an Incoming Call

The following procedure shows you how to answer an incoming call.

When the call comes in, touch and slide to the right to answer the call.

Mute the Ringing Sound

You can mute the ringtone without rejecting the call by press the volume button down.

Reject an Incoming Call

When you receive an incoming call, touch and slide to the left.

Reject a Call with a Text Message

You can automatically reject an incoming call and send a text message to the caller.

- Touch and slide up Reject call with message.
- 2. Select an existing message and tap **Send**.
 - or -

Tap Create new message to compose a new text message.

Phone Call Options

Dialing Options

- 1. Press while dialing a call.
- 2. Tap one of the following options:
 - Send message: Sends a text message to this number.
 - Add to Contacts: Adds this number to the Contacts list. For more information, see "Add a Contact" on page 67.
 - Speed dial setting: Displays the contacts assigned to numbers 2 through 100. The number 1 is reserved for Voicemail.
 - Add 2-sec pause: Adds a 2-second pause to this number
 - Add wait: Adds a pause to the calling sequence until you tap a key to continue.

 Call settings: Displays the Call settings menu. see "Call Settings" on page 37.

Caller ID

Caller ID identifies a caller by displaying the phone number of the incoming caller.

To hide your number when making a call, follow these steps.

- 1. Press and tap 🔃.
- 2. Tap the Keypad tab.
- 3. Tap * P 6 MNO 7 PORS .
- 4. Enter a phone number, then tap .

Call Waiting

When you are on a call, Call Waiting alerts you to incoming calls by sounding a tone. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is waiting and displays the caller's phone number (if it is available).

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

1. Slide to the right to place the first caller on hold and answer the second call.

2. Tap Swap to switch back to the first caller.

3-way Calling

Note: With 3-Way calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls depending on your service plan.

- 1. Press and tap .
- 2. Tap the Keypad tab.
- 3. Enter a number and tap ().
- 4. When the number connects, tap Add call and dial the second number.

The first caller is placed on hold while dialing the second number.

5. Tap Merge to merge the calls into a three-way all.

Note: If one person hangs up during the call, you and the remaining person stay connected. If you are first to hang up, all callers are disconnected.

Call Forwarding

Call Forwarding lets you forward all your incoming calls to another phone number – even when your phone is turned off. You can continue to make calls from your phone when you have activated Call Forwarding.

Important: You are charged a higher rate for forwarded calls.

To activate Call Forwarding:

- 1. Press 🛆 and tap 🚺
- 2. Tap * P 7 PORS 2 ABC
- Enter the area code and number in which to forward calls.
- 4. Tap . A tone confirms Call Forwarding activation.

To deactivate Call Forwarding:

- 1. Press 📤 and tap 🔃.
- 2. Tap * P 7 PQRS 2 ABC 0 +
- 3. Tap ... A message displays and a tone plays to confirm deactivation.

In-call Options

While on a call, a number of onscreen options display. Tap an option to select it.

- Add call: Displays the keypad so you can dial another number.
- Keypad: Displays the keypad.
- End call: Terminates the call.
- Speaker: To hear audio through the speaker.
- Mute/Unmute: Mutes the microphone. Tap again to unmute.
- Headset: Connects to a Bluetooth headset. Tap again to disconnect.

Press for more options:

- Contacts: Displays the Contact list.
- Memo: Create a memo during a call.

Speed Dialing

You can assign a shortcut to dial a phone number in your Contacts List for speed dialing. There are one hundred available numbered spaces. The number 1 is reserved for Voicemail.

Assign a Speed Dial Number

- 1. Press 🛆 and tap 🚺.
 - or -
 - Press 📤 and tap 🔼
- Press > Speed dial setting.
- Tap a Not assigned slot, then tap a contact to assign to this number.

The selected number displays in the speed dial number area.

Remove a Speed Dial Number

- 1. Press and tap
- Press > Speed dial setting.
- Press > Remove.
- 4. Tap the X next to the speed dial entry to remove.

Edit a Speed Dial Number Location

- 1. Press 📤 and tap 🔼.
- Press > Speed dial setting.
- 3. Press **=** > Change order.

- 4. Tap the entry to move. The entry highlights.
- Tap a Not assigned space to move the entry to this location.

Voicemail

The phone automatically transfers all unanswered calls to voicemail, even when the phone is in use or turned off. You should set up your voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your phone is activated. Always use a password to protect against unauthorized access.

Set Up Voicemail Through the Phone Application

The following steps will guide you through setting up your voicemail using the Phone application.

Your phone automatically transfers all unanswered calls to your voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off

- 1. Press and tap 📢.
- 2. Touch and hold 1 w to dial voicemail.

- 3. Follow the prompts to:
 - Create a password.
 - Record a name announcement.
 - Record a greeting.

Retrieve Voicemail Messages

- 1. Press 📤 and tap 📢.
- 2. Touch and hold 1 to dial voicemail.
- When connected, follow the voice prompts from the voicemail center.

Note: If you previously set up Visual Voicemail, that application launches and directs you to visual voicemail. For more information, see "Visual Voicemail" on page 31.

Voicemail Notification

There are several ways the phone alerts you to a new message.

- Playing the assigned ringtone type.
- Displaying within the Notifications area of the Status bar when a single new unheard voicemail message is received.

Visual Voicemail

Visual Voicemail provides a quick and easy way to access voicemail. You can locate one message without listening to every voicemail message. This new feature periodically retrieves caller information from all of the current voicemails and populates a list with the caller name and number, along with the length of time and priority level of the voicemail message.

Set Up Visual Voicemail

Setting up Visual Voicemail uses the same procedures as setting up regular voicemail.

Your phone automatically transfers all unanswered calls to your voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off

- Press and tap \$\circ\$ Voicemail.
 The first time you access the Voicemail application the Personalize your voicemail prompt displays.
- Tap Personalize now to access the voicemail setup program.

- 3. Follow the system prompts to:
 - Create a password.
 - Record a name announcement.
 - Record a greeting.

Review Visual Voicemail

- 1. Press and tap Some > O Voicemail.
- 2. Touch a message to review.

- While reviewing a voicemail message these options are available:
 - Call: to call the contact who left the voicemail message.
 - Reply: to reply to the message, then touch Send to delivery the new message. You can reply to the sender or forward the message to another recipient with an email address or phone number. You can send this voicemail message to multiple recipients. You can tag the reply message for both Urgency and Privacy.
 - Speaker Off/On: to turn the speakerphone on or off during playback. If the speakerphone feature is enabled, the speakerphone is automatically enabled during voicemail playback.
 - Delete: to delete the current voicemail message. The message is moved to the Deleted folder.

Listen to Multiple Voicemail Messages

When you are done listening to a voicemail message you can easily access other voicemail messages without returning to the main voicemail screen.

- 1. Press and tap Since > 5 Voicemail.
- Listen to the first voicemail message, then swipe your finger left or right to display the next or previous message. The message automatically begins playing.

Visual Voicemail Settings

Use the Menu button to access and configure Visual Voicemail settings.

- Tap > Settings and select one of the following options:
 - Manage subscription: Subscribe to the Voice-to-Text transcription service.

Note: Use of the Voice-to-Text service may require additional fee.

- Auto forward to email: Sends a copy of new messages to a selected email address.
- Personalize voicemail: Changes your voicemail greeting from incoming calls and updates your password.
- Notifications: Sets the notification sound and vibration settings.
- Delete messages: Deletes selected voicemail messages.
- Display name: Enter a name to display when replying or forwarding messages.
- View quick tips tutorial: Displays a tutorial of quick tips.
- Help: Displays Visual Voicemail help.
- Send feedback: Sends error feedback to Boost using Email or Gmail.
- Check for update: Checks for a visual voicemail software updates.
- About Voicemail: Displays build and copyright information for this visual voicemail application.

Activating Wi-Fi

1. Press 📤 and tap 🔳 > Settings.

- 2. Tap the Wi-Fi OFF/ON slider on to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. Tap Wi-Fi again to access Wi-Fi networks.

Advanced Wi-Fi Settings

The advanced Wi-Fi settings allow you to set up and manage wireless access points.

- Press and tap > Settings > Wi-Fi > Advanced.
- 2. Select one of the following:
 - Network Notification: alerts you when a new WAP is available.
 - Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep: allows you to specify when to disconnect from Wi-Fi. Options are: Always, Only when plugged in, or Never (increase data usage).
 - Wi-Fi timer: schedules Wi-Fi operations to keep Wi-Fi enabled when charging the phone.
 - MAC address: view your phone's MAC address, required when connecting to some secured networks (not configurable).
 - IP address: view your phone's IP address.

Bluetooth Settings

Bluetooth settings activate Bluetooth, view or assign a name for the phone, activate the phone so other Bluetooth devices can discover it, or scan and pair with other Bluetooth devices.

For more information, about Bluetooth settings, see "Bluetooth Settings" on page 101.

Data Usage

Use this feature to view Mobile data usage and turn Mobile data capability On or Off.

- 1. Press and tap > Settings > Data usage.
- Tap Mobile Data (a green checkmark indicates that the feature is turned on).
- Tap Set mobile data limit to turn off the mobile data connection when it reaches the configured limit.
- 4. Tap and drag the far right ends of the Red and Orange horizontal lines to manually adjust the Warning and Maximum data limits.
- Touch and drag the bottom, gray vertical lines to adjust the time frames.

Airplane mode

Airplane mode allows you to use many of your phone's features when you are in an airplane or another area where making or receiving calls or using a data feature is prohibited.

Important: When your phone is in Airplane Mode, it cannot send or receive any calls or access online information or applications.

1. Press and tap Settings > More settings > Airplane mode.

- or -

Press and hold the Power button until the Phone options menu displays, then tap **Airplane mode**.

Virtual Private Network (VPN) Settings

Using this menu you can set up and manage Virtual Private Networks (VPNs).

Important: Before you can use a VPN you must establish and configure one.

Press and tap > Settings > More settings > VPN.

Note: You must first set up a screen unlock pattern, PIN, or Password. This is a security measure required for using credential storage. See "Screen Lock" on page 50.

Tap Add VPN network.

Enter a name for this VPN network, select a VPN type, enter the configuration information for this connection type, then tap Save.

Connecting to a VPN

- 1. Press and tap Settings > More settings > VPN.
- 2. Tap the VPN in which to connect.
- 3. Enter the requested information at the prompt.
- Tap Connect.

Deleting a VPN

- Press and tap > Settings > More settings > VPN.
- 2. Touch and hold the VPN to delete.
- Tap Delete network at the prompt.

Wi-Fi Direct Settings

Wi-Fi Direct allows device-to-device connections so you can transfer large amounts of data over a Wi-Fi connection.

- Tap the Wi-Fi Direct OFF/ON slider to turn on Wi-Fi Direct.

Mobile Networks

Before you use applications such as Google Maps and find your location or search for places of interest, you must enable the Mobile networks options.

Call Settings

Your phone's Call Settings menu lets you configure your voicemail options and a number of other settings for the phone application.

- 1. Press and tap
- 2. Tap = > Call settings.

- 3. Configure the following call settings:
 - Set reject messages: manages both existing rejection messages and creates new ones.
 - Call alert: allows you to assign call alert tones and activate call alerts and vibration.
 - Call vibrations: vibrates the phone when the called party answers.
 - Call status tones: assigns sounds settings during the call.
 - Alerts on call: selects whether alarm and message notification is turned off during a call.
 - The power key ends calls: press the power key to end the current call.
 - Auto screen off during calls: turns on the proximity sensor so the screen turns off during a call to save power.
 - Accessory settings for call: configures call settings when using a regular or Bluetooth headset.
 - Automatic answering: automatically answers a call using a connected headset.

- Automatic answering: adjusts the delay time before automatically accepting incoming calls using a headset. Selections are: 2 seconds, 5 seconds, and 10 seconds.
- Outgoing call conditions. When activated you can use a Bluetooth headset to call even when the phone is locked.
- Increase volume in pocket: increases the ringtone volume when the device is in a pocket or bag.
- US dialing: allows you to have the phone automatically dial the international access code for your location. See "Activating Plus Code Dialing" on page 39.
- International dialing: allows you to set a prefix for international calls. By default, the international dialing prefix (code) is set to 011. This code cannot be changed until the feature is temporarily disabled. Once disabled, the field becomes accessible and can be altered. See "Changing the International Dialing Code" on page 40.
- TTY mode: allows you to enable TTY (also known as a TDD or Text Telephone). See "TTY Use" on page 40.

- DTMF tones: This option sets the length of Dualtone multifrequency (DTMF) signaling tones. See "DTMF Tones" on page 40.
- DDTM: allows you to send calls to during an active data connection.
- Voicemail settings: allow you to choose the method by which you receive your voicemails and general playback preferences. See "Voicemail Settings" on page 39.
- Accounts: Adds a new Internet calling account and configures incoming call preferences. See "Adding an Internet Calling Account" on page 41.
 - Receive incoming calls: maintains a connection with your Internet calling service provider, so the phone rings and receives the incoming internet call.
- Use Internet calling: determines when to use Internet calling. Selection: For all calls when mobile network available, Only for Internet calls, or Ask for every call.

