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




1.1 Keys and connectors














Menu key

- Touch: display menu options. On the Home screen, touch to access **Wallpaper**, **Widgets** and **Settings**.
- Touch & hold: this shows you images of your most recently-used apps. Touch an image to open the associated app, or swipe it left or right to remove it from the list.

Home key

- While on any app or screen, touch the **Home** key to return to the main Home screen.
- Touch & hold this key to access **Google Now** & **Voice Search**.

Back key

• Touch to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialogue box, options menu, the Notification panel, etc.

These keys are visible when the screen lights up.

Power key

- Press: activate the lock screen/wake up the screen.
- Press and hold: show the pop-up menu to select from Power off, Restart, Airplane, etc.
 Press and hold: power on.
- Press and hold the **Power** key and the **Volume down** key to capture a screenshot.

Volume keys

- During a call, they adjust the earpiece or headset volume.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, they adjust the media volume.
- In general mode, they adjust the ringtone volume.
- Mute the ringtone of an incoming call.

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• In Camera mode, pressing either volume key captures a photo.






1.2 Getting started


1.2.1 Set-up

Removing or installing the back cover



Inserting or removing the SIM card


You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls.



Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the SIM card, press and slide it out.




Your phone only supports micro-SIM card. Do not attempt to insert other SIM types like mini and nano cards, otherwise you may damage your phone. Installing the microSD card



Place the microSD card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the microSD card, press and slide it out.

Charging the battery



To charge the battery, connect the charger to your phone and mains socket. You can also charge your phone via a USB cable.

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To reduce energy wastage, disconnect your charger from the plug when the battery is fully charged.

To reduce your phone's power consumption, switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or apps running in the background when not needed. In Settings you can also lower the brightness of the screen, and shorten the length of time before the screen goes to sleep.

Power on your phone 1.2.2

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on. It will take a few seconds before the screen lights up. Unlock your phone (Slide, PIN, password or pattern) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen will display.

If you do not know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code with your phone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

Set up your phone for the first time

The first time you power on the phone you will be asked to set the following options: language, mobile data, Google account, date & time. etc.

- 1 Select the phone's language, then touch Next.
- 2 Select Mobile Data, then touch Next.



- 3 Setup Google account: Touch Setup now. If you have a Google Account, touch **Existing** to sign in, then enter your Email and password. If you forget your password, you can go to http://www.google.com/ to retrieve it. Touch Next to skip to the next step.
- 4 Set your date and timezone, you can also choose Automatic time zone, then touch Finish to confirm.

If you power on your phone with no SIM card inserted you will still be able to connect to a Wi-Fi network to sign into your Google account and to use some features.

Hold down the **Power** key from the Home screen until the Phone options appear, then select Power off.

1.3 Home screen

You can bring all your favourite items (apps, shortcuts, folders and widgets) to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the Home key to switch to the Home screen.

Status bar

- Status/Notification indicators
- Touch and drag down to open the Notification panel

Google Search bar

- Touch a to enter text search screen
- Touch b to enter voice search screen

Slide left or right to view other panels on the Home screen

Favourite tray apps

- Touch to enter the app
- Touch and hold to move or change apps
- Application tab
- Touch to open All apps

The Home screen extends on either side of the screen to allow more space for adding apps, shortcuts, etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view of the Home screen. The white spot in the lower part of the screen indicates which screen you are viewing.

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1.3.1 Using the touchscreen

Touch 🖑

To access an app, touch it with your finger.

Touch and hold 🖁

Touch and hold the Home screen to access the available options for setting the wallpaper.

Drag 🥂

Touch and hold an item to be able to drag it to another location.

Slide/Swipe

Slide the screen to scroll up and down lists, screens of apps, images, web pages, etc.

Flick ~ 👫

Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.

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Pinch/Spread

Place your fingers of one hand on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.


Rotate

Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways.

1.3.2 Status bar

From status bar, you can view both phone status (on the right side) and notification information (on the left side).



Notification panel

Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Quick setting panel or Notification panel. Touch and drag up to close it. When there are notifications, you may touch and drag the Status bar with two fingers to access Quick setting panel directly. From the Notification panel, you can open items and other reminders indicated by notification icons or view wireless service information.





Touch and drag the Status bar with two fingers to access Quick setting bar





Touch a notification and slide it sideways to delete it.

Touch the icon 🚅 to clear all event–based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).

Touch 👫 and then the Settings icon 🔯 to access **Settings**.



Quick setting bar • Touch icons to enable/disable functions or to change modes • Touch & hold to show the settings

1.3.3 Search bar

The phone provides a Search function which can be used to locate information within applications, the phone or the web.



a Search by text

- Touch Search bar from the Home screen.
- Enter the text/phrase you want to search for.
- Touch \square on the keyboard if you want to search on the web.
- **b** Search by voice
- Touch \bigcirc from Search bar to display a dialog screen.
- Speak the word/phrase you want to search for. A list of search results will display for you to select from.

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


1.3.4 Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock your phone screen with a variety of patterns, PIN or password, etc. through **Settings > Security > Set up screen lock**.

To create a screen unlock pattern (Follow onscreen instructions)

- Touch Settings > Security > Set up screen lock > Pattern.
- Draw your own pattern.



To create a screen unlock PIN/Password

- Touch Settings > Security > Set up screen lock > PIN or Password.
- Set your PIN or password.

To lock phone screen

•

Press the **Power** key once to lock the screen.

To unlock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, draw the unlock pattern you have created or enter PIN or password to unlock the screen.

If you have chosen **Slide** as the screen lock, touch and drag the icon (a) right to unlock the screen.





1.3.5 Personalise your Home screen

Add an app or widget

Touch the Application tab \fbox , then touch and hold the app or widget to activate the Move mode, and drag the item to any Home screen.

Reposition an app or widget

Touch and hold the item to be repositioned to activate the Move mode, drag the item to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favourites tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.



Remove

Touch and hold the item to be removed to activate the Move mode, drag the item up to the top of **Remove** icon, and release after the item turns red.

Create folders

To make it easier to organise apps and shortcuts on the Home screen and the Favourite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

Wallpaper customisation

Touch and hold an empty area on the Home screen or go to **Settings > Display > Wallpaper** to customise your wallpaper.

1.3.6 Volume adjustment

Using volume key



Press **Volume** key to adjust the volume. To activate the vibrate mode, press the **Volume down** key until the phone vibrates. Press the **Volume down** key once more to activate the silent mode.

Using Settings menu

Drag down the notification panel and touch and then the settings icon it to enter **Settings**, then touch **Sound**, you can set the volume of calls, notification, system and etc. to your preference.

