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
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
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1 Your phone

1.1 Keys and connectors





Recents key

• Touch: this shows your recently-used apps. Touch an app to open it, or swipe it left or right to remove it from the list.

Home key

- While on any app or screen, touch the Home key to return to the main Home screen.
- Long press this key to access Google Assistant Go.

Back key

 Touch to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialogue box, options menu, the notification panel, etc.



Volume keys

- During a call, these keys serve to adjust the volume of the earpiece or headset.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, these keys serve to adjust the media volume.
- These keys also serve to adjust the ringtone volume.
- Mute the ringtone of an incoming call.



Power key


- Press and hold: Power on/Power off.
- Press: activate the lock screen/wake up the screen.
- Long press: show the pop-up menu to select from Power off, Restart, Screen capture, Flight mode.
- Long press the Power key and the Volume down key to capture a screenshot.
- In some cases you can scroll down the screenshot to choose which part to capture. Touch [] to scroll the phone screen, then \bigcirc to save the screen capture.

1.2 Getting started

1.2.1 Setup

Inserting or removing the SIM card or microSD card

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls.




Insert the pin into the hole and pull out the tray. Place the SIM card or microSD card with the chip facing downwards on the tray, and put the tray into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the SIM card or microSD card, pull out the tray.



Your phone only supports nano SIM cards. Do not attempt to insert other SIM types like mini or micro cards, as you may damage your phone.

Charging the battery



To charge the battery, connect the charger to your phone and main socket. You can also charge your phone via a USB cable.



To reduce your phone's power consumption, switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or apps running in the background when not needed. In Settings you can also lower the brightness of the screen, and shorten the length of time before the screen goes to sleep.

1.2.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on. It will take a few seconds before the screen lights up. Swipe to unlock your phone, or use the PIN, Password, Pattern if you have set this up already.

If you do not know your SIM PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code with your phone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

Set up your phone for the first time

The first time you power on the phone you will be asked to set the following options: language, mobile data, date & time, etc.

- 1. Select the phone's language, then touch **START.**
- 2. Insert a SIM card or touch **SKIP**.
- 3. Select a Wi-Fi network, or touch **SKIP** and then **CONTINUE**.
- 4. Adjust **Date & time** if needed, then touch **NEXT**.
- 5. Input your **Name**, then touch **NEXT**.
- 6. Protect your phone, set screen lock now or touch **Not now** and then touch **SKIP ANYWAY**.
- 7. Touch the switch on/off to select **Google servies**, once finished, then touch **AGREE**.
- 8. Touch the switch on/off to disable/enable the improvement of your phone by sending anonymous diagnostics and usage data, touch **NEXT**.
- 9. Set up additional features or touch **No thanks** to next setup.
- 10. Touch the switch on/off to enable/disable the showing of features and **Help tips**, then touch **ALL SET**.
- 11. Read more warnings about this device before you using it, then touch **Done**.

When the other options (**Font size**, **Display size**, etc) are also configured, you will have completed setting up your phone.


If you power on your phone with no SIM card inserted, you will still be able to connect to a Wi-Fi network to sign into your Google account and to use some features.

1.2.3 Power off your phone


Hold down the **Power** key from the Home screen until the Phone options appear, then select **Power off**.

1.3 Home screen

Touching the **Home** key always takes you to your main Home screen, and you can personalise all your Home screens by adding your favourite apps, shortcuts and widgets to them.



In the standard Home screen the bottom set of icons is always visible, whichever of your Home panels you are on. This also includes the Application tab, which will show all your available apps.



The Home screen extends on either side of the screen to allow more space for adding apps, shortcuts, etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view of the Home screen.

In the standard Home screen, you can slide right to access your favourite app. You can change this to open a different app by going to **Settings > Display > Favourite Home screen app.**

1.3.1 Using the touchscreen



To access an app, touch it with your finger.

Long press



Long press the Home screen to access the available options for setting the wallpaper.

Drag 🦨



Long press an item to be able to drag it to another location.

Slide/Swipe



Slide the screen to scroll up and down lists, screens of apps, images, web pages, etc.

Flick



Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.

Pinch/Spread



Place your fingers of one hand on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.

Rotate



Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways.

1.3.2 Status bar

From status bar, you can view both phone status (on the right side) and notification information (on the left side).



Notification panel


Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the Quick settings panel and drag down again to extend the Quick settings panel. Touch and drag up to close it. From the Notification panel, you can open items and other reminders indicated by notification icons or view wireless service information.



Touch a notification and slide it sideways to delete it.

Touch **CLEAR ALL** to clear all event—based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).

Touch the Settings 🏚 icon to access **Settings**.



1.3.3 Search bar

The phone provides a Search function which can be used to find the information you want on your phone, in your applications or on the web.



Search by text

- Touch the Search bar from the Home screen.
- Enter the text/phrase you want to search for.
- Touch a on the keyboard if you want to search on the web.

Search by voice


- Touch \$\Psi\$ from the Search bar to display a dialogue screen.
- Speak the word/phrase you want to search for. A list of search results will display for you to select from.

1.3.4 Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock your phone screen with a variety of patterns, PIN or password, etc. Go to **Settings > Security & location > Screen lock**.

To create a screen unlock pattern (follow the onscreen instructions)

- Go to Settings > Security & location > Screen lock > Pattern.
- Draw your own pattern.



To create a screen unlock PIN/Password

• Go to **Settings > Security > Screen lock > PIN** or **Password**.