Voicemail Settings

- Tap Display name to enter a name or number that is attached to your outgoing voicemails as part of an identification string.
- View quick tips tutorial to view a brief slideshow of shortcuts, icon definitions, and features.
- Tap Help to access help with your phone's voicemail features.
- Send feedback via email with opinions and comments about the voicemail feature to smithmicro.com.
- Tap Check for update to search for an upgrade to your Visual Voicemail software.
- Tap About Voicemail to view build information about the current visual voicemail application.

Activating Plus Code Dialing

Plus Code dialing configures the phone to automatically dial the international access code for your location when you touch and hold 0 + .

- 2. Tap = > Call settings

Tap US dialing to activate the international dialing code feature. A green checkmark indicates activation.

Important: This feature does not work for 1+ dialing.

Changing the International Dialing Code

By default, the international dialing prefix (code) is set to 011. This code can not be changed until the feature is temporarily disabled. Once disabled, the field becomes accessible and can be altered.

- 1. Press and tap .
- 2. Tap = > Call settings.
- Tap US dialing to deactivate it. This enables the International dialing field.
- Tap International dialing then press to erase the previous number.
- 5. Enter a new number, then tap OK.

DTMF Tones

This option sets the length of Dual-tone multifrequency (DTMF) signaling tones.

- Tap DTMF tones and select Normal or Long.

TTY Use

A TTY (also known as a TDD or Text Telephone) is a telecommunications device that allows people who are deaf, hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities, to communicate by telephone.

Your device is compatible with select TTY devices. Please check with the manufacturer of your TTY device to ensure that it is compatible with digital cell phones. Your device and TTY device will connect via a special cable that plugs into your phone's headset jack.

Contact your TTY device manufacturer to purchase the connector cable if one was not provided with the device.

1. Press and tap .

- 2. Tap > Call settings.
- Tap TTY mode then tap TTY Full, TTY HCO, or TTY VCO.

WARNING: 911 Emergency Calling

Boost Mobile recommends that TTY users make emergency calls by other means, including Telecommunications Relay Services (TRS), analog cellular, and landline communications. Wireless TTY calls to 911 may be corrupted when received by public safety answering points (PSAPs), rendering some communications unintelligible. The problem encountered appears related to software used by PSAPs. This matter has been brought to the attention of the FCC, and the wireless industry and the PSAP community are currently working to resolve this.

Internet Call Settings

Internet calls use the Session Initiation Protocol (SIP) for voice calls on Internet Protocol (IP) networks. Using these settings you can add an Internet calling account so you can place and receive Internet calls.

Important: You must be connected to a Wi-Fi network and add an Internet calling account to use Internet calling.

Once the account is configured for Internet calling, you can configure the settings to use Internet calling for all calls, you can just place calls to Internet calling addresses, or receive Internet calls.

Adding an Internet Calling Account

- 1. Press and tap .
- 2. Tap = > Call settings.
- 3. Configure the following call settings:
 - Accounts: Adds a new Internet calling account and configures incoming call preferences.
 - Receive incoming calls: maintains a connection with your Internet calling service provider, so the phone rings and receives the incoming internet call.
 - Use Internet calling: determines when to use Internet calling. Selection: For all calls when mobile network available, Only for Internet calls, or Ask for every call.

Device Settings

General Sound Settings

Silent Mode

Use the Silent mode setting when you want to stop the phone from making any noise. In this mode, the speaker is muted and the phone only vibrates to notify you of incoming calls, or other functions that normally have a defined tone or sound as an alert.

Press and hold the volume button down in standby mode until displays.

– or –

Press and tap > Settings > Sound > Silent mode, then tap Off, Vibrate, or Mute.

Adjusting the Volume

Adjust the volume settings for both the device and Media playback to suit your needs and environment.

1. Press and tap >Settings > Sound.

Tap Volume and drag each of the volume type slides left (to decrease volume) or right (to increase volume). Selections are: Music, video, games, and other media, Ringtone, Notifications, or System.

Tip: You can adjust the ringtone volume in standby mode (or the earpiece volume during a call) by using the volume button on the left side of your device.

Tap **OK** when finished.

Ringtone and Notifications Settings

Set up the device ringtone, device vibration, and sounds for default notifications. You can also set up sound and vibration for the phone and notifications.

- 2. Configure the following options:
 - Device ringtone: select a default phone ringtone from the list.
 - Device vibration: select a default phone vibration ringtone from the list. Or tap Create and create your own custom device vibration ringtone.
 - Default notifications: select a default phone notification ringtone from the list.

Tap Sound and vibration so the phone will vibrate and ring during notifications. This setting overrides any other Vibration setting.

System Tone Settings

The System tone settings are used when you use the dialing pad, make a screen selection, lock your screen, or tap the screen.

- 1. Press and tap >Settings > Sound.
- 2. Tap the following options to activate the feature.
 - Keytones: plays a sound when you tap a key on the keyboard.
 - Touch sounds: plays a sound when you touch the screen.
 - Screen lock sound: plays a sound when you lock or unlock the screen.
- Tap Emergency tone then tap Off, Alert, or Vibrate to configure whether or not to play a sound, or vibrate when you receive an Emergency alert.

Display Settings

Changing the Brightness

Adjust your screen's brightness to suit your surroundings.

- Press and tap >Settings > Display.
- Tap Automatic brightness to allow the phone to automatically adjust the brightness levels.
 - or -

Tap **Brightness**, then touch and drag the **Brightness** slider left (to decrease brightness) or right to (increase brightness), then tap **OK**.

Changing the Backlight Time Length

Select how long the display screen remains lit after you press a key.

- 1. Press and tap >Settings > Display.
- Tap Screen timeout, then tap a time setting (15 seconds through 30 minutes).

Note: Long screen backlight settings reduce the battery's talk and standby times.

Changing the Screen Orientation

Although most screens change orientation if you rotate the phone into a landscape position, you can manually enable the feature to change the orientation for all screens when they are rotated.

- Press and tap >Settings > Display.
- Tap Auto-rotate screen (enabled by default). A checkmark indicates activation.
- Clear the Auto-rotate screen checkmark to disable the automatic adjustment.

Touch Key Light Duration

This feature allows you to set the delay time before the Touch key light (keys located at the bottom of the phone) automatically turns off.

- 1. Press and tap >Settings > Display.
- Tap Key backlight duration and touch a duration. Selections: 1.5 seconds, 6 seconds, Always off, or Always on.

Display Fonts

Font settings allows you to set the font style and size used on the phone's screen.

- Press and tap >Settings > Display.
- Tap Font style, select a font style from the list, or tap Get fonts online to download fonts.
- 3. Tap Font size, and select a font size.

Display Battery Power

Use these settings to configure additional Display settings.

- 1. Press and tap **Settings** > **Display**.
- Tap Display battery percentage to display the percentage of available battery power on the screen.

Wallpaper

You can customize the screen's wallpaper image on the Home screen, Lock screen, or you can place the same image on both the Home and lock screens.

Press and tap >Settings > Wallpaper.

- Select the screen(s) in which to change the wallpaper. Selections: Home screen, Lock screen, or Home and lock screens.
- Select a location in which to search for wallpaper, then select a wallpaper image. Selections are: Gallery, ID Wallpapers, Live Wallpapers, or Wallpapers (Launcher or SecWallpaperChooser)

LED Indicator

Configure the LED lights to indicate when the device is connected to a charger, battery levels are low, or you missed a call, message, or application event.

- 2. Tap one of the following to activate the feature:
 - Charging: LED lights up when the phone is connected to a charger.
 - Low battery: LED lights up when the battery level is low.
 - Missed event: LED lights up when there are missed calls, messages, or application events.

Power Saving

Power Saving Mode allows you to manage your phone in order to save power.

When you pull down the Notification panel, the power saving features display at the top of the screen or you can access Power Saving from the Settings menu.

- Press and tap >Settings > Power saving.
- Tap the Power saving OFF/ON slider on to activate Power saving mode.
- 3. Tap Power saving again to configure these options:
 - CPU power saving: Limits the maximum CPU performance and conserves battery life.
 - Screen power saving: Reduces the screens refresh rate and brightness to extend battery life when the screen is on.
 - Learn about power saving: Displays power saving tips for both CPU and Screen power.

Storage Settings

From this menu you can view the memory allocation for the memory card and USB as well as mount or unmount the SD card.

▶ Press and tap >Settings > Storage. Device memory and SD card memory details display.

Mounting and unmounting a microSD card*

- 2. Tap Mount SD card to mount the card so you can use it to store data.
- 3. Tap Unmount SD card to unmount the card so you can safely remove it from the phone, then tap OK.

Note: *microSD Card not included. Must be purchased separately

Formatting a microSD card

- 2. Tap Format SD card to re-format the card. This deletes all the data on the SD including music. videos, and photos.
- 3. Tap Format SD card again.
- Tap Delete all to continue.

Batterv

View the amount of battery power used for phone activities from this menu.

- 2. Tap Screen, Android System, or one of the listed applications to view the battery usage for that application.

Application Manager

You can download and install applications from the Play Store or create applications using the Android SDK and install them on your phone. Use Applications settings to manage applications.

From this menu you can view memory or resources, as well as view remaining memory and resources for the installed or downloaded applications. You can also clear the data, cache, or defaults.

- Press and tap >Settings > Application manager.
- Tap the **Downloaded, Running**, or **All** tab to display memory usage for this category or applications.
 The graph at the bottom of the Downloaded tab displays used and free phone memory. The graph a the bottom of the Running tab displays used and free RAM
- Tap and application in which to clear the cache or data then tap Force stop, Clear data, or Clear cache.
- Tap the Downloaded tab to view a list of downloaded applications.
- Press MENU > Sort by size or Sort by name to switch the order of the lists displayed.
- Tap an application to view and update information including memory usage, default settings, and permissions.

Uninstalling Third-party Applications

- Press and tap Settings > Application manager.
- Tap the Downloaded tab and select the application to uninstall.
- 3. Tap Uninstall.
- 4. Tap **OK** at the prompt to uninstall the application.

Running Services

From this menu you can view and control services running on the phone.

- Press and tap > Settings > Application manager.
- Tap the Running tab. All the running applications display.
- Tap Show cached processes to display all the cached processes running.
- 4. Tap Show services in use to switch back.
- 5. Tap one of the applications to view application information.

- 6. Tap one of the following options:
 - Stop: Stops the application from running on the phone. This is usually done prior to uninstalling an application.

WARNING: Stopping services may have undesirable consequences for the application or Android system. You cannot stop all services.

Report: Report failure and other application information.

Personal Settinas

Accounts and Synchronization

This menu allows you to set up, manage, and synchronize accounts, including your Google and email accounts.

Adding an Account

- sync.
- Tap Add account.

- Tap an account type.
- 4. Follow the prompts and enter your credentials to set up the account.

Removing an Account

- Press and tap > Settings > Accounts and svnc.
- Tap an account to remove then tap Remove account.

Synchronizing Accounts

- svnc.
- Tap Sync all to synchronize all your accounts.

Synchronization Settings

Once an account is added you can synchronize features such as the calendar, contacts, Gmail, and more.

- Sign in to your Google account.
- 2. Press and tap > Settings > Accounts and sync.

- 3. Tap the account in which to configure synchronization.
- Tap each category that you want to synchronize. You can synchronize the calendar, contacts, Gmail, Google Photos, Google Play Books, Internet, or Picasa Web albums.

Location Services

Use Location Services to configure how the phone determines your location.

Use Wireless Networks

Before using applications such as Google Maps to find your location or search for places of interest, you must enable the Use wireless networks option or enable the GPS satellites.

- 1. Press and tap Settings > Location Services.
- Tap Use wireless networks to enable location information using the wireless network.

Use GPS Satellites

This option allows you to locate locations accurately to street level. To conserve power, deselect this option when not in use.

- 1. Press and tap Settings > Location Services.
- 2. Tap Use GPS satellites to enable the GPS satellite.

Location and Google search

This option allows Google to use your location data for improved search results and other services.

- 1. Press and tap > Settings > Location Services.
- Tap Location and Google search to activate the feature.

Security Settings

The Security settings allow you to determine the security level for the phone.

Screen Lock

Choose settings for unlocking your screen.

- 1. Press and tap Settings > Security > Screen lock.
- 2. Select one of the screen lock options:
 - Swipe: Swipe the screen to unlock it.
 - Pattern: A screen unlock pattern is a touch pattern you create and use to unlock your device. Follow the prompts to create or change the screen unlock pattern.
 - PIN: Select a PIN to use for unlocking the screen.
 - Password: Create a password for unlocking the screen.
 - None: No swipe, pattern, PIN, or password is required. The screen does not lock.