2 Text input

2.1 Using the onscreen keyboard


Onscreen keyboard settings

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, select **Settings > Language & input**, then touch the Settings icon on the right of **Google keyboard**.

Adjust the onscreen keyboard orientation

Turn the phone sideways or upright to adjust the Onscreen Keyboard orientation. You can also adjust it by changing the settings (go to **Settings > Display > Orientation**).

2.1.1 Google keyboard




2.2 Text editing

You can edit the text you have entered.

- Touch and hold or double-tap on the text you would like to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the highlighted selection.
- The following options will show: Select all 📰 , Cut 🔀 , Copy 📄 and Paste 🖹.
- Touch the icon \checkmark to confirm.

You can also insert new text

- Touch where you want to type, or touch and hold a blank space, the cursor will blink and the tab will show. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have selected any text, touch the tab to show **PASTE** icon which allows you to paste any text you have previously copied.




3 Phone call, Call log & People

3.1 Phone call

3.1.1 Placing a call

You can easily make a call using **Phone.** Touch the Application tab from the Home screen and select **Phone**.





Enter the number you want from the dialpad directly or select a contact from **People** or **Call log** by touching tabs, then touch **Call to place the call**.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching $\langle \times \rangle$.

To hang up a call, touch 🕋 .

International call

To dial an international call, touch and hold <u>o</u> to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and finally touch **C**.

Emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial emergency number and touch \bigcirc to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.

3.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive a call, touch 🕓

- Slide the icon right to answer the call;
- Slide the icon left to reject the call;



• Slide the icon up to reject the call by sending a preset message.

To mute incoming calls, press the **Volume up/down** key directly.

3.1.3 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

To access your voicemail, touch and hold 1 ... on **Phone** tab.

To set your voicemail number, touch touch **Settings > Voice call > Voicemail.**

If you receive a voicemail, a voicemail icon **QO** appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel, touch **New voicemail**.

3.1.4 During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the **Volume up/down** key.





Touch to hold the current call. Touch this icon again to retrieve the call.

Touch to display Dialpad.



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Touch to end the current call.

Touch to mute the current call. Touch this icon again to unmute the call.

Touch to activate the speaker during the current call. Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.



Touch to add the number to new contact.



To avoid misoperation on touchscreen during a call, screen will be locked automatically when you put the cellphone close to your ear; and it will be unlocked when the cellphone is taken away from your ear.

3.1.5 Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

Conference calls (1)

You can set up a conference call.

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Touch and select Add call.
- Enter the phone number of the person you want to add to conference and touch **Solution**. You can also add participants from **Contacts** or **Call log**.
- Touch icon 🎗 to start a conference call.
- During a conference call, touch so to drop a participant or to talk privately to one of the participants. Touch is to drop the participant from the conference, touch is to talk privately to the participant and hold on other participants.



• Touch **r** to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.



3.1.6 Call settings

Touch two select **Settings** from Phone screen, the following options are available:

Voice call

- Voicemail
- VoicemailOpens a dialog box where you can selectserviceyour carrier's voicemail service or another
service.
- Voicemail settings If you are using your carrier's voicemail service, this opens a dialog box where you can enter the phone number to use for listening to and managing your voicemail. You can enter a comma (,) to insert a pause into the number — for example, to add a password after the phone number.

• Call forwarding

Touch to configure how your calls are always forwarded or when you are busy, unanswered or unreachable.

Additional settings

- **Caller ID** Opens a dialog box where you can set whether your phone number is displayed when making calls.
- **Call waiting** Mark the check box to notify you of a new incoming call.
- Call waiting status Check the call waiting status of your phone.

• Video call⁽¹⁾

Local video replacement	You can choose a picture from your collection to display when the Camera is unreachable.
Outgoing video call	Touch to display local video when you place a call.
Incoming video call	Touch to display local video when receiving an incoming call.

Other settings

• Fixed dialing numbers

Fixed Dialing Number (FDN) is a service mode of SIM, where outgoing calls are restricted to a set of phone numbers. These numbers are added to the FDN list. The most common practical application of FDN is for parents to restrict the phone numbers which their children can dial.



For security reasons, you'll be prompted to enable FDN by entering SIM PIN2 which is usually acquired from your service provider or SIM maker.

• Minute reminder

Mark the check box to enable minute reminder at 50s of every minute during a call.

• Vibrate reminder

Mark the check box to enable vibration when the call is connected.

• Power key ends call

Mark the checkbox to enable hangup function of **Power** key during a call.

⁽¹⁾ Depending on your model.

• Dual mic noise reduction

Mark the checkbox to turn on dual mic for noise reduction.

• Quick responses

Touch to edit quick responses which will be used when you reject a call with messages.

• TTY mode

Touch to set TTY mode.

• International dialing assist

Mark the checkbox to activate.

3.2 Call log

You can view your call history by touching () from the Phone screen to view call history in categories of Incoming calls, Outgoing calls, and Missed calls.



Touch a contact or number to view information or further operations.

You can view detailed information of a call, launch a new call or send messages to a contact or number, or add numbers to **People** (only available for unsaved phone numbers), etc.

Touch the photo 👤 to open the Quick Contact panel.

To clear the entire call memory, touch 🗮 key and **Delete**.

3.3 People




You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronise these with your Gmail contacts or other apps on the web or on your phone.



When using People for the first time you are asked to add new contacts, import contacts from your SIM card or synchronise contacts from other app accounts to your phone.

3.3.1 View your contacts

To access **People** app, touch the Application tab on the Home screen, then select **People**.



Touch 🚞 key to display contacts list option menu.

Following actions are enabled:

- **Delete contact** Select and delete unwanted contacts.
- Contacts to Choose contacts to display. display
- Import/Export Import or export contacts between phone, SIM card, and microSD card, or share contacts.
- Accounts Manage the synchronisation settings for different accounts.
- Settings Access to contact display settings.
- Share visible Share contacts with others by sending contacts the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Email, SMS, etc.



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
3.3.2 Managing contact groups

The contact group helps you to improve the organisation of your contacts. You can add, remove and view groups in the **Contact group** screen.

Touch the icon store to view local groups. To create a new group, touch the icon store, enter the new name and touch **DONE** to confirm. If you have added accounts to your phone, touch the icon store to view groups in accounts.

3.3.3 Adding a contact

Touch the Application tab on the Home screen, select the **People**, then touch the icon \mathbf{a}_{+} in the contact list to create a new contact.



If you want to add more information, touch **Add another field** to add a new category.

When finished, touch **DONE** to save.

To exit without saving, you can touch they and then **Discard**.

Add to/remove from Favourites

To add a contact to favourites, you can touch a contact to view details then touch \bigstar to add the contact to favourites.