• Set your PIN or password.

To lock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to lock the screen.

To unlock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to light up the screen, draw the unlock pattern you have created or enter PIN or password to unlock the screen.

If you have chosen **Swipe** as the screen lock, slide upward to unlock the screen.



1.3.5 Personalise your Home screen

Add an app or widget

Touch the Application tab ::: , then long press the app to activate the Move mode, and drag the item to any Home screen.

Reposition an app or widget

Long press the item that you want to reposition to activate the Move mode, drag the item to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favourites tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

Remove

Long press the item to be removed to activate the Move mode, drag the item up to the top of **Remove** icon, and release after the item turns grey.

Create folders

To make it easier to organise apps and shortcuts on the Home screen and the Favourite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it and touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

Wallpaper customisation

Long press an empty area on the Home screen or go to **Settings > Display > Wallpaper** to customise your wallpaper.

1.3.6 Volume adjustment

Using volume key

Press **Volume** key to adjust the volume. To activate the vibrate mode, press the **Volume down** key until the phone vibrates. Press the **Volume down** key once more to activate the silent mode.

Using Settings menu

Drag down twice from the notification panel and touch the settings to icon to open **Settings**, then touch **Sound**. You can set the volume of Ringtone, Media, Notification and etc. to your preference.

2 Text input

2.1 Using the onscreen keyboard


Onscreen keyboard settings

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, select **Settings > System > Language & input**.

Adjust the onscreen keyboard orientation

Turn the phone sideways or upright to adjust the Onscreen Keyboard orientation. You can also adjust it by changing the settings (go to **Settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen**).

2.1.1 Google keyboard



Touch to switch between the symbol and numeric keyboard


2.2 Text editing

You can edit the text you have entered.

- Long press or double touch the text you want to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the highlighted selection.
- The following options will show: **CUT, COPY, SHARE, SELECT ALL.**

You can also insert new text

- Touch where you want to type, or long press a blank space, the cursor will blink and the tab will show. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have selected any text, touch the tab to show **PASTE** which allows you to paste any text you have previously copied.




3 Phone call, Call log & People


3.1 Phone call



3.1.1 Placing a call

To make a call when the phone is active, go to the Home screen and touch the Phone icon in the Favourites tray.





Enter the number you want from the dial pad directly or select a contact from **Contacts** or **Call history** by touching tabs, then touch to place the call.

The number you entered can be saved to **Contacts** by touching +2.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching .

To hang up a call, touch .

International call

To dial an international call, long press \bigcirc to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and finally touch \bigcirc .

Emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and touch to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.

3.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call





When you receive a call, a call window will be presented on top of the screen. Touch **DECLINE** to dismiss a call or **ANSWER** to answer a call.

Touch the call window to open the Phone call screen.

On the Phone call screen, touch

- Swipe the icon up to answer the call;
- Swipe the icon down to reject the call;
- Swipe the pup to reject the call by sending a predefined message.

To mute incoming calls, press the **Volume up/down** key.

3.1.3 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can access at any time.

To listen to your voicemail, long press 1 on **Phone** tab.

To set your voicemail number, touch : key and touch Phone > Settings > Voicemail.

If you receive a voicemail, a voicemail **\OO** icon appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel, touch **New voicemail**.

3.1.4 During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the **Volume up/down** key.



- Touch to hold the current call. Touch this icon again to retrieve the call.
- Touch to display the dial pad.
- Touch to end the current call.
- Touch to mute the current call. Touch this icon again to unmute the call.
- Touch to activate the speaker during the current call. Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.
- Touch to place a call to another contact.



To avoid accidentally pressing the touchscreen during a call, the screen will be locked automatically when you put your phone close to your ear; and it will be unlocked when the phone is taken away from your ear.

3.1.5 Managing multiple calls

With this phone you can handle multiple calls at the same time.

Conference calls (1)

You can set up a conference call.

- Place a call to the first participant of the conference call.
- Touch 😃
- Enter the phone number of the person you want to add to conference and touch . You can also add participants from CALLS or CONTACTS.
- Touch to start a conference call.
- During a conference call, touch to drop a participant or to talk privately to one of the participants. Touch to drop the participant from the conference, or touch to talk privately to the participant and put the other participants on hold.
- Touch to end the conference call and disconnect all callers.

3.1.6 Call settings

From the phone screen, touch the : key and select **Settings**. The following options are available:

Display options

Sort by

Touch to set the contacts display to First name or Last name.

Name format

Touch to set the name format to First name first or Last name first.

⁽¹⁾ Depending on your network operator.

Sounds and vibration

Phone ringtone

Touch to set the ringtone of phone.

Also vibrate for calls

Touch ____ to enable/disable vibration for incoming calls.

Keypad tones

Touch to enable/disable Keypad tones.

Quick responses

Touch to edit quick responses which will be used when you reject a call with messages.

Calls

Fixed dialling numbers

Fixed Dialling Number (FDN) is a service mode of SIM, where outgoing calls are restricted to a set of phone numbers. These numbers are added to the FDN list. The most common practical application of FDN is for parents to restrict the phone numbers which their children can dial.

For security reasons, you'll be prompted to enable FDN by entering SIM PIN2 which is usually acquired from your service provider or SIM card provider.

Call forwarding

Touch to configure whether your calls are always forwarded or only when you are busy, not able to answer or unreachable.

Call barring

You can activate or deactivate the call barring for outgoing and incoming calls. The various options are:

All outgoing calls

All outgoing calls are barred.

