

1.1 Keys and connectors





Bac

Back key

 Touch to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the notification panel, etc.

Home key

• While on any application or screen, touch to return to the Home screen.

Recents key

• Touch and hold to open a list of thumbnail images of apps you've worked with recently.

Power key

- Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen.
- Press and hold: Generate a pop up menu providing more options: Restart, Power off, Airplane mode.
- Press the Power key for more than 15 seconds to restart.
- Press the **Power** key to light up the screen when it dims during a call.
- Press the Power key and Volume up key to reset if the phone is off.
- Press the Power key and Volume down key to capture a screenshot while the device is on.

Volume Keys

- In call mode, adjusts the earpiece or headset volume.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, adjusts the media volume.
- In general mode, adjusts the ringtone volume.
- Mutes the ringtone of an incoming call.

1.2 Getting started

1.2.1 Set-up

Removing and installing the back cover



Installing and removing the micro SD card




Insert the micro SD card with golden contact facing downwards into the slot. Slide it out to remove the micro SD card.




To avoid data loss and SD card damage, before removing the SD card, please ensure that the SD card is unmounted (**Settings\ Storage\Unmount SD card**).

Installing and removing the battery



- To install, insert and click the battery into place, then close the phone cover.
- To remove the battery, first power the phone off. Then unclip the cover and remove the battery.

Charging the battery



Connect the battery charger to your phone and main socket respectively.



To reduce power consumption and energy waste, once the battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

1.2.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on, unlock your phone (Slide, PIN, Password, Pattern or Voice unlock) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen is displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or have forgotten it, contact your service provider. Do not leave your PIN code with your phone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

Set up your phone for the first time

The first time you power on the phone, you should set the following options:

- Select the phone's language, then touch Get started.
- Select the input method, then touch
- Set up Wi-Fi and your Mobile data connection, then touch

- Set up your Google account: Touch Set up now to set up your Google account. If you already have a Google account, touch Existing; then enter your Email address and password. If you've forgotten the password, go to http://www.google.com to retrieve it. If you don't own a Google account, touch New to create one.
- Set up screen lock to activate device protection, you can also touch
 Cancel to skip it.
- Finish **Backup & reset** settings, then touch **>** .
- Activate **Location**, or skip by touching **\rightarrow** .
- When the **Finished** screen displayed, touch **Enjoy now**.

If you power on your phone with no SIM card inserted, you can connect to a Wi-Fi network to sign into your Google account and to use some features.

1.2.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the **Power** key from the Home screen until the phone options appear, select **Power off**.

1.3 Home screen

You can bring all the items (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) you love or use most frequently to your Home screen for quick access. Touch the **Home** key to switch to the Home screen.



Status bar

- Status/Notification indicators
- Touch and drag down to open the notification panel.

Slide left or right to view other panels on the Home screen.

Touch an icon to open an application, folder, etc.

Favorite tray applications

- Touch to enter the application.
- Touch and hold to move applications.

Application tab

• Touch to enter application list.

The Home screen is provided in an extended format to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view.

1.3.1 Using the touchscreen

Touch



To access an application, touch it with your finger.

Touch and Hold



To enter the available options for an item, touch and hold the item. For example, select a contact in Contacts, touch and hold this contact, an options list will then appear on screen.

Drag



Place your finger on the screen to drag an object to another location.

Slide/Swipe



The device also supports one finger zoom in (Message, Browser, Email and Gallery) by double tapping the screen then slide with one finger to zoom in/out).

Flick



Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move guicker.

Pinch/Spread



Place your fingers of one hand on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.

Rotate



Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways.

1.3.2 Status bar

From the status bar, you can view both phone status and notification information.

Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel or Quick setting panel. Touch and drag up to close it. When there are notifications, you can touch them to access notifications directly.

Notification panel


When there are notifications, touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Notification panel to read the detailed information.



Touch a notification and slide it sideways to delete it.

Touch the icon to clear all event-based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).

Touch and then the Settings icon to access **Settings**.



Touch to access **Settings**, where you can set more items.

Quick settings bar

Touch icons to enable/disable functions or to change models.

1.3.3 Search bar

The phone provides a Search function which can be used to locate information within applications, the phone or the web.



Search by text

- Touch the Search bar from the Home screen.
- Type the text/phrase you want to search for.

• Touch the Q icon on the keyboard if you want to search on the web.

Search by voice


- Touch ① from the Search bar to display a dialog screen.
- Speak the word/phrase you want to search for. A list of search results will display for you to select from.

1.3.4 Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock the phone screen by creating a variety of patterns, PINs or passwords etc.

To create a screen unlock pattern

- Touch the Menu key from the Home screen, then touch Settings\Lock settings\Screen lock\Pattern.
- Draw your own pattern.



To create a screen unlock PIN/Password

- Touch the Menu key from the Home screen, then touch Settings\Lock settings\Screen lock\PIN or Password.
- Set your PIN or password.

To lock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to lock the screen.

To unlock phone screen

Press the power key once to light up the screen, draw the unlock pattern you have created or enter PIN or password, etc. to unlock the screen.

1.3.5 Personalize your Home screen

Add an app or widget

You can touch and hold a folder, an application or a widget to activate the Move mode, and drag the item to any Home screen as you prefer.

Reposition an app or widget

Touch and hold the item to be repositioned to activate the Move mode, drag the item to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the favorite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

Remove

Touch and hold the item to be removed to activate the Move mode, drag the item up to the top of the **Remove** icon, and release after the item turns red.

Create folders

To improve the organization of items (shortcuts or applications) on the Home screen and the favorite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

Wallpaper customization

Touch and hold the Home screen then touch **WALLPAPERS** to customize wallpaper.

1.3.6 Widgets and recently-used applications

Consult widgets


Touch and hold the Home screen to enter applications and widgets list.

Slide left and right to view all applications and widgets. Touch **WIDGETS** to access the category directly.

To return to the Home screen, touch the **Home** key.

Consult recently-used applications

To consult recently-used applications, touch the Recents key from the Home screen. Touch a thumbnail in the window to open the related application.



Slide Vertically to view all thumbnails of recently-used applications.

Touch one thumbnail and slide it left or right to delete it.

Touch 1 at the bottom to activate the system's one key boost which clears memory used by recent applications.