Lock Screen Options

From this menu you can activate or deactivate various Unlock screen functions.

Note: The Lock screen options are only available when the Screen lock option is set to Swipe or Motion.

- Press and tap Settings > Security > Lock screen options.
- 2. Select an option:
 - Shortcuts: Sets shortcuts that display at the bottom of the Lock screen.
 - Clock: Displays the digital clock while the Lock screen is active. Enabled by default.
 - Dual clock: Displays a set of dual digital clocks on the Lock screen while traveling. Tap the entry to set your home city. This time zone is the one used by one of these on-screen clocks.
 - Weather: Displays the current area weather on the Lock screen. Tap and set both the temperature units (F or C) and a refresh time.
 - Help text: Displays help information on the Lock screen.

Note: These options vary depending on the selected Lock settings.

Owner Information

This option displays owner information on the lock screen. You can also enter text to the display screen.

- 1. Press and tap >Settings > Security >
- 2. Enter the text to display on the screen in the Owner information field.
- Tap the Show owner info on lock screen checkbox if you want to display the Owner information.
- 4. Tap **ok**.

Encryption

To require a numeric PIN or password in order to decrypt your phone each time it is turned on or encrypt the data on the SD card each time it is connected:

- Press and tap Settings > Security > Encrypt device. Read the screen for more information about encryption.
- 2. Tap Encrypt device.
- Tap Encrypt external SD card to prevent another user from using your SD card to make unauthorized calls or from accessing information stored on your SD card by protecting the information using a password.

When enabled, your phone will ask for a password each time you use the phone. Using this option you can also change your SD card PIN number.

Important: The battery should be more than 80 percent charged because encryption could take an hour or more to complete.

Passwords

When enabled, password characters display briefly as they are entered.

- Press and tap > Settings > Security > Passwords.
- Tap Make passwords visible to enable or diable the display of password characters.

Device Administration

Select one or more administration application that control your device for security purposes (for example, if your phone is lost or stolen). These applications enforce remote or local device security policies.

Some features a device administrator might control are:

Setting the number of failed password attempts before the device is restored to factory settings.

- Automatically locking the device.
- Restoring factory settings.

Note: If a device uses multiple enabled administration applications, the strictest policy is enforced.

- Press and tap >Settings > Security > Device administrators.
- Select a device administrator and follow the prompts. If no device administrators are listed, download one or more from the Play Store.

Unknown Sources

This feature allows you to download and install non-Market applications.

► Press and tap > Settings > Security > Unknown sources

WARNING: Enabling this option makes your phone and personal data more vulnerable to attack by applications from unknown sources.

Credential Storage — Trusted Credentials

If a certificate authority (CA) certificate gets compromised or for some other reason becomes unstable, you can disable or remove it.

Press and tap Settings > Security > Trusted credentials.

Two tabs display:

- System: Displays CA certificates that are permanently installed in the ROM of your device.
- User: Displays any CA certificates that were installed, for example, in the process of installing a client certificate.
- 2. Tap a CA certificate to examine its details.
- Scroll to the bottom of the details screen and tap Disable to disable a System certificate or Remove to remove a User certificate.

Caution!: When you disable a system CA certificate, the Disable button changes to Enable, so you can enable the certificate again, if necessary. When you remove a user-installed CA certificate, it is permanently deleted and must be re-installed, if needed.

4. Tap **OK** to return to the certificate list.

Install from Device Storage

Install encrypted certificates from an installed memory card.

Note: The phone must have an installed memory card containing encrypted certificates to use this feature.

- Press and tap > Settings > Security > Install from device storage.
- 2. Select a certificate and follow the prompts to install.

Clear Credentials

This feature clears stored credentials.

Press and tap Settings > Security > Clear credentials.
 All certificates are removed.

Language and Input

Use this menu to configure the language to display on menus. You can also set onscreen keyboard options.

Language

Change the language used by your device by following these steps:

- Press and tap > Settings > Language and Input > Language.
- 2. Select a language from the list.

Default Input Method

Change the keyboard used by your device by following these steps:

- Press and tap Settings > Language and Input > Default.
- Select Samsung keyboard.
- Tap Configure input methods. and select Google voice typing or Samsung keyboard.
- 4. Tap the icon next to the input method to configure the settings.

Google Voice Typing

This feature listens to voice input and translates it into text.

Note: You must select Google voice typing as the default input method before managing its settings.

- 1. Press and tap Settings > Language and Input.
- 2. Tap the icon next to Google voice typing to access the following options:
 - Select input languages: Select a language for input. Select Automatic to use the local language or select a language from the list.
 - Block offensive words: Blocks recognized offensive words.

Voice Search

The Voice Search feature is a voice-activated application that allows you to tell the phone what to search for and then the phone activates a Google search based on what was said.

- 1. Press and tap Settings > Language and Input
 - > Voice search.
- 2. Select one of the following options:

- Language: Sets the language used for voice input and output.
- SafeSearch: Filters explicit images when performing voice searches. Selections: Off, Moderate, or Strict.
- Block offensive words: Blocks recognized offensive words.
- Personalized recognition: Improves speech recognition and accuracy by allowing Google to associate your recordings with your Google Account.
- Google Account dashboard: manages collected data using your Google account.

Text-to-Speech Output

The Text-to-speech output feature allows the phone to provide a verbal readout of onscreen data such as messages and incoming caller information (based on Caller ID).

 Press and tap > Settings > Language and Input > Text-to-speech output. For more information, see "Text-to-Speech Settings" on page 88.

Backup and Reset Settings

The phone's Privacy menu includes the Factory Data Reset option. This option lets you reset your phone to the original factory settings, which erases all data from the phone's application storage, including:

Backup and Restore

The phone can be configured to back up your current settings, application data and settings.

- Press and tap Settings > Backup and reset.
- Tap Back up my data to create a backup of the current phone settings and applications.
- Tap Backup account to assign the account being backed up.
- Tap Automatic restore to assist in the re-installation of a previously installed application (including preferences and data).
- Tap Factory data reset to reset your phone and sound settings to the factory default settings.

Factory Data Reset

From this menu reset the phone and sound settings to the factory default settings.

- 1. Press and tap > Settings > Backup and reset > Factory data reset.
- 2. Read the onscreen reset information then tap Reset device.
- If necessary, enter your password and tap Delete all. The phone resets to the factor default settings.

System Settings

Using the System Settings menu you can configure way the phone behaves when it is docked. You can also configure the phone's time and date.

Accessory Settings

Accessory settings configure the Dock Sound, output mode for Audio, and Desk home screen display.

Dock Settings

This menu allows you to assign external speakers when the phone is docked.

- 1. Press and tap >Settings > Accessory.
- Tap **Dock sound** to play sounds when you insert or remove the phone from the dock.
- Tap Audio output mode to use the external dock speakers when the phone is docked.
- Tap Desk home screen display to display the desk home screen when the phone is docked.

Date and Time Settings

Your phone obtains its time and date information by using the network-provided date, time, and time zone. These values can be manually altered.

- 1. Press and tap >Settings > Date and time.
- Tap Automatic date and time to disable the feature. If enabled, you cannot alter the date, time zone, or time values.
- Tap Automatic time zone to disable the feature. If enabled, you cannot alter the time zone values.

- Tap Set date. Adjust the date, month, and year. Tap Set when finished.
- Tap Set time. Adjust the hour and minute. Tap the am or pm icon to change the value. Tap Set when finished.
- Tap Select time zone, and then select a time zone from the onscreen list. Scroll down the list to view additional time zones.
- Tap Use 24-hour format to toggle between using a 12-hour or a 24-hour format.
- Tap Select date format to select how the date information is displayed on your phone. The selected date format is also applied to the date displayed within the phone's Alarm Clock.

Accessibility Settings

The Accessibility settings menu lets you set several options to simplify phone use and improve accessibility for users with vision or hearing issues.

This service is able to collect all the text you type, including personal data credit card numbers except passwords. It may also log your user interface interactions. Using TalkBack, every interaction and

keypress is explained in audio. The Accessibility menu also allows you to set various vision, hearing, and access options.

- 1. Press and tap >Settings > Accessibility.
- 2. Select settings from the following options:

System Settings

- Auto-rotate screen: Automatically rotates the screen from landscape to portrait.
- Speak passwords: The phone reads password information aloud.
- The power key ends call: Pressing the Power key ends the active call.
- Accessibility shortcut: Accesses the Accessibility menu by pressing and holding the Power key.
- Screen timeout: Turns the screen off when there is no activity for a determined amount of time.

TalkBack Settings

This feature uses synthesized speech to describe the results of actions. The following procedures enhance TalkBack capabilities.

- Press and tap Settings > Accessibility > TalkBack.
- Tap the TalkBack OFF/ON slider to turn on TalkBack.
- 3. Tap **Settings** and configure the following:
 - Ringer volume: Provides voice feedback at all ringer volumes or not to provide voice feedback during silent or vibrate mode.
 - Speak when screen is off: Provides voice feedback when the screen is off.
 - Speak caller ID: Provides voice feedback for caller ID.
 - Use proximity sensor: Silences voice feedback when the proximity sensor is engaged.
 - Bluetooth output: Provides voice feedback through Bluetooth connections when available.
 - Vibration feedback: Increases the vibration intensity of key presses.
 - Assign vibration patterns: Select vibration patterns to differentiate between touchable and clickable items.

- Sound feedback: Enables sound feedback when you touch the screen.
- Sound volume: Customizes the volume return based upon the volume of your voice. Choose from Match speech volume, 75% of speech volume, or 50% of speech volume.
- Assign sounds: Select sounds to differentiate between touchable and clickable items.

Vision

- Install Web scripts: Allows applications to install scripts from Google that make their Web content more accessible. Tap Allow.
- Negative colors: Reverses the display of onscreen colors from White text on a Black background to Black text on a White background.
- Font size: Changes the size of the fonts used on the phone within menus, options, etc.
 Choose from: Tiny, Small, Normal, Large, or Huge.

Hearing

 Mono audio: Compresses stereo audio into a single mono audio stream for use with a single earbud/earphone. Turn off all sounds: Mutes every sound made by the phone during taps, selections, notifications, and more.

Mobility

 Tap and hold delay: Select a time interval for this action. Choose from: Short, Medium, or Long.

Developer Options

Use the Developer Options to set options for application development.

Press and tap > Settings > Developer options.

Important: These features are used for development purposes only.

USB Debugging

When enabled, this allows debugging when the phone is attached to a PC by a USB cable.

 Press and tap > Settings > Developer options > USB debugging. A checkmark indicates activation.

Development Device ID

This is the identification number for your phone when using it as a development tool.

Allowing Mock Locations

If you are a developer who is testing a GPS applications using this device, you can use mock locations to tell the device that the phone is at different GPS locations. The phone is allowed to "mock" the coordinates.

Important: These features are used for development purposes only.

Press and tap > Settings > Developer options > Allow mock locations. A checkmark displays to indicate activation.

Desktop Backup Password

This protects the desktop with a backup password ID.

Press and tap >Settings > Developer options > Desktop backup password.

- In the Settings screen, enter the current full backup password, the new password for the full backups, then enter the new password again.
- 3. Tap Set backup password to save.

User Interface Options

Configure the user interface by determining the way the screen behaves when using applications or displaying data.

- Press and tap >Settings > Developer options.
- 2. Tap the checkbox next to each option to enable:
 - Strict mode: Makes the screen flash when applications perform long operations on the main thread.
 - Show pointer location: Highlights the data that was touched on the screen.
 - Show touches: Displays touch interactions on the screen.
 - Show screen updates: Areas of the screen flash when they update.

- Show CPU usage: Screen highlights the current CPU usage.
- Force GPU rendering: Uses a 2D acceleration in applications.
- Window animation scale: Configure the scale for animation (ranges from off to 10x).
- Transition animation scale: Configure the scale for transitioning when using animation (ranges from off to 10x).

Application Options

These options allow you to manage applications that are running in the background.

- Press and tap >Settings > Developer options.
- Tap Do not keep activities to destroy every activity as soon as the application is closed.
- Tap Limit background processes to set the number of processes that can run in the background.
 Options are: Standard limit, No background processes, and 1 to 4 processes at most.

 Tap Show all ANRs to display a prompt when applications running in the background are not responding.

Activate This Device

This feature allows you to activate your Boost Mobile phone. If your phone is activated, this feature displays information such as your plan type, monthly payment date, and current usage details.

System Update Settings

This feature contains tools that allow you to update the phone to the latest PRL, Profile, Samsung Software, and Firmware. Access this menu on a regular basis to ensure that your phone maintains the most recent system enhancements and security features.

Update PRL

This option allows you to download and automatically update the preferred roaming list (PRL).

- 1. Press and tap Settings > System Update > Update PRL
- 2. Follow the onscreen instructions.

Update Profile

This option automatically updates your online user profile information. If you choose to change your user name and select a new one online, you must update the user name on your phone.