International outgoing calls

Outgoing international calls are barred.

International outgoing calls while roaming

Outgoing international calls are barred when you are abroad.

All incoming calls

All incoming calls are barred.

Incoming calls while roaming

Incoming calls are barred when you are abroad.

Cancel all

Deactivate all call barring.

Change barring password

Change the original barring password for activating call barring.

Additional settings

Caller ID

Opens a dialogue box where you can set whether your phone number is displayed when making calls.

Call waiting

Touch the ____ to notify you of a new incoming call.

• WiFi Calling (1)

Touch the ____ to enable/disable WiFi Calling.

Blocked numbers

Select **ADD A NUMBER** to block a specific number. You will not receive any calls or texts from that number.

Voicemail

Notifications

Touch to set notifications when a voicemail is received.

Advanced Settings

<u>Service</u>

Opens a dialogue box where you can select your carrier's voicemail service or another service.

Setup

If you are using your carrier's voicemail service, this opens a dialogue box where you can enter the phone number to use for listening to and managing your voicemail.

Accessibility

Hearing aids

Touch to enable/disable hearing-aid compatibility.

Noise Reduction

Touch to enable/disable your background noise during calls.

Caller ID & spam

Touch enable/disable **Caller ID & spam** when you receive a call.

Nearby palces

Touch enable/disable **Nearby places**, which will use your location to find nearby places that match your query.

Personalised search results

Touch to enable/disable function of **Personalised search** results, which improves your results from your search history.

Google Account

Touch to add your Google account in order to use the functionality of **Nearby places**.

Location settings

Touch to get more location settings information.

3.2 Recents

You can view your call history by touching : from the Phone screen to view your call history.

Touch a contact or number to view information or further operations.

You can view detailed information of a call, launch a new call or send messages to a contact or number, or add numbers to **Contacts** (only available for unsaved phone numbers), etc.

Touch the photo **1** to add numbers to **Contacts**.

To clear the entire call memory, touch : key from the phone screen and touch Clear frequents.


3.3 Contacts



You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronise these with your Gmail contacts or other apps on the web or on your phone.

3.3.1 View your contacts

To access the **Contacts** app, touch the Application tab on the Home screen, then select **Contacts**.



Touch the key to display the contacts list option menu.

Following options are available:

Labels

Touch to create label, which allows you to add contacts in the label.

Accounts

Manage the synchronisation for Contacts in the **Google, Phone** and **SIM** accounts.

Settings

My info

Set up your profile.

Accounts

Manage the synchronisation settings for different accounts.

Default account for new contacts

Manage the default account for new contacts.

Contacts to display

Choose which contacts to display.

Sort by

Touch to set the contacts display to First name or Last name.

Name format

Touch to set the name format to First name first or Last name first.

Phonetic name

Touch to set phonetic name to show or hide.

Import/Export

Import or export contacts between phone, SIM card, and microSD card, or share contacts.

Blocked numbers

When defining specific numbers as as blocked numbers, then you won't receive calls and texts from them any more.

Show SIM capacity


Touch to show number of contacts stored on SIM card.

About Contacts

Display information about contacts.

3.3.2 Adding a contact

Touch the Application tab on the Home screen, select **Contacts**, then touch the icon in the contact list to create a new contact.



When you're finished, touch **SAVE** to save.

To exit without saving, you can touch \times and then **DISCARD**.

Add to/remove from Favourites

To add a contact to favourites, you can touch a contact to view details then touch to add the contact to favourites.

To remove a contact from favourites, touch on contact details screen.



Only phone and account contacts can be added to favourites.

3.3.3 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch // key in the contact details screen. When finished, touch **SAVE**.

Change a contact's default phone number

The default phone number (the number which has priority when making a call or sending a message) will always be displayed under the contact name.

To change the default phone number, long press the number you want to set as the default number from the contact's details screen, then select **Set default**. A ppears before the number.

This choice is only available when the contact has more than one number.

Delete a contact

To delete a contact, touch : and touch **Delete** from the contact (details) screen.



The contact you have deleted will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronise your phone.

3.3.4 Communicating with your contacts


From contact details screen you can communicate with your contacts by making a call or sending a message.

To launch a call, touch the phone number.

To send a message, touch the icon on the right side of the number.

Use Quick Contact for Android

Touch a contact's picture to open Quick Contact for Android, then you can touch the number or the icon for the way you want to connect.



The icons available on the Quick Contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications/accounts on your phone.

3.3.5 Importing, exporting and sharing contacts

From the Contacts screen, touch the key to open the options menu, touch **Settings** then touch **Import** or **Export** to import/ export contacts from/to your SIM card, Phone, microSD card, Phone storage, Accounts, etc.

To import/export a single contact from/to your SIM card, choose an account and target SIM card, select the contact you want to import/export, and touch **OK** to confirm.

To import/export all contacts from/to your SIM card, choose an account and select SIM card, touch **Select all** and touch **OK** to confirm.

You can share a single contact or multiple contacts with others via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

To do this, touch a contact you want to share, touch the key and **Share** from the contact details screen, then select the app to perform this action.

3.3.6 Displaying contacts

You can configure which group of contacts you want to display in the People list. Touch the key then touch **Settings**, and then **Contacts to display** from the contacts list screen, then you can choose which contacts to display.

Touch the key and then **Settings.** You can **Sort by** First name or Last name, as well as **Name format** as First name first or Last name first.