1.3.7 Volume adjustment

Using Volume key

Press the **Volume** key to adjust the volume. To active the vibrate mode, press the **Volume down** key until the phone vibrate. Press the **Volume down** key once more to active the silent mode.

Using Settings Menu

Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen, then touch **Settings\Sound & notification** you can set the volume of media, Alarm,Ring,Notification etc. to your preference.


Text input

2.1 Using Onscreen Keyboard

Onscreen keyboard settings

Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen, select **Settings/Language & input/ Android Keyboard** and a series of settings will become available for your selection.

2.1.1 Android keyboard



2.2 Text editing

You can edit the text you have entered.

- · Touch and hold within the text you would like to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the highlighted selection.
- The following options will show: CUT, COPY, SHARE.



You can also insert new texts as you prefer

- Touch where you want to type, or touch and hold the blank, the cursor will blink and the tab will show. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have selected any text, touch the tab to show SELECT ALL icon which allows you to complete paste immediately.





3.1 Call



3.2 Placing a call

You can easily launch a call using **Call**. Touch the Application tab from the Home screen and select **Call**.



Enter the desired number from the keyboard directly or select a contact from **Contacts** or **Call log** then touch to place the call.

The number you entered can be saved to **Contacts** by touching **Create new contact** icon .

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching

To hang up a call, touch

International call

To dial an international call, touch and hold $\mathbf{0}_+$ to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and finally touch $\mathbf{0}_+$.

Emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial emergency number and touch to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.

3.3 Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive a call:

- Slide the icon to the right to answer;
- Slide the icon to the left to reject;
- Slide the icon upwards to reject the call by sending a preset message.

To mute the ringtone volume of an incoming call, press the **Volume up/down** key.

3.3.1 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

To access your voicemail, touch and hold 1 on the dial pad.

To set your voicemail number, touch the **Menu** key from the Phone screen, then touch **Settings\Call settings\Voicemail\Setup\Voicemail number**.

3.3.2 During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the **Volume up/down** key.



- Touch to end the current call.
- Touch to display the dial pad.
- Touch to activate the speaker during the current call. Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.
- Touch to mute the current call. Touch this icon again to unmute the call.
- Touch to hold the current call. Touch this icon again to retrieve the call.
- Touch to add a call.

During a call:

Press the Power key to light up the screen when it dims.



To avoid accidentally pressing the touchscreen during a call, the screen will automatically lock and unlock once the cellphone is placed and removed from your ear.

3.3.3 Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

Swap calls

When you accept two calls, touch the icon to switch between two lines. The current call is put on hold and you have joined in the other call.

Conference calls (1)

You can set up a conference call.

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Touch the icon
- Dial to add a call and then touch
- Touch Merge calls to start conference.
- Touch to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

3.3.4 Call settings

Touch the **Menu** key from the Phone screen, then touch **Settings\Call settings**, the following options are available:

Voicemail

Touch to access voicemail service and number settings.

- Service Opens a dialog box where you can select your provider's voicemail service or another service.
- Setup If you are using your provider's voicemail service, this opens a
 dialog box where you can enter the phone number to use for listening to
 and managing your voicemail.
- Sound Touch to select the notification sound.
- Vibrate Mark the check box to enable vibration when there's an incoming voicemail call.

Fixed Dialing Numbers

Fixed Dialing Number (FDN) is a service mode of SIM, where outgoing calls are restricted to a set of phone numbers. These numbers are added to the FDN list. The most common practical application of FDN is for parents to restrict the phone numbers to which their children can dial. For security reasons, you'll be prompted to enable FDN by entering SIM PIN2 which is usually acquired from your service provider or SIM maker.

Depending on your network service provider.

Call forwarding

Select to always forward your calls or when you are busy, unanswered, or unreachable.

Call barring

Touch to pick out calls to be barred, cancel call barring, or change barring password.

Additional settings

Touch to access other voice call settings.

Caller ID: Touch to use default operator settings to display my number in outgoing calls.

Call waiting: Mark the checkbox to notify you of new incoming calls during a call.

Other settings

Display options

Touch to set display options, sort by First name or Last name, and Name format, First name first or Last name first.

Quick responses

Touch to edit quick responses which will be used when you reject a call with messages.

Accessibility

- **TTY mode** Touch to select among TTY Off, TTY Full, TTY HCO, and TTY VCO.
- **Turn over to mute** Mute the incoming calls by turning the phone over.
- Turn over to reject Reject incoming calls by turning the phone over.
- Vibrate reminder Vibrate when outgoing calls connect successfully.

Call log 3.4

You can access your call log by touching (1) from the Dial screen. Touch on the right side of a contact/number to place a call directly.

Touch a contact or number to view information or further operations.

You can view detailed information of a call, launch a new call or send messages to a contact or number, or add numbers to **Contacts**, etc.

To clear the entire call log, touch **Menu key\Call history\Clear call history**.

3.5 Contacts




Contacts enables quick and easy access to the people you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronize these with your Gmail contacts or other applications on the web or on your phone.

3.5.1 **Consult your Contacts**

To access this feature, touch (IIII) from the Home screen, then select Contacts.



Touch the **Menu** key to display contacts list option menu, following actions are enabled:

Contacts to display

Choose contacts to display.

Import/export

Import or export contacts between phone, SIM card, and micro SD card, or share contacts.

Block contacts Select and delete unwanted contacts.

list

Share your contacts through Bluetooth, Email, etc. Groups

Accounts

Manage the synchronization settings for different

accounts.

Settings

Touch to change the display of the sort list and

contact names.

3.5.2 **Managing contact groups**


The contact group helps you to improve the organization of your contacts. You can add, remove and view groups in the **Group** screen.

To create a new group, touch the see icon and then type the group's name and person's name, finally touch **DONE** to confirm.

3.5.3 Adding a contact

Touch the (a) icon to create a new contact.

You are required to enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another easily.



If you want to add more information, touch **More Fields** to add a new category.

When finished, touch ____ to save.

To exit without saving, you can touch the Home key directly.

Add to/remove from Favorites (1)

To add a contact to favorites, you can touch a contact to view details then touch $\$ to add the contact to favorites (the star will turn white in color).

To remove a contact from favorites, touch the star \bigstar on contact details screen.

3.5.4 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch the **Menu** key in the contact details screen, then touch . When finished, touch .

