



Set up & go

Create or log into a MOTOBLUR account to get your contacts, email, messages and status information, for all your accounts, all in one place, all the time. There's more in "Your MOTOBLUR account" on page 11. Registration is secure and should only take a few minutes:

1 Turn on.



- 2 Select a language.
- 3 Register or log in.

Tip: Open your phone to type.



If you have not created a MOTOBLUR account, you'll need to register: Enter your name, your current email address (where MOTOBLUR can send account information) and a new MOTOBLUR account password.

4 Add your accounts to MOTORI UR



5 Import your SIM contacts.

To add an account, touch it. Then, enter the username or email and password that you set up on that account.

Tip: For more, or to add accounts anytime, go to "Add account" on page 11.

After you sign in, your phone will automatically start to import your SIM contacts.

Note: This phone supports data-intensive apps and services. It is strongly recommended that you purchase a data plan that meets your needs. Contact your service provider for details.

Turn it on & off

To turn on your phone, press and hold Power (on the right side of the phone).

To turn off your phone, press and hold Power ①, then touch **Power off**.

Wi-Fi connect

If you want to use a Wi-Fi computer network for even faster Internet access, touch Menu 🔠 > Settings > Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings.

Your phone comes with a microSD memory card installed—you can fill it with photos, videos and music from your computer using "USB drag & drop" on page 42.

Security

Your contacts are backed-up on MOTOBLUR, so don't worry. Even if you lose your phone, MOTOBLUR can help you find it or wipe it. And when you get your next MOTOBLUR product, your stored info makes it a breeze to set up with just a username and password.

Touchscreen & keys

Touch tips

Here are some tips on how to navigate around your phone.

Touch

To choose an icon or option, touch it




Touch & hold

To open special options, touch and hold an icon or other item. Try it: On the home screen, touch

Contacts, then touch and hold a contact to open options.



Drag



Tip: When you drag or flick a list, a *scroll bar* appears on the right. Drag the scroll bar to move the list to a letter A – 7

Flick

To scroll through a list or move quickly, *flick* across the touchscreen (drag quickly and release).

Tip: When you flick a long list, touch the screen to stop it from scrolling.

Pinch-to-zoom

Get a closer look at maps, web pages or photos. To zoom in, *touch* the screen with two fingers and then slide them apart. To zoom out, *drag* your fingers together.

Key tips

Menu, home & back

Touch Home (a) to close any menu or app and return to the home screen.

On the home screen, touch and hold Home $\widehat{\ \ \ }$ to show the last few apps you used, then touch an app to open it.

Press Search $\boxed{\mathbf{Q}}$ for text search, or press and hold for voice search.

Touch Menu \blacksquare to open menu options, or touch Back \bigcirc to go back.

Sleep & wake up

To save your battery, prevent accidental touches or when you want to wipe smudges off your touchscreen, put the touchscreen to sleep by pressing Power ①. To wake up the touchscreen, just press Power ② again, or open the phone.

To change how long your phone waits before the screen goes to sleep automatically, touch Menu Settings > Sound & display > Screen timeout.

Tip: To make the screen lock when it goes to sleep, use "Screen lock" on page 47.

Power key menu

Press and hold Power ① to open the power key menu, where you can turn off the phone (**Power off**), or turn **Flight mode** or **Silent mode** on or off.

Adjust volume

Press the volume keys to change the ring volume (on the home screen) or the earpiece volume (during a call).

Tip: To silence the ringtone with a double tap, or to switch to vibrate mode by placing your phone face down, touch Menu 🔠 > Settings > Sound & display > Double tap to silence or Smart profile: face down to vibrate.

Spin the screen

The touchscreen can rotate 90 degrees in some apps, such as messaging and contacts, to stay right-side up when you rotate your phone:

Home screen

quick access to the things you need most

Quick start: Home screen

The home screen gives you all your latest information in one place. It's what you see when you turn on the phone or touch Home from a menu. It's basically like this:



Note: Your home screen might look a little different.