3.3.7 Joining/Discarding contacts

To avoid duplicating information you can easily add a new contact's details to an existing contact.

Touch the contact which you want to add information to, touch the key, then touch the key in edit screen and touch **Link**.

Then you will be asked to choose the contact whose information you want to merge with the first contact. The information from the second contact is added to the first one, and the second contact will no longer be displayed in the contacts list.

To separate contact information, touch the contact whose information you want to separate, touch the key, then touch the key in the edit screen. Then touch **View liked contacts** and touch **UNLINK** to confirm.

3.3.8 Synchronising contacts in multiple accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronised from multiple accounts, depending on the apps installed on your phone.

To add an account, touch to on the Quick settings bar to get to Settings, then touch Users & accounts.

You will be asked to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, Exchange, etc.

As with other account setups, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account and all associated information from the phone. Open the **Settings** screen, touch the account you want to delete, then touch **REMOVE ACCOUNT** to confirm.

Sync

You can synchronise an account on **Users & accounts** screen, touch beside Automatically sync data.

4 Messaging & Email

4.1 Messaging




Your phone can create, edit and receive chat, SMS and MMS messages.

Go to the Home page and touch the licon in the Favourites tray if available, or touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch licon.

4.1.1 Create a new message

On the message list screen, touch the new message + icon to write new text/multimedia messages.



Sending a text message

Enter the mobile phone number of the recipient on the recipients' bar or touch to add recipients. Touch the content bar to enter the text of the message. When you have finished, touch to send the text message.



A SMS of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. Specific letters (e.g. accents will also increase the size of the SMS. This may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

Sending a multimedia message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, slides and audio to other compatible phones and e-mail addresses.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, etc.) are attached or email addresses are added.

To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the recipients bar, touch content bar to enter the text of the message. Touch + to open attachment options, select a picture, the location, an audio file or contacts that you want to add as attachments.

When finished, touch > to send the multimedia message.

Attach options:



Touch to select an emoji as an attachment.



Touch to select a sticker.



View your Photos, Gallery, or File Manager to select a picture as an attachment.



Touch and share your location.



Touch and hold the voice message recorder to record a voice message.

4.1.2 Manage messages

When a new message comes, an icon will appear on the status bar as a notification. Drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel, touch the new message to open it. You can also open and touch the new message to open it.

Messages are displayed as a conversation.

To reply to a message, touch the current message to enter the message-composing screen, enter the text, then touch >.

If you long press a message in the message details screen, the following options will be available:



Touch to archive the current message.



Touch to delete the current message.



Touch to mute mute phone notifications when receiving a new message.



Touch to block the selected number. You will not receive any calls or texts from this number.

4.1.3 Adjust message settings

In the message list screen, touch the : key and select **Settings**.

Default SMS app

Touch to change default SMS app.

Notifications

Touch to turn on/off notifications for **Messages**.

Importance

Touch to choose the notification type for incoming messages.

Additional settings in the app

Touch to set additional settings for **Messages**.

Hear outgoing message sounds

Touch to enable/disable to hear message sounds when you send a message.

Your current country

Touch to choose your current country.

Advanced

Group messaging

Mark the checkbox to send a single message to multiple recipients.

Auto-download MMS

Touch to enable/disable the automatic download of MMS.

Auto-download MMS when roaming

Touch to enable/disable the automatic download of MMS when roaming.

• Use simple characters

Touch to enable/disable the use of simple characters in MMS.

• Get SMS delivery reports

Touch to enable/disable the use of simple characters in MMS.

Wireless alerts

Touch to access wireless alerts settings.

SIM card messages

Touch to view messages on SIM card.

Phone number

Show your phone number.

4.2 Gmail



The first time you set up your phone, you can select to use an existing Gmail account or to create a new Email account.

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. Gmail on your phone can be automatically synchronised with your Gmail account on the web. Unlike other kinds of email accounts, each message and its replies in Gmail are grouped in your inbox as a single conversation; all emails are organised by labels instead of folders.

To access Gmail

From the Home screen, touch the Application tab to enter the applications list, then touch **Gmail**.

Gmail displays messages and conversations from one single Gmail account at a time. If you own more than one account, you can add an account by touching the icon and select **Settings** from the inbox screen, then touch **Add account**. Besides your Gmail account, you can also add or set up external email accounts by choosing Personal (IMAP/POP) or Exchange. When finished, you can switch to another account by touching the account name from Inbox screen.

To create and send emails

- 1 Touch from the Inbox screen.
- 2 Enter the recipients' email addresses in the **To** field.
- 3 If necessary, touch the popup menu vicon Add Cc/Bcc to add a copy or a blind copy to the message.
- 4 Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- 5 Touch the icon and select **Attach file** to add an attachment.
- 6 Finally, touch the > icon to send.
- 7 If you do not want to send the mail out right away, you can touch the icon and then **Save draft** or touch the **Back** key to save a copy. To view the draft, touch your account name to display all labels, then select **Drafts**.

If you do not want to send or save the mail, you can touch the icon and then touch **Discard**.

To add a signature to emails, touch the icon and then touch **Settings** from the inbox screen, choose an account, then touch **Signature**.

To receive and read your emails

When you receive a new email, you will be notified by a ringtone or a vibration, and an icon will appear on the Status bar.

Drag down the Status bar to display the Notification panel. Select the new email to view it. You can also open the Gmail Inbox to view the new email.

