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safety and information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



Safety warnings

Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

Protect your hearing



Excessive exposure to sound at high volumes can cause hearing damage. Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source and use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone.
 Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries or phones in a fire.
 Follow all local regulations when disposing of used batteries or phones.

- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated
- Never crush or puncture the battery. Avoid exposing the battery to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating.

Avoid interference with pacemakers

Maintain a minimum of 15 cm (6 inches) between mobile phones and pacemakers to avoid potential interference, as recommended by manufacturers and the independent research group, Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that your phone is interfering with a pacemaker or other medical device, turn off the phone immediately and contact the manufacturer of the pacemaker or medical device for guidance.

Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories

Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

While using your phone, hold the phone with a relaxed grip, press the keys lightly, use special features that reduce the number of keys you have to press (such as templates and predictive text), and take frequent breaks.

Do not use the phone if the screen is cracked or broken

Broken glass or acrylic could cause injury to your hands and face. Bring the phone to a Samsung service centre to replace the screen. Damage caused by careless handling will void your manufacturer's warranty.





Safety precautions

Drive safely at all times

Avoid using your phone while driving and obey all regulations that restrict the use of mobile phones while driving. Use hands-free accessories to increase your safety when possible.

Follow all safety warnings and regulations

Comply with any regulations that restrict the use of a mobile phone in a certain area.

Use only Samsung-approved accessories

Using incompatible accessories may damage your phone or cause injury.

Turn off the phone near medical equipment

Your phone can interfere with medical equipment in hospitals or health care facilities. Follow all regulations, posted warnings, and directions from medical personnel.

Turn off the phone or disable the wireless functions when in an aircraft

Your phone can cause interference with aircraft equipment. Follow all airline regulations and turn off your phone or switch to a mode that disables the wireless functions when directed by airline personnel.

Protect batteries and chargers from damage

- Avoid exposing batteries to very cold or very hot temperatures (below 0° C or above 45° C).

Handle your phone carefully and sensibly

- Do not disassemble your phone due to a risk of electric shock
- Do not allow your phone to get wet—liquids can cause serious damage and will change the colour of the label that indicates water damage inside the phone. Do not handle your phone with wet hands. Water damage to your phone can void your manufacturer's warranty.
- Avoid using or storing your phone in dusty, dirty areas to prevent damage to moving parts.
- Your phone is a complex electronic device protect it from impacts and rough handling to avoid serious damage.
- Do not paint your phone, as paint can clog moving parts and prevent proper operation.



- If your phone has a camera flash or light, avoid using it close to the eyes of children or animals.
- Your phone may be damaged by exposure to magnetic fields. Do not use carrying cases or accessories with magnetic closures or allow your phone to come in contact with magnetic fields for extended periods of time.





assembling and preparing your mobile phone

Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

Install the SIM or USIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services. To use UMTS or HSDPA services, you can purchase a Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card.

To install the SIM or USIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.





If the phone is on, press and hold [γ] to turn it off

2. Insert the SIM or USIM card.





- Place the SIM or USIM card in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.
- Without inserting a SIM or USIM card, you can use your phone's non-network services and some menus.

3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

- 1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the phone.
- 2. Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

- Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- When the battery is fully charged (the imicon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 5. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- 6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.



About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards up to 16 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).



- Your phone supports only FAT12, FAT16, and FAT32 file systems for memory cards.
- Formatting the memory card on a PC may cause incompatibility with your phone.
 Format the memory card only on the phone.
- Frequent writing and erasing of data will shorten the lifespan of memory cards.
- 1. Open the cover to the memory card slot on the left side of the phone.

2. Insert a memory card with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.



3. Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.

To remove the memory card, push it gently until it disengages from the phone, and then pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.

using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

- Press and hold [].
- Enter your PIN and press < Confirm> (if necessary).

To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

Switch to the offline profile

By switching to the offline profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.

To switch to the offline profile, in Menu mode, select $Settings \rightarrow Sound profiles \rightarrow Offline$.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

 In Idle mode, press < Menu> to access Menu mode.



You may need to press the Confirm key to access Menu mode depending on your region or service provider. When you are using the smart home screen, you cannot use the Confirm key to access Menu mode.