Change a contact's default phone number

The default phone number (the number which has priority when making a call or sending a message) will always be displayed under the contact name.

To change the default phone number, touch and hold the number you want to set as the default number from the contact's details screen, then select **Set default**.

This choice is only available when the contact has more than one number.

Set ringtone for a contact (2)

On the contact's detail screen, touch Edit contact to display options menu, touch More Field to set Ringtones.

Delete a contact

To delete a contact, touch the **Menu** key and **Delete** from the contact list screen. Tick the contact you want to remove and touch **OK** to confirm.



The contact you have deleted will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronize your phone.

3.5.5 Communicating with your contacts

From the contact list, you can communicate with your contacts by making a call or exchanging messages.

To launch a call to a contact, touch the contact to enter the detail screen, then touch the number.


To send a message to a contact, touch the contact to enter the detail screen, then touch the icon on the right side of the number.

Use Quick contact for Android

Touch a contact's picture to open Quick Contact for Android, then you can touch the number to make a phone call or the icon to send a message.

Only phone and account contacts can be added to Favorites.

You can only set a ringtone for established contacts.



The icons available on Quick Contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications and accounts on your phone.

3.6 Contacts importing, exporting and sharing

From the Contacts screen, touch the **Menu** key to open the options menu, then touch **Import/Export**.

To import/export a contact to your SIM card, select the contact you want to import/export, then touch **OK** to confirm or **CANCEL** to quit.

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

Touch the contact you want to share, touch the **Menu** key and **Share** from the contact details screen, then select the application to perform this action.

3.6.1 Displaying contacts

You can configure which group of contacts, for each account, you want to display in the Contacts list. Touch the **Menu** key and touch **Contacts to display** from the contact list screen, then you can choose contacts to display.

Touch the **Menu** key and **Settings**, you can sort list by the First name or Last name as well as view contact names as First/Last name first.

3.6.2 Joining/Separating contacts (1)

To avoid duplication, you can add any new contact information to existing contacts in a single action.

Touch the contact which you want to add information to, touch the **Menu** key and touch , then touch the **Menu** key again and touch **Join**.

At this time, you are required to select the contact whose information you want to join with the first contact. The information from the second contact is added to the first one, and the second contact will no longer be displayed in the Contacts list.

To separate contact information, touch the contact whose information you want to separate, touch the **Menu** key and touch , then touch the **Menu** key again and touch **Separate**, touch **OK** to confirm.

Only applicable for phone contacts.

3.6.3 Accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronized from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone.

To add an account, touch if from the Home screen and enter **Settings**, then touch **Accounts\Add account**.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, Corporate, etc.

As with other account set-ups, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account to delete it and all associated information from the phone. Open the **Settings** screen, select the account you want to delete, touch **Remove account**, then confirm.

Turn on/off the sync & Auto-sync

Touch an account to enter the account screen, mark/unmark the checkbox(s) to turn on/off the account's auto-sync. When activated, all changes to information on the phone or online will be automatically synchronized to each other.

Sync manually

You can also synchronize an account manually on **Accounts** screen, touch an account in the list, then touch the **Menu** key and select **Sync now**.



Messaging



You can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS with this phone.

To access this feature, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then select **Messaging**.



To consult messages stored in your SIM card, touch the **Menu** key from the Messaging screen, then touch **Settings\Text** message (SMS)\Multimedia message (MMS).

4.1 Write message

On the message list screen, touch the new message icon a to write text/multimedia messages.



Touch to create a new message

Sending a text message

Enter the mobile phone number of the recipient in the **Type name or number** bar or touch + to add recipients; then touch the **Type text message** bar to type the text of the message. When finished, touch to send the text message.



An SMS of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. Specific letters (accent) will also increase the size of the SMS, this may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, slides and sounds to other compatible phones and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides, etc.) are attached or Subject or email addresses added.

To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the **Type name or number** bar, and touch **Type text message** bar to type the text of the message. Then touch the icon to attach picture, video, audio and so on.

When finished, touch > to send the multimedia message.

Attach options:

• Capture picture Access Camera to capture a new picture for attaching.

• Capture video Access Camcorder to record a new video for attaching.

• **Record audio** Enter voice message recorder to record a voice message for attaching.


• **Contact** Enter Contacts to select a contact as attachment.

• **Pictures** Access Gallery application or File manager to select a picture as attachment.

 Videos Access Gallery application or File manager to select a video as attachment.

Audio Access to select an audio file as attachment.

• **Slideshow**Enter Edit slide show screen, touch **Add slide** to create a new slide, and touch currently existing slide to edit it (see following picture). Touch the **Menu** key to get more actions, like setting the slide duration, adding music, etc.



4.1.1 Manage messages

When receiving a message, an icon will appear on the status bar as notification. Drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel, touch the new message to open and read it. You can also access the Messaging application and touch the message to open.

Messages are displayed in conversational order.

To reply to a message, touch the current message to enter message composing screen, enter the text, then touch **>**.

Touch and hold an SMS in message details screen. The following message options are available for selection:

• Copy	This option displays when the message is an SMS. Copy the current message content. You can paste it to the enter bar of the new message you are going to compose.
Forward	Touch to forward the message to another recipient.
 Delete message 	Delete the current message.
• Save message to SIM card	Touch to select the message to SIM card.

• Lock	Touch to lock/unlock the message so it can't/can be deleted if you reach maximum number of stored messsges.
 Select text 	Touch to select the message text to copy, cut, add to dictionary, etc.
View details	Touch to view details of the message.

4.1.2 Adjust message settings

You can adjust a set of message settings. From the Messaging application screen, touch the **Menu** key and then **Settings**.

5 Gmail/Email.....

The first time you set up your phone, you can select to use an existing Gmail or to create a new Email account.

5.1 Gmail ⁽¹⁾......



As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. Gmail on your phone can be automatically synchronized with your Gmail account on the web. Unlike other kinds of email account, each message and its replies in Gmail are grouped in your inbox as a single conversation; all emails are organized by labels instead of folders.

To access Gmail

From the Home screen, touch it to enter the applications list, then touch **Gmail**.