You can search for an email by sender, recipient, subject, etc.

- Touch the Q icon from the Inbox screen.
- Enter the keyword you want to search for in the searching box and touch on the software keyboard.

To reply or forward emails

Reply

When viewing an email, touch \(\strice \) to reply to it.

Reply all

Touch: and select **Reply all** to send a message to all people in a mail loop.

Forward

Touch: and select **Forward** to forward the received mail to other people.

5 Calendar, Alarm clock & Calculator

5.1 Calendar




Use Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Calendar**.

5.1.1 Multimode view

To change your Calendar view, touch the date title to open the month view, or touch \equiv and select **Schedule**, **Day**, **3 Day**, **Week** or **Month** to access different views. Touch the gicon to return to Today's view.



5.1.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- Touch 🕩.
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a full day event, you can select **All-day**.

When finished, touch **SAVE** from the top of the screen.



Before you can add an event, you must add at least one Calendar account+.

To delete or edit an event

To edit or delete an event, touch the icon to edit the event and touch **Delete** to delete an event.

5.1.3 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event 31 icon will appear on the Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives

Touch and drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel. Select the event to view the Calendar notification.

Touch the **Back** key to keep the reminders pending in the status bar and the Notification panel.

5.2 Clock



Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Clock**.

Touch to add or set an alarm.

5.2.1 To set an alarm

From the **Clock** screen, touch to enter the **Alarms** screen, then touch to add a new alarm. Following options will show:

Time

Set the time for your alarm.

Touch next to the time you have set to turn the alarm on/off.

Repeat

Mark the checkbox to activate **Repeat**. Select the days you want the alarm to be repeated.

Ringtone

Touch to select an alarm ringtone.

Vibrate

Mark the checkbox to activate/deactivate vibration.

Label

Touch to set a name for the alarm.

Touch an already existing alarm and touch **t**o delete the selected alarm.

5.2.2 To adjust alarm settings

Touch the key from **Clock** screen. The following options will be available under **Settings**:

Clock

Style

Touch to set **Analogue** or **Digital** style.

Display time with seconds

Touch to switch to display time with seconds.

Automatic home clock

Touch to switch to set home clock while travelling outside.

Home time zone

Touch to set home time zone.

Change date & time

Touch to set date and time.

Night clock

Touch to enable night clock.

Alarms

Wake device

Touch to switch on to activate the alarm sound even if your phone is powered off.

Silence after

Touch to set the time limit for the alarm tone duration.

Snooze length

Touch to choose length of snooze.

Alarm volume

Touch to set the alarm tone volume.

Gradually increase volume

Touch to set gradually increase volume.

Volume buttons

Touch to choose **Snooze**, **Dismiss** or **Do nothing** as volume buttons.

Start week on

Touch to select the first day of a week as per your preference from **Saturday**, **Sunday** or **Monday**.

Timers

Timer sound

Touch to select timer sound.

Gradually increase volume

Touch to set gradually increase volume.

Timer vibrate

Touch to switch to enable vibration for timer.

5.3 Calculator



With Calculator you can solve many mathematical problems.


To open it, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Calculator**.

Touch $\fint \frac{1}{2}$, there are two panels available: Basic panel and Advanced panel.

To switch between panels, select one of the following two options:

- Touch and drag the basic screen to the left to open the Advanced panel, or touch to open Advanced panel.
- Turn the phone horizontally to switch to the Advanced Panel (1).


To view the calculation history, drag down the screen.





6 Getting connected

Your phone can connect to the Internet using either GPRS/EDGE/3G/4G or Wi-Fi.

6.1 Connecting to the Internet

6.1.1 GPRS/EDGE/3G/4G

The first time you turn on your phone with the SIM card inserted, it will automatically configure a mobile network service: GPRS, EDGE, 3G or 4G. If the network is not connected, you can turn on **Mobile data** on **Settings > Network & Internet > Data usage**.

To check the network connection you are using, touch the Application tab on the Home screen, then touch **Settings > Network & Internet > Mobile network > Access point names** or **Network operators**.

To create a new access point

A new mobile network connection can be added to your phone with the following steps:


- 1 Touch a on the Quick settings bar to go to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Mobile network > Access point names.
- 3 Then touch + key to add new APN.
- 4 Enter the required APN information.
- 5 When finished, touch the : key and Save.

To activate/deactivate Data roaming

When roaming, you can decide to connect/disconnect to a data service.

- 1 Touch a on the Quick settings bar to go to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Mobile network.
- 3 Touch the switch to activate or deactivate data roaming.
- 4 When Data roaming is deactivated, you can still perform data exchange with a Wi-Fi connection (see **"6.1.2 Wi-Fi"**).

When you are abroad, a fixed panel will appear in the notification drawer to allow you to enable or disable the service.



6.1.2 Wi-Fi

You can connect to the Internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your phone even without a SIM card inserted.

To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- 1 Touch touch Network & Internet > Wi-Fi.
- 2 Touch the switch to turn on/off Wi-Fi.
- 3 Turn on Wi-Fi: detailed information of all detected Wi-Fi networks is displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- 4 Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect to it. If the network you selected is secured, you will need to enter a password or other credentials (contact network operator for details). When you are finished, touch **CONNECT.**

To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you can add new Wi-Fi networks.

- 1 Touch 🏚 on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Network & Internet> Wi-Fi, and then touch Add network.
- 3 Enter the name of the network and any required network information.