- Use the Navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.
- 3. Press < Select>, < Save>, or the Confirm key to confirm the highlighted option.
- Press < Back> to move up one level; Press [">"/" |
 to return to Idle mode.

Switch applications

Your phone allows you to multi-task by running multiple applications at the same time.

Switch from one active application to another

- 1. Press and hold [] to open a list of applications.
- Scroll to an application and select it.
 To change the view mode, press < Options> → 3D view.



When you are running too many applications at once, a pop-up message will warn you that there are not enough resources. Restart your phone or press <Options> → End all to close applications.

Close applications

To close the current application, press [**].

To close an application that is running in the background,

- 1. Press and hold [a] to open a list of applications.
- Scroll to an application and press < Options> → End.

Use the smart home screen

The smart home screen allows you to access your favourite applications and contacts and view upcoming events or tasks. You can customise the smart home screen to fit your preferences and needs



When you are using the smart home screen, the Navigation key does not access shortcuts.

Customise the smart home screen

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display → Smart home.
- Press < Edit>.
- 3. Select the items to display on the smart home screen.
- Press < Options> → Save.
 If you select Dual clock, you can set the second clock.
- 5. Press the Confirm key.



You can change the idle screen to another style. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Display** → **Smart home** and scroll left or right to a style you want.

Access the smart home idle items

Press the Navigation key to scroll through the items on the smart home screen and press the Confirm key to select an item. The following items are available.



Available items may vary depending on your service provider.

- Shortcuts toolbar: access your favourite applications. You can customise the shortcut toolbar as desired.
- My buddies: access contacts that are saved in the favourite number list.
- PIMs ticker: access upcoming calendar events and tasks.
- Smart search: search for any specific data stored in your device or on the web.
- Dual clock: view your home clock and a world clock.

- Monthly calendar: view the monthly calendar.
- Single clock: view the current time and date.
- Facebook/Twitter: access recently updated feeds.

Customise the shortcut toolbar

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display → Smart home.
- 2. Press < Edit>.
- 3. Scroll to Shortcuts toolbar and press <Options> → Edit shortcuts.
- 4. Select a menu to change or an empty location.
- Select the menus you want.
 Press < Options> → Open to select submenus (if necessary).
- 6. Press <Save>, or press <Options> → Save.

Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press the Volume key and adjust the key tone volume.

Switch to or from the silent profile

In Idle mode, press and hold [#] to silence or unsilence your phone.

Change your ringtone

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Sound profiles.
- 2. Scroll to the profile you are using.



If you are using the silent or offline profile, you are not allowed to change the ringtone.

- Press <Edit> → Voice call ringtone or Video call ringtone.
- 4. Select a memory location (if necessary).
- 5. Select a ringtone.
- 6. Press the Confirm key.

To switch to another profile, select it from the list.

Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display → Wallpaper.
- 2. Select a memory location (if necessary).
- 3. Select an image.

Select a theme for the display

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display → My theme.
- 2. Select a theme by pressing the Confirm key.
- 3. Scroll left or right to preview the theme.
- 4. Press < Set >.

Set menu shortcuts

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone → Shortcuts.
- 2. Select a key to use as a shortcut.
- 3. Press the Confirm key and select a menu to assign to the shortcut key.



When you are using the smart home screen, the Navigation key (left/right) does not work as shortcuts.

Lock your phone

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Security → Phone lock
- 2. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and press < Confirm>.
- 3. Enter the new password again and press < Confirm>.



- The first time you access a menu that requires a password, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.
- Samsung is not responsible for any loss of passwords or private information or other damages caused by illegal software.

Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.

Make a call

- In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.
- Press [\(\)] to dial the number.
 For a video call, press < Options> → Video call.
- 3. To end the call, press [♥].

Answer a call

- 1. When a call comes in, press [\setminus].
- 2. For a video call, press < Show me> to allow the caller to see you via the front camera lens.
- 3. To end the call, press [γ].

Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume key.

Use the speakerphone feature

- During a call, press the Confirm key to activate the speaker.
- 2. To switch back to the earpiece, press the Confirm key again.



In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode.

Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press and hold the headset button.
- To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To end a call, press and hold the headset button.

Send and view messages

Learn to send or view text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), or email messages.

Send a text or multimedia message

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create message.
- 2. Enter a recipient number and scroll down.