To create and send emails

- Touch the icon from Inbox screen.
- Enter recipient(s)'s email address in To field, and if necessary, touch and then add a copy or a blind copy to the message in Cc or Bcc field.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch the icon and select Attach file to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch the > icon to send.
- If you do not want to send the mail out right away, you can touch the Menu key and Save draft or touch Back key to save a copy. To view the draft, touch your account name to display all labels, then select Drafts.

 If you do not want to send or save the mail, you can touch the Menu key and then touch Discard.

To add a signature to emails, touch the icon from the inbox screen and then touch **Settings**, choose an account, then touch **Signature**.

To receive and read your emails

When a new email arrives, you will be notified by a ringtone or vibration, and an icon will appear on Status bar.

Touch and drag down the Status bar to display the Notification panel, touch the new email to view it. Or you can also access the Gmail Inbox label and touch the new mail to read it.

You can search for an email by sender, subject, label, etc.

- Touch the Q icon from Inbox screen.
- Enter the keyword you want to search for in the searching box and touch

5.2 Email



Besides your Gmail account, you can also set up external POP3, IMAP or Exchange email accounts in your phone.

To access this feature, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then select **Email**.

An email wizard will guide you through the steps to set up an email account.

- Enter the email address and password of the account you want to set up.
- Touch Next. If the account you entered is not provided by your service
 provider in the phone, you will be prompted to go to the email account
 settings screen to enter settings manually. Alternatively, you can touch
 Manual setup to directly enter the incoming and outgoing settings for
 the email account you are setting up.
- Finish Account settings of Email checking frequency, notification, synchronizing, etc.
- Enter the account name and display name in outgoing emails.

To add another email account, you can touch the Menu key and Settings. Touch ADD ACCOUNT on the right of the title to create it.

To create and send emails

- Touch the icon and then Compose from the Inbox screen.
- Enter recipient(s) email address(es) in the To field.
- If necessary, touch the Menu key and touch Add Cc/Bcc to add a copy or a blind carbon copy to the message.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch and Attach file to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch > to send.
- If you do not want to send the mail right away, you can touch the Menu key and Save draft or touch the Back key to save a copy.

5.3 Hangouts ⁽¹⁾.....



Google's instant messaging service, Hangouts, lets you communicate with your friends whenever they are connected to this service.

To access this feature and sign in, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Hangouts**. All friends added by using Hangouts from the web or phone will be displayed in your friends list.

To sign out, touch from Friends list screen to display options, then touch **Settings\Sign out**.

5.3.1 Chatting with your friends

To start a chat, touch the name of a friend in your Friends list, then type your message and finally touch .

You can invite other friends to join in a group chat by touching + and select **New group** on group chatting screen and then selecting the friend you want to add.

5.3.2 To add a new friend

From Friends list, touch the icon + to add a new friend. Type name, email or number of the friend you want to add, and then touch **New conversation** or **New video call** to start a chat.

A notification with this invitation will be received by the friend. By touching the invitation, the friend can select **Decline** or **Reply** in response.

5.3.3 To manage your friends

Besides adding new friends to your friends list, touch and selecting **People & options** from your Chatting screen, the following actions will be available:

To change your Calendar view, touch the date title to open a drop-down menu of **Day, 3 Day, Week and Month** for your options. Touch the icon to return to Today's view.



In **Schedule, Day** or **Week** view, touch an event to view its details. Touch a day in **Month** view to open that day's events.

6.1.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch and then Event to access new event edit screen.
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select **All day**.
- When finished, touch SAVE from the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from **Day, Week** view screen, touch an empty spot or an event to open the event details screen of the time you have previously selected. Or you can also touch an empty spot till it turns blue, then tap again to enter **New event** editing screen.

6.2 Clock



Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To access this function, touch (iii) from the Home screen, then touch Clock.

6.2.1 World clock

To access this function, touch (m) on the Time screen.

According to the delivery location, the system will set a default clock.

- Touch a city name to choose a time zone from the list.
- Touch the selected city name again to delete the time zone.

6.2.2 Alarm

To set an alarm

From the Time screen, touch to enter the **Alarm** screen, touch to set time, When finished, touch OK to confirm. Following options will show:

• **Label** Touch to set a name for the alarm.

Repeat Touch to select days you want alarm to work.

Vibrate Select to activate vibration.

• **Ringtone** Touch to select a ringtone for the alarm.

• **Time** Scroll up or down to select time for your alarm.

Touch a currently existing alarm to enter alarm editing screen.

Touch iii to delete the selected alarm.

To adjust alarm settings

Touch the Menu key\Settings from the Alarm screen, the following options can now be adjusted:

- **Silence after** Touch to select silence time after an alarm.
- **Snooze length** Touch to set temporary turn off time of an alarm.
- Alarm volume Touch to set the volume of an alarm.
- Volume buttons Touch to set side Volume key behaviors when alarm sounds: Snooze\Dismiss\Do nothing.
- Start week on Touch to set an alarm start on Saturday\Sunday\
 Monday.
- Turn over to Touch to turn over behavior Snooze or Dismiss.

6.2.3 Timer

From the Time screen, touch to enter the **Timer** screen.

Touch to activate the timer.

Touch , the total time and the lap time will not run until touch **Resume**.

Touch to delete the record.

6.2.4 Countdown

From the Time screen, touch to enter the **Countdown** screen.

Touch to enter numbers to set countdown time.

Touch to activate Countdown. Or touch to dismiss the ongoing countdown.

6.3 Calculator.....



With Calculator, you can solve many mathematical problems.

To access this function, touch from the Home screen, then touch **Calculator**.





Enter a number and the arithmetic operation to be performed, enter the second number, then touch "=" to display the result. Touch DEL to delete digits one by one, touch and hold DEL to delete all at one time.

7 Getting connected.....

To connect to the internet with this phone, you can use GPRS/EDGE/UMTS networks or Wi-Fi, whichever is more convenient.

7.1 Connecting to the Internet

7.1.1 GPRS/EDGE/UMTS

The first time you turn on your phone with your SIM card inserted, it will automatically configure your network service: GPRS/EDGE/UMTS.

To check the network connection you are using, touch the **Menu** key on the Home screen, then touch **Settings\More\Mobile networks\Access Point Names** or **Network operators**.

To create a new access point

A new GPRS/EDGE/UMTS network connection can be added to your phone with the following steps:

- Touch the Menu key from the Home screen.
- Touch Settings\More\Mobile networks\Access point names.
- Touch the icon and then New APN to access editing screen.
- Enter required APN information.
- When finished, touch the icon and then Save.

