# 1 Your mobile

# 1.1 Keys and connectors





Pressing the **Left softkey** and **Right softkey** equals to select lower-left and lower-right words in bottom bar.



- Flick to go left/right/up/down
- Press to confirm an option (press the middle of the key)
- Pick up/Send a call
- Enter Call log

### 1.2 Home screen

The Home screen is divided into several parts, as shown below:



### 1.2.1 Status bar (1)

From the status bar, you can view both phone status and notifications.

- Battery charge level.
- 8 Bluetooth activated and visible.
- Bluetooth activated but invisible.
- **Bluetooth status** (Connected to an audio device).
- Java application activated.
- Headset connected.
- Keypad locked.
- Call forwarding activated: your calls are forwarded (see page 28).
- Alarm or appointment programmed (see page 40, 41).
- Level of network reception.
- Voicemail message received.
- Missed calls.
- Call in progress.

- Stopwatch activated.
- Email unread.
- Radio is on.
- WAP alerts (1).
- Roaming.
- SD card inserted.
- SIM card unavailable.
- G GPRS in use.
- G GPRS connected.
- Edge in use.
- E Edge connected.
- Music player active.
- Message receipt in progress.
- Sending a message.
- Silence mode.
- SMS unread.
- MMS unread.
- Message list is full: your phone cannot accept any new messages. You must access the message list and delete at least one message from your SIM card.
- Tlight mode.
- Data refreshing.

#### 1.2.2 Facebook status update

The Home screen provides quick access for users to update their own status or view status updates of Facebook friends.

Use the  $\hfill \Box$  key to locate your cursor on the Facebook bar and enter your feelings or ideas.

When finished, press 🗌 to share them with your Facebook friends.

#### 1.2.3 Widget bar

You can bring main menu items and favourite or frequently used contact details to your widget bar for quick access. Flick left or right to view current widgets, select  $\frac{1}{40}$  to add a new widget.

Locate the cursor on the widget bar and press the **Left softkey** to select **"Options**", the following choices are available:

- Add Add a new item to the widget bar
- Move Move the current widget to desired position
- Change Change the current widget to a new one
- **Remove** Remove the current widget from the widget bar

Free maximum number of the widgets allowed is 15; when the list is full, 💠 will not be displayed on the bar.

#### 1.2.4 Wallpaper customization

#### 1.2.5 Lock/Unlock screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock the screen by pressing and holding the **Space** key.

To unlock the screen, press 🔲 , then the **Space** key.

#### 1.2.6 Main menu

To access the main menu screen, select "Menu" from the Home screen.

 On the main menu screen, select "Options", the following choices are available:

 Move
 Move the current widget to desired position

 Show app in menu
 Select to show applications you like on the main menu screen

# 2 Getting started

# 2.1 Set-up

#### Removing or installing the back cover



#### Inserting or removing the SIM card (1)

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. Please power off your phone and remove battery before inserting or removing the SIM card.



Place the SIM card with the chip facing downwards and slide it into its housing. Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press it and slide it out.

#### Installing or removing the battery



- Insert and click the battery into place, then close the telephone cover.
- Unclip the cover, then remove the battery.

#### Installing and removing the memory card (MicroSD card)



Insert the MicroSD card with its golden contact facing downwards into the slot until it is locked. Gently push the SD card until it is unlocked.

#### **Charging the battery**



Connect the battery charger to your phone and mains socket respectively.

- If the battery is flat, it may take around 20 minutes to display the battery charger indicator on the screen.
- Be careful not to force the plug into the socket.
- Make sure the battery is correctly inserted before connecting the charger.
- The mains socket must be near to the phone and easily accessible (avoid electric extension cables).
- When using your phone for the first time, charge the battery fully (approximately 3 hours). The charge is complete when the animation stops.



To reduce power consumption and energy waste, when battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

<sup>(1)</sup> Check with your network operator to make sure that your SIM card is 3V or 1.8V compatible. The old 5 Volt cards can no longer be used. Please contact your operator.