4 Touch CONNECT.

When successfully connected, your phone will be connected automatically the next time you are within range of this network.

To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- 1 Turn on Wi-Fi.
- 2 In the Wi-Fi screen, long press the name of the saved network.
- 3 Touch **FORGET**.

6.2 Chrome




Using the Chrome browser you can enjoy surfing the Web.

To get onto the Web, go to the Home screen and touch the Chrome o icon in the Favourites.

To go to a web page

On the Chrome browser screen, touch the URL box at the top, enter the address of the web page, then touch to confirm.



6.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

To access this function, touch \Leftrightarrow on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**, then touch **Connected devices > Bluetooth**. Your device and other available ones will show on the screen.

To turn on Bluetooth

- 1 Touch touch Connected devices > Bluetooth.
- 2 Touch to activate/deactivate this function.

To make your phone more recognisable, you can give your phone a new name which will be visible to others.

- 1 Touch 🏚 on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Connected devices > Bluetooth.
- 3 Touch **Device name**.
- 4 Enter a name, and touch **RENAME** to confirm.

To pair/connect your phone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- 1 Touch to on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Connected devices > Bluetooth.
- 3 Pair new device.
- 4 Touch a Bluetooth device you want to be paired with in the list.
- 5 A dialogue will pop up touch **PAIR** to confirm.
- 6 If the pairing is successful, your phone connects to the device.

To disconnect/unpair from a Bluetooth device

- 1 Touch after the device name you want to unpair.
- 2 Touch **FORGET**.

6.4 Connecting to a computer via USB

With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your phone and computer.

To connect:

- Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- Open the Notification panel and touch **USB for file transfer**, then, in the next dialogue, choose the way in which you want to transfer files.

To locate data you have transferred or downloaded in the internal storage:

- 1 Touch the Application tab from the Home screen to open the apps list.
- 2 Touch Files Go.

All data you have downloaded is stored in **Files Go**, where you can view media files (images, videos, audio and others), rename files, install apps onto your phone, etc.

6.5 To safely remove the microSD card from your phone

The microSD card can be removed from your phone any time the phone is powered off. To remove the microSD card while the phone is on, you must unmount the storage card from the phone first, to prevent corrupting or damaging the storage card.

To remove a microSD card

- 1 Touch to on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch **Storage > SD card.**
- 3 Touch : and select **Storage settings**.
- 4 Touch the **EJECT** button to confirm.

Additionally, you can simply touch the **SD** card to eject it.

Both options serve to safely remove the microSD card from the phone.

To format a microSD card

- 1 Touch 🌣 on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch **Storage > SD card.**
- 3 Touch: and select **Storage settings > Format**.
- 4 Touch ERASE & FORMAT to confirm.

6.6 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with a single computer via a USB cable (USB tethering) or with up to ten devices at once by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot or via Bluetooth.



Sharing data may incur additional charges from your network operator. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas.

To share your phone's data connection via USB

Use the USB cable that came along with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer.

- 1 Touch a on the Quick settings bar to go to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Hotspot & tethering.
- 3 Touch the switch beside **USB tethering** to activate/ deactivate this function.

To share your phone's data connection via Bluetooth

- 1 Touch to on the Quick settings bar to go to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Hotspot & tethering.
- 3 Touch the switch next to **Bluetooth tethering** to activate/deactivate this function.

To share your phone's data connection as a portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- 1 Touch a on the Quick settings bar to go to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Hotspot & tethering > Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 3 Touch the switch to activate/deactivate this function.

To rename or secure your portable hotspot

When Portable Wi-Fi hotspot is activated, you can change the name of your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network.

- 1 Touch a on the Quick settings bar to go to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > Hotspot & tethering > Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 3 Touch **Set up Wi-Fi hotspot** to change the network SSID or set your network security.
- 4 Touch SAVE.

6.7 Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside that network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

To add a VPN

- 1 Touch a on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > VPN and then touch +.
- 3 In the screen that opens, follow the instructions from your network administrator to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- 4 Touch SAVE.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a lock screen pattern, PIN code or password for your phone.

To connect/disconnect to a VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- 1 Touch 🏚 on the Quick settings bar to get to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch Network & Internet > VPN.
- 3 VPNs you have added are listed. Touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- 4 In the dialogue that opens. Enter any requested credentials in the dialogue and touch **CONNECT**.

To disconnect:

 Open the Notification panel and touch the resulting notification for VPN disconnection.

To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

1 Touch 🏚 on the Quick settings bar to go to **Settings**.

- 2 Touch Network & Internet > VPN.
- 3 VPNs you have added are listed; touch the property icon next to the VPN you want to edit.
- 4 When you have finished, touch **SAVE**.

To delete:

Touch the to the selected VPN, touch **FORGET** to delete it.

7 Google Play Store (1)



Google Play Store is an online software store, where you can download and install applications and games to your Android Powered Phone.

- Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Play Store**.
- For the first time you access Google **Play Store**, a screen with terms of service will appear. Touch **ACCEPT** to continue.

Touch the \equiv icon and then select **Help & feedback** to enter Google Play Store help page for more information on this function.

Multimedia applications

8.1 Camera




Your mobile phone is equipped with a Camera for taking photos and shooting videos.

Before using the camera, make sure you have removed the protective lens foil from the camera.

To take a photo when your phone is active, touch the Camera (icon in the Favourites tray on your Home screen.



If the phone is locked, press the Power button and then swipe the camera icon to the left to open the camera.