To activate/deactivate Data roaming

When roaming, you can connect/disconnect to a data service.

Touch the Menu key from the Home screen.

- Touch Settings\More\Mobile networks.
- Mark/Unmark the checkbox to activate or deactivate data roaming mode.

When data roaming is disabled, you can still perform data exchange with a Wi-Fi connection (refer to "7.1.2 Wi-Fi").

7.1.2 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi, you can connect to the Internet when your phone is within the the range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your phone even without a SIM card inserted.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Touch the Menu key from the Home screen, then touch Settings and select Wi-Fi..
- Touch the switch beside Wi-Fi to turn Wi-Fi on or off (1).
- Touch Wi-Fi, the detailed information of detected Wi-Fi networks is displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (you may contact the network operator for details). When finished, touch CONNECT.

To activate notification when a new network is detected

When Wi-Fi is on and the network notification is activated, the Wi-Fi icon will appear on the status bar whenever the phone detects an available wireless network within range. The following steps activate the notification function when Wi-Fi is on:

- Touch the **Menu** key and **Settings** from the Home screen.
- Touch Wi-Fi, then touch the Menu key and then Advanced from Wi-Fi screen.
- Wi-Fi is turned on by default when the first time you power on the phone.

 Mark/Unmark the Network notification checkbox to activate/deactivate this function.

To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- Touch the **Menu** key and **Settings** from the Home screen.
- Touch Wi-Fi, and then touch the Menu key\Add network.
- Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- Touch Save.

When successfully connected, your phone will be connected automatically the next time you are within the range of this network.

To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- In the Wi-Fi screen, touch the name of the saved network.
- Touch FORGET in the dialog that opens.

7.2 Browsei



Using the Browser, you can enjoy surfing the Web.

To access this function, touch from the Home screen, then touch **Browser**.

To go to a web page

On the Browser screen, touch the URL bar at the top, enter the address of the web page, then confirm.



The URL bar will hide after a few seconds. To show the URL bar, you can touch and slide down the screen.

To set home page

- Touch the Menu key from the Browser screen to display option menu, touch Settings\General\Set home page.
- Choose a page or most visited websites as your home page.
- If you choose **Other**, enter the URL of the website you want to set as your home page, touch **OK** to confirm.

7.2.1 Viewing web pages

When opening a website, you can navigate on web pages by sliding your finger on the screen in any direction to locate the information you want to view.

To zoom in/out of a web page

Pinch/Spread your finger on the screen to zoom out/in of the web page.

To quickly zoom into a section of a web page, tap on the section you want to view. To return to normal zoom level, tap again.

To find text on a web page

- Touch the Menu key from web page screen, then touch Find on page.
- Enter the text or phrase you want to find.
- The first word with matching characters will be highlighted on the screen, and subsequent matches will be boxed.
- Touch the up or down arrow to switch to the previous or next matching items.
- When finished, you can touch or the Back key to close the search bar.

Further operations for the text on a web page

You can copy, share or search the text from a web page:

- Touch and hold the text to highlighted the text.
- Move two tabs to select the text.
- Touch SELECT ALL to select all words in this web screen.
- Touch the icon to share or WEB SEARCH to search on the page or the web.
- When finished, touch or the **Back** key to deactivate the mode.

To open new window/switch between windows

Multiple windows can be opened at the same time for your convenience.

- Touch
 to open all windows' thumbnails.
- Touch + to open a new window.

 To close a window, touch × on the window you want to close or slide it sideways.

• **Settings** To access a series of Browser settings.

Version Touch to view Browser version.

Touch the **less** icon on the left of the URL, you can view more information about the current page.

7.2.2 Manage links, history, downloads

• **Link** Touch the link to open the web page.

Touch and hold the link to open options for further operation, like **Open, Open in new window, Save link, Copy link URL, Share link as bookmark, etc.**

To view Browser history

- Touch the Menu key from the Browser screen.
- Touch Bookmarks/History.
- Touch **History** tab to view browser history.
- Touch Most visited to view your most frequently visited pages.

To download a web application/view your downloads

Before downloading a web application, you need to enable your phone to install web applications (Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen, touch **Settings\Security**, mark the checkbox of **Unknown sources**, finally touch **OK** to confirm).

To download an item, touch the item or the link you want to download.

To cancel a download, touch the downloaded item from the Notification panel, select the item to be canceled, and touch to confirm.

To view items you have downloaded, touch the Application tab, then touch **DOWNLOADED**.

7.2.3 Manage bookmarks

To bookmark a web page

- Open the web page you want to bookmark.
- Touch the Menu key and Save to bookmarks, or from the History screen, touch the star icon ☆ beside the URL.
- Enter the name and the location if needed and touch OK to confirm.

To open a bookmark

- Touch the Menu key and then Bookmarks/History, or touch the

 icon

7.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices (1)

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

To access this function, touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen, then touch **Settings\Bluetooth**, your advice and other available ones will show on the screen.

To turn on Bluetooth

- Touch the Menu key from the Home screen, then touch Settings.
- Touch to activate/deactivate this function.

To make your phone more recognizable, you can change your phone name which is visible to others.

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen,
- Touch Settings\Bluetooth.
- Touch the Menu key and Rename this device.
- Enter a name, and touch Rename to confirm.

To Show received files

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen.
- Touch **Settings\Bluetooth**.
- Touch your device to make it visible or invisible.
- Touch the Menu key and Show received files to view your transfer history.
- You are recommended to use ALCATEL Bluetooth headsets, which have been tested and proved compatible with phone. You can go to www.alcatel-mobile.com for more information about ALCATEL Bluetooth headsets.

To pair/connect your phone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen.
- Touch Settings\Bluetooth.
- Touch Touch On to turn on Bluetooth.
- Touch a Bluetooth device you want to be paired with in the list.
- A dialog will pop up, touch Pair to confirm.
- If the pairing is successful, your phone connects to the device.

To disconnect/unpair from a Bluetooth device

- Touch the device you want to unpair.
- Touch Unpair to confirm.

7.4 Connecting to a computer (1)

With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your micro SD card/internal storage and the computer.