- Press and tap Settings > System Update > Update profile.
- Follow the onscreen instructions.

Note: If your data services or account syncing unexpectedly stops working, use this feature to reconnect with the network.

Update Samsung Software

Use this feature to upgrade your phone to the latest version of SPH-M830 software for your Samsung Galaxy Rush^{TM} phone.

- Press and tap Settings > System Update > Update Samsung Software.
- 2. Follow the onscreen instructions.

Update Firmware

Once all the data is backed up on the phone, use the Update Firmware option to update the phone firmware.

Press and tap Settings > System Update > Update Firmware.

The phone automatically downloads and installs any available updates. You may be required to power the phone off and back on to complete the software upgrade.

About Device

The About Device menu lets you access important phone information, such as the phone model number, Android version, Baseband version, Kernel version, Build, signal strength, mobile network type, service state, mobile network state, IMEI number, Wi-Fi MAC address, Bluetooth address, phone number, software version network, and legal information.

Status

This option displays the battery status, the level of the battery (percentage), the phone number for this phone,

battery status and level, User name, and signal strength.

► Press and tap >Settings > About device > Status.

Legal Information

This option displays information about Open source licenses as well as Google legal information. This information clearly provides copyright and distribution legal information and facts as well as Google Terms of Service, Terms of Service for Android-powered Phones, and much more pertinent information as a reference.

- Press and tap Settings > About device > Legal information.
- 2. Tap one of the legal information categories to view information:
 - Open source licenses
 - Google legal
 - Privacy Alert



Tip: Swipe the entry left to right to place a call or from right to left to send a message.

Save a Number from the Call Log

Get Started with Contacts

Here is some basic information about contacts.

- You can create a Google contact, a phone contact, or a Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync contact.
- Contacts are stored locally to the phone's memory.
- Contact entries are automatically sorted alphabetically.
- Google contacts are shared with your existing Google account and you can import them to the phone after creating a Google Mail account.
- Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync (also known as Work or Outlook) contacts are those contacts intended to share with either an Exchange Server or from within Microsoft® Outlook®.

Note: Contacts stored locally can be lost if the phone is ever reset to its factory default parameters.

Access Contacts

Here are two ways to display contacts:

- Press and tap Contacts.
 - or -
- 2. Press and tap <a> > Contacts tab.

The Contacts List

Your phone automatically sorts Contact entries alphabetically. You can create either a Google, Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync, or Phone contact.

- 1. Press and tap Contacts to display the Contacts list.
 - The Contacts list displays all contacts stored to the phone's memory including Google contacts, Exchange ActiveSync contacts, Phone contacts, and Facebook contacts.
- 2. Scroll through the list to view all your contacts.
- 3. Tap a contact entry to view it.

Tip: Tap a letter on the right side of the list to jump directly to contacts listed under that letter.

Contacts List Options

- 4. Press **t** to display these options:
 - Delete: Erases the currently selected contact(s).
 - Import/Export: Imports or exports the selected contact information from a specified location.
 - Merge with Google: Joins your phone contacts with a Google account accounts.
 - Accounts: Displays your managed accounts.
 - Speed dial setting: Assigns a speed dial number to a selected contact.
 - Send email: Sends an email to the selected contact using Gmail or Email.

Note: You must add a Google or Email account before sending an email.

- Send message: Send a text message to the selected contact.
- Contacts to display: Selects a specific location from which to access contacts that display in your Contacts list.

Settings: Displays options for viewing contacts, including whether to show only contacts with phone numbers and whether to list or display by first name or last name. There is also an option to select how contacts are transferred to another device, either individually or as a full group.

Add a Contact

You can add contacts directly from the Contacts application. Enter details such as name, phone number(s), email address, mailing address, and more.

- Press and tap Contacts to display the Contacts list.
- 2. Tap + (at the top of the screen).
- Tap a destination type (Phone, Google, or Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync). The Create contact screen displays.

Note: You must establish a Google or Exchange ActiveSync account to select a destination.

4. Tap the picture icon to assign a picture to this entry. There are three selections:

- Picture: Retrieves a stored image from your Gallery or from My files folder and assigns it to this entry. Tap an image to assign the image to the contact, then tap Done.
- Take picture: Use the camera to take a new picture and assign it to this entry, then tap Save After you take a picture, you are prompted to crop the picture before assigning it to the contact. When complete, tap Done.
- Remove: Although not an option with a new entry, deletes any previously assigned image in an existing contact entry.
- Tap the Name field and use the onscreen keyboard to enter the full name.

- or -

Tap **to the right of the Name** field to enter additional name fields.

- 6. Tap the **Phone number** field. The number keypad displays.
- Tap the Mobile icon to change the phone type.
 Selections are: Mobile, Home, Work, Work Fax, Home Fax, Pager, Other, Custom, or Callback.

- 8. Tap the **Email address** field to enter the contact's email address. Tap

- Vibration pattern: Sets a specific type of vibration.
- Add another field: Tap this button to add another field such as Phonetic name, Organization, IM, Notes, Nickname, Website, Internet call, or Relationship.

Add an Emergency Contact

In Case of Emergency (ICE) contacts are those marked with the letters 'ICE' so emergency personnel will know who to contact in case of an emergency if you are unable to communicate that information. For example, if your Mother is your primary emergency contact, list her as ICE-Mom in Contacts. You add an ICE contact that same way you add a regular contact to your Contacts list, except that you select the Group entry ICE - emergency contacts to make this contact easy to locate.

Save a Phone Number to Contacts

- Remove: Although not an option with a new entry, deletes any previously assigned image in an existing contact entry.
- 8. Tap the **Name** field and use the onscreen keyboard to enter the full name.

Tap vo to the right of the Name field to enter additional name fields.

- Tap the Phone number field. The number keypad displays.

Assign a New Picture to a Contact

Use these steps to add a picture to a contact through taking a new photo.

Synchronize Contacts

Syncing data from your managed accounts allows you to add and manage a new or existing contact from your online or remote accounts to your phone.

You must create a Google or Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync (Outlook) account with contact entries, and sign in to the account using your phone prior to synchronizing.

When you synchronize, any Contact entries (with phone numbers, email addresses, pictures, etc.) are updated and synchronized with your Samsung Galaxy Rush™.)

To synchronize Gmail contacts:

Press and tap > Settings > Accounts and sync.

- Tap the Gmail account to view the account's synchronization settings.
- Tap each category to synchronize. You can synchronize the calendar, contacts, Gmail, Google Photos, Google Play Books, Internet, or Picasa Web albums.

Note: In order to use Sync Picasa Web Albums, Picasa must be downloaded through your Gmail credentials.

To synchronize Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync contacts:

- 3. Tap each category to synchronize.

Note: You must log in to your Gmail or Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync (Outlook) account using the phone before you can synchronize contacts.

- Sync Email: synchronizes your exchange email to any updated email existing on the remote Exchange server.
- Sync Tasks: synchronizes your exchange calendar task entries between your phone and the remote Exchange server.

Add Entries to Favorites

The Favorites tab is a listing that can help you quickly access your most used or preferred Contacts entries.

- Press and tap Contacts to display the Contacts list.
- 2. Touch and hold the entry name from Contacts.
- 3. Tap Add to favorites.

Tip: You can add or remove an entry from the Favorites list by tapping the star on the upper-right portion of the Contacts details page. The star turns orange when added. Tap again to remove.

Add Facebook Content to Your Contacts

You can add your Facebook contacts' information. such as pictures, email, and phone numbers directly to vour Contacts list. All of the current contacts' information is transferred to the phone.

Note: To add Facebook contacts you must have an active Facebook page populated with friends sharing their contact information

If a Contacts entry already exists with a slightly different name, separate entries are created that you can link (join) into a single entry. For more information, see "Join a Contact" on page 72.

Add Your Facebook Friends to Your Contacts.

Before you can add your friends, you must add your Facebook account to the list of managed and synchronized accounts. This process is similar to synchronizing your email accounts.

This process synchronizes contact information, status, events, and more.

1. Press and tap > Settings > Accounts and svnc.

- Tap Facebook (for syncing) to view the account's synchronization settings.
- 3. Tap **Sync Contacts** to synchronize your Facebook contacts. If you want to synchronize immediately, tap Sync now.

Create Groups

This feature allows you to add a new or existing contact to a call group. This group can be one of the already created groups (Family, Friends, or Work) or a user-created group.

To create a new group:

- Press and tap Contacts > Groups.

- 3. Tap the **Group name** field and enter a name for the new group.
- 4. Tap **Group ringtone** and select a ringtone for the aroup.
- 5. Tap Vibration pattern and select a vibration pattern for the group.

- Tap Done when finished adding members, then tap Save.

To send a message to a group:

- Press and tap Contacts > Groups.
- Tap an existing group and then press > Send message.
- Select the recipients of the new message then tap Done.
- 4. Type a message, then tap Send.

Share a Contact

Share contacts using Bluetooth, email, Gmail, or through a text message.

- Press and tap Contacts.
- Tap a contact to display, then press > Share namecard via.
- Send the current contact information to an external recipient using one of the following methods:

Bluetooth: Sends the information using Bluetooth.

Note: You must activate Bluetooth before using the Bluetooth feature and the recipient's device must be visible.

- Email: Sends the information as an email attachment. If prompted, select an email account. Address the message, add a subject and a message, and then tap Send.
- Gmail: Sends the information as a Gmail attachment. Address the message, add a subject and a message, and then tap Send.
- Messaging: Sends the information as an MMS message attachment. Select a contact or enter a wireless phone number or email address, enter additional information, then tap Send.
- Wi-Fi Direct: Sends the information using a phone-to-device connection.

Google Calendar is an application that synchronizes new and existing entries between your Samsung Galaxy Rush™ and your online Google account.

Calendar

Use Calendar to create and manage events, meetings, and appointments. Your Calendar helps organize your time and reminds you of important events. Depending on your synchronization settings, your phone's Calendar stays in sync with your Calendar on the Web, Exchange ActiveSync calendar, and Outlook calendar.

Add an Event to the Calendar

Add events to your Calendar to help you organize your time and remind you of important events.

1. Press and tap ::: > 31 Calendar.

Note: To synchronize calendar events among Google and Corporate accounts, make sure they are managed by your phone.

Tap the circle in the top-right corner of the screen, then select a view from the available tabs. Selections are: Year, Month, Week, Day, List, and Task.

- 3. Double-tap a day in which to add an event.
 - or -

Tap 🛨

- 4. Touch the Add event tab.
- Touch the Calendar field, select an account in which to assign this event, and then tap Edit event details.
- 6. Tap the **Title** field and enter a title for the event.
- 7. Select From/To dates and times.
- 8. Select a Time zone.
- 9. Tap the All day checkbox if this events lasts all day.
- Tap Repeat and select a recurrence cycle. Selections are: One-time event, Daily, Every weekday(Mon-Fri), Weekly (every [day]), Every 2 weeks(day), Monthly (every [number] [day]), Monthly (on day [number]), or Yearly (on [month] [day]).

- 11. Enter a location for this event in the **Location** field, or tap to select the location from a map.
- Enter a description for this event in the Description field.
- Tap the Reminders field to select an alarm time.
 Tap Customize to enter your own reminder time.
- 14. Tap to the right of **Images** to take a new picture, or add an image from the Gallery.

Note: To send the event to specific contacts via your Email account, tap Forward. For more information, see "Email" on page 120.

 Tap Save to store the new event and synchronize it with the selected account.

Event Alerts

When the phone is turned on and you have an event alarm scheduled, your phone sounds an alert and displays the event summary. There are several ways your phone alerts for scheduled events:

- Playing an assigned ringtone.
- Displaying the Alert screen.

Event Reminders

When your phone is turned on and you have an event alarm scheduled, there are several ways your phone alerts you to scheduled events:

- Playing a short beep.
- Displaying an icon in the Status bar.

To view additional options:

- Tap the Status bar, and then slide your finger down the screen to open the Notifications panel.
- Tap the event name from the list to display the event on the Calendar notifications screen.
- 3. Tap an option:
 - Set snooze duration: Sets the length of time to allow before you are reminded of the event. Choose from: 3 minutes, 5 minutes, 10 minutes, 15 minutes, or 30 minutes.
 - Snooze: Reminds you of the event at a future time.
 - Dismiss: Dismisses the reminder.

View Events

Use this procedure to view your calendar events.

- 1. Press and tap | 31 Calendar. When an event is created, the entry displays in the default view.
- Tap the circle in the top-right corner of the screen, then tap Week or Month to view events scheduled after today.
- 3. Tap the day in which to view events. (Events display in chronological order).
- Tap the event to view details.

Day and List Views

Day view displays a list of the events of one day.

List view displays a list of all the events in chronological order.

When in Day view, slide left or right across the screen to view earlier or later days.

Week View

Week view displays a chart of the events of one week. In Week view:

- Touch and hold a time slot to create a new event.
- Tap an event to view details.
- Slide left or right across the screen to view earlier or later weeks.