Use & change your home screen

On your home screen, *shortcuts* are icons that you open your favourite apps, web bookmarks, contacts,

mail labels or music playlists. Widgets show you news, weather, messages and other updates.

Flick the home screen left or right to open other *panels* of shortcuts and widgets.

- To open something, touch it. Touch Home to return to the home screen.
- To change a widget's settings, open it and then touch Menu Setup.

Tip: For each **Messages** or **Happenings** widget, you can choose the accounts you want to show.

You can find details about the settings for **Happenings** ("Add account" on page 11), **Messages** ("Set up messaging" on page 20), **Music** ("Music" on page 39), **Social status** ("Update your status" on page 11), **News** or **Weather** ("Widgets" on page 35).

 To resize a widget, touch and hold a corner until you feel a vibration, then drag to resize. Arrows appear in the corners of the widget. Drag the arrows to resize.



 To add something or change your wallpaper, touch and hold an empty spot until you see the Add to Home screen menu.

You can add a folder to organise your shortcuts.

 To move or delete something, touch and hold it until you feel a vibration, then drag it to another spot, another panel or the trash on the lower right of the screen.

Running multiple apps

No need to close an app before opening another one. Your phone runs multiple apps, all at once.

You can open a new app while already running another. Touch Home to return to the home screen. Open the Applications tab and touch the app you want. To switch from one running app to another, touch and hold Home to see what apps are already open, then touch the one you want. You can view up to the last six apps that you ran.

Search

To search, touch Search \bigcirc on the front of the phone, or press Search \bigcirc on the QWERTY keypad.



Notifications & phone status

At the top of the screen, icons on the left notify you about new messages or events. Icons on the right tell you about phone status.

Notifications

To access a message, email or meeting reminder directly from the status bar, drag the status bar down and touch the notification.

Main menu

Quick start: Main menu

The main menu shows you all of your applications. To open it from the home screen, touch
. To close it, touch Home

Note: Your main menu will vary.

Tip: To find an app in the main menu, open your phone (or touch and hold Menu 📆 to open a display keypad), then type the app name.

Recent apps

Touch and hold Home (a) to see the last few apps you used, then touch the app you want. Touch Home (a) to return to the home screen.

Your MOTOBLUR account

The first time you turned on your phone, you registered for a MOTOBLUR account that manages your messages, contacts and more ("Set up & go" on page 4). You can log into this account from a computer to upload contacts, reset your password, get help or even locate your phone:

What is MOTOBLUR?

MOTOROLA **FLIPOUT** with MOTOBLUR is a phone with social skills.

MOTOBLUR is the only service that can sync all your friends, emails, messages, FacebookTM, MySpace, Twitter and happenings with continuous updates and back-ups, along with the ability to remotely locate and wipe your phone if it's lost or stolen.

Update your status

After you add a social networking account, you can update and see your current status in a **Social status** widget on your home screen.

To update your status, just touch your **Social status** widget and enter text. If you have more than one

account, you can use the pull-down menu to limit which accounts are updated. If you don't see a **Social status** widget, flick your home screen left or right to check all panels.

To add a Social status widget:

- 1 Touch and hold an empty spot on your home screen to open the Add to Home screen menu.
- 2 Touch Motorola widgets > Social status. The widget appears in the empty spot and will show your status the next time your phone updates from the network.

Add account

If you skipped setting up a MOTOBLUR account when you first turned on your phone, you'll need to set up a MOTOBLUR account before you can add other accounts. On your home screen, touch **Set up your account** and follow the steps in "Set up & go" on page 4.

Note: You can add your **Facebook**, **MySpace**, **Twitter** or other accounts to your phone. If you don't have accounts, you can visit their web sites to set them up.

To sign into your account, use the username or email and password that you set up on that account (the same as on your computer).

When you sign into social networking accounts, you'll see your friends and contacts in your **Contacts** list, and your status and updates can appear in **Social status** and **Happenings** widgets.

Note: Twitter and MySpace messages will always appear as "read" on your phone, but your phone notifies you when you receive a new message. MySpace marks your messages as "read" online.