To connect/disconnect your phone to the computer:

To connect:

- Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- Open the Notification panel and touch for USB options.
- Touch **Mount** in the dialog that opens if you want to transfer files.
- You can change your default connection mode via **Settings\ Storage & USB**. Some operations which are available under mass storage are not usable under MTP and PTP.

To disconnect (for mass storage):

- Open the Notification panel and touch USB connected.
- Touch **Turn off** in the dialog that opens to cancel USB mass storage.



Before using MTP, make sure that the driver (Windows Media Player 11 or higher version) has been installed.

To locate the data you have transferred or downloaded in the internal storage, touch **File Manager**. All data you have downloaded is stored in **File Manager**, where you can view media files (videos, photos, music and others), rename files, install applications into your phone, etc.

To safely remove the micro SD card from your phone

The micro SD card can be removed from your phone any time the phone is powered off. To remove the micro SD card while the phone is on, you must unmount the storage card from the phone first, to prevent corrupting or damaging the storage card.

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen,
- Touch Settings\Storage & USB.
- Touch SD card in Portable storage.
- Touch 🚦 to enter **Settings\Eject**.

You can now safely remove the micro SD card from the phone.

To format a micro SD card

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen,
- Touch Settings\Storage & USB.
- Touch **SD card** in Portable storage.
- Touch : to enter **Settings\Format**. a popup message appears to warn you that formatting the micro SD card will erase its contents.
- Touch ERASE & FORMAT to confirm.

7.5 Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

To add a VPN

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen.
- Touch Settings\More\VPN and then touch + .
- In the screen that opens, follow the instructions from your network administrator to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- Touch Save.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a PIN code or password for your phone.

To connect/disconnect to a VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen.
- Touch Settings\More\VPN.
- VPNs you have added are listed; touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch
 Connect.

To disconnect:

 Open the Notification panel and touch the resulting notification for the VPN disconnection.

To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

- Touch the **Menu** key from the Home screen.
- Touch Settings\More\VPN.
- VPNs you have added are listed; touch & hold the VPN you want to edit.
- Touch Edit profile.
- After finished, touch Save.

To delete:

 Touch and hold the VPN you want to delete, in the dialog that opens, touch **Delete profile**.

Google Play Store (1)....



Google Play Store is an online application store, where you can download and install applications and games to your Android Powered Phone.

To open Google Play Store:

- Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Play Store**.
- For the first time you access Google Play Store, a screen with terms of service pops up for your attention.

Touch and then select Help to enter Google Play Store help page for more information on this function.

8.1 Locate the item you want to download and install

Google Play Store home page provides several ways to find applications. It showcases applications and games in categorized listings.



Touch to search in **Play Store**.

Slide up and down to see all categories.

Touch a category on Google Play Store screen to browse its contents. Within each category you can select to view items sorted by Top free, Top grossing, etc.



Touch (to return to the previous screen.

8.2 Download and install

To download & install:

- Navigate to the item you want to download, and select to enter the details screen from which you can read its description, overall rating or comments, view developer's information, etc.
- Touch INSTALL to preview the functions and data the application can access on your phone if you install it.
- Touch ACCEPT to download.
- \bullet The progress of the download will show on the details screen, touch \times to stop downloading the item. You can also access this screen through Notification panel.
- After download and installation have finished, you will see a notification icon on the status bar.



Be especially cautious with applications that have access to many functions or to a significant amount of your data. Once you accept, you are responsible for results of using this item on your phone.

To open the application you have downloaded:

- On Google Play Store screen, touch and My Apps.
- Touch the installed application in the list, then touch OPEN.

To buy an application (1)

On Google Play Store, some applications are labeled as free, while some of them are to be paid for before downloading and installing.

- Touch the application you want to buy.
- Touch the price on the upper-right of the screen to preview the functions and data the application can access on your phone if you install it.
- Touch Continue to confirm.
- When making your first purchase, you are required to input your credit card information and to log in to Google payment and billing service.
- If your account has multiple credit card accounts, select one to proceed.
- Select the Terms of service link and read the document. When finished, touch the Back key.
- Mark the checkbox if you agree with the terms of service.
- Touch **Buy now** at the bottom of the screen.

When finished, Android downloads the application.

To request a refund

If you are not satisfied with the application, you can ask for a refund within 15 minutes of the purchase. Your credit card will not be charged and the application will be removed. If you change your mind, you can install the application again, but you will not be able to request a refund.

- Touch and My apps from Google Play Store screen.
- Touch the application that you want to uninstall and refund.
- Touch REFUND to uninstall the application and refund. If the button becomes UNINSTALL, your trial period has expired.
- In the survey form, select the answer that best matches your reason, and touch **OK**.

8.3 Manage your downloads

After you downloaded and installed an application, the following further operations are available for your selection.

View

On Google Play Store screen, touch and My Apps.

Uninstall

On Google Play Store screen, touch and **My Apps**. Touch the application you want to uninstall to enter the details screen, touch **Uninstall**, and finally touch **OK** to confirm.

Refund

On Google Play Store screen, touch and My Apps. Touch the application you want to uninstall for a refund, touch REFUND, and finally touch OK to confirm.

Google Paid applications may not be available to users in some countries.

Update notification

On Google Play Store screen, touch and My Apps. Touch the Menu key and Settings\Notifications to enable update notification.

Auto update

Touch the **Menu** key and **Settings\Auto-update apps** to enable this function. To auto update one specific application, mark the checkbox of **Auto-update apps at any time. Do not auto-update apps** or **Auto-update apps over Wi-Fi only** from the details screen,

Rate and review

Open the details screen for an application, touch the stars \bigstar \bigstar \bigstar \bigstar to award and input comments, touch **OK** to confirm.

Flag

You can report an inappropriate application to Google Play Store by flagging it. Open the details screen for the application, scroll to the bottom and touch **Flag as inappropriate**, enter the reason and finally touch **Submit**.


9.1 Camera.



Your mobile phone is fitted with a Camera and a Camcorder for taking photos and shooting videos.

Before using the Camera or Camcorder, please be sure to remove the protective lens cover before use to avoid it affecting your picture quality.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen and then touch **Camera**.



To take a picture

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch the icon to take the picture which will be automatically saved.