- Enter your message text. ▶ p. 29
 For sending as a text message, skip to step 5.
 For attaching multimedia, continue with step 4.
- Press < Options> → Add multimedia and add an item.
- 5. Press the Confirm key to send the message.

Send an email

- 1. In Menu mode, select Email.
- Press < Options> → Create email.
- 3. Enter an email address.
- Scroll down and enter a subject.
- 5. Scroll down and enter your email text.
- Press < Options> → Attach items and attach a file (if necessary).
- 7. Press the Confirm key to send the message.

Enter text



Available text input modes may vary depending on your region.

When entering text, you can change the text input mode:

- Press and hold [#] to switch between T9 and ABC modes. Depending on your country, you may be able to access an input mode for your specific language.
- Press [#] to change case or switch to Number mode.
- Press [*] to switch to Symbol mode. Enter text in one of the following modes:

Mode	Function
ABC	Press an appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.

Mode	Function
T9 ABC	Press appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word. When the word displays correctly, press [0] to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, press the Navigation key up or down to select an alternative word.
Number	Press an appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a number.
Symbol	Press an appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a symbol.

View text or multimedia messages

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Inbox.
- 2. Select a text or multimedia message.

View an email

- 1. In Menu mode, select Email.
- 2. Press the Confirm key.
- 3. Select an email or a header.
- 4. If you selected a header, press the Confirm key to view the body of the email.

Add and find contacts

Learn the basics of using the phonebook feature.



The memory location to save new contacts may be preset depending on your service provider. To change the memory location, in Menu mode, select Contacts → <Options> → Settings → Save new contacts to → a memory location. If Save new contacts to does not appear on the display, select View contacts on → All.

Add a new contact

- 1. In Idle mode, enter a phone number and press < Options >.
- 2. Select Add to Contacts → Create contact.
- 3. Select a memory location (if necessary).
- 4. Select a number type (if necessary).
- Enter contact information.
- 6. Press the Confirm key to add the contact to memory.

Find a contact

- 1. In Menu mode, select Contacts.
- 2. Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find.
- 3. Select the contact's name from the contact list.



Once you have found a contact, you can:

- call the contact by pressing [\]
- edit the contact information by pressing < Options> → Edit

Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

Capture photos

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
 - To change the preview screen, press the Navigation key up (<a>¬).

- To adjust the brightness, press the Navigation key left or right (∑).
- To change the time delay, press the Navigation key down (32).
- To zoom in or out, press the Volume key.
- 4. Press the Confirm key or the Camera key to take a photo.

The photo is saved automatically.

After capturing photos, press < View> to view photos.

View photos

Use one of the following methods to view photos:

- In Menu mode, select My files → Images → a photo file.
- In Menu mode, select Apps → Media browser → a photo file.



With **Media browser**, you can rate the files or add tags to them.

Capture videos

- In Idle mode, press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.
- Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Press [1] twice to switch to Recording mode.
- 4. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
 - To change the preview screen, press the Navigation key up (
 - To adjust the brightness, press the Navigation key left or right (∑).
 - To change the time delay, press the Navigation key down (38).
 - · To zoom in or out, press the Volume key.
- 5. Press the Confirm key or the Camera key to start recording.

6. Press **<Stop>** or the Camera key to stop recording.

The video is saved automatically.

After capturing videos, press < View > to view videos.

View videos

Use one of the following methods to view videos:

- In Menu mode, select My files → Videos → a video file.
- In Menu mode, select Apps → Media browser → a video file.

Listen to music

Learn how to listen to music via the music player or FM radio

Listen to the FM radio

 Plug the supplied headset into the phone's multifunction jack.

- 2. In Menu mode, select Apps → FM radio.
- Press the Confirm key to start the FM radio.
- Press < Yes> to start automatic tuning.
 The radio scans and saves available stations automatically.



The first time you turn on the FM radio, you will be prompted to start automatic tuning.

5. Control the FM radio using the following keys:

Confirm	Turn the FM radio on or off
Volume	Adjust the volume
Navigation	Left/Right: Tune a radio station Up/Down: Select a radio station saved in the favourite list ▶ p. 50

If you want to get information about the song you hear, press <**Options** $> \rightarrow$ **Find music**. \blacktriangleright p. 50

6. To turn off the FM radio, press the Confirm key.



troubleshooting