Month View

Month view displays markers on days that have events scheduled.

In Month view:

- Tap a day to view the events for that day.
- Touch and hold a day to create a new event.
- Slide up or down to view earlier or later months.

Erase Events

Use this procedure to erase calendar events.

1. Press and tap 31 Calendar.

- 2. Open the calendar event details:
 - In Day, Week, and List views, tap the calendar event to delete.
 - In Year view, tap the month in which the event occurs.
- 3. Press 📤 > Delete
- Tap OK in the Delete confirmation box.
 If this is a recurring event, select Only this event,
 This & future events, or All events, and tap OK.

Alarm & Timer

Use the following methods to create an alarm event.

- 1. Press and tap | Solution | Clock. The alarm and media application screen displays.
 - Alarm: Set an alarm to ring at a specific time.
 - World clock: View the time in other parts of the world. World Clock displays time in hundreds of different cities, within all 24 time zones around the world.
 - Stopwatch: Measures intervals of time.

- Timer: Acts as a countdown timer. Counts down time to an based on a preset time length (hours, minutes, and seconds).
- 2. Tap (Create alarm).
- Adjust the hour and minute using the up/down arrows and then adjust the AM or PM value. When complete, tap Set.

Note: The number of hours and minutes left before the alarm goes off briefly displays onscreen after setting the new alarm time.

- Tap the Alarm repeat field to select a repeating status for the alarm.
- Tap the day(s) to repeat this alarm, or tap Repeat weekly to check all boxes.
- Tap Alarm type to select Melody, Vibration, Vibration and melody, or Briefing.
- 7. Slide the alarm volume slider left or right to decrease or increase the alarm volume.
- Tap Alarm tone to select a ringtone that plays with the alarm.

- Tap the Snooze ON/OFF slider to activate the Snooze feature.
- Tap Snooze and set a duration (3, 5, 10, 15, or 30 minutes) and tap a number of times for Snooze to repeat (1, 2, 3, 5, or 10 times).
- 11. Tap the Smart alarm ON/OFF slider on to activate the Smart alarm feature.

Smart alarm tracks body movement and calculates the best time to sound the alarm. Place the phone on the bed, and then the phone's movement sensor (accelerometer) detects the movements that set off the alarm.

Note: If you set the smart alarm, the sound starts quiets a few minutes early and slowly increases the volume.

My Files

My files allows you to manage your sounds, images, videos. Bluetooth files. Android files, and other memory card data in one convenient location. This application allows you to launch a file if the associated application is already on your phone.

- 1. Press and tap :::: >
 - - My files.
- 2. The following folders display:
 - extSdCard: display files saved to your phone.
 - sdcard: displays all of the files saved to your microSD card.

Note: Different folders may display depending on how your phone is configured.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth phones, such as headsets and hands-free car kits, and Bluetooth-enabled handheld devices. computers, printers, and wireless phones. The Bluetooth communication range is usually approximately 30 feet.

Turn Bluetooth On or Off

The following procedures will guide you through turning on and turning off your Bluetooth device.

- Press and tap > Settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. Tap the Bluetooth OFF/ON slider on Bluetooth.

Tip: You can also turn Bluetooth on and off through the Notifications panel. Drag the Notifications panel down and tap Bluetooth to enable or disable Bluetooth.

Turn off Bluetooth when not in use to conserve battery power, or in places where using a wireless phone is prohibited, such as aboard an aircraft and in hospitals.

The Bluetooth Settings Menu

The following procedure provides you with a path to the Bluetooth settings menu.

A microSD™ (Secure Digital) or microSDHC™ card is an optional accessory that allows you to store images, videos, music, documents, and voice data on your phone.

Insert a microSD Card*

Use the following procedures to insert the microSD/microSDHC card from your phone.

- Using your fingernail, lift the microSD cover upward.
- 2. Orient the card with the gold strips facing down.
- Firmly press the card into the slot and make sure that it catches with the push-click insertion.

Note: *microSD Card not included. Must be purchased separately.

Remove a microSD Card

Use the following procedures to remove the microSD/microSDHC card from your phone.

- Using your fingernail, lift the microSD cover upward.
- Firmly press the card into the slot and release it. The card should pop partially out of the slot.
- 3. Remove the card from the slot.
- 4. Replace the battery cover.

Important: Please be careful when inserting, removing, or handling the microSD card and its adapter because is it easily damaged during improper operation.

Do not over-insert the card as this can damage the contact pins.

Be sure to use only recommended memory cards. Using non-recommend memory cards could cause data loss and damage to your phone.

Make sure the battery is fully charged before using the memory card. Your data may become damaged or unusable if the battery runs out while using the memory card.

View the microSD Card Memory

Use the following procedure to view the microSD card memory information.

▶ Press and tap > Settings > Storage. (The total and available memory space displays.)

Format the microSD Card

Formatting a microSD card permanently removes all files stored on the card.

- Scroll down the screen, tap Format SD card > Format SD card > Delete all.

Important: The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSD card, after which you CANNOT retrieve files. To prevent the loss of important data, please check the contents before you format the card

Unmount the microSD Card

When you need to remove the microSD card, you must first unmount the microSD card to prevent corrupting the data stored on it or damaging the card. Since you will remove the battery first before you can remove the microSD card, close all running applications on your phone and save any data first.

- Tap Unmount SD card.
- Remove the microSD card. See "Remove a microSD Card" on page 82.

Update Your Phone

From time to time, updates may become available for your phone. You can download and apply updates through the **Settings** > **About Phone** menu.

Update Your Phone Firmware

Update your phone's software using the **Update Firmware** option.

Before Updating Your Firmware

Updating your phone firmware erases all user data from your phone. You must back up all critical information before updating the phone firmware.

Back Up All Data Prior to Update

To back up your Gmail information:

- Press and tap >Settings > Accounts and sync.
- 2. Tap the **Auto-sync** option to enable the feature.
 - If the Auto-sync option is on, email, Calendar and Contacts automatically synchronize whenever a change is made.

• If the Auto-sync option is off, tap the sync icon within the account field to reveal the account's synchronization settings screen.

To back up your Exchange Mail information:

- 1. Press and tap > Settings > Accounts and sync.
- Tap the sync icon within the Corporate account field to display the account's synchronization settings screen.
- 3. Toggle the onscreen checkmark to manually synchronize the desired parameters.

To back up your Google™ applications:

Your Google™ application purchases are reloaded remotely and can be re-installed after the update is applied.

- 1. Log into your Google account using the phone.
- Tap > My Apps.
- Scroll through the list of previously downloaded Google applications and choose the application to reinstall.

Follow the onscreen instructions.

As an added precaution, please remove the microSD card prior to starting the update process in order to preserve data.

Update Your Phone Firmware

Once you have backed up all your data, use the Update Firmware option to update your phone firmware.

The phone automatically downloads and installs any available updates. You may be required to power the phone off and back on to complete the software upgrade.

The following information will guide you through using Voice Services.

Voice Dialer

You can use your Samsung Galaxy Rush™ built-in automatic speech recognition (ASR) software, called Voice Dialer, to dial a phone number in your Contacts or to launch phone functions. All you have to do is to talk into the phone, and ASR recognizes your voice and completes the tasks.

Activating Voice Dialer

1. Press and tap Sound > Woice Dialer.

The screen displays "Listening" and the phone prompts you to say the name of the command you want to use. To complete your task, follow the voice prompts or tap an onscreen option.

Available ASR commands include:

- Call <Name> to call an entry in your Contacts list.
- Dial <#> to call a spoken phone number.
- Redial to redial the last number called.
- Open <Menu> to jump directly to menu items or applications.

Tip: Use Voice Dialer in a quiet environment so it can accurately recognize your commands.

Calling a Contact with Voice Dialer

- 1. Press and tap Some Voice Dialer.
- When "Listening" displays, say "Call" followed by the name and the label for the contact to call. For example, say "Call John Smith Mobile." The device displays the name it understands on the screen.
 - If the location is not recognized or the name does not have a phone number stored in Contacts, a list of onscreen options displays.
 - If a name has only a single number, or if you know the name but are not sure which number to call, say "Call" followed by the name only. For example, say "Call John."
 - If the name is recognized and there is only one phone number for the name. Tap OK to dial the number.
 - If there are multiple numbers, a list displays; tap a number to place the call.

Calling a Phone Number with Voice Dialer

1. Press and tap Some Voice Dialer.

When "Listening" displays, say "Dial" followed immediately by a valid string of digits to dial, for example, say "Call 555 5555."

Speak naturally and clearly and remember to speak one digit at a time — for example, pronounce 1-800 "One Eight Zero Zero."

Opening Menus With Voice Dialer

You can jump directly to many menu items or applications by saying "Go to" followed by a menu option.

- 1. Press and tap Sim > Woice Dialer.
- When "Listening" displays, say "Open." A list of valid actions displays.
- 3. Tap an option to open the selected menu.

Tip: You can also say "Open" and the name of the item you want to open. The item displays. Tap OK to open it.

Text-to-Speech

Allows the Samsung Galaxy Rush $^{\text{\tiny{IM}}}$ to provide a verbal readout of onscreen data such as messages and incoming caller information (based on Caller ID).

Text-to-Speech Settings

- Press and tap > Settings > Language and input > Text-to-speech output. For more information, see "Text-to-Speech Output" on page 54.
- 2. Select from the following options:

Preferred TTS engine

■ Google text-to-speech Engine: allows you to use and modify Google Text-to-speech settings. Tap the icon next to Google text-to-speech for additional settings.

General

Speech rate: Adjusts the rate at which the phone speaks onscreen text. Selections: Very slow, Slow, Normal, Fast, and Very fast.

- Listen to an example: Plays a sample text-to-speech feature sounds when activated.
- Driving mode: Reads incoming calls and new notifications aloud.

Pointer Speed

This feature allows you to adjust the speed of the Mouse/trackpad.

- Press and tap > Settings > Language and Input > Pointer speed.
- Use the slider to adjust the Pointer speed and tap OK.

Voice Search

The Voice Search feature is a voice-activated application that allows you to tell the phone what to search for and then the phone activates a Google search based on what was said.

You can use the camera or camcorder to take and share pictures and videos. Your phone comes with an 3.0 megapixel camera with an autofocus feature that lets you capture sharp pictures and videos.

Take Pictures

Taking pictures with your phone's built-in camera is as simple as choosing a subject, pointing the camera, then pressing the camera key.

Launch the Camera

Follow the below procedure to access your phone's camera.

▶ Press 📤 and tap 🔐 > 📵 Camera.





Viewfinder Screen

You will find the following controls on the Viewfinder screen.



Available options are:

- Front/back lens: Sets the front camera so you can take pictures of yourself or video chat.
- Flash: Tap to switch between various camera flash modes.
- Shooting mode: Sets the mode type for image output.
- 4. **Settings**: allows you to access the menu panel and lets you change the camera settings.

- Camera / Camcorder Mode: allows you to take a photo in various modes. Once you change the mode, the corresponding indicator appears at the top left of the display. Slide the button up for Camera, or down for Camcorder.
- Shutter release: Tap this button to take a photo or begin capturing video. Tap it again to stop capturing video.
- Gallery: Opens the Gallery application so you can browse through and view the photos and videos on your storage card.
- Volume key (not shown): Zoom in and out of the image.

Review Screen

After capturing a photo or video, the review screen lets you save, view, send, or delete the picture or video by tapping a button at the bottom of the screen.

After you take a photo or shoot a video, you can access various options from the Pictures and Videos Image Viewer.

Available options are:



Share: Offers several ways to share your picture or video. Options are: Group Cast, Picasa, S Memo, Bluetooth, Wi-Fi Direct, Messaging, Google+, Email, and Gmail.



Slideshow: View your photos in a slideshow or access the slideshow settings.



Menu: allows you to select one of the following:

- Delete: Allows you to delete the current picture.
- Face tag: Allows you add embedded tag information about those in your image.
- Copy to clipboard: Allows you to copy one or more pictures to a different folder.
- Rotate left: Allows you to rotate the view of the current image in a counterclockwise direction.
- Rotate right: Allows you to rotate the view of the current image in a clockwise direction.

- Crop: Provides an on-screen box that allows you to crop the current picture. Tap Save to update the image with the new dimensions or tap Discard to ignore any changes.
- Set picture as: Allows you to assign the current image as a Contact photo, Home and lock screens, Home screen wallpaper, or Lock screen wallpaper.
- Print: Prints the current image on a compatible Samsung printer.
- Rename: Renames the current file.
- Scan for nearby devices: Scans for in-range devices in which to connect and send the current image.
- Details: files details such as Title, Type, Date taken, Album, Location, Latitude, Longitude, etc.

Take a Picture

You can take high-resolution pictures using your phone's 5.0 megapixel camera.

- 1. Press and tap Camera
- Using the phone's main display screen as a viewfinder, adjust the image by aiming the camera at the subject.