# 2.2 Power on your phone

Hold down the  $\sim$  key until the phone powers on, type in your PIN code if necessary. The main screen is displayed.



If you do not know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code with your phone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

If Broadcast SMS are displayed, use the  $\square$  key to browse through them or press the  $\checkmark$  to return to the Home screen.

While the phone is searching for a network, "Searching/Emergency" will be displayed.

#### Set up your phone for the first time

The first time you power on the phone, you are required to adjust initial basic settings and login to your Facebook account to synchronize Facebook information.



The initial set up can be skipped by pressing the **Right softkey** or enabled from within the main menu of "**Settings**".

# 2.3 Power off your phone

Hold down the 🖘 key from the Home screen.

# 3 Calls

# 3.1 Placing a call

Enter the desired number from the keypad directly or select a contact from **Contacts** or **Call log**, then press the  $\checkmark$  key to place the call. The number you entered can be saved to **Contacts** by selecting **"Save**".

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing the **Delete** key.

To hang up, press the 🔊 key.

#### International calls

To make an international call, enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and finally press the  $\checkmark$  key.

### Making an emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and press the  $\checkmark$  key to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code <sup>(1)</sup>.

# 3.2 Answering or rejecting a call

When you receive an incoming call, press the  $\checkmark$  key or select "Answer" by pressing the  $\square$  key to answer.

Hang up the call by pressing the  $rescaled{second}$  key. If the caller (local contact only) is not one of your Facebook friends and the remind setting (refer to page 51) is active, a reminder screen will appear to suggest sending a Facebook friend request to the caller.

When you receive an incoming call but don't want to answer, you may select "SMS reject" to reject it by SMS.

To mute the ringtone volume of an incoming call, press the  ${\mbox{Left}}$  softkey to select "Mute".

# 3.3 Calling your voicemail <sup>(1)</sup>

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time. To access your voicemail, hold down the  $\mathbb{M}$  key.

To set your voicemail number, enter Settings\Call settings\My numbers.



To use your voicemail service from abroad, contact your network operator before leaving.

# 3.4 During a call<sup>(1)</sup>

When a call is in progress, press the Left softkey to open the call options: New call Hold the current call and dial another number

- DTMF Enable/Disable sending DTMF during the call
- Switch audio patch Switch audio speech from handset to Bluetooth device when connected
- Contacts Enter Contacts menu
- Messaging Enter Messaging menu
- Calendar Enter Calendar menu
- Services Enter Service menu
- Sound recorder Record your current call

You can mute the call by pressing the **Right softkey** and use the **Handsfree** function by pressing the  $\square$  key during a call.



Move the handset away from your ear while using the **Handsfree** option because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

You can switch the audio speech from handset to Bluetooth device when connected.

#### Handling two calls

- Answering a second call (ensure that "Call waiting" is activated, see page 28).
- To call a second party during a call, you can select "Options\New call".

# 3.5 Managing multiple calls (1)

# 3.5.1 Conference calls

Your phone allows you to talk to several people at the same time (up to five). If you are on a two party call, press "**Options**" and select "**Conference**". If a third call comes in, answer it by pressing the  $\checkmark$  key and speak with your new caller.

This caller becomes a member of the conference if you press "**Options**" and select "**Conference call**". Pressing r disconnects the current call.

To end the conference call, press "Options" and select "End conference".

# 4 Messaging.....

You may access this menu using the following options:

- Access from the main menu screen by selecting "Messaging".
- Select 🖾 from the widget bar.

You will see three tabs within this menu:

SMS/MMS List all SMS and MMS you have sent or received.

Facebook List all Facebook messages

Email List all Emails

# 4.1 SMS/MMS

You can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS with this mobile phone.

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations and sounds to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses.



The MMS function can only be used if the service is provided by your operator, if your contract includes the MMS option and if all the parameters for MMS have been entered.