To remove a contact from favourites, touch 📩 on contact details screen.



Only phone and account contacts can be added to favourites.

3.3.4 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch \equiv key in the contact details screen, then touch **Edit.** When finished, touch **DONE**.

Change a contact's default phone number

The default phone number (the number which has priority when making a call or sending a message) will always be displayed under the contact name.

To change the default phone number, touch and hold the number you want to set as the default number from the contact's details screen, then select **Set default**. A $\sqrt{}$ appears after the number.



This choice is only available when the contact has more than one number.

Delete a contact

To delete a contact, touch \equiv key and touch **Delete** from contact (details) screen.

On contacts list screen, touch = key and then **Delete contact**, select the contact(s) you want to remove and touch **OK** to confirm. Touch **Select all** and then **OK** to delete all contacts, touch **CANCEL** to exit.



The contact you have deleted will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronise your phone.

3.3.5 Communicating with your contacts


From contact details screen, you can communicate with your contacts by making a call or exchanging messages.

To launch a call, touch the phone number.

To send a message, touch the icon \blacksquare on the right side of the number.

Use Quick Contact for Android

Touch a contact's picture to open Quick Contact for Android, then you can touch the number or the icon for the way you want to connect.



The icons available on Quick Contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications/ accounts on your phone.

3.3.6 Importing, exporting and sharing contacts

From the Contacts screen, touch \equiv key to open the options menu, touch **Import/Export**, then select to import/export contacts from/to your SIM card, Phone, microSD card, Phone storage, Accounts, etc.

To import/export a single contact from/to your SIM card, choose an account and target SIM card, select the contact you want to import/export, and touch **OK** to confirm.

To import/export all contacts from/to your SIM card, choose an account and target SIM card, touch **Select all** and touch **OK** to confirm.

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

To do this, touch a contact you want to share, touch \implies key and **Share** from contact details screen, then select the app to perform this action.

3.3.7 Displaying contacts

You can configure which group of contacts, for each account, you want to display in the People list. Touch regiments key and then **Contacts to display** from contacts list screen, then you can choose contacts to display.

Touch then **Settings**, you can **Sort list by** Given name or Family name, as well as **View contact names as** Given name first or Family name first.

3.3.8 Joining/Discarding contacts

To avoid duplication, you can add any new contact information to existing contacts in a single action.

Touch the contact which you want to add information to, touch \equiv key and then **Edit**, then touch \equiv key in edit screen and touch **Join**.

At this time, you are required to select the contact whose information you want to join with the first contact. The information from the second contact is added to the first one, and the second contact will no longer be displayed in the contacts list.

To separate contact information, touch the contact whose information you want to separate, touch \implies key and then **Edit**, then touch \implies key in edit screen and touch **Separate**, touch **OK** to confirm.

3.3.9 Synchronising contacts in multiple accounts



Contacts, data or other information can be synchronised from multiple accounts, depending on the apps installed on your phone.

To add an account, touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**, then touch **Add account**.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, Corporate, etc.

As with other account set-ups, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account and all associated information from the phone. Open the **Settings** screen, touch the account you want to delete, touch 🗮 key and then select **Remove account**, then confirm.

Sync

You can synchronise an account on **Accounts** screen, touch an account in the list, then touch \equiv key and select **Sync now**.

4 Messaging & Email

4.1 Messaging



Your phone can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS messages.


Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then select **Messaging**.



All messages you receive or send out can be saved in your phone memory or SIM card. To view SMS messages stored on your SIM card, touch \equiv key from Messaging screen, then touch **Settings > Text messages (SMS) > Manage SIM messages**.

4.1.1 Create a new message

On the message list screen, touch the new message icon = to write new text/multimedia messages.



Sending a text message

Enter the mobile phone number of the recipient on the **Type name or number** bar or touch **S**, to add recipients, then touch the **Type text message** bar to enter the text of the message. When you've finished, touch **>** to send the text message.



An SMS of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. Specific letters (like accents, for example) will also increase the size of the SMS, so this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, slides and audio to other compatible phones and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides, etc.) are attached or Subject or email addresses are added.



To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the **Type name or number** bar, touch **Type text message** bar to enter the text of the message. touch \implies key to open the option menu, touch **Add subject** to insert a subject, and touch \bigoplus to attach picture, video, audio and so on.

When finished, touch \sum to send the multimedia message.

Attach options:

- **Pictures** Access Gallery or File manager to select a picture as attachment.
- Capture picture Access Camera to capture a new picture for attaching.
- Videos Access Gallery or File manager to select a video as attachment.

• Capture video Access Camcorder to record a new video for attaching.

- **Record audio** Access Sound Recorder to record a new record.
- Audio Access music from Ringtone or Audio.
- Slideshow Enter Edit slide show screen, touch Add slide to create a new slide, and touch currently existing slide to edit it (see following picture). Touch = to get more options, like slide duration setting, music adding, etc.

• Contact

Access **People** to select one or more contact(s) to attach.



• Calendar Ac

Access **Calendar** to select one or more event(s) to attach.



Manage messages 4.1.2

When a new message comes, an icon 😅 will appear on status bar as notification. Drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel, touch the new message to open it. You can also access Messaging and touch the new message to open it.

Messages are displayed in conversational order.

To reply to a message, touch the current message to enter message-composing screen, enter the text, then touch \geq .

Touch and hold a message in message details screen, the following options will be available:

- This option only available for SMS. Touch to • Copy copy current message content and past it to **Type text message** bar of the new message you are going to compose.
- Forward Touch to forward the message to another recipient.
- Delete Delete the current message.
- Lock/Unlock Touch to lock/unlock message.
- View details Touch to view details of the message.
- Select text Touch to select text to **Type text message** bar as new message.
- Save message This option displays when the message is to SIM card an SMS. Touch to save the message to SIM card.

Adjust message settings 4.1.3

In message list screen, touch key and select **Settings**.

SMS Enabled

Touch to change your default SMS app.

Text messages (SMS)

- Delivery Mark to request a delivery report for each reports text message you send.
- Manage SIM Touch to view or manage messages on your SIM card. messages
- Edit guick text Touch to add or edit message templates.
- SMS service Touch to view or edit your SMS service centre centre.
- SMS storage Touch to select phone or SIM card to store location messages.