For email accounts, see "Set up messaging" on page 20.

Tip: To download updates faster, use "Wi-Fi™" on page 31.

View account updates & features

After you add a social networking account, you can see and respond to friends' updates with the **Happenings** widget on your home screen. If you don't see one, set one up in "Widgets" on page 35.

When you touch the **Happenings** widget to open an update, you can touch on the social network's icon to open the relevant web site.

Note: Your network or other factors might affect the speed of widget updates.

Edit & delete accounts

Find it: Menu 🔠 > Settings > Accounts

Touch and hold an account, then touch **Open account** to edit it, or touch **Remove account** to remove it (along with its contacts and messages).

Touch for voicemail, speed dial and frequent calls.

In-call options



During a call, touch Menu 📆 to choose **Hold**, **New call** or **Use Bluetooth**. Your touchscreen goes dark to avoid accidental touches. To wake it up, press Power 💽.

Tip: You can touch Home or Back to hide the active call display. To reopen it, touch Dialler.

Make & answer calls

Note: Unless you have a headset connected, you need to open the phone to make and answer calls.

To make a call, open the phone, touch Call.

Tip: To enter an international dialling code, touch and hold . To add a pause or wait after numbers. touch Menu 🔠.

To answer a call, open the phone or drag Answer to the right (when your phone is unlocked. Answer is just a touch button).

Speed dial

Find it: (Dialler > Menu 🔡 > Speed dial

- To call a number touch it.

Frequent calls

Find it: C Dialler > Menu 🔡 > Frequent

- To call a number, touch it.
- To send a text message, view a contact, add the call to speed dial or other options, touch and hold an entry.

Hands-free

Note: Using a mobile device or accessory while driving may cause distraction and may be illegal. Always obey the laws and drive safely.

During a call:

- To use the speakerphone, touch Speaker.
- To use a Bluetooth™ device, touch Menu :: > Use Bluetooth

Mute & hold

During a call:

- To mute the current call, touch Mute.
- To put a call on hold, touch Menu > Hold.

Enter numbers during a call

To enter numbers during a call, touch IIII and then touch the dial pad.

Conference calls

To start a conference call, call the first number, After they answer, touch Menu 📳 > New call and call the next number. When the next number answers touch Menu 🔛 > loin.

Your phone number

Find it: Menu 😬 > Settings > About phone > Status > My phone number

Your caller ID

To hide your number from the people you call, touch Menu 📆 > Settings > Call settings > Additional settings > Caller ID.

Emergency calls

Note: Your service provider programmes one or more emergency phone numbers (such as 999 or 112) that you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone is locked. Emergency numbers vary by country. Your pre-programmed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental or interference issues.

- 2 Enter the emergency number.
- 3 Touch **Call** to call the emergency number.

Note: Your mobile device can use AGPS satellite signals to help emergency services find you (see "GPS & AGPS" on page 53).

Call forwarding & waiting

You can forward calls all the time or only when your phone is busy, unanswered or unreachable (not on the network):

Find it: Menu 🔛 > Settings > Call settings > Call forwarding

When you're on a call and a second call comes in, **Call waiting** lets you answer it by touching **Answer**. You can turn off **Call waiting** to send second calls straight to your voicemail:

Find it: Menu > Settings > Call settings > Additional settings > Call waiting

Restrict outgoing calls

To restrict your phone so that it can only dial a few numbers:

Find it: Menu 📆 > Settings > Call settings > Fixed dialling number


- To turn fixed dialling on, touch FDN disabled.
- To add or delete the allowed numbers, touch Manage FDN list.

Contacts

Quick start: Contacts

Find it: L Contacts



Tip: To search the list, touch and hold Menu 📆 > **Search**, then type a name. When you flick or drag this list, a scroll bar appears on the right. Drag the scroll bar to move the list faster.

Import contacts from your SIM

Note: You might have already done this during "Set up & go" on page 4.

If you need to import the contacts from your SIM card, touch Contacts, then touch Menu Settings > Manage SIM card.