To take a picture

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch (a) icon to take the picture which will be automatically saved.

To shoot a video

Slide to swith camera mode to **Video** and touch the red spot in the bottom centre of the screen to start recording a video.

Touch sto take the picture which will be automatically saved.

Touch to pause video recording and touch to continue.

Touch to stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

8.1.1 Camera settings


Before taking a photo/shooting a video, touch the iii icon and below options will display for you to choose from:

Modes





Get into **Pano** mode. Touch the shutter button to start taking panoramic photo and move the phone steadily along the direction indicated by the onscreen line. Once the preview frame is filled, the phone will automatically save the photo.



Allows you to create impressive and immersive 360-degree panorama pictures you can share on Facebook

Allows you to create time lapse videos by capturing a series of photos over a period of time and replay them at a faster speed.

Allows you to create a short video which could be easily and quickly shared on social networks.



Touch to edit favourite/other modes. Favourite modes can easily be accessed by swiping horizontally in the view finder. Other modes can be accessed from the modes screen.



Touch to access camera settings and below options will display for you to choose from:

Photo

Photo size (rear)

Touch to select photo size.

Video

Video quality (rear)

Touch to select either HD or VGA for video quality.

Anti shake

Touch the switch to anti shake.

General

Edit modes

Touch to edit camera modes.

Grid

Touch the switch to set/cancel grid in camera screen.

Shutter sound

Touch the switch to activate/deactivate shutter sound while taking pictures.

Location tag

Touch the switch to enable/disable Location tag function.

Volume key control

Touch to choose from Shutter, Zoom and Off.

Camera quick launch

Touch the switch to enable/disable camera quick launch by double pressing volume key when in sleep or lock screen.

Storage

Touch to select either Phone or SD card for pictures/videos storage.

Zoom

Touch the switch to enable/disable zoom function.

Reset to factory settings


Touch to reset Camera to factory settings.

8.2 Gallery




Photos acts as a media player for you to view photos and playback videos.

To open your Photos, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Gallery.**



To view a picture/play a video

Pictures and videos are displayed by albums in Gallery.




- Touch an album and all pictures or videos will show on the screen.
- Touch the picture/video directly to view or play it.
- Slide upward/downward to view previous or next pictures/ videos.

Editing pictures

You can edit pictures, add effects, crop, share, and set them as contact photo or wallpaper.

Select the picture you want to work on and touch the options available such as edit, share, crop or delete. Touch the for more options.



Touch in the full-screen picture view to edit a picture.



Touch to add effects such as Original, Auto, West etc.

Touch to add a border.



Touch to **Crop, Straighten, Rotate, Mirror** or **Draw** the picture.



Touch to adjust picture settings such as Exposure, vignette, etc.



After activating the crop mode, the cropping square appears in the middle of the picture. Select the portion to crop, touch to confirm and **Save**, or touch icon to cancel.

8.3 Play music




You can play music files stored on the microSD card in your phone. Music files can be downloaded from computer to microSD card using a USB cable.

To play your music, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Play Music**.

You will find four categories in which all songs are classified: **PLAYLISTS, ARTISTS, ALBUMS, SONGS** and **GENRES**. Slide left and right to see them all. Touch **SHUFFLE ALL** to shuffle all songs.

8.3.1 Playing music

Touch a song to play it.



Touch key to get to **Settings**

ACCOUNT

Touch to choose an account.

PLAYBACK

Equaliser

Touch to adjust audio settings.

Allow external devices to start playback

Touch switch to allow external devices to start playback, such as car Bluetooth, wired headsets, etc.

Show album art on lock screen

Touch switch to enable to show album art on lock screen.

ABOUT PLAY MUSIC

Privacy policy

Touch to read Privacy policy with the app.



While playing songs with Music you can still Pause, Play or Skip your music even if the screen is locked.

Touch: when a song is highlighted for the following options:

Play next

Touch to play the song you choose next.

Add to queue

Touch to add the song into the now-playing queue.

Add to playlist

Touch to add to a playlist.

Go to artist

Touch to go to artist.

Go to album

Touch to go to album.

Delete

Touch to delete the song.

9 Maps Go



9.1 Get My Location

9.1.1 Turn on GPS

To turn on your phone's global positioning system (GPS) satellite receiver:


- 1 Touch a on the Quick settings bar to go to **Settings**.
- 2 Touch **Security & location > Location**.
- 3 Touch the switch beside **Location** and choose location mode you preferred.

9.1.2 Open Maps Go and view My Location

Touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Maps Go**.

Touch the icon on the map to view My Location.

The map will then centre on a blue dot. Your actual position will be at the blue dot.




To move the map, drag the map with your finger.

To zoom in and out of a map, pinch or spread your fingers, or you can also zoom in by double-tapping a location on screen.

9.2 Search for a location

In the search box, enter an address, a city or a local business.

Touch the search icon to search, and in a while your search results will appear on the map as red dots. You can touch one to show a label.



9.3 Save a location

Just like bookmarking a web address on the Internet, you can save any position on the map for later use. Just touch the red drop picon to bring up a menu about the location, then touch the SAVE icon to save it.

If there is no icon on the point you want to save, tap and hold on that location on the screen to create one.


9.4 Open Street View for a location

- 1 Long press a location to display its address at the bottom of the maps screen.
- 2 Drag up the details screen to save for offline usage.

9.5 Get driving, public transportation or walking directions

9.5.1 Get suggested routes for your trip

Touch o icon from Maps screen.