Multimedia messages (MMS)

- **Group messaging** Mark the checkbox to send a single message to multiple recipients.
- Delivery Select to request a delivery report for each multimedia message you send.
- **Read reports** Select to request a report on whether each recipient has read a multimedia message sent by you.
- Send read Select to request a report on whether the multimedia message is sent out.
- Auto-retrieve Select to download full MMS message (including message body and attachment) automatically to your phone. Otherwise, download only the MMS message header.
- Roaming autoretrieve Select to download full MMS message (including message body and attachment) automatically when roaming. Otherwise, download only the MMS message header to avoid extra charges.
- **Creation mode** Touch to set MMS creation mode when composing message.
- Maximum Select to edit the message size, but it should not be more than 300KB.
- Priority Set MMS priority as High, Normal or Low.
- Notifications
- Notifications Select to display message notifications in status bar.
- Select ringtone Touch to select a ringtone as a new message notification tone.
- Mute Select to make phone mute as a notification when receiving a new message.

General

- Chat wallpaper Touch to select wallpaper for message background.
- Message font Touch to select message font size. size
- Show email Mark the checkbox to include email address address in contact results.
- Delete old Select to delete old messages when maximum number of stored messages is reached.
- Text message Touch to set the number of text messages to be saved per conversation.

• Multimedia Touch to set the number of multimedia message limit messages to be saved per conversation.

- Enable CB Mark/unmark the checkbox to enable/ ringtone disable cell broadcast ringtone.
- Select CB Touch to select a ringtone for cell broadcast.

• Cell Broadcast Touch to enable or disable cell broadcast service or to choose language and channel for it.

• Enable WAP Mark/Unmark the checkbox to allow or PUSH block WAP PUSH.







4.2 Gmail/Email

The first time you set up your phone, you can select to use an existing Gmail account or to create a new Email account.

4.2.1 Gmail



As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. Gmail on your phone can be automatically synchronised with your Gmail account on the web. Unlike other kinds of email account, each message and its replies in Gmail are grouped in your inbox as a single conversation; all emails are organised by labels instead of folders.

To access Gmail

From the Home screen, touch the Application tab to enter the applications list, then touch **Gmail**.



Gmail displays messages and conversations from one single Gmail account at a time, if you own more than one account, you can add an account by touching wey and select **Settings** from Inbox screen, then touch **ADD ACCOUNT**. When finished, you can switch to another by touching the account name from Inbox screen, then select the account you want to view.

To create and send emails

- 1 Touch \sim from Inbox screen.
- 2 Enter recipient(s)'s email address in To field.
- 3 If necessary, touch touch **Add Cc/Bcc** to add a copy or a blind copy to the message.
- 4 Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- 5 Touch teve and select **Attach file** to add an attachment.
- 6 Finally, touch the icon > to send.

7 If you do not want to send the mail out right away, you can touch 🗮 key and then **Save draft** or touch the **Back** key to save a copy. To view the draft, touch your account name to display all labels, then select **Drafts**.

If you do not want to send or save the mail, you can touch we want then touch **Discard**.

To add a signature to emails, touch \equiv key and then touch **Settings** from inbox screen, choose an account, then touch **Signature**.

To receive and read your emails

When a new email arrives, you will be notified by a ringtone or vibration, and an icon \bowtie will appear on Status bar.

Touch and drag down the Status bar to display the Notification panel, touch the new email to view it. Or you can also access the Gmail Inbox label and touch the new mail to read it.

You can search for an email by sender, recipient, subject, etc.

• Touch the icon Q from Inbox screen.



• Enter the keyword you want to search for in the searching box and touch 🔍 on the software keyboard.

To reply or forward emails

- **Reply** When viewing an email, touch **K** to reply this mail.
- **Reply all** Touch and select **Reply all** to send message to all people in a mail loop.
- Forward Touch and select Forward to forward the received mail to other people.

4.2.2 Email

Besides your Gmail account, you can also set-up external email accounts on your phone.

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then select **Email**.

An email wizard will guide you through the steps to set up an email account.

- 1 Enter the email address and password of the account you want to set up.
- 2 Touch Next. If the account you entered is not provided by your service provider in the phone, you will be prompted to go to the email account settings screen to enter settings manually. Or you can touch Manual setup to directly enter the incoming and outgoing settings for the email account you are setting up.
- 3 Enter the account name and display name in outgoing emails.
- 4 To add another email account, you can touch **E** key and **Settings**. Touch **ADD ACCOUNT** on the right of the title to create a new account.

To create and send emails

- 1 Touch the icon \square_{\perp} on Inbox screen.
- 2 Enter recipient(s) email address(es) in the To field.
- 3 If necessary, touch to key and touch **Add Cc/Bcc** to add a copy or a blind copy to other recipients.
- 4 Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- 5 Touch text, then touch **Attach file** to add an attachment.
- 6 Finally, touch > to send.
- 7 If you do not want to send the mail right away, you can touch key and **Save draft** or touch the **Back** key to save a copy.

5 Calendar, Alarm clock & Calculator

5.1 Calendar




Use Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Calendar**.

5.1.1 Multimode view

You can display the Calendar in daily, weekly, monthly, or agenda view.

To change your Calendar view, touch the date title to open a drop-down menu for your options. Touch the icon 2 to return to Today's view.



5.1.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch the icon + to access new event edit screen.
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a wholeday event, you can select **All day**.
- When finished, touch **DONE** from the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from Day, Week view screen, touch and hold an empty spot or an event to open Option menu, then touch **New event** to enter the event details screen of the time you have previously selected. Or you can also touch an empty spot till it turns blue, then tap again to enter new event editing screen.

5.1.3 To delete or edit an event

5.1.4 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon will appear on Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Touch and drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel, touch event name to view Calendar notification list.

Touch **Snooze** to turn off all event reminders for 5 minutes.

Touch **Back** key to keep the reminders pending in the status bar and the Notification panel.

Important options by touching \equiv key from Calendar main screen:

- **Refresh** To refresh the calendar.
- Search To search in the calendar.
- Calendars to To show or hide the synchronised display calendars.
- **Clear events** To clear events in the calendar.
- Go to Select to go to specific date.
- **Settings** To set a series of Calendar settings.

5.2 Clock



Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Clock**.

Touch 🕥 to add or set an alarm.

5.2.1 To set an alarm

From **Time** screen, touch (1) to enter **Alarms** screen, touch + to add a new alarm. Following options will show:

- Time Touch numbers to set the time for your alarm.
 Label Touch to set a name for the alarm.
- **REPEAT** Touch to select days you want alarm to work.

- OCEAN Touch to select an alarm ringtone.
- VIBRATE Select to activate vibration.



Touch and hold an already existing alarm and touch 👕 to delete the selected alarm.