Camera Settings

Open the menu panel to change the camera settings. You can also switch between photo and video modes from the menu panel.

Change Advanced Settings

To change the advanced settings on your camera, refer to the following procedures.

Tap to display the Settings menu and access more camera settings. You can change the following settings from the Settings menu:

- Edit shortcuts: allows you to set shortcut icons for the settings that you use the most.
- Self-portrait: allows you to set the front camera so you can take pictures of yourself or video chat.
- Flash: allows you to set the flash options to Off,
 On, or Auto flash.
- Shooting mode: allows you to set the shooting mode. Choose from the following options:
 - Single shot: Takes a single photo and view it before returning to the shooting mode.
 - Smile shot: The camera focuses on the face of your subject. Once the camera detects the person's smile, it takes the picture.
 - Panorama: Takes a landscape photo by taking an initial photo and then adding additional images to itself. The guide box lets you view the area wherein the second part of the panoramic picture should fall.

- Scene mode: allows you to set the Scene to help take the best pictures possible. Options include None, Portrait, Landscape, Night, Sports, Party/ Indoor, Beach/Snow, Sunset, Dawn, Fall Color, Firework, Text, Candlelight, and Backlight. Helpful tips are shown for each scene mode at the bottom of the display screen.
- Exposure value: allows you to adjust the overall image brightness. Use the onscreen slider to adjust the value. Choose from +2, -2, 0 (default).
- Focus mode: Set this option to Auto focus or Macro. Use Macro mode to take close-up pictures.

 Negative, Black and white, and Sepia.
- Resolution: Set the image size to:
 3.2M(2049x1536), 2M(1600x1200), 1.3M(1280x960),
 and 0.3M(640x480).

- White balance: Set this option to one of the following choices: Auto, Daylight, Cloudy, Incandescent. or Fluorescent.
- Metering: Set how the camera measures or meters the light source: Center-weighted, Spot, or Matrix.
- Guidelines: Turn the guidelines On or Off.
- Image quality: Sets the image quality to: Superfine,
 Fine, or Normal.
- GPS tag: Turn GPS On or Off (also known as Geotagging). The location of where the picture is taken is attached to the picture. (Only available in Camera mode.)
- Storage: Configure the default storage location for images or videos as either Phone or MicroSD card (if inserted).
- Reset: Resets all camera or camcorder settings to the default values.

View Pictures and Videos using Gallery

Using the Gallery application, you can view photos and watch videos that you've taken with your phone's camera, downloaded, or copied onto your storage card.

For photos that are on your storage card, you can do basic editing such as rotating and cropping. You can also easily make a photo as your contact picture or wallpaper and share photos with your friends.

Open Gallerv

The Gallery is where you can access the Gallery of stored camera images.

Working with Photos

You can touch and hold on a photo to open a selection menu and choose what to do with it. You can choose to delete the photo, rotate or crop it, and more.

Rotate and Save a Photo

To rotate or save your photo, follow the below procedures.

Crop a Photo

About Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth devices, such as headsets and hands-free car kits, and Bluetooth-enabled handhelds, computers, printers, and wireless devices. The Bluetooth communication range is usually up to approximately 30 feet.

Turning Bluetooth On and Off

By default, your Galaxy Rush™ Bluetooth feature is set to **Off**. Turning Bluetooth on activates the internal Bluetooth antenna.

Note: Activating Bluetooth can drain your battery faster and reduce your available usage times. It is recommended that if you do not need it active, turn it off.

It is also recommended to turn off your Bluetooth within locations that prohibit its use.

Bluetooth Settings

Bluetooth settings activate Bluetooth, view or assign a name for the phone, activate the phone so other Bluetooth devices can dicover it, or scan and pair with other Bluetooth devices.

The Bluetooth Settings Menu

The following procedure provides you with a path to the Bluetooth settings menu.

▶ Press and tap = > Settings > Bluetooth.

Change the Phone Name

The phone name identifies your phone to other phones.

- 1. Press and tap >Settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. If Bluetooth is not on, tap the Bluetooth OFF/ON slider on to turn it on.
- Enter the name for your phone in the dialog box, then tap **OK**.

Connect a Bluetooth Headset or Car Kit

You can listen to music over a Bluetooth stereo headset, or have hands-free conversations using a compatible Bluetooth headset or car kit. Use the same procedure to set up stereo audio and hands-free devices

To listen to music with your headset or car kit, the headset or car kit must support the A2DP Bluetooth profile.

- Press and tap >Settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. If Bluetooth is not on, tap the Bluetooth OFF/ON slider to turn it on.
- Set the headset to "discoverable" to your phone can find the headset. Refer to the instructions that came with the headset for discoverable mode instructions.
- Tap Scan. Your phone starts scanning for Bluetooth devices within range.
- Tap the name of this device when the name of the headset displays. You phone automatically tries to repair the headset.

If automatic pairing fails

Enter the passcode supplied with your headset.

The pairing and connection status displays below the hands-free headset or car kit name in the Bluetooth devices section. When the Bluetooth headset or car kit is connected to your phone, (Bluetooth connected) displays in the status bar. Depending on the type of headset or car kit connected, you can begin using the headset or car kit to listen to music or make and receive phone calls.

Note: Due to different specifications and features of other Bluetooth-compatible devices, display and operations may be different, and functions such as transfer or exchange may not be possible with all Bluetoothcompatible devices.

Reconnect a Bluetooth Headset or Car Kit

When you have paired a headset with your phone, the headset should automatically reconnect when you turn it on. However, sometimes you will need to reconnect manually, for example if you were using your headset with another Bluetooth device.

- 2. If Bluetooth is not on, tap the Bluetooth OFF/ON slider on to turn it on.
- 3. Make sure that the headset is set to discoverable mode.
- 4. Tap the headset's name in the Bluetooth devices section.
- 5. If prompted to enter a passcode, try 0000 or 1234. or consult the headset or car kit documentation to find the passcode.
- 6. If you still cannot reconnect to the headset or car kit, follow the instructions in "Disconnect or Unpair from a Bluetooth Device" on page 102, then follow the instructions in "Connect a Bluetooth Headset or Car Kit" on page 101.

Disconnect or Unpair from a Bluetooth Device

Follow these instructions to disconnect or unpair your phone from a Bluetooth device.

Disconnect from a Bluetooth Device

Press and tap > Settings > Bluetooth.

- 2. Tap the name of the device from which you want to disconnect.
- 3. From the Disconnect? prompt, tap OK.

Unpair from a Bluetooth Device

You can make your phone forget its pairing connection with another Bluetooth device. To connect to the other device again, you may need to enter or confirm a passcode again.

- 1. Press and tap >Settings > Bluetooth.
- 2. Tap next to the device to unpair.
- 3. Tap Unpair.

Send Information Using Bluetooth

You can use Bluetooth to transfer information between your phone and another Bluetooth-enabled device such as a phone or notebook computer. The first time you transfer information between your phone and another device, you need to enter or confirm a security passcode. After that, your phone and the other device are paired, and you will not need to exchange passcodes in the future.

Send Information From Your Phone to Another Device

You can send the following types of information, depending on the device you are sending to:

- Images and videos
- Calendar events
- Contacts
- Audio files
- Set the receiving device to discoverable mode. You
 may also need to set it to "Receive Beams" or
 "Receive Files". Refer to the device's
 documentation for instructions on receiving
 information over Bluetooth.

- 3. Calendar event. In the Calendar's Day view, Agenda view, or Week view, tap the event and then tap Share via > Bluetooth.
- 4. Music track. This feature is available through the Music Player. With the track displayed on the Now playing screen, tap = > Share music via > Bluetooth.
- 5. Tap Yes if you are prompted to turn on Bluetooth.
- Tap the name of the receiving device.
- 7. Accept the connection on the receiving phone (if prompted), and enter the same passcode on both your phone and the other device, or confirm the auto-generated passcode.
- 8. Accept the file on the receiving device.

The location where the information is saved depends on the type of information and the receiving device:

- If you send a calendar event or contact, it is normally added directly to the corresponding application on the receiving device. For example, if you send a calendar event to a compatible phone, the event display on that phone's calendar.
- If you send another file type to a Windows computer, it is normally saved in the Bluetooth Exchange folder within your personal document folders.
- If you send a file to another device, the saved location may depend on the file type. For example, if you send an image file to another wireless phone, it may be saved in a folder named "Images."

Receive Information Using Bluetooth

Your phone is capable of receiving a wide variety of file types with Bluetooth, including photos, music tracks, and documents such as PDFs.

1. Press and tap > Settings > Bluetooth.

- 2. If Bluetooth is not on, tap the Bluetooth OFF/ON slider on to turn it on.
- 3. Tap the check box next to your phone's Bluetooth name to make it discoverable.
- On the sending device, send one or more files to your phone. Refer to the device's documentation for instructions on sending information over Bluetooth.
- Enter the same passcode on both your phone and the other device (if prompted), or confirm the auto-generated passcode. A Bluetooth authorization request displays on your phone.
- When a message displays, tap Accept.
- Slide down the notifications panel, then tap the relevant notification.

When you open a received file, what happens next depends on the file type:

 Media files and documents usually open directly in a compatible application. For example, if you open a music track, it starts playing in the Music application.

- vCalendar file. Select the calendar where you want to save the event, then tap Import.
- vCalendar is added to your Calendar events.
- vCard contact file. If there are multiple vCard files on your storage card, you can choose to import one, several, or all of those contacts to your contacts list.

Service: The Basics

Setting Up Your Voicemail

Your device automatically transfers all unanswered calls to your voicemail, even if your device is in use or turned off. You should set up your Voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your device is activated.

Always use a password to protect against unauthorized access.

- Press then press and hold 1 ∞ .
- 2. Follow the system prompts to:
 - Create your password.
 - Record your name announcement.
 - Record your greeting.

Note: Voicemail Password

Boost Mobile strongly recommends that you create a password when setting up your voicemail to protect against unauthorized access. Without a password, anyone who has access to your device is able to access your voicemail messages.

Voicemail Notification

There are several ways the phone alerts you to a new message.

- Playing the assigned ringtone type.
- Displaying within the Notifications area of the Status bar when a single new unheard voicemail message is received.

Text Messaging (SMS)

With Text Messaging (SMS), you can send and receive instant text messages between your wireless phone and another messaging-ready phone.

Compose Text Messages

Quickly compose and sent text messages on your phone.

- 1. Press and tap Messaging.
- Tap the Enter recipient field and enter a Contacts name, a mobile phone number, or an email address using the onscreen keyboard.
- Tap the Enter message field and enter your message.
- 4. Review the message and tap

Multimedia Messaging (MMS)

Multimedia messages, or MMS, can contain text and pictures, recorded voice, audio or video files, picture slideshows, contact cards (vCard), or appointments (vCalendar).

- 1. Press and tap See > Messaging
- Tap the Enter recipient field and enter a Contacts name, a mobile phone number, or an email address using the onscreen keyboard.
- Tap the Enter message field and enter your message.
- 4. Tap 🕖
- 5. Select an attachment type:
 - Pictures: Tap an existing image from your Pictures list to add it to your message.
 - Take picture: Temporarily exits the message to take a photo with phone's camera. Tap Save to add the photo to your message.
 - Videos: Choose an existing video from the Videos list and then add it to your message.
 - Capture video: Temporarily exits the message to record a video clip using the phone's camcorder.
 Tap Save to add the video to your message.
 - Audio: Select an existing audio file from the Audio list and then add it to your message. Tap the circle to the right of the audio, then tap OK.

- Record audio: Temporarily exits the message to record an audio clip. The audio clip automatically attaches to the message.
- Memo: Attaches a memo you create.
- Calendar: Attaches a calendar event.
- Location: Attaches a thumbnail of a map displaying your location.
- Contacts: Tap on an existing Contacts entry then tap Done to add it to your message.

Caller ID

Caller ID identifies a caller by displaying the phone number of the incoming caller.

To hide your number when making a call, follow these steps.

- 1. Press and tap 🔃
- 2. Tap the Keypad tab.
- 3. Tap * P 6 MNO 7 PORS .
- 4. Enter a phone number, then tap .

Call Waiting

When you are on a call, Call Waiting alerts you to incoming calls by sounding a tone. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is waiting and displays the caller's phone number (if it is available).

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

- 1. Slide to the right to place the first caller on hold and answer the second call.
- 2. Tap Swap to switch back to the first caller.

3-way Calling

- Press and tap .
- 2. Tap the Keypad tab.
- 3. Enter a number and tap (.
- When the number connects, tap Add call and dial the second number.

The first caller is placed on hold while dialing the second number.

5. Tap Merge to merge the calls into a three-way all.

Note: If one person hangs up during the call, you and the remaining person stay connected. If you are first to hang up, all callers are disconnected.

Call Forwarding

Call Forwarding lets you forward all your incoming calls to another phone number – even when your phone is turned off. You can continue to make calls from your phone when you have activated Call Forwarding.