To shoot a video

Switch Camera mode to Video mode. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, and touch the icon to start recording. Touch the icon to pause recording, and then the icon to proceed. Touch the icon stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

Further operations when viewing a picture/video you have taken

- Slide left to quick review the pictures or videos you've taken.
- Touch the sicon then Gmail, Bluetooth, Messaging, etc to share.
- Touch the icon to access Gallery.




Gallery acts as a media player for you to view photos and playback videos. In addition, a set of further operations to pictures and videos are available for your choice.

Pictures and videos are displayed by albums in **Gallery**.




- Touch an album and all pictures or videos will spread the screen.

Working with pictures

You can work with pictures by rotating or cropping them, sharing them with friends, setting them as contact photo or wallpaper, etc.

Locate the picture you want to work on, touch the picture from full-screen picture view. Touch the icon \Rightarrow to share the picture, touch the Menu key above select Delete device copy to delete the picture.

Touch from full-screen picture view to edit a picture.





Touch to set effect such as Punch, Vintage, B/W, Bleach, Instant, Blue and etc.

After activating the crop mode, the cropping square appears in the middle of the picture. Select the portion to crop, touch \checkmark to confirm, touch \times icon to exit without saving.

Batch operation

Gallery provides a multi-select function, so that you can work with pictures/videos in batches.

Open the main Gallery window or an album, touch and touch **Select item** to activate batch operation mode (you can also touch and hold one album/picture), then touch albums/pictures you want to work on. Touch to delete. Touch to share selected ones.

9.3 YouTube



YouTube is an online video-sharing service where the user can share and view videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the Internet.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **YouTube**.



As an online video service, your phone must have a network connection to access YouTube.



By touching from YouTube screen, you can set General settings for YouTube. For details about these features, please visit the YouTube website: www.YouTube.com.

9.3.1 Watch videos

Touch a video to play it. In the Playing screen, you can view information and comments of the video, and also reach to more related ones. You can also rate, share, label as Favorite, create a new playlist, etc from this screen.

To exit video playing screen, touch the **Back** key to return to the video list.

9.4 Music




Using this menu, you can play music files stored on the micro SD card in your phone. Music files can be downloaded from computer to micro SD card using an USB cable.



11.3 Radio



12.1 WIRELESS & NETWORKS

12.1.1 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi you can now surf the Internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in the range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the **Wi-Fi** screen and configure an access point to connect your phone to the wireless network.

For detailed instructions on using Wi-Fi, please refer to "7.1.2 Wi-Fi".

12.1.2 Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows your phone to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) in a small range with another Bluetooth supported device (phone, computer, printer, headset, car kit, etc.).

For more information on Bluetooth, please refer to "7.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices".

12.1.3 Data usage

Touch the **Menu** key you can view settings related to your data usage. Mark the checkbox of set mobile data limit, your mobile data connection will be disabled when the specified limit is reached. You can also choose a data usage cycle to view the statistics and related applications of used data by your phone.

Application availability depends on country and provider.



Data usage is measured by your phone, and your provider may count differently. Please consider using a conservative limit.

12.1.4 Airplane mode

Through **More\Airplane mode** to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

You can also open Airplane mode by touching AIRPLANE MODE on Quick setting bar or in phone options when pressing Power key.

12.1.5 SMS app

Touch More\SMS app to select between Hangouts or Messaging.

12.1.6 VPN settings

A mobile virtual private network (mobile VPN or mVPN) provides mobile devices with access to network resources and software applications on their home network, when they connect via other wireless or wired networks. Mobile VPNs are used in environments where workers need to keep application sessions open at all times, throughout the working day, as the user connects via various wireless networks, encounters gaps in coverage, or suspend-and-resumes their devices to preserve battery life. A conventional VPN cannot survive such events because the network tunnel is disrupted, causing applications to disconnect, time out, fail, or even the computing device itself to crash.

For more information on VPN, please refer to "7.5 Connecting to virtual private networks".

12.1.7 Mobile networks

Data roaming

If you don't need to transmit data on other provider's mobile networks, unmark the checkbox of **Data roaming** to avoid incurring significant roaming charges.

 Preferred: You can select your preferred Network ID or Network type with this menu.

Access point names

You can select your preferred network with this menu.

Network operators

You can select a network operator manually or automatically.

12.2 DEVICE

12.2.1 Gestures

Touch to set Incoming calls and Alarm gestures.

- Incoming calls: Turn over to mute or reject.
- Alarm: Turn over to activate.

12.2.2 Display

- Brightness level: Touch to adjust the brightness of the screen.
- Wallpaper: Touch to set the wallpaper.
- Auto-rotate screen: Touch to set whether to rotate the contents of the screen or stay in portrait view.
- **Sleep:** Touch to set screen timeout.
- **Daydream:** Touch to turn on or off daydream and select a mode and time for it.

Font size: Touch to set the font size.

12.2.3 Lock settings

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock your phone with a variety of patterns, PIN or password, etc.

- Func: Touch to enable or disable Func, it displays shortcuts on your lock screen.
- Screen lock: Touch to choose screen lock None\Swipe\Pattern\PIN\ Password.

12.2.4 Sound & notification

Use the sound & notification settings to configure many aspects of call and notification ringtones, music, and other audio settings.

Sound

- Media volume: Slide to adjust the volume of music, video, games,ets.
- Alarm volume: Slide to adjust the volume of your alarms.
- Ring volume: Slide to adjust the volume of your ringtonges and alerts.
- Notification volume: Slide to adjust the volume of your notifications.
- Also vibrate for calls: Touch to vibrate the phone for incoming calls.
- **Do not disturb:** Touch to select the prioritised apps for notification permission or customise the automatic rules.
- Phone ringtone: Touch to set your default incoming call ringtone.
- Default notification ringtone: Touch to set your default notification ringtone.
- Mute power on & off ringtone: Touch to mute power on & off ringtone.
- Other sounds: Touch to set Dial pad tones, Screen locking sounds. Touch sounds and Vibrate on touch.

Notification

- When device is locked: Touch to show all notification content.
- **App notifications:** Touch to show all apps and set for your preferences.

Advanced:

- Notification access: Touch to view the notification listeners.
- Do not disturb access: Touch to view the apps which have requested Do Not Disturb access.

12.2.5 Apps

You use the Apps settings to view details about the applications installed on your phone, to manage their deta and force them to stop, and to set whether you want to permit installation of applications that you obtain from web sites and emails.