5.2.2 To adjust alarm settings

Touch two from **Alarms** screen. The following options will be available under **Settings**:

- CLOCK
- Style Touch to set Analog or Digital style.
- Automatic Touch to set home clock while travelling outside.
- Home time Touch to set home time zone. zone

ALARMS

- Silence after Touch to set time silence.
- **Snooze length** Touch to choose length of snooze.
- Alarm volume Touch to set alarm volume.
- Volume buttons Touch to choose Snooze, Dismiss or Do nothing as volume buttons.

5.3 Calculator


With Calculator, you can solve many mathematical problems.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Calculator**.

There are two panels available: Basic panel and Advanced panel.

To switch between panels, select one of the following two ways:

- Touch and drag the basic screen to the left to open the Advanced panel.
- Or touch **t** key from basic panel to open option menu and touch **Advanced panel**.









6 Getting connected

Your phone can connect to the Internet using either GPRS/ EDGE/3G or Wi-Fi.

6.1 Connecting to the Internet

6.1.1 GPRS/EDGE/3G/4G

The first time you turn on your phone with the SIM card inserted, it will automatically configure a mobile network service: GPRS, EDGE, 3G or 4G. If the network is not connected, you can touch and the Quick setting bar.

To check the network connection you are using, touch the Application tab on the Home screen, then touch **Settings > More... > Mobile networks > Access Point Names** or **Network operators**.

To create a new access point



A new mobile network connection can be added to your phone with the following steps:

1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.

2 Touch More... > Mobile networks > Access Point Names.

- 3 Then touch television and select New APN.
- 4 Enter the required APN information.
- 5 When finished, touch me key and **Save**.

To activate/deactivate Data roaming

When roaming, you can decide to connect/disconnect to a data service.

- 1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to Settings.
- 2 Touch More... > Mobile networks.
- 3 Mark/Unmark the checkbox to activate or deactivate data roaming.
- 4 When Data roaming is deactivated, you can still perform data exchange with a Wi-Fi connection (refer to "**6.1.2 Wi-Fi**").

6.1.2 Wi-Fi

You can connect to the Internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your phone even without a SIM card inserted.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.



- 2 Touch the switch of beside Wi-Fi to turn on/off Wi-Fi.
- 3 Touch **Wi-Fi**: detailed information of all detected Wi-Fi networks is displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- 4 Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (contact network operator for details). When you're finished, touch **Connect**.

To activate notification when a new network is detected

When Wi-Fi is on and the network notification is activated, the Wi-Fi icon will appear on the status bar whenever the phone detects an available wireless network within range. The following steps activate the notification function when Wi-Fi is on:

- 1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to Settings.
- 2 Touch **Wi-Fi**, then two and select **Advanced**.
- 3 Mark/Unmark the **Network notification** checkbox to activate/ deactivate this function.

To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- 1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Wi-Fi, and then touch +
- 3 Enter the name of the network and any required network information.



4 Touch Save.

When successfully connected, your phone will be connected automatically the next time you are within range of this network.

To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- 1 Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- 2 In the Wi-Fi screen, touch & hold the name of the saved network.
- 3 Touch **Forget network** in the dialogue that opens.

6.2 Browser




Using the Browser you can enjoy surfing the Web.

To get onto the Web, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Browser.**

To go to a web page

On Browser screen, touch the URL box at the top, enter the address of the web page, then touch \bigcirc to confirm.



The URL bar will hide after a few seconds. To show the URL bar, you can touch and slide down the screen.

To set homepage

- 1 Touch ≡ key from Browser screen to display option menu, touch Settings > General > Set home page.
- 2 Choose a page or most visited website as your homepage.
- 3 If you choose **Other**, enter the URL of the website you want to set as your homepage, touch **OK** to confirm.

6.2.1 Viewing web pages

When opening a website, you can navigate on web pages by sliding your finger on the screen in any direction to locate the information you want to view.

To zoom in/out of a web page

Pinch/Spread your finger on the screen to zoom out/in of the web page.

To quickly zoom into a section of a web page, double-tap on the section you want to view. To return to normal zoom level, double-tap again.

To find text on a web page

- 1 Touch they from web page screen, then touch **Find on page**.
- 2 Enter the text or phrase you want to find.
- 3 The words with matching characters will be highlighted on the screen.



- 4 Touch the up or down arrow to switch to the previous or next matching items.
- 5 When finished, you can touch \checkmark or the **Back** key to close the search bar.

Further operations for the text on a web page

You can copy, share or search the text from a web page:

- 1 Touch and hold the text to highlight.
- 2 Move the two selecting tabs to locate the text. Or touch **SELECT ALL** to select all words in this web screen.
- 3 Touch icons above for further options, including **Copy**, **Share** and **Web Search**.
- 4 When finished, touch \checkmark or the **Back** key to deactivate the mode.

To open new window/switch between windows

Multiple windows can be opened at the same time for your convenience.

- 1 Touch 📑 to open all windows' thumbnails.
- 2 Slide up and down to view all windows, touch one to view it.
- 3 Touch to open a new window.
- 4 To close a window, touch 🗙 on the window you want to close or slide it sideways.

Other options:

- **Refresh** To refresh the current page.
- **Stop** To stop opening the current page.
- Home page To get back to the homepage you set.
- Save to To add the current website page as bookmark. bookmarks
- Close To close all tabs and exit.
- Save for offline reading. You can find it by touching key and then touching Bookmarks/History > Saved pages.
- Share page To share the current page with your friends via various ways, like Message, Email, Bluetooth, etc.
- Find on page To input contents you want to find on the current page.
- Request To enable/disable computer version websites. desktop site
- **Bookmarks/** To see the bookmarks and browsing history. **History**

- **Settings** To access a series of Browser settings.
- Version To see the version of browser.



6.2.2 Manage links, history, downloads

To manage a link, phone number or address displayed on a web page

• Link Touch the link to open the web page.

Touch and hold the link to open options for further operation, like open in new window, save link, Copy link URL, etc.

- Phone number Touch to call the phone number.
- Address Touch to open Google Maps and locate the address.

To view Browser history

 $(\mathbf{\Phi})$

- Touch 🗮 key from Browser screen.
- Touch **Bookmarks/History**.
- Touch **HISTORY** tab to view browser history.
- Touch **SAVED PAGES** to view the pages you saved.

To download a web application/view your downloads

Before downloading a web application, you need to enable your phone to install web applications (touch the Application tab from the Home screen, touch **Settings > Security**, mark checkbox of **Unknown sources**, finally touch **OK** to confirm).

To download a item, touch the item or the link you want to download.

To cancel a download, touch the downloaded item from the Notification panel, touch and hold the item to be deleted, and touch are to confirm.

To view items you have downloaded, touch the Application tab, then touch **DOWNLOADED**.

