
# Use manufacturer-approved batteries, chargers, accessories



It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves (radio frequency electromagnetic fields) recommended by international guidelines. The quidelines were developed by an independent scientific organisation (ICNIRP) and include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health. The radio wave exposure quidelines use a unit of measurement

known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2.0 W/kg.

## Install the SIM or USIM card and battery