12.2.6 Storage & USB

Use these settings to monitor the total and available space on your phone and, on your microSD card; to manage your microSD card; and, if necessary, to reset the phone, erasing all of your personal information.

12.2.7 Battery

In battery screen you can view the battery usage data since you last connected the phone to a power source. The screen also shows your battery status and how long it has been used since last charging. Touch one category, then you can learn its specific power consumption.

You can adjust power use via the screen brightness or screen timeout in the Display screen.

12.2.8 Memory

In the Memory screen you can view the total and available memory on your phone, including the average memory used by each application.

12.3 PERSONAL

12.3.1 Location

Touch the switch open location services.

Mode

Touch to select a location mode among **High accuracy**, **Battery saving**, and **Device only** to use GPS, Wi-Fi, or mobile networks to determine your approximate location.

RECENT LOCATION REQUESTS

Touch to view detailed information of applications that had recent location requests.

LOCATION SERVICES

Touch to access **Google Location History**.

12.3.2 Security

Encrypt phone

Require a numeric PIN or passwords to decrypt your phone each time you power it on.

Find My Phone

Find My Phone is developed to prevent user data from being leaked and help users to locate and retrieve their devices.

Make passwords visible

Mark the checkbox to show passwords as you type.

Device administrators

Touch to view or deactivate device administrators.

Unknown sources

Mark the checkbox to permit installation of applications that you obtain from websites, emails, or other locations other than Google Play Store.

To protect your phone and personal data, download applications only from trusted sources, such as Google Play Store.

Auto-start management

Touch to allow or deny auto-start of selected applications when system boots up.

App permissions

Turn on the switch to manage app permissions for security and privacy protection.

Storage type

Credential storage is software only.

Trusted credentials

Touch to display trusted CA certificates.

Install from Memory

Touch to install encrypted certificates from the phone storage.

Clear credentials

Touch to remove all certificates.

Advanced

- **Trust agents:** Touch to view or deactivate trust agents.
- **Screen pinning:** Touch to pin or unpin your screen.
- Apps with usage access: Touch to set usage access of Apps.

12.3.3 Accounts

Use the settings to add, remove, and manage your Email and other supported accounts. You can also use these settings to control how and whether all applications send, receive, and synchronise data on their own schedules , and whether all applications can synchronise user data automatically.

Add account

Touch to add an account for selected app.

12.3.4 Google

This phone offers you Google account and service setting options.

12.3.5 Language & input

Use the Language & input settings to select the language for the text on your phone and for configuring the onscreen keyboard. You can also configure voice input settings and the pointer speed.

Language

Touch to select the language and the region you want.

Spell checker

Mark the checkbox to enable the system to show suggested words.

Personal dictionary

Touch to open a list of the words you've added to the dictionary. Touch a word to edit or delete it. Touch the add button (+) to add a word.

Current Keyboard

Touch to choose keyboards.

Android keyboard (AOSP)

The Android keyboard settings apply to the onscreen keyboard that is included with your phone. The correction and capitalization features affect only the English version of the keyboard. Available options are as follows:

Languages

Touch to set input language.

Preferences

- Auto-capitalization Mark the checkbox to have the onscreen keyboard automatically capitalize the first letter of the first word after a period, the first word in a text field, and each word in name fields.
- Double-space period Mark the checkbox to have a period inserted in spacebar.
- **Vibrate on keypress** Mark the checkbox to have the phone vibrate briefly each time you touch a key on the onscreen keyboard.
- **Sound on keypress** Mark the checkbox to play a brief sound each time you touch a key on the onscreen keyboard.
- Popup on keypress Mark the checkbox to pop up the key that you touched.
- Voice input key Touch to set the Mic button on Main keyboard or symbols keyboard or not display.

Appearance & layouts

- Theme: Touch to choose the theme of your phone with Material light/ Material Dark/Holo White/Holo Blue
- Custom input styles: Touch to choose custom input styles.

Text correction

 Personal dictionary: Touch to open a list of the words you've added to the dictionary. Touch a word to edit or delete it. Touch the add button (+) to add a word.

- Add-on dictionaries: Touch to select language for personal dictionaries.
- Block offensive words: Mark the checkbox to hide recognized offensive voice results.
- Auto correction: Touch to turn on/off auto correction, or you can also adjust the sensitivity of correction.
- Show correction suggestions: Touch to show or not the correction suggestions while typing.
- **Personalized suggestions:** Touch to show or not the improve suggestions that learn from your communications and typed data.
- Suggested Contact names: Mark the checkbox to use names from Contacts for suggestions and corrections.
- Next word suggestions: Mark the checkbox to use the previous word in making suggestions.

Advanced

Touch to view more advanced settings for android keyboard, such as key popup dismiss delay, keypress vibration duration, keypress sound volume, key long press delay, Emoji for physical keyboard, Show app icon.

Swype

Swype Input lets you enter a word with one continuous motion: just drag your finger over the letters in the word. Touch to configure settings for Swype.

Google voice typing

Touch to configure settings for Google voice typing.

Text-to-speech settings

- **Prefered engine:** Touch to choose a preferred text-to-speech engine, touch the Settings icon to show more choices for each engine.
- **Speech rate:** Touch to open a dialog where you can select how quickly you want the synthesiser to speak.

- **Listen to an example:** Touch to play a brief sample of the speech synthesiser, using your current settings.
- **Default language status:** Touch to show status of default language.

Pointer speed: Touch to open a dialog where you can change the pointer speed, touch OK to confirm.

12.3.6 Backup & reset

Back up my data

Mark the checkbox to back up your phone's settings and other application data to Google servers with your Google account. If you replace your phone, the settings and data you've backed up are restored onto the new phone for the first time you sign in with your Google account. If you mark this option, a wide variety of settings and data are backed up, including your Wi-Fi passwords, bookmarks, a list of the applications you've installed, the words you've added to the dictionary used by the onscreen keyboard, and most of the settings that you configure with the Settings application. If you unmark this option, you stop backing up your settings, and any existing backups are deleted from Google servers.

Backup account

Touch to back up your account.

Automatic restore

Mark the checkbox to restore your backed up settings or other data when you reinstall an application.

Network settings reset

Touch to reset network settings including: Wi-Fi, Cellular data, Bluetooth.

DRM reset

Touch to delete all DRM licenses.

Factory data reset