Manage bookmarks

To bookmark a web page

- Open the web page you want to bookmark.
- Touch touch **Save to bookmarks**, or from the **History** screen, touch the star beside the URL.
- Enter the name and the location if needed and touch **OK** to confirm.

To open a bookmark

- Touch key and touch **Bookmarks/History**, or touch the icon to enter the Bookmarks screen.
- Touch the bookmark you want to open.
- You can also touch and hold to display the options screen, then touch **Open** or **Open in new window**.

Touch and hold a bookmark in the bookmark list to view additional options:

• Add shortcut to To add a bookmark shortcut to the Home screen.



- **Share link** To share the bookmark.
- **Copy link URL** To copy the bookmark link.
- Set as homepage To set this page as the homepage.



6.2.3 Settings

A series of settings are available for your adjustment. To access Browser settings, touch 🗮 key from Browser screen, and touch **Settings**.

6.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

To access this function, touch in a Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**, then touch **Bluetooth**, your device and other available ones will show on the screen.

To turn on Bluetooth

1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.

2 Touch O to activate/deactivate this function.



To make your phone more recognizable, you can change your phone name which is visible to others.

- 1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Bluetooth.
- 3 Touch me key and select **Rename phone**.
- 4 Enter a name, and touch **Rename** to confirm.

To make device visible

- 1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Bluetooth.
- 3 Touch your device to make it visible or invisible.
- 4 Touch to select **Visibility timeout** to select the visible time.

To pair/connect your phone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- 1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to Settings.
- 2 Touch Bluetooth.
- 3 Touch SEARCH FOR DEVICES.
- 4 Touch a Bluetooth device you want to be paired with in the list.
- 5 A dialog will popup, touch **Pair** to confirm.
- 6 If the pairing is successful, your phone connects to the device.

To disconnect/unpair from a Bluetooth device

- 1 Touch the device name you want to unpair.
- 2 Touch **Unpair** to confirm.

6.4 Connecting to a computer via USB



With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your phone and computer.

To connect/disconnect your phone to/from the computer:

Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.

If you want to change the USB connection type, open the Notifications panel and touch ψ .



To locate data you have transferred or downloaded in the internal storage:

1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen to open the apps list.

2 Touch File Manager.

All data you have downloaded is stored in **File Manager**, where you can view media files (videos, photos, music and others), rename files, install apps onto your phone, etc.

To format a microSD card

- 1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Storage.
- 3 Touch **Format SD card**, a popup message appears to warn you that formatting the miscroSD card will erase its contents.
- 4 Touch Format SD card to confirm.



6.5 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with a single computer via a USB cable (USB tethering) or with up to eight devices at once by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot or via Bluetooth.

To turn on USB tethering or Portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- 1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to go to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch More... > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 3 Mark the checkbox of **USB tethering** or turn on **Wi-Fi hotspot** to activate this function.



Sharing data may incur additional charges from your network operator. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas.

To share your phone's data connection via USB

Use the USB cable that along with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer.

- 1 Drag down the Notification panel and touch **R** then the Settings icon to access **Settings**.
- 2 Touch More... > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 3 Mark\unmark the checkbox of **USB tethering** to activate/ deactivate this function.

To share your phone's data connection as a portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- 1 Drag down the Notification panel and touch 🔛 then the Settings icon 🔯 to access **Settings**.
- 2 Touch More... > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 3 Touch the switch **O** beside **Wi-Fi hotspot** to activate/ deactivate this function.

To share your phone's data connection via Bluetooth

1 Drag down the Notification panel and touch **R** then the Settings icon **o** to access **Settings**.



- 2 Touch More... > Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 3 Mark/Unmark the check box of **Bluetooth tethering** to activate/deactivate this function.

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To rename or secure your portable hotspot

When Portable Wi-Fi hotspot is activated, you could change the name of your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network.

- 1 Drag down the Notification panel and touch settings icon of to access **Settings**.
- 2 Touch More... > Tethering & portable hotspot > Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 3 Touch **Set up Wi-Fi hotspot** to change the network SSID or set your network security.

4 Touch Save.

6.6 Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

To add a VPN

- 1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch More... > VPN settings and then touch +
- 3 In the screen that opens, follow the instructions from your network administrator to configure each component of the VPN settings.

4 Touch Save.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a lock screen pattern, PIN code or password for your phone.

To connect/disconnect to a VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- 1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch More... > VPN settings.
- 3 VPNs you have added are listed; touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- 4 In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch **Connect**.

To disconnect:

• Open the Notification panel and touch the resulting notification for VPN disconnection.

To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

- 1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch More... > VPN settings.
- 3 VPNs you have added are listed; touch & hold the VPN you want to edit.
- 4 Touch Edit profile.
- 5 After finished, touch Save.

To delete:

• Touch and hold the VPN you want to delete, in the dialog that opens, touch **Delete profile**.

7 Google Play Store ⁽¹⁾



Google Play Store is an online software store, where you can download and install applications and games to your Android Powered Phone.

To open Google Play Store:

- Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Google Play Store**.
- For the first time you access Google Play Store, a screen with terms of service pops up for your attention, touch **Accept** to continue.

Touch the select **Help** to enter Google Play Store help page for more information on this function.


8.1 Camera



Your mobile phone is fitted with a Camera for taking photos and shooting videos.

Before using the Camera, please be sure to open the protective lens cover before use to avoid it affecting your picture quality.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen and then touch **Camera**.



To take a picture

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch a icon to take the picture which will be automatically saved.

To shoot a video

First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, and touch icon to start recording. Touch it to stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

Further operations when viewing a picture/video you have taken

- Touch the icons below the screen to share and edit the photo or video you have taken.
- Touch the photo icon to access **Gallery**.

8.1.1 Settings in framing mode

Before taking a photo/shooting a video, touch the si icon to adjust a number of settings in framing mode.

Back camera shooting mode

Touch the \equiv key to access camera settings and below options will display for you to choose from:

- **Full screen** Touch to turn on/off full screen preview mode.
- **Night** Touch to turn on/off night mode.
- **Sports** Touch to turn on/off sports mode.
- Advanced Touch to set picture size, timer, ISO, exposure or turn on/off GPS location info.
- Restore defaults Touch to restore camera default settings.
- **Shutter sound** Touch to turn on/off shutter sound.
- HDR Touch to turn on HDR (high-dynamic range) function. HDR photos can better reflect the visual effects people have in the real environment by synthesizing images under different exposure time. The phone will then automatically save the original photos and HDR ones.
- Panorama Touch to turn on panorama function. Press the **Shutter** button or the **Volume** key to start taking panoramic photo and move the phone towards your capture direction and overlap the two lines. Once the nine slots below the screen are filled, the phone will automatically save the photo.