#### 4.1.1 Write new SMS/MMS

You can select "Write new SMS/MMS" from the messaging screen to write text/ multimedia messages. One or more recipients can be added from the contact list and you can remove a recipient by pressing  $\infty$ . Select "Contacts" using the  $\square$  key and then select multiple recipients.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when images, videos, audio, slides or attachments are inserted; Subject, CC/BCC/email address is added; or the message contains more than 8 pages of text.

When finished entering text, press the 🔲 key to send it.

An SMS message of more than a certain number of characters (the number of characters depends on your language) will be charged as several SMS. An MMS message containing photos and/or sounds may also be billed as more than one message. Specific letters (accents) will increase the size of the SMS, this may cause your recipient to receive your message as two or more SMS messages.

#### 4.1.3 Messaging settings

#### • Text message

Profile settings	Profiles can be retrieved directly from SIM card. Alternatively, you can create your own profile.
Common settings	Delivery report, request for acknowledgement of delivery report On/Off. Reply path <sup>(1)</sup> : show reply path.
Alphabet management	Enables the definition of SMS data coding for SMS sending.
SMS Memory status	Memory used on the phone.
Preferred storage	Select default message storage, SIM or phone.
Preferred bearer	Bearer preference.

### • Multimedia message

Edit	Set slide timing, edit mode, image size, signature, etc.
Send	Set the values for validity period, Read report, etc.
Retrieve	Set the values for Home network, Roaming network, etc.
Profile	Follow the same procedure as for setting your Web connection.
MMS Memory status	Memory used on the phone.

Broadcast SMS<sup>(1)</sup>

Receiving mode	Enable to receive broadcast SMS.
Languages	Language selection.
Channel settings	Select/Add/Edit/Delete channels.

# 4.2 Facebook

From this tab, you can exchange messages with your Facebook friends.

Select "Write new Facebook message" to enter message editing screen, enter your friend's name or select one friend from your friends list by pressing the  $\$  key, then enter message text. When finished, press the  $\$  key to send it.

#### Available options:

View profile	View the sender's profile
View recipient list	View recipients' profiles if there are two or more recipients
Delete	Delete the current conversation thread
Delete all	Delete all threads.
Refresh	Data refresh.

# 4.3 Email

Your phone has an email client with the settings pre-defined for a few popular email services like – GoogleMail, Yahoo, AOL, etc. Besides these, you can set up other POP3 or IMAP4 email accounts that you may be using.

#### 4.3.1 Email account set-up

#### Pre-defined email service

If you own an email account with a predefined service, you can install it to your phone by selecting the service (GoogleMail, yahoo, etc.), entering the username, password and account name, and then confirming by selecting "**OK**".

### New email service

To set up a new email account other than the predefined email services, select "Other Email accounts".

You are required to enter your email address, display name, password, account name, then confirm with **"Save**". Afterwards you'll need to select protocol <sup>(1)</sup> (POP3 or IMAP4), then enter your incoming server address and outgoing server address, and finally select **"Save**".

Consult your email service provider for more information about protocol.

#### 4.3.2 Write new email

Select **"Write new email**" from the Email screen to enter the email writing interface. You can add a recipient by entering their Email address in the enter bar, or selecting a contact from Contacts.

#### 4.3.3 Available options

Send and receive	Connect to the email server in order to receive/send mails.

# 5 Contacts.....

### 5.1 Consulting your contacts

You can access this function from the main menu screen by selecting "Contacts" or selecting **LL** from the widget bar.

When accessing this menu, you will see three tabs:

All	List all contacts
Favourites	List your favourite contacts
Phone	List phone contacts

When consulting your contacts for the first time, you  $% \left( {{\rm are required to import}} \right)$  them from the SIM card to your phone.

Contacts with the **If** icon at the end are your Facebook Friends or merged contacts.