Call, text or email contacts

Find it: L Contacts

For **View contact**, **Send email**, **Delete contact**, touch and hold the contact.

View & use contacts

With a MOTOROLA **FLIPOUT** with MOTOBLUR, you'll know what everybody's up to and when. Every time you pick up a call, check a message or look up a friend's contact info: you'll not only see their name and number, but you'll see their social network status and smiling face too.

Find it: L Contacts

Tip: To change which account provides the pictures for your Contacts, from the home screen touch Menu () > Settings > Accounts > Menu () > Picture source.

- To find a contact, just type the name.
 - Touch a contact to open their details. To start a call or compose a message, just touch their phone number or other info.
- To change the list view to History (recently used),
 A-Z (list without status) or Status (list with status),
 flick the screen to the left or right.
- To send a contact's details in a message or over a Bluetooth connection, touch and hold the contact, then choose Share contact.

Edit or delete contacts

Find it: L Contacts

Touch the contact, then touch Menu 📳 > **Edit** or **Delete**. You can set a ringer, address and other details that will be saved on your phone and your MOTOBLUR account.

Where are contacts edited or deleted? Your phone edits the contacts in its memory, and also updates your MOTOBLUR account. Your changes won't affect your SIM card.

Link contacts

You might have two **Contacts** for the same person, maybe a Facebook friend who is also stored on your

SIM card, or one friend with two email addresses. To combine these two contacts:

Find it: L Contacts

Touch a contact to open it, then touch Menu 📆 > Link contact and touch the second entry. Your MOTOBLUR account remembers this connection.

Create contacts

Find it: Contacts > Menu > Add contact

Open your phone to type the name and details.

Touch **Other** to choose a different type for this entry.



To see more details, flick up.

When you're finished, touch Save.

Where are contacts saved? Your phone saves new contacts in its memory, your MOTOBLUR account and other accounts you select: In **Contacts**,

touch Menu [#] > **Settings** to choose which accounts get updated. New contacts won't be on your SIM card, but they will download to any new MOTOBLUR phone when you log into your MOTOBLUR account.

Synchronise contacts

When you change one of your **Contacts**, your phone automatically updates your MOTOBLUR account online. Also, your phone updates your **Contacts** and MOTOBLUR account whenever you change a friend in your social networking accounts.

So, you don't have to do anything to synchronise your **Contacts** with your other accounts! MOTOBLUR takes care of it for you.

My details

Find it: Contacts > Menu > My info

To edit details, touch them.

Groups

You can put your **Contacts** into groups that you create (like "friends", "family" or "work"). Then, you can find contacts faster by showing one group at a time.

To create a group in your **Contacts**, touch Menu 📳 > **Display group** > **Create new group**. Enter a group name, then touch Menu 📳 > **Add member** to add members.


To show only one group in your **Contacts**, touch **Contacts** at the top of your screen and choose the group name.

Messaging

sometimes it's best to text or IM or email . . .

Quick start: Messaging

Find it: Home > > Messaging > Universal inbox



Touch to select multiple messages to move, delete and more. Or touch Menu $\left[\begin{smallmatrix}\mathbf{0}\\\mathbf{0}\\\mathbf{0}\end{smallmatrix}\right]$ > **Select all** or **Deselect all**.

Tip: To see more messages, flick or drag up.

Read & reply to messages

Every text, email, friend-feed, wall post and bulletin is automatically delivered to you, ready for you to reply instantly using the flip-open keypad. The best part is you don't have to dig through any apps, screens or menus—every message streams right to the phone, viewable exactly the way you want.

Find it: Home > Messaging > Universal inbox

Note: Universal inbox shows all of your messages together—text, email and social networking messages. To show only one type of message, touch a message account type instead of **Universal inbox**.

- To open a message and all of its replies, touch it.
- To respond to a message, just open it and enter your response in the text box at the bottom.
- To open options, touch and hold a message.

Tip: Add the **Messages** widget to your home screen, see "Widgets" on page 35.