Front camera shooting mode

Switch to front camera, touch the \implies key to access camera settings and the following options will display for your choice:

- Face beauty Touch to turn on/off face beauty function.
- Expression (4-shot) Touch to turn on expression (4-shot) function: once four photos taken, the phone will automatically synthesize and save them as one picture.
- Filter Touch to choose between different filter modes.


8.2 Gallery

Gallery acts as a media player for you to view photos and playback videos. In addition, a set of further operations to pictures and videos are available for your choice.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Gallery**.

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pictures (max 9) for further editing

Touch to Switch to camera

Touch to select categories: Albums, Locations, Times

Touch the album to spread it apart

Slide left or right to view more albums



To view a picture/play a video

Pictures and videos are displayed by albums in Gallery.



Touch to return to gallery's main screen




- Slide left or right to view more pictures

- Touch an album and all pictures or videos will spread the screen.
- Touch the picture/video directly to view or play it.
- Slide left/right to view previous or next pictures/videos.

Working with pictures

You can work with pictures by rotating or cropping them, sharing them with friends, setting them as contact photo or wallpaper, etc.

Locate the picture you want to work on, touch the picture from full-screen picture view. Slide the icon bar below left and right to select one, touch icon \gg to share the picture, touch \overline{m} icon above and confirm **OK** to delete the picture.



Touch to share the picture through selected

Touch to edit the picture: Beauty, Enhance, Effect, Frame, Mosaics, etc.

- Touch to set the picture as contact photo or wallpaper
- Touch to play the slideshow

Touch *☑* from full-screen picture view to edit a picture.



- Edit Touch to Crop, Rotate or Sharpen the picture.
- Touch to beautify the picture by **Dermabrasion**, Beauty Whitening or Complexion.
- **Enhance** Touch to open **Toning color** and **Smart fill light**.
- Effect Touch to set effect of Lomo. Portrait. Fashion or Art.

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- Touch to choose frame. Frame
- **Mosaics** Touch to add mosaics to the picture.
- Text Touch to add text to the picture.
- Bokeh Touch to set **Circle bokeh** or **Line bokeh**.

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After activating the crop mode, the cropping square appears in the middle of the picture. Select the portion to crop, touch it confirm and Save, touch icon to exit without saving.

Batch operation

Gallery provides a multi-select function, so that you can work with pictures/videos in batches.

Open the main Gallery window or an album, touch key and touch **Select album** to activate batch operation mode (you can also touch and hold one album/picture), then touch albums/ pictures you want to work on. Touch to delete. Touch to share selected ones.

8.3 Play music

Using this menu, you can play music files stored on the microSD card in your phone. Music files can be downloaded from computer to microSD card using a USB cable.



To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Play Music**.

You will find four categories in which all songs are classified: **GENRES, ARTISTS, ALBUMS** and **SONGS**. Slide left and right to view all. Touch **Shuffle all** to shuffle all songs.

8.3.1 Playing music

Touch a song to play the song.



Touch to get to **Settings**.

9.1.2 Open Google Maps and view My Location

To move the map, drag the map with your finger.





File Manager displays all data stored on both microSD card and phone storage, including applications, media files; videos, pictures or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB cable, etc.

When you download an application from PC to microSD card, you can locate the application on File Manager, then touch it to install it in your phone.

File Manager allows you to perform and be really efficient with the following common operations: create (sub) folder, open folder/file, view, rename, move, copy, delete, play, share, etc.







11.1 Wireless & networks

11.1.1 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi you can now surf the Internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the **Wi-Fi** screen and configure an access point to connect your phone to the wireless network.

For detailed instructions on using Wi-Fi, please refer to "6.1.2 Wi-Fi".

11.1.2 Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows your phone to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) in a small range with another Bluetooth supported device (phone, computer, printer, headset, car kit, etc.).



For more information on Bluetooth, please refer to "6.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices".

11.1.3 Data usage

To enable/disable mobile data by touching the switch

Mark the checkbox of **Set mobile data limit**, then you can drag the limit line and the warning line according to your limitation. Your mobile data connection will be disabled when the specified limit is reached. You can also choose a data usage cycle to view the statistics and related applications of used data by your phone.

Touch \equiv key, and you can view more settings related to your data usage.



Data usage is measured by your phone, and your carrier may count differently. Please consider using a conservative limit.

11.1.4 Airplane mode

Through **More... > Airplane mode** to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

You can also open Airplane mode by touching **AIRPLANE MODE** on Quick setting bar or in phone options when pressing **Power** key.

11.1.5 Default SMS app

Choose default app for SMS functions.

11.1.6 NFC



Mark the check box to allow data exchange when the device touches another device.

11.1.7 Android Beam

When NFC is enabled, it can transmit app content to another device.

11.1.8 VPN settings

A mobile virtual private network (mobile VPN or mVPN) provides mobile devices with access to network resources and software applications on their home network, when they connect via other wireless or wired networks. Mobile VPNs are used in environments where workers need to keep application sessions open at all times, throughout the working day, as the user connects via various wireless networks, encounters gaps in coverage, or suspend-and-resumes their devices to preserve battery life. A conventional VPN cannot survive such events because the network tunnel is disrupted, causing applications to disconnect, time out, fail, or even the computing device itself to crash.

11.1.9 Tethering & portable hotspot

This function allows you to share your phone's mobile data connection via USB or as a portable Wi-Fi access point (Please refer to "**6.5 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection**").

Mark the check box to connect to data services when roaming.

Network mode

Touch to select network mode.

You can select your preferred network with this menu.

You can select a network operator.

11.1.11 USB Internet

Mark the checkbox to share Windows PC internet via USB cable.

- 1 Connect your phone to your PC with USB cable.
- 2 Select PC system version, then touch **Next**.

3 Finish connection as instructed, then touch **Done**.

11.2 Device

11.2.1 Sound

Use the Sound settings to configure ringtones for different events and environments.

VOLUME

- Vibrate Mark the check box to vibrate phone for incoming calls.
- Silent mode Mark the check box to silence all sounds except media & alarms.
- **Ringtone &** Slide to adjust volume of Ringtone, notification notifications and system.
- Music, video, Slide to adjust multimedia volume of music, video, games and video, games, etc.
- Alarms Slide to adjust Alarms ringtone volume.

In battery screen you can view the battery usage data since you last connected the phone to a power source. The screen also shows your battery status and how long it has been used since last charging. Touch one category, then you can learn its specific power consumption.

You can adjust power use via the screen brightness or screen timeout in Display screen.

Touch to choose storage type for credentials.

Trusted credentials

Touch to display trusted CA certificates.