#### Searching for a contact

You can search for a contact by entering the initial of their name. Subsequent letters may be added to refine the search.

#### Viewing a contact

Select a name from your contacts, then click to read the contact details.

#### Making a call

Locate the name you want to call, then press the 🛶 key.

If several numbers are associated with the name to be called, you must first choose the number from the list (Mobile, Home, Work, etc.), and then press the  $\checkmark$  key to make the call.

# 5.2 Adding a contact

You can add a new contact by selecting "Add contact".

The following fields are accessible when you create a new entry in Contacts: Name, Image, Mobile, Home, Work, Email, Birthday, Birthday reminder, URL, Address, Ringtone. You can move from one field to another using the  $\Box$  key.

#### Adding birthday reminder

You can set a birthday reminder when editing contact information. This will remind you at regular intervals during the day prior to the set date.



If you use your phone abroad, store your Contact numbers in international format: "+" followed by the country code.

# 5.3 Available options

From the contact list or contact info screen, you can access the following options:

# 6.1.2 Call settings (1)

# • My numbers

Type in or modify your telephone number or the number to access your voicemail and confirm. Your telephone number is usually written on your SIM card.

### Call duration & data counter

You can access different items with this option:

- Amount You can view the last, max. or total cost of charged calls, modify or reset it and enter the cost of a call in the currency of your choice.
- **Duration** You can view or reset the total duration of all outgoing calls.
- GPRS counter Manages the volume of data communication charged for (in kilobytes).
- Beep duration You can activate or cancel the beep emitted during a call with a specified frequency (enter the frequency and confirm by pressing the □ key).

# • Call waiting

Activate/deactivate the notification of a second incoming call by a beep.

# • Call forwarding

You can activate, cancel or verify the status of calls forwarded to voicemail or to a specified number. The following configurations are possible:

Unconditional: automatic forwarding of all your calls. The 👐 icon is displayed.

Conditional: if your line is busy, if you don't answer or if you are outside the network range.

<sup>1)</sup> Contact your network operator to check service availability.

#### Call barring

You can activate or deactivate call barring for outgoing and incoming calls. The various options are:

# Outgoing calls

All calls	All outgoing calls are barred.

#### • Caller ID

You can activate or deactivate automatic callback for calls that do not get through the first time.

From this menu, you can view all voicemail memory.

# 7 Facebook features

Facebook is a social utility that connects people with friends and others who work, study and live around them. It provides a number of features with which users may interact: Wall, a space on every user's profile page that allows friends to post messages for the user to see; Pokes, which allow users to send a virtual "poke" to each other, etc.

To get a Facebook account, please visit www.facebook.com.

To login to Facebook using your phone, please refer to page 51.

With this device, you can press set with other Facebook news Feed page. You can also personalize this key with other Facebook features by selecting "Settings\Facebook settings\Assign Facebook key".

7.1 Chat.....



To access this feature, you can select "**Chat**" from the main menu screen, or directly select from the widget bar on Home screen.

Facebook Chat is a service which provides a new way to communicate with your friends in real-time. Chat allows more immediacy than using either the Wall or Inbox which are the ways of keeping up with friends. No installation or assembly is required. Messages are delivered and displayed to your friend as soon as they are sent. You can also collapse conversations to get them out of the way and go offline if you do not want to use chat at all.

7.2 Me......

To access this feature, you can select "Me" from the main menu screen, or directly select I from the widget bar on Home screen.

This menu displays the following tabs when accessed:

Info	Displays your Facebook profile information.

# **Product Safety Information**

#### • RF Exposure

#### **General Statement on RF energy**

Your phone contains a transmitter and a receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your phone transmits.

#### Specific Absorption Rate (SAR)

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organisation ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to ensure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg and the highest SAR value for this device when tested at the ear was  $0.749 W/kg^{(1)}$ . As mobile devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in other positions, such as on the body as described in this user guide.

# Distraction

#### Driving