Create messages

Choose a message type. Then, enter the recipient and message. In text messages and emails, touch Menu 📳 to add files or choose other options.

Send & receive attachments

To send a file in a message, open a new message, touch Menu 📳, and choose the file.

When you receive a message with an attachment, open the message and touch the file name to download it. Then, touch the name again to open it. Some file formats can be converted to HTML for faster

viewing, and your phone will show a button that says **Get HTML version**.

Tip: To send and receive large attachments faster, use a Wi-Fi connection, in "Wi-FiTM" on page 31.

Set up messaging

To add email accounts, on the home screen touch Menu 🔠 > Settings > Accounts > Add account.

- Corporate sync is for Exchange server work email accounts. Enter details from your IT administrator.
 - **Tip:** You might need to enter your domain name with your user name (like *domain/username*)
 - Note: Some work accounts might require you to add a password lock to your phone for security. To stop an account from showing the contacts you create on your phone, touch Contacts, touch Menu Settings, then uncheck the account under New contacts.
- Email is for most personal email accounts. For account details, contact the account provider.
 - **Note:** While you are using a Wi-Fi network, you cannot access **Yahoo Mail** accounts. You can still use your browser to see these accounts at mail.vahoo.com.

To change your settings, touch Home \bigcirc > \bigcirc > \bigcirc > Messaging > Menu \bigcirc , then touch:

- Manage accounts to change your user name or password (or server settings, for email).
- Edit universal inbox to choose which accounts show messages in the Universal inbox.
- Messaging settings to set the notification for each account type (along with other preferences, for email).

Tip: For social network accounts, see "Add account" on page 11.

Instant messages

To send and receive instant messages, you can use an instant messaging app or your browser.

 To download and use an instant messaging app, touch Home > >
 Market > Applications

- > **Communication**, then choose an app for your provider. Once you download the app, you'll see it in "Main menu" on page 10.
- If you don't see an app for your IM provider, you can use your web browser. Touch Home (a) > (a) > (b) > (b) > (b) > (c) > (



Symbols/numbers

Touch to open a keypad for symbols and numbers.

To change your settings for this keypad, from the home screen, touch Menu 💼 > Settings > Language & kevboard > Android kevboard.

Text entry settings

When you use the touchscreen keypad, your phone suggests words from your dictionary and chosen language. Your phone also automatically enters apostrophes in some words, such as "dont."

Find it: In the home screen touch Menu 🔛 > Settings > Language & keyboard

- To edit your dictionary, touch User dictionary.
- To change the language and the style for your touchscreen keypad, touch Select locale.
- To change the sounds, corrections and other settings for your touchscreen keypad, touch Android keyboard.
- To change the automatic correction settings for your full keypad, touch **Device keyboard**.

Zoom & magnify

In web pages, when you scroll (drag or flick), zoom icons appear at the bottom of your screen.

Select links

When you touch a link, your phone outlines it. If you touch and hold the link, your



phone shows options, like Open in new window or Bookmark link

Browser options

Touch Menu 🔛 to see browser options:

Bookmarks	Shows a list of your bookmarks. Touch Add bookmark to add the current page to your list.
Windows	View the browser windows that are currently open.
Refresh	Reloads the current page.
Forward	Navigate to a previously viewed page.
More	Shows browser options, like Find on page, Select text , Page info , Share page , Downloads and Settings .

Download apps

Warning: Apps downloaded from the web can be from unknown sources. To protect your phone and personal data, only download apps from sources you trust, such as "Apps for all" on page 29.

Note: All apps downloaded are stored in your phone memory.

To download apps:





Crash recovery

In the unlikely event that your phone stops responding to touches and key presses, try a quick reset. Remove the back cover and battery ("Assemble & charge" on page 3), then replace and turn on your phone as usual.

Safety, regulatory & legal

Battery use & safety

Important: Handle and store batteries properly to avoid injury or damage.

Most battery issues arise from improper handling of batteries, and particularly from the continued use of damaged batteries.

DON'Ts