Touch to install encrypted certificates from the microSD card.

Touch to remove all credentials.

11.3.3 Language & input

Use the Language & input settings to select the language for the text on your phone and for configuring the onscreen keyboard. You can also configure voice input settings and the pointer speed.

Language

Touch to select the language and the region you want.

Spell checker



Mark the checkbox to enable the system to show suggested words.

Personal dictionary

Touch to open a list of the words you've added to the dictionary. Touch a word to edit or delete it. Touch the add button (+) to add a word.

Default

Touch to select a default input method. Touch the Settings icon on the right of selected input method, a series of settings are available for your selection.



Google keyboard

If you've turned on this function, a wide variety of settings and data are backed up, including your Wi-Fi passwords, bookmarks, a list of the apps you've installed, the words you've added to the dictionary used by the onscreen keyboard, and most of the settings that you configure with the Settings app. If you turn this option off, it will stop backing up your settings, and any existing backups are deleted from Google Servers.

Factory data reset

To activate a factory data reset:

- 1 Touch 🔯 on Quick setting bar to go to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Backup and reset > Factory data reset.
- 3 Touch Reset phone > Erase everything.

Phone resetting will erase all of your personal data from internal phone storage, including information about your Google Account, any other accounts, your system and app settings, and any downloaded apps. Resetting the phone does not erase any system updates you have downloaded. If you reset the phone in this way, you are prompted to re-enter the same kind of information as when you first started Android.

If you're unable to turn your phone on, there is another alternative to perform a factory data reset by pressing the **Volume up** key and the **Power** key at same time under power off mode until the screen lights up.

Mark the checkbox to display the time using 24-hour clock format.

Touch to open a dialog where you can select the format for displaying dates.

Touch to view legal information.







12 Update your phone's software

Using the FOTA (Firmware Over The Air) Upgrade tool you can update your phone's software.

To access System Updates, open the Notification panel and touch and then 💽, then touch About phone > System updates. Or you can directly touch (:::) and access Settings > About phone > System updates. Touch Check for updates, and the phone will search for the latest software. If you want to update the system, please touch **Download**, and when that's finished, touch **Install** to complete the upgrade. Now your phone will have the latest version of the software.

You should turn on data connection before searching for updates. Settings for auto-check intervals and reminders about upgrades are also available once you restart the phone.

If you have chosen auto-check, when the system discovers the new version, the icon 🐱 will appear in the status bar. Touch the notification to access the System Updates directly.

Product safety information RF exposure

General statement on RF energy

Your phone contains a transmitter and a receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your phone transmits.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR)

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organisation ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to ensure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg and the highest SAR value for this device when tested at the ear was 0.311 W/kg ⁽¹⁾ and when tested near the body (at a distance of 10 mm) the highest SAR value was 0.644 W/kg. As mobile devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in other positions, such as on the body as described in this user guide.



As SAR is measured utilising the device's highest transmitting power, the actual SAR of this device while operating is typically below that indicated above. This is due to automatic changes to the power level of the device to ensure it only uses the minimum power required to communicate with the network.

Body worn operation

Important safety information regarding radiofrequency radiation (RF) exposure.

To ensure compliance with RF exposure guidelines the phone must be used with a minimum of 10 mm separation from the body.

Failure to observe these instructions could result in your RF exposure exceeding the relevant guideline limits.




Product handling

- Always treat your phone and its accessories with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.
- Do not expose your phone or its accessories to open flames or lit tobacco products.
- Do not expose your phone or its accessories to liquid, moisture or high humidity.



- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or aerosols to clean the device or its accessories.
- Do not paint your phone or its accessories.
- Do not attempt to disassemble your phone or its accessories, only authorised personnel must do so.
- Do not expose your phone or its accessories to extreme temperatures, minimum -10 and maximum +50 degrees Celsius.

Small children

Seizures/Blackouts

Repetitive motion injuries

To minimise the risk of RSI, when texting or playing games with your phone:

Emergency calls

To prevent possible hearing damage, do not listen at high volume levels for long periods. Exercise caution when holding your device near your ear while the loudspeaker is in use.

Bright light

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This phone is capable of producing flash of light or use as a torch, do not use it too close to the eyes.

Phone heating

Your phone may become warm during charging and during normal use.

Electrical safety

Accessories

Use only approved accessories.

Do not connect with incompatible products or accessories. Take care not to touch or allow metal objects, such as coins or key rings, to contact or short-circuit the battery terminals.

Connection to a car

Seek professional advice when connecting a phone interface to the vehicle's electrical system.

Faulty and damaged products

Do not attempt to disassemble the phone or its accessories. Only qualified personnel must service or repair the phone or its accessories.

If your phone or its accessories have been submerged in water, punctured, or subjected to a severe fall, do not use them until you have taken it to be checked at an authorised service centre.







Battery handling & safety

Always switch the device off and disconnect the charger before removing the battery.

Only use the battery and charger supplied, or manufacturer approved replacements intended for use with your phone. Using other batteries and chargers could be dangerous.

Do not disassemble or short-circuit the battery. Accidental shortcircuiting can occur if a metallic object such as a key, paper clip, or pen touches the terminals of the battery.

Improper battery use may result in a fire, explosion, or other hazard. If you believe the battery has been damaged, do not use it, take it to a service centre for testing.

Interference

General statement on interference

Care must be taken when using the phone in close proximity to personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids. **Pacemakers**

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 15 cm be maintained between a mobile phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. To achieve this use the phone on the opposite ear to your pacemaker and do not carry it in a breast pocket.



Hearing aids

People with hearing aids or other cochlear implants may experience interference noises when using wireless devices or when one is nearby. The level of interference will depend on the type of hearing device and the distance from the interference source, increasing the separation between them may reduce the interference. You may also consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Medical devices

Please consult your doctor and the device manufacturer to determine if operation of your phone may interfere with the operation of your medical device.

Hospitals

Switch off your wireless device when requested to do so in hospitals, clinics or health care facilities. These requests are designed to prevent possible interference with sensitive medical equipment.

Aircraft

Switch off your wireless device whenever you are instructed to do so by airport or airline staff.

Consult the airline staff about the use of wireless devices on board the aircraft, if your device offers a 'flight mode' this must be enabled prior to boarding an aircraft.

Interference in cars

Please note that because of possible interference to electronic equipment, some vehicle manufacturers forbid the use of mobile phones in their vehicles unless a handsfree kit with an external antenna is included in the installation.


Explosive environments

Petrol stations and explosive atmospheres

In locations with potentially explosive atmospheres, obey all posted signs to turn off wireless devices such as your phone or other radio equipment.