Important: You are charged a higher rate for forwarded calls.

To activate Call Forwarding:

- 1. Press 📤 and tap 📢
- 2. Tap * P 7 PGRS 2 ABC .
- Enter the area code and number in which to foward calls.
- 4. Tap ... A tone confirms Call Forwarding activation.

To deactivate Call Forwarding:

- 1. Press 🛆 and tap 🔙
- 2. Tap * P 7 PORS 2 ABC 0 +

 Tap . A message displays and a tone plays to confirm deactivation.

Getting Started with Data Services

With your Boost service, you are ready to start enjoying the advantages of data services. This section demonstrates the basics of using your data services, including managing your user name, launching a data connection, and navigating the Web with your Samsung Galaxy Rush[™].

Your User Name

When you buy your phone and sign up for service, you're automatically assigned a user name, which is typically based on your name and a number, followed by "@myboostmobile.sprintpcs.com."

When you use data services, your user name is submitted to identify you to the Boost Mobile network. Your user name is automatically programmed into yourphone. You don't have to enter it.

Updating Your User Name

If you choose to change your user name and select a new one online, you must then update the user name on your device.

- 1. Press and tap > Settings > System
 Update > Update profile.
- Follow the onscreen instructions.

Note: If your data services or account syncing unexpectedly stops working, use this feature to reconnect with the network.

Launching a Web Connection

- 1. Press and tap sim > (internet.
- 2. From any open Web page, tap . Options available in the browser menus include:
 - Forward: Forwards the browser to another web page.
 - New window: Displays a new window so you can browse multiple URLs.
 - Add bookmark: Allows you to add a URL to your bookmark list.
 - Add shortcut to home: Allows you to add a shortcut to your Home screen.
 - Share page: Allows you to share the page using Gmail or as a message.

- Find on page: Allows you to search in the current page.
- Desktop view: Allows you to assign the browser to display the current page in the desktop view (to closely mimic the screen as it would display on a Desktop computer).
- Save for offline reading: Saves the Web page so you can read it later even when offline.
- Brightness and colors: Allows you to adjust the brightness and color of your display.
- Downloads: Displays the download history.
- Print: Allows you to print the screen or Web page on a Samsung printer using Wi-Fi.
- Settings: Allows you to modify your Web settings.

Select Text on a Web Page

You can highlight text on a Web page and copy, search for, or share it.

- From the active Web page, scroll to the area of text to select.
- Touch and hold the screen area to select any word or character.

- 3. Touch and drag across the screen and highlight the desired text. The selected text higlights.
- 4. Select an onscreen option:
 - Select all: Tap to select all text on the Web page.
 - Copy: Tap to copy the selected text.
 - Share: Tap to share the item using one of these options: Bluetooth, Email, Gmail, Google+, Messaging, or Wi-Fi Direct.
 - More: Tap to select the following:
 - Find: Searches for all instances of the selected text on the Web page.
 - Web Search: Searches for the selected text on the Web.

View a Specific Website

Just like any other browser, you can use the URL field to enter a website address and go to a specific website.

Tap the URL field and enter a website address.
 As you type the address, if your desired website displays within the suggested sites list, tap the entry to begin viewing.

2. Tap **Go**.

Note: Not all websites are viewable on this phone.

Adjust Browser Settings

You can change the page settings for your browser, including default zoom level, pop-up blocking, display options, and setting your home page. You can also change your browser's security and privacy settings, including history, cache, whether or not to save passwords, and other data settings.

- 1. Press and tap | > Internet.
- 2. From any open Web page, tap **Settings**.
- Navigate to the Page content settings area and select from one of the following page settings:
 - General
 - Set home page: Sets the current home page for the Web browser.
 - Form auto-fill: allows you to fill in Web forms with a single tap.
 - Auto-fill text: allows you to enter text to be used in the Form auto-fill feature.
 - Privacy and security

- Clear cache: Deletes all currently cached data.
 Tap OK to complete the process.
- Clear history: Clears the browser navigation history. Tap OK to complete the process.
- Show security warnings: Notifies you if there is a security issue with the current website.
- Accept cookies: Allows sites that require cookies, to save and read cookies from your phone.
- Clear all cookie data: Deletes all current browser cookie files.
- Remember form data: Allows the phone to store data from any previously filled out forms. Remove the checkmark to disable this function.
- Clear form data: Deletes any stored data from previously filled out forms. Tap OK to complete the process.
- Enable location: Allows websites to request access to your location.
- Clear location access: Clears location access for all websites. Tap OK to complete the process.

- Remember passwords: Stores usernames and passwords for visited sites. Remove the checkmark to disable this function.
- Clear passwords: Deletes any previously stored usernames or passwords. Tap OK to complete the process.
- Enable notifications: Enables notifications for all websites. Choose from: Always on, On demand (user driven), or Off.
- Clear notifications: Clears Web notification access for all websites. Tap OK to complete the process.

Accessibility

- Force zoom: Overrides the website's request to control zoom.
- Text size: Allows you to preview the text size. You can also adjust the following using a slider bar: Scale text up and down, Zoom amount on double tap, and Minimum font size.
- Minimum font size: Sets the minimum font size using a slider bar.

- Inverted rendering: Displays a website with inverted colors (black becomes white and vice versa). Tap Inverted rendering to activate the feature and tap the Contrast slider bar to adjust the color contrast.
- Contrast: Sets the contrast when using Inverted rendering.

Advanced

- Select search engine: Set your default search engine to Google, Yahoo!, or Bing.
- Open in background: New pages are launched in a separate page and displayed behind the current one. Remove the checkmark to disable this function.
- Enable JavaScript: Enables javascript for the current Web page. Without this feature, some pages may not display properly. Remove the checkmark to disable this function.
- Enable plug-ins: Allows the download of plug-ins such as Adobe Flash.
- Default storage: Sets your default storage to Phone or Memory Card.

- Website settings: View advanced settings for individual websites.
- Default zoom: Adjusts the zoom feature. Set to Far, Medium, or Close.
- Open pages in overview: Shows an overview of newly opened Web pages.
- Auto-fit pages: Allows you to resize Web pages to fit as much of the screen as possible.
- Block pop-ups: Prevents popup advertisement or windows from appearing onscreen.
 Remove the checkmark to disable this function.
- Text encoding: Adjusts the current text encoding.
- Reset to default: Clears all browser data and resets all settings to default.

Bandwidget management

- Preload search results: Allows the browser to preload high confidence search results in the background to help speed up searches.
- Load images: Allows Web page images to load along with the other text components of a loaded website.

Labs

- Quick controls: Allows you to open quick controls and hide the app and URL bars by swiping your thumb from the left or right edge of the screen.
- Full screen: Allows you to access Full screen mode and hide the status bar.

Reset the Browser to Default

- 1. Press and tap ::: > (*) Internet.
- 2. Tap Settings > Advanced > Reset to default.
- 3. Tap **OK** to complete the process.

Set the Browser Home Page

- 1. Press and tap | > (Internet.
- 2. Tap **Settings > General > Set home page**.
- Select Current page, Blank page, Default page, or Other.

Create Bookmarks

1. From any open Web page, tap Bookmarks.

- 2. Tap the Hisotry or Saved pages tab.
- Touch and hold an entry from the list to display an onscreen popup menu.
- Tap Add bookmark to add the selected entry to your current list of bookmarks.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi provides wireless Internet access over distances of up to 300 feet. To use your phone's Wi-Fi, you need access to a wireless access point or "hotspot".

The availability and range of the Wi-Fi signal depends on a number of factors, including infrastructure and other objects through which the signal passes.

Turn Wi-Fi On and Connect to a Wireless Network

By default, your phone's Wi-Fi feature is turned off. Turning Wi-Fi on makes your phone able to discover and connect to compatible in-range Wi-Fi networks (or WAPs - wireless access points).

Activating Wi-Fi

- 1. Press and tap = > Settings.
- 2. Tap the Wi-Fi OFF/ON slider to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. Tap Wi-Fi again to access Wi-Fi networks.
 - When you select an open network, you are automatically connected to the network.
 - When you select a secured network, the wireless password is required to connect to the network. Enter the password and tap Connect.

Tip: You can use the show password option to display the password as you enter it.

To manually add a new network connection:

- 1. Tap Add Wi-Fi network.
- Enter the Network SSID. This is the name of your Wi-Fi network.
- Tap the Security field and select a security option. This must match the current security setting on your target network.

 Tap Save to store the new information and connect to the Wi-Fi network.

Note: The next time the phone connects to a previously accessed or secured wireless network, you are not prompted to enter the wireless password again, unless the phone is reset back to its factory default settings.

To manually scan for a Wi-Fi network:

- 1. Press and tap = > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- 2. Tap Scan.

Check the Wireless Network Status

The following information is designed to help you check the wireless connection.

- 1. Press and tap > Settings > Wi-Fi.
- Tap the weireless network (the one in which the phone is connected). A message box displays the Wi-Fi network name, status, speed, signal strength, and other details.

Note: If you want to remove the phone's wireless network settings, tap Forget. You must enter the settings again to connect to this wireless network. The following icons display your Wi-Fi connection status:



Wi-Fi is connected and active.



Wi-Fi is active but there is a communication issue with the target Wireless Access Point.

Connect to a Different Wi-Fi Network

The following information is designed to help connect the device to a different Wi-Fi network.

- 1. Press 奋 and tap 🖃 > Settings > Wi-Fi.
 - Detected Wi-Fi networks display. To manually scan for available Wi-Fi networks, on the Wi-Fi settings screen, tap Scan.
- 2. Tap another Wi-Fi network to connect to it.

Note: If the wireless network you want to connect to is not in the list of detected networks, scroll down the screen, and tap Add network. Enter the wireless network settings and tap Save.

Wi-Fi Direct

About Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct allows device-to-device connections so you can transfer large amounts of data over a Wi-Fi connection.

Note: See your service plan for applicable Wi-Fi Direct charges.

Activate a Connection

- Press and tap Settings > More... > Wi-Fi Direct.
- Tap the Wi-Fi Direct OFF/ON slider to turn on Wi-Fi Direct.
- Tap **OK** to start Wi-Fi Direct. This deactivates regular Wi-Fi or hotspot connections.

Note: The target device must also have Wi-Fi Direct service active and running before you device can connect.

Assign a Unique Name

- Press and tap > Settings > More...>
 Wi-Fi Direct.
- 2. Press > Device name.
- 3. Modify the current name, then tap OK.

Sharing Information with a Connected Device

To share Videos, Photos, or other information with the connected device, use this procedure:

- Display the information to share. For example, to share a photo, locate the photo and display it in the camera viewer, then tap the Share, Share via, or Send via option.
- 2. Tap the Wi-Fi Direct option.
- 3. Tap the connected device name.
- Tap OK when the other device receives a prompt to receive information.
 - The file transfers and the other device displays a screen notification that a Wi-Fi file was received.

Note: Depending on the other device model, the prompts and shared folder information may differ.

Email

Use the Email application to send and receive email from your webmail or other accounts, using POP3 or IMAP. You can also access your Exchange ActiveSync email and other features on your phone.

Add an Email Account

Email allows you to review and create email using various email services. You can also receive text message alerts when you receive an important email.

 Press and tap > Settings > Accounts and sync > Add account > Email.

Note: Press > = and tap > Settings, then tap + to display the Set up email screen.

Enter your email address in the Email address field. Enter your password in the Password field, then tap Next.

Tapping Next prompts your phone to attempt a "regular" email setup and test the incoming and outgoing servers. If you have custom settings you need to configure, tap Manual setup and enter your settings. These may include mail type, user name, password, server, security type, etc.

- At the Account options screen, tap the Email check frequency drop-down list box and select how often you would like your email to be checked.
- Tap any of the other options you would like to create a checkmark.
- 6. Tap Next.
- 7. Enter a name for this email account (optional).
- 8. Tap Done.

Google Mail

This email client is Google's web-based email service. A Gmail account is created once you sign up for a new Google account online.

Depending on your synchronization settings, Gmail (along with calendar events, phone numbers and other contact information) on your device are automatically synchronized between your device and your Gmail account on the Web.

You must have a valid and active Google account prior to using this email client.

Important: You must log into your Google account after every power cycle of your device to use Gmail, Android Market, and other account-related applications.

Accessing Gmail

- 1. Press and tap See > Gmail.
- 2. Do any of the following:
 - View more email messages: If the Inbox is full, swipe your finger up the screen to view more messages and conversations.
 - Read a new email message: Tap the unread message or the conversation with an unread message (just-arrived items display in bold).
 - Select messages and conversations: Tap the box before the email or conversation.

- View the Inbox of another Gmail account:
 - Tap Inbox at the top of the screen and then tap the inbox of the Gmail account you want to view.

Send a Gmail Message

Below are procedures for sending a Gmail.

- 1. Press and tap :::: > Gmail.
- 2. Tap \longrightarrow from the Inbox.
- Enter the message recipient's email address in the To field.