- 1 Touch enter bar to edit your start point by entering an address or selecting a saved item.
- 2 Do likewise for your end point.
- 3 To reverse directions, touch $\uparrow_{\mathbf{L}}$.
- 4 Then select a transport mode: driving by car, using public transportation, or walking directions.
- 5 Touch Route options to select Avoid motorways, Avoid toll roads or Avoid ferries.
- 6 A couple of suggested routes will appear in a list. Touch any route to view its respective detailed direction.

10 Others

10.1 Files Go



To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Files Go**.

Files Go works with both microSD card and phone storage.

Files Go displays all data stored on both microSD card and phone storage, including applications, media files; videos, pictures or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB cable, etc.

When you download an application from PC to microSD card, you can locate the application on Files Go, then touch it to install it in your phone.

Files Go allows you to perform and be really efficient with the following common operations: view, rename, move, copy, delete, play, share, etc.

10.2 Sound Recorder



To record a sound or voice memo, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Sound Recorder**.

10.3 Radio




Your phone is equipped with a radio ⁽¹⁾. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you turn to stations that offer Visual Radio service.

To listen to the radio, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Radio**.

Please insert a headset to listen to the radio. The headset is used as an antenna for the radio.

The quality of the radio depends on the coverage of the radio station in that particular area.



Available options:

Scan channels

Scan all channels.

Edit name

Touch to edit channel name.

Delete

Delete the channel.

Enter frequency

Enter the frequency manually.

Station info

Mark the checkbox to view the station info.

Exit

Turn off the radio and exit radio application.

11 Settings



Drag down twice from the Notification panel and touch the Settings **t** icon to access **Settings**.

11.1 Network & Internet

11.1.1 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi you can now surf the Internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the Wi-Fi screen and configure an access point to connect your phone to the wireless network.

For detailed instructions on using Wi-Fi, please refer to "6.1.2" Wi-Fi".

11.1.2 Mobile networks

Data roaming

Touch the switch to connect to data services when roaming.

Data roaming reminder

Touch the switch to allow/disallow ask before connecting to data when your phone is switched on.

Preferred network type

Touch to select the preferred network type.

Access point names

You can select your preferred network with this menu.

Network operators

You can select a network operator.

Network operator name

Touch the switch to allow/disallow the display of network operator name in the status bar.

11.1.3 Data usage



Touch **Billing cycle** and then the **Set data limit** switch, then touch **Data limit** to set the maximum amount of mobile data that you want to use. Your mobile data connection will be disabled when the specified limit is reached. You can also choose a data usage cycle to view the statistics and related applications of used data by your phone.

Touch the : icon, and you can view more settings related to your data usage.



Data usage is measured by your phone, and your carrier may count differently.

11.1.4 Hotspot & tethering

This function allows you to share your phone's mobile data connection via USB or as a portable Wi-Fi access point (Please refer to "6.6 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection"

You can also select Flight mode in the phone options when pressing **Power** key.

11.1.5 VPN

A mobile virtual private network (mobile VPN or mVPN) provides mobile phones with access to network resources and software applications on their home network, when they connect via other wireless or wired networks. Mobile VPNs are used in environments where workers need to keep application sessions open at all times, throughout the working day, as the user connects via various wireless networks, encounters gaps in coverage, or suspend-and-resumes their phones to preserve battery life. A conventional VPN can't survive such events because the network tunnel is disrupted, causing applications to disconnect, time out, fail, or even the computing device itself to crash.

For more information on VPN, please refer to **"6.7 Connecting to virtual private networks"**

11.1.6 Flight mode

Use the **Flight mode** to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

You can also select Flight mode in the phone options when pressing **Power** key.

11.1.7 Wi-Fi Calling

Touch the switch to enable/disable **Wi-Fi Calling**.

11.2 Connected devices

11.2.1 Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows your phone to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) in a small range with another Bluetooth supported device (phone, computer, printer, headset, car kit, etc.).

For more information on Bluetooth, please refer to **"6.3** Connecting to Bluetooth devices".

11.2.2 Cast

Touch to set wireless display.

11.2.3 NFC

Touch the switch to allow/disallow data exchange when the phone touched another device.

11.2.4 Android Beam

Touch the switch to turn Android Beam on/off.

When this feature is turned on, you can beam app content to another NFC-capable device by holding the devices close together. For example, you can beam Browser pages, YouTube videos, People contacts and more.

Just bring the devices together (typically back to back) and then tap your screen. The app determines what gets beamed.

11.2.5 Printing

Your phone supports wireless printing to enabled printers and online services.

11.2.6 USB

Touch to view the default apps installed on your phone.

With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your phone and computer. For more information on USB, please refer to "6.4 Connecting to a computer via USB".

11.3 Apps & notifications

You use the Apps settings to view details about the applications installed on your phone, to manage their data and force them to stop, and to set whether you want to permit installation of applications that you obtain from web sites and emails. And you can also get further app or system notification settings.

11.4 Battery

In the Battery screen you can view the battery usage data since you last connected the phone to a power source. The screen also shows your battery status and how long it has been used since last charging. Touch a category to find out its specific power consumption.

You can adjust power use via the screen brightness or screen timeout in the Display screen.

11.5 Display

Home screen

Touch to set the Home screen style.

Favourite app panel

Touch to switch to turn on the function of launching your favourite app by swiping right.

Favourite Home screen app

RF exposure

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR)