Note: To send a carbon copy (Cc) or a blind carbon copy (Bcc) of the current email to other recipients, tap Add Cc/Bcc.

- 4. Tap the Subject field and enter the email subject.
- Tap the Compose email field and compose your email.
- 6. Tap > Attach file to add a picture attachment.
- 7. Tap > to send the message.

- Tap > Discard to delete the current email message.

Read and Reply to Gmail Messages

Below are procedures for reading and replying to Gmail messages.

- 1. Press 📤 and tap 🚟 > 💜 Gmail.
- 2. Tap a message to display its contents.

Tip: You can also access new messages through the Notifications bar. When a new Gmail message arrives, the icon in the Notifications bar displays. Touch and hold the bar and slide it down to display notifications. Tap a message to view.

- 3. Tap Reply to display the reply screen.
- 4. Tap Reply then tap Reply, Reply All, or Forward.
- 5. Tap > to send the message.

Adding a Work Email Account

The main Email application also provides access to your Outlook Exchange server via your phone. If your company uses Microsoft Exchange Server 2003, 2007, or 2010 as the corporate email system, you can use this email application to wirelessly synchronize your email, Contacts, and Task information directly with your company's Exchange server.

Important: This Outlook application does not utilize Microsoft® ActiveSync® to synchronize the phone to your remote Exchange Server. This synchronization is done wirelessly over the air (OTA) and not through a direct connection.

Use the following procedure to synchronize your phone with a corporate email account.

- Press and tap > Settings > Accounts and sync > Add account > Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync.
- Enter your Email address and Password information, and then tap Next. Consult your Network Administrator for further details.

- Domain\Username: Use the arrow keys to place your cursor before your username and enter your network domain\desktop login username.
- Password: typically your network access password (case-sensitive).

Important: Key information here is the Domain information.

Maintain the "\" between the Domain and
Username.

- Exchange Server: your exchange server remote email address. Typically starts with mail.XXX.com. Obtain this information from your company network administrator. Do not accept the default entry as this is a guess based on returned information
- If your network requires SSL encryption, tap the Use secure connection (SSL) field to place a checkmark in the box and activate this additional level of security.

Important: If your exchange server requires this feature, leaving this field unchecked can prevent connection.

Read the onscreen activation disclaimer and, if prompted, tap Next.

- Configure your Email check frequency, Amount to synchronize (days to synchronize between your phone and server), and activate any other email settings, and then tap Next.
- Identify your new account with a unique name and provide the outgoing name text then tap **Done**.

Note: You can create multiple Work Email (Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync) accounts active on your phone.

Compose and Send Email

Compose and send email using any account you have set up on your phone. Increase your productivity by attaching files such as pictures, videos, or documents to your email messages.

- 1. Press and tap ::: > [Email.
- 2. Tap from the Inbox.
- Select an email account. Tap the From field and select an available account.
- Enter the message recipient's email address in the To field.

You can add as many message recipients as you want.

- Tap > Add Cc/Bcc to send a carbon copy (Cc) or a blind carbon copy (Bcc) of this email to other recipients.
- 6. Tap the Subject field and enter the email subject.
- 7. Tap the text entry field and compose your email.
- 8. Tap to send the message.

View and Reply to Email

Reading and replying to email on your phone is as simple as on your computer.

- On the email account Inbox, tap a message to view it.
- Tap Reply, Reply all, or Forward to reply to or forward the message.
- Add a message (if desired) then tap



Manage the Email Inbox

Reading and replying to email on your phone is as simple as on your computer.

- Tap the account name field (upper-left) to open the complete email account list page.
- Select an email account and tap an email message.

Refresh an Email Account

Whatever your automatic synchronization settings are, you can also synchronize your sent and received email messages manually at any time.

- 1. Press and tap See > 6 Email.
- 2. Select an email account.
- If you have already selected an account, tap the account name field to open the compele email account list page.
- 4. Tap O Refresh.

Sort Email Messages

- 1. Press **Sort by**.
- Select from the options to sort email messages by date received, sender, read/unread, favorites, attachments, or priority.

Delete an Email Message

- On the email account Inbox, touch and hold the message you want to delete.
- On the options menu, tap **Delete**. Tap **Delete** again to confirm.

Delete Multiple Email Messages

Tap the checkmark boxes to the left of each email you want to delete then tap _____. Tap Delete again to confirm.

Work Email Features

The following information provides details about specific email features that can enhance your experience.

Synchronize Exchange ActiveSync Email

You can set Exchange ActiveSync to automatically check for new Exchange ActiveSync email messages.

Flag Email Messages

For an Exchange ActiveSync account, you can flag email messages to help you keep track of them.

- On the email account Inbox, tap the flag icon to the right of the email message to mark it. The flag turns red.

Set Out of Office Status

You can set your Out of Office status and auto-reply message right from your phone.

- 1. Press and tap since > [Email.
- Tap > More > Account settings > Out of office settings.
- Tap On and set the dates and times for the period when you will be out of the office.
- Tap Internal message settings to modify the auto-replies to inter-office e-mail. Tap External message settings to modify the auto-replies to email received outside of your immediate office location.

5. Tap Set.

Set Email Message Priority

You can set the priority for an email message you send with your Exchange ActiveSync account.

- 1. Tap > Priority while composing the message.
- 2. Select one of the following: High, Normal, or Low.

Edit Email Account Settings

Once an account is added you can synchronize features such as the calendar, contacts, Gmail, and more.

- 1. Sign in to your Google account.
- Press and tap > Settings > Accounts and sync.
- Tap the account name, then configure these settings:
 - Account name: Displays the name used by the phone to track the account.
 - Your name Edits the name attached to emails you send from the selected account.

- Signature: Attaches a customized signature to the bottom of all outgoing emails.

This phone guide contains important operational and safety information that will help you safely use your phone. Failure to read and follow the information provided in this phone guide may result in serious bodily injury, death, or property damage.

General Precautions

There are several simple guidelines to operating your phone properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

- To maximize performance, do not touch the bottom portion of your phone where the internal antenna is located while using the phone.
- Speak directly into the mouthpiece.
- Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, immediately turn the power off and remove the battery.
- Do not expose your phone to direct sunlight for extended periods of time (such as on the dashboard of a car).
- Although your phone is quite sturdy, it is a complex piece of equipment and can be broken. Avoid dropping, hitting, bending, or sitting on it.
- Any changes or modifications to your phone not expressly approved in this document could void your warranty for this equipment and void your authority to operate this equipment.

Note: For the best care of your phone, only Samsung-authorized personnel should service your phone. Failure to do so may be dangerous and void your warranty.

Maintaining Safe Use of and Access to Your Phone

Do Not Rely on Your Phone for Emergency Calls

Mobile phones operate using radio signals, which cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore you should never rely solely upon any mobile phone for essential communication (e.g., medical emergencies). Emergency calls may not be possible on all cellular networks or when certain network services or mobile phone features are in use. Check with your local service provider for details.

Using Your Phone While Driving

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free device) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions. Remember that safety always comes first.

Following Safety Guidelines

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.

Note: Always turn off the phone in healthcare facilities, and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying

Turn off your phone before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the plane is on the ground. To prevent any risk of interference, FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while the plane is in the air.

Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn your phone off when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to set off explosives.

Turn your phone off when you're in any area that has a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it's rare, your phone and accessories could generate sparks. Sparks can cause an explosion or fire, resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include:

- Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- Below deck on boats.
- Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.
- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust, or metal powders.
- Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.

Note: Never transport or store flammable gas, flammable liquids, or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

Using Your Phone With a Hearing Aid Device

A number of our phones have been tested for hearing aid device compatibility. When some wireless phones are used with certain hearing devices (including hearing aids and cochlear implants), users may detect a noise which can interfere with the effectiveness of the hearing device.

Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise, and phones also vary in the amount of interference noise they may generate. ANSI Standard C63.19 was developed to provide a standardized means of measuring both wireless phone and hearing devices to determine usability rating categories for both.

Ratings have been developed for mobile phones to assist hearing device users find phones that may be compatible with their hearing device. Not all phones have been rated for compatibility with hearing devices. Phones that have been rated have a label located on the box. Your Samsung Galaxy Rush™ has an M4 T4 - 2007 rating.

These ratings are not guarantees. Results will vary depending on the user's hearing device and individual type and degree of hearing loss. If a hearing device is particularly vulnerable to interference noise; even a phone with a higher rating may still cause unacceptable noise levels in the hearing device. Trying out the phone with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

M-Ratings: Phones rated M3 or M4 meet FCC requirements for hearing aid compatibility and are likely to generate less interference to hearing devices than unrated phones. (M4 is the better/higher of the two ratings.)

T-Ratings: Phones rated T3 or T4 meet FCC requirements and are likely to be more usable with a hearing device's telecoil ("T Switch" or "Telephone Switch") than unrated phones. (T4 is

the better/higher of the two ratings. Note that not all hearing devices have telecoils in them.)

Note: New Technologies, Including Wi-Fi

This phone has been tested and rated for use with hearing aids for some of the wireless technologies that it uses. However, there may be some newer wireless technologies used in this phone that have not been tested yet for use with hearing aids. It is important to try the different features of this phone thoroughly and in different locations, using your hearing aid or cochlear implant, to determine if you hear any interfering noise. Consult your service provider or the manufacturer of this phone for information on hearing aid compatibility. If you have questions about return or exchange policies, consult your service provider or phone retailer.

Hearing aid devices may also be measured for immunity to interference noise from wireless phones and should have ratings similar to phones. Ask your hearing healthcare professional for the rating of your hearing aid. Add the rating of your hearing aid and your phone to determine probable usability:

- Any combined rating equal to or greater than six offers excellent use.
- Any combined rating equal to five is considered normal use.
- Any combined rating equal to four is considered usable.

Thus, if you pair an M3 hearing aid with an M3 phone, you will have a combined rating of six for "excellent use." This is synonymous for T ratings.

We further suggests you experiment with multiple phones (even those not labeled M3/T3 or M4/T4) while in the store to find the one that works best with your hearing aid device.

Getting the Best Hearing Device Experience With Your Phone

To further minimize interference:

- Set the phone's display and keypad backlight settings to ensure the minimum time intervals.
 - Press > and tap Settings > Display > Screen timeout.
 - 2. Touch the minimum time interval setting.
- Position the phone so the internal antenna is farthest from your hearing aid.
- Move the phone around to find the point with least interference.

Caring for the Battery

Protecting Your Battery

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

 Recently there have been some public reports of wireless phone batteries overheating, catching fire, or exploding. It appears that many, if not all, of these reports involve counterfeit or inexpensive, aftermarket-brand batteries with unknown or questionable manufacturing standards. Boost Mobile is not aware of similar problems with Boost Mobile phones resulting from the proper use of batteries approved by the manufacturer of your phone. Use only manufacturer-approved batteries found through your phone's manufacturer.

- In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from 32° F to 113° F (0° C to 45° C).
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.
- The battery may need recharging if it has not been used for
- It's best to replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. It can be recharged hundreds of times before it needs replacing.
- Don't store the battery in high temperature areas for long periods of time. It's best to follow these storage rules:

Radio Frequency (RF) Energy

Understanding How Your Phone Operates

Your phone is basically a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radio frequency (RF) signals. When you use your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level. This power can range from 0.006 watt to 0.2 watt in digital mode.

Knowing Radio Frequency Safety

The design of your phone complies with updated NCRP standards described below.

In 1991–92, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) joined in updating ANSI's 1982 standard for safety levels with respect to human exposure to RF signals. More than 120 scientists, engineers and physicians from universities, government health agencies and industries developed this updated standard after reviewing the available body of research. In 1993, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted this updated standard in a regulation. In August 1996, the FCC adopted hybrid standard consisting of the

existing ANSI/IEEE standard and the guidelines published by the National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP).

Body-Worn Operation

To maintain compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines, if you wear a handset on your body, use a manufacturer approved carrying case, holster or other body-worn accessory. If you do not use a body-worn accessory, ensure the antenna is at least 1.5 centimeters from your body when transmitting. Use of non-manufacturer-approved accessories may violate FCC RF exposure guidelines.

Specific Absorption Rates (SAR) for Wireless Phones

The SAR value corresponds to the relative amount of RF energy absorbed into the head of a user of a wireless handset.

The SAR value of a phone is the result of an extensive testing, measuring and calculation process. It does not represent how much RF the phone emits. All phone models are tested at their highest value in strict laboratory settings. But when in operation, the SAR of a phone can be substantially less than the level reported to the FCC. This is because of a variety of factors including its proximity to a base station antenna, phone design and other factors. What is important to remember is that

each phone meets strict federal guidelines. Variations in SARs do not represent a variation in safety.

All phones must meet the federal standard, which incorporates a substantial margin of safety. As stated above, variations in SAR values between different model phones do not mean variations in safety. This arbitration provision is entered pursuant to the Federal Arbitration Act.
